

# SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



### **CEO** Position

At the Council meeting on Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> May, the Council received a recommendation from the CEO Recruitment Panel that Mr. Stephen Gollan be appointed as Chief Executive Officer of the Shire of Beverley. A formal motion to this effect was passed unanimously with Council agreeing to a term of five years commencing from 27<sup>th</sup> January 2026.

With this matter now dealt with, Council can continue business seamlessly and incorporate the upcoming elections on 18<sup>th</sup> October 2025.

# **Budget 2025/2026**

The preparation of the budget for the next financial year is progressing and will be considered at the Corporate Strategy meeting set for Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> July; to be presented at the full Council meeting on Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> July for approval. As in previous years, Council attempts to minimise rate increases, recognising the burden to be borne by Ratepayers.

Unfortunately, this is not assisted by the State Government who continue to load Local Government with extra compliance and financial burdens which in the end, adds very little to improving the facilities or amenities for the benefit of the Community. For example; Audit costs for the Financial Year 2024/2025 will be of the order of \$37,000 because of the involvement of the Office of Auditor General. This is an increase of about 110% from the fees paid in 2015/2016.

# <u>Swimming Pool</u>

This project is progressing well and is expected to be completed by the end of October 2025.

The earthworks on the ramp/stair access and children's pool are now complete. The earthworks for the balance tank and formwork are due to progress to the end of June with the concrete pour to begin in mid-July. Shade sails have been ordered and ragbolt cages for the shade poles have been delivered to the site and will be incorporated with the bowl concrete works.

The required electrical upgrade request has been submitted to Western Power with the final electrical design being worked through with the contractor. The electrical design will incorporate the requirements for the new building proposed for Stage 2 so that no additional electrical work will be required in the future.

### In Brief

- With Local Government elections due in October 2025, information sessions are being considered for the benefit of anyone who may wish nominate for Council.
- The abandonment of PetsWA by this State Government is a huge disappointment to the Administration Staff after all the work they had undertaken to provide information and data to the Department.
- Work is continuing with Landgate to obtain access to the Nurses' Old Quarters. This has proved to be yet another frustrating example of bureaucratic impediment to what should have been a simple granting of a Management Order. The Quarters are a vital component of Beverley 2035.
- Progress with the Air Show is now moving apace with the completion of the Prospectus and ticket sales to go live with the launch of the website anticipated next month.



# **Activity Notice**

Brookton-Beverley airborne electromagnetic groundwater survey



Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) is using a helicopter to conduct an airborne electromagnetic (AEM) survey in the area from 24 June 2025.

DPIRD is working in partnership with CSIRO and the local governments of Brookton and Beverley to better understand the water resources of the palaeochannel.

### Survey Area and Dates

Weather permitting, a helicopter will fly daily, for about 2 weeks, from 24 June 2025.

# What you might see

A helicopter flying across the survey area about 60 m above the ground, along parallel lines 300 m apart. The helicopter tows a circular frame beneath it which is about 30-40 m above the ground. The helicopter will keep approximately 300 m from houses and other structures.

# Is AEM safe?

Yes. Electromagnetic fields generated are weaker than those from mobile phones and TV antennas. There will be noise from the helicopter.







On Tuesday last a pleasant evening, in the form of a suchre party, was spent at Mrs Turner's residence, "Hiawatha." A large number of guests were present, and the euchre tournament resulted as follows :- Ladies prize, Mrs. A. White; booby prize, Miss Appleby ; gentleman's prize, M Anderson ; booby, Mr. W. Hutchins. After the tournament refreshments were served and a few songs, etc., were given by Mrs. White, Miss Turner, Mr. Daniel, Mr. White, Mr. Hatfield and Mr. Gamble. The toast of the health of Master Sidney Harold Langsford (who had attained the mature age of one year) was proposed by Mr. V. B. Daniel, supported by Mr. F. W. Clarke, and enthusiastically honored. Mr. H. G. Langsford suitably responded on behalf of his son and heit and a pleasant evening was brought to a close with a verse of the National Anthem.

Mrs Rosina Turner, widow of Sydney Turner, farmer of Popanyinning (formerly South Australia), was left money in her husband's will in September 1905. Their daughter, Sylvia, married Harold Langsford in 1910.

Mrs Turner opened a gentleman's boarding house in Forrest St in December 1905. The house was named "Hiawatha" & had enough boarders & friends to field a cricket team to play a friendly match against the Crystal Palace boarders. It was closed by 1916 when all household effects went to auction. The numbers of gentlemen requiring room & board in Beverley lessened after WW1 began in 1914.

We have been told that the Boarding House had previously been Mrs Annie Lucy Sewell's house behind C Edwards store that is now Avon Trading. Mrs Sewell had opened a fancy goods shop in the side door as seen on the left in an early photo of the corner. ♥





# Wildflower Journeys through the Southwest

Highly-respected author and York resident Simon Nevill has spent the past year compiling a guide to the wildflower hotspots of the southwest. His newly-released book was in demand at his presentation last month at the York Racecourse. Sharing his knowledge is important to Simon. His passion was apparent as he described how the flora of WA has evolved in isolation from the rest of the world, and how rich it is as a result. Australia's climate has changed over aeons from very wet to arid, which has resulted in incredible adaptations, such as lignotubers in eucalypts to survive fire, and plants with leathery leaves to decrease water loss. The book covers the Southwest Botanical Province. This is recognised as one of the world's thirty six biodiversity hotspots, considered both irreplaceable and threatened. There are over 7,300 vascular plantsin this area, 80% of which are found nowhere else in the world. From his extensive travels, Simon has developed ten journeys ranging from one day to 3 weeks in length, where wildflower lovers can see the beauty and diversity of the flora of the southwest. The book contains maps, photos of hundreds of species and peak flowering times. The event was sponsored by Lottery West and Volunteering WA and organized by the York Wildflower Society as a Thankyou to all York volunteers. Beverley Community Garden

With the current winter weather, it has been a bit of a guessing game down at the garden as to whether to light the fire, water the garden or cover up the potatoes from a frost, but what you can count on is our caring and dedicated volunteers to turn up and get whatever the job is.....Done xxx

We definitely need to acknowledge Peter, Peter the Compost keeper (haha I told you I was going to say that!).

Seriously though, the compost that keeps our garden looking a bit like Jurassic park is thanks to the dedication of our volunteer Peter and a couple of other contributors.

Peter thoroughly enjoys and delves right into producing the best compost possible, which is not an easy feat. The process take around 9 months and some muscle work to complete, depending on the weather conditions.

The 1st of 4 bins is prepared with layers of discarded local produce, mulched hay and shredded garden waste. These layers are added to weekly and covered to retain and encourage heat. When this bin is full, it needs to rest for a period of 3 months and so a second bin is started. Once the bin has ripened, it is then turned over into a second bin where it is left to mature for a further 3 months before being turned over

The garden LOVES it, we LOVE it and hopefully you can LOVE it too by purchasing your \$10.00 basket of fresh veggies.

again to the final resting bin where we can then use it in our garden.

We are continuing to enjoy our morning teas on Tuesdays and Saturdays at 10.00am and have really enjoyed seeing so many new faces coming down to see what we have been up to and joining in the local banter with a bit of gossip thrown in here and there.

You are welcome to come down to the garden for morning tea, ask some gardening advice, purchase a basket of freshly picked vegetables or you may want to help around the garden.

However you choose to enjoy the Community garden, it would be great to meet you.

We are open Tuesdays and Saturdays from 9am - 11:30 during the winter months.

The new green bins for recyclables has been a big success and we thank those who have dropped off their 10c refund cans and bottles for recycling.

# **BEVERLEY NATURALISTS CLUB NEWS**

We haven't put anything in the Blarney for quite a while now but rest assured there has been lots happening in our wonderful bush reserves.

Peter has been busy eradicating significant weeds such as freesias and Veldt Grass at the Brooking Street Reserve and what a difference this has made. The freesias are a significant threat to the orchids. With Peter's hard work over the last couple of years, the freesias have been reduced significantly. As part of the fire management plan for this reserve, we have removed some of the fallen timber in the fire protection zone. We have also planted lots of native species in our memorial garden on Dempster Street (part of the Brooking Street Reserve).

We are starting to see the leaves coming through ready for our orchid season. The Bunny Orchids have already been and gone. These are early season orchids and they were in large numbers this year.

Phyllis has been busy photographing all flowering flora in our bush reserves with the intension of putting together a photographic book of our beautiful native flora. Phyllis has also been doing some weeding and fire risk management in the Carolling Rd Reserve and the Beverley Airfield Reserve. These two reserves are very beautiful and contain some stunning and endangered flora.

Kaitlyn and Phyllis did a clean-up in the Carolling Rd Reserve on the WA Day public holiday. As you can see by the photos, there was a large amount of old and recently dumped rubbish. Thank you to the Shire of Beverley for removing this rubbish so quickly. Watch this space for more info about this very special reserve.

Kaitlyn is also organising a school holiday event for the children in conjunction with the CRC on carnivorous plants like Droseras (sundews) and Trigger plants which we have in our bush reserves.
