SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Beverley Early Years Network

Beginning as a small group of concerned Mothers in 2016, the Beverley Early Years Network was formed to promote and assist early learning among pre-school children to better prepare them for their initiation into the education system. From here it has grown with membership of 12 mothers and 3 other interested volunteers.

On the 22nd November, the group was successful in winning an Award at the Western Australian Community Achievement Awards for their considerable efforts. Awarded the **Gowrie WA Early Learning Community Award,** the citation for this amply describes their achievements.

The Beverley Early Years Network fosters intergenerational connections and provides accessible resources for all. Since 2016, the Beverley Early Years Network has been a key resource for families, offering developmental support and educational activities. Starting with a small Storytime, they revitalised the Toy Library and launched programs like "Me @ 1, 2, 3," which brings health professionals together to assist young children's growth. Their free activity tent at local shows has become a popular family attraction. By developing a comprehensive five-year plan, they are working to meet evolving needs and ensure sustainability. Their innovative initiatives make them an integral part of Beverley's support network for children and families.

Yet another volunteer community group helping to build a better Beverley. Congratulations to them all for this achievement.

Breach of Vehicle Movement Ban

Towards the end of November, the Shire was advised of a breach of the Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban. To put it mildly, this is disappointing and totally unacceptable. The owners of the property were contacted by phone and a follow-up letter was sent. Those in charge of the movements on the property were unaware of this and have undertaken to speak with the offenders.

For those new to Beverley, these restrictions are sensibly imposed on relevant days, as fire is a very real danger in the Wheatbelt. It is land owners' responsibility to find out if a Ban is in place. A Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban means you cannot move **any type of vehicle** through a paddock. The Shire of Beverley has an SMS text notification advising on the imposition and lifting of Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans. Kokeby Fire 18 December

Given the above incident, the importance of being aware of circumstances that can result in a fire, there was no better example of that than the fire that occurred within the Kokeby area on the afternoon of Wednesday 18th December.

Whilst the cause is yet unknown, the result could have been catastrophic. Thanks go to all the farmers, and Brigade volunteers who reacted so quickly and dealt with the situation as they did. Assisted by the Shire and two water bombers, the fire was contained before it could spread further. Without these efforts the weather conditions of the day could have resulted in the loss of houses and possibly life.

Proposed Retirement Village - 18 (Lot 4) Hunt Road

Public Notification (Planning Advertising) for this proposed development concluded on the 6th December 2024 and several submissions have been received, including some objections.

At the 10th December Annual Electors Meeting concerns were received from ratepayers as to the details of the proposal. In response to these concerns, the Shire have agreed to an extension of the Public Submission period until close of business on Friday 24th January 2025.

Roads Roadworks

York Williams Road - Road Closure 13 January to June 2025 - Bridge 3197 Replacement

York Williams Road will be closed for a bridge replacement between 13 January and June 2025.

Bridge 3197 is approximately 11 kms from the Great Southern Highway just south of Beverley.

The new bridge will have two traffic lanes unlike the old bridge which is a single lane bridge.

Great Southern Highway – Road Rehabilitation and Shoulder Sealing – Beverley to Brookton

Shoulder sealing and road rehabilitation on Great Southern Highway between Beverley and Brookton is progressing well and is due for completion by the end of January 2025.

We appreciate the patience shown by road users to enable a safe work site.

Timber bridge 311 (near Smart Road) is also due for replacement and the road will be realigned 2 kilometres either side of the bridge. This will be done at a future time.

Great Southern Highway – Shoulder Sealing – York to Beverley

Culvert extensions are currently underway between Young Road and Beverley and scheduled for completion mid-November 2024. Shoulder sealing will shortly commence in January 2025 until May 2025.

There will be lane closures and speed restrictions in place, so please allow extra travel time.


Department of Transport Licensing in 2025.

Delay to Bremner Road Bridge Construction

Due to a delay in receiving *Aboriginal Heritage Act 1972* Section 18 approval, the previously advertised repair and construction of Bremner Road Bridge 3205, which was due to begin in January 2025, will be delayed. Construction is likely to now start in February 2025 although approval timeframes are not definite. We apologise for the further delay and any inconvenience this may cause.

The York-Williams Road closure for Bridge 3197 replacement is still scheduled to commence from 13 January 2025 as previously advertised.

Drums will now be accepted at the Beverley Refuse Site DrumMuster compound every **Monday** between 9.00am & 3.00pm.

Protocols **must** still be followed and all drums must be cleaned thoroughly in accordance with DrumMuster requirements.

Our collection site is accessible every Monday when the Beverley Tip is open.

Load your trailer with clean drums, head to the Beverley Tip, ask the Refuse Site Manager for the drumMuster folder (including cage key and declarations) and stack your drums in the cage, fill out the declaration and return the folder. The attendant can sign the declaration if required.

Harvest Bans And Extreme Fire Danger Warnings

No burning whatsoever is permitted on days of HIGH or above FIRE DANGER or where WINDS EXCEED 20 km/hr. Harvest bans and the prohibiting of vehicle movement in paddocks are broadcasted daily on RadioWest and ABC radio.

Dress Standard for Fighting Fires

The minimum standard of dress for ALL persons attending a fire is:

- LONG PANTS
- LONG SLEEVE SHIRT
- BOOTS

Any person not conforming to this standard and not meeting minimum training standards will be requested by the Fire Control Officer to leave the fire ground. If you choose to remain on the ground, it is at your own liability.

Water supply in a bushfire

This information could save your life

While leaving high-risk bushfires is the safest option, if you plan to stay and defend your home, you must have an INDEPENDENT water supply and pumping capability. This typically requires water tanks of at least 20,000 litres, pump and generator.

This is required as mains water supply and pressure cannot be guaranteed during a bushfire due to the risk of power cuts, fire damage and extreme demand.

Use the Department of Fire and Emergency Services resources to develop your personal bushfire plan: **mybushfireplan.wa.gov.au** You can also download the My Bushfire Plan app via the App Store or Google Play to access your bushfire plan anytime - even without an internet connection.

To support bushfire plans, if you have groundwater bore access to surface water, you can take and store emergency water without it counting against your annual entitlement. For more information on this, and for the location of emergency bushfire water supplies in dryland agricultural areas, visit the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation website.

Drinking water

We recommend you keep a supply of drinking water on hand throughout summer in case your water supply is interrupted.



Beverley Agricultural Machinery Museum 'November & December' News.

Firstly, a big apology to our regular readers, between the editor's desk and the printing press the 'November News' got left out, although it was submitted in plenty of time, so here is the scaled down version, --- better late than never, together with the 'December News'.

Alas, by the time you read this article the Beverley Ag Museum located in the grounds of Avondale Farm will be closed to the public until March 2025. As country people are aware the fire risk in our region increases over the warmer months, so given the dryer conditions viewing can only be done by appointment now.

With additional openings this past year (and by special request), the Museum has seen several groups and visitors to our town come out to enjoy the collection, with many being given the opportunity to see items in operation, well it is 'A Working Museum'. One of our latest efforts being to get the 1919 Caterpillar running again, as you can see from the smiling

faces, we are pleased to report that she burst into life relatively easily. something that has not occurred for many years, but alas, as always, some repairs are necessary before she will be seen 'tracking around'. On filling with water, leaks appeared from the cooling system, with both top radiator hose inlets cracked and a leaking core, so the radiator is being repaired as I write.

Every November the Beverley Shire sponsors an end of year bar-be-que to show their appreciation of the time given by our group not only for restoring and maintaining the vast collection of items in the Museum, but also for giving up their time to open to the public and groups wishing to visit. It also gives our members the opportunity to show their wives and partners what they get up to twice a month. Many thanks' guys, with you around the dust is not allowed to settle!



And such is the dedication of some members (you know who you are Kevin & Gerry) who had to be dragged away from their work to eat, yes Kevin has dedicated himself (with the assistance of Eric & Tim) to getting the '2 Ton Caterpillar' running again, alas (as previously mentioned) time had deteriorated the two top hose inlets of the heavy radiator, and with no known parts available new outlets had to be made, many thanks to Rod at Beverley Hydra Boom for the laser cut flanges which Eric then welded two galvanized steel tubes onto, naturally there are a few other water leaks that need to be addressed, but given the system is not under pressure a 'Can of fix it' may well do the job.

The past few months has seen a lot of brake hose issues with two of the items, Tim was able to acquire a new rear hose for the Holden which was blocked solid, and Paul & Bob managed to gently clear the blocked hoses on the Fargo Truck, which saved us quite a few dollars as they would have needed to be manufactured given the age of the vehicle, being built in 1929. Both jobs are still in progress. Gerry's enthusiasm with the Holden continues with him making a special trip to put the engine spark plugs back in to avoid dirt entering the cylinders. And although not mentioned much these days, work continues on the restoration of the C 30 International Truck, many thanks to John H and Paul, a long and tedious task.







STAYING IN PLACE' IN BEVERLEY

InCasa Country has partnered with the Beverley CRC to assist older residents to get access to support services and care at home. The CRC is committed to helping our older residents, by cutting through the complexity of accessing federal funding and managing support care workers to better support you living at home.

Step 1 - Make an appointment at the CRC who will arrange an assessment with My Aged Care. To qualify for an assessment, you must meet these age requirements - you are 65 years or older (50 years or older for Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander people).

Step 2 – My Aged Care assessment team will come out and do an at home assessment.

Step 3 – If you're eligible, My Aged Care will allocate you a Home Care Package.

Step 4 – Sign on with Incasa via the CRC, to develop and activate your Home Care Package.

Step 5 – The CRC will organise and manage a dedicated team of support workers for you.



What things can I access if I'm on a Home Care Package?

If you're eligible for a Home Care Package from the Commonwealth Government, funding is made available to assist with the costs in staying at home. *You may be eligible for:*

Personal Care – assisting you to perform essential self-care tasks **Domestic Assistance** – supporting you to complete everyday household tasks **Home Maintenance** – Assistance with maintenance of your home and garden ie. cleaning and gardening

Meal Assistance – Assisting with meal preparation or meal delivery

Transport Services – Helping you get to appointments or activities outside the home **Social Support** – Keeping you connected to your local community and hobbies **Respite Care** – Providing relief to carers

Clinical Care – Access and coordination of key health professionals to suit your individual care plan





If I'm worried about my ageing parent/s in Beverley, can I contact the CRC? Absolutely, we understand that families don't always live in the same area and are unable to keep an eye on their loved ones. If you're concerned about a parent who seem to be struggling with everyday tasks, feel free to contact Sam at the CRC who can walk you through the process of requesting home support services through My Aged Care.

I can't get out and about at the moment, can you visit me at home to talk about the Staying in Place program?

We sure can. If you're unable to visit us at the CRC, we can arrange an at home visit to talk about the program, arrange assessments with My Aged Care, onboard you with InCasa if you've been allocated a HCP or help you change your service providers if you're not happy with your current provider. Call to make an appointment today.

A loved one or family member suddenly needs aged care. What can I do?

There are three options for you:

- For urgent medical care, call their doctor or emergency services on 000.
- For emergency respite care, contact Carer Gateway on 1800 422 737. For more information, you can go to the Carer Gateway website www.carergateway.gov.au.
- For ongoing care (longer than respite can provide), call My Aged Care on 1800 200 422 to arrange an assessment. If you want to speak on their behalf, you will need to become their representative.

I would like an online account to access my My Aged Care account, how can I do this? To set up an online account you need to register with My Aged Care first. To register with My Aged Care, call 1800 200 422 or apply for an assessment online. Once you're registered, you can sign in to your myGov account and link your online account to access your My Aged Care information. You only need to do this step once. If you need help setting up your MyGov account, call the CRC to **arrange an appointment** to set up your account.

Lifelong Learning encompasses a wide range of learning opportunities from formal education schooling, other institutions, workplaces and through community participation.

Does this mean we all have to enrol in University, TAFE or a certified training course? The short answer is no, as learning is no longer considered an activity confined to education institutions. 
