SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Local Government Elections 2025

Elections for vacancies on the Council of the Shire are due to be held on Saturday 18th October next. These elections have never been more important for Beverley as there have been more nominations for the four vacancies on Council than we have ever seen in past years. Eight candidates have nominated for the four vacancies.

Councillors Sue Martin, Alan Sattler, and John Maxwell have renominated along with five other candidates. Mr. Adam Freeman, Ms. Alex McKeller, Mr. Geoffrey Newby-Butt, Mr. Andrew Shaw, and Mr. Barry Shardlow are the remaining candidates.

With the WA Electoral Commission conducting the elections it will be solely by Postal Vote. Every person on the Shire's Electoral Roll will receive a Postal Vote so that there will be no in-person voting on the day.

You can either return your vote through the post or drop your completed envelopes in to the Shire Office before the close of business on Friday 17th. You may also take your completed postal vote to the Civic Centre (Old School Building) on the Saturday 18th. You will be required to follow the instructions issued by the WA Electoral Commission when they send you your Postal Voting papers.

The thing that voters need to know that it is <u>NOT COMPULSORY THAT YOU VOTE</u>. You will not be fined if you exercise your right not to vote but we would encourage you to cast a vote. The more votes that are cast the better view the Shire has of the community's wishes.

When voting, you <u>DO NOT HAVE TO CAST A VOTE FOR EVERY CANDIDATE</u>. <u>YOU CAN VOTE FOR AS MANY OR AS FEW AS YOU WISH.</u> Voting for just one candidate or all eight will be valid. Remember, there are only four vacancies.

When voting please ensure you <u>number</u> the squares and preferably <u>do not</u> X or $\sqrt{\ }$ any of the boxes. If you use two or more X or $\sqrt{\ }$ and no numbers, your vote will be invalid.

In exercising your vote, just remember you can vote for as many or as few as you wish.

Beverley 2021 - 2025

With my departure, I would like to take some space to look back over the past fourteen years and reflect on all that has been achieved. For a small Shire like Beverley, it has been a lot.

- The first of these would be the additions and renovations to the sporting complex at the oval including the construction of new netball courts (to which the Netball Club contributed significant funds). The playground area has also been extended beyond its initial establishment;
- The construction of two Independent Living Units in Dawson Street;
- The construction of the Cornerstone Building which houses the Community Resource Centre, Library, Visitor Centre, Day Care Centre, and four leased offices;
- The installation of a dual charging station for electric vehicles at the rear of the Cornerstone building;
- The installation of solar panels on both the Shire offices and the Cornerstone building;
- The construction of the Moort Wabiny Park which incorporates numerous activities for our youth, a project that was driven largely by the community;
- Reroofing the Town Hall and Lesser Hall and the replacement of the flooring in both halls. Also included, the installation of new entrance doors in each hall as well as the replacement of the Stage curtain in the Town Hall, and the complete renewal of the kitchen in the Lesser Hall;
- The re-roofing of the Old School building as well as renovating the building to become a new Civic Centre which includes new Council Chambers and reception area;
- The re-roofing of the old Courthouse building and the establishment of a gymnasium within;
- The construction of six cottages near the caravan park comprising three two bedroom and three onebedroom units;
- Water Harvesting Project which has reduced reliance on scheme water and consequently saved the Shire money; and,
- The complete redevelopment of Vincent Street with underground power and new drainage system.

In all, these projects, have incurred investment of \$18 million over the 14 years. Pleasingly, our Balance Sheet today is still as healthy as it was at the commencement of these projects with financing coming from Grants, borrowings, and Reserves.

Future Projects – Beverley 2035

Work completed 18 months ago in preparation for grants under the the Regional Precincts Partnership Programme or rPPP, resulted in identification of several projects needed by the community and for which future Councils will be working. Named Beverley 2035, this plan will be a focus that will underpin future planning and provide continuing benefits to Beverley. It is a plan that is not fixed and future Councils will modify as they see fit.

And, of course, don't forget the big event coming up being the Beverley Air Show on 11th April 2026. Please tell all your friends and relatives. With Paul Bennet and his team, it will be spectacular. A big thank you to the Beverley Soaring Society and Rifle Club for their assistance with the event. I would also acknowledge Stefan de Beer and Jacinta Murray for picking up the load of organisation for the event.

To the new Council I extend my best wishes. To all the Staff led by Stephen Gollan, thank you for all your assistance and patience and for the way you keep such a cheerful culture in the office. To the blokes who have worked on the outside crew over the past fourteen years, thank you for your efforts working behind the scenes.

In conclusion I would like to thank the community for the opportunity to serve as a Councillor and especially as President for the last four years. It was never a position I would have sought so I want to "thank" Lew Shaw for his encouragement!







A recent donation of a little black notebook to the Dead Finish Museum highlights the thoroughness of the planning for the provision of luncheon to Beverley Agricultural Show patrons in the years from 1959 to 1973. Each necessary item was allocated to various people to produce. Cooking was done on the day. Shown here are the six pages for 1959 with some additions about prices & revenue for 1960 & 1961 at the end. The cost of lunch in 1959 was 5/6 for adults and 2/6 for children (55¢ and 25¢). The takings were £55 (\$110) meaning they must have served between 250 and 300 meals to adults & children. An awesome example of community spirit.

🖐 Prepare Your Property for Summer & Bushfire Season 😂 🥚



With Spring in full swing, now is the perfect time to get your property ready for the upcoming Bushfire Season.

August rain has been great for the garden, but it also encourages fast-growing grass and long grass is a magnet for fire, snakes, and mosquitoes.

Here's what you can do:

- Keep grass trimmed to 15cm or less around your property.
- Prune thick shrubs and remove any vegetation growing against your home, sheds, or water tanks.
- Maintain at least a 2-metre gap between your roofline and any overhanging tree branches.
- Clear out fire hazards such as leaves, twigs, bark, rubbish, and other debris that could catch fire or shelter snakes.

Don't forget:

- The Restricted Burning Period commences 3 October. A permit is required for any burning.
- Firebreaks must be installed by 1 November. Shire rangers will commence preinspections in October.
- Check the Shire website Firebreak Management page or refer to your rates brochure for detailed requirements based on your land size and location.

Sharing the Road with Oversize Vehicles

The distance the pilot and escort vehicles travel ahead of the oversize vehicle and the gap between them will vary depending on the speed of oncoming traffic, speed of the oversize vehicle, the road geometry and the availability of pull-over areas for the oncoming traffic. The pilot and escort vehicles should be a sufficient distance ahead to enable all types of vehicles to pull off the road before the oversize vehicle reaches them.

Pilot

Front Pilot

Traffic Escort Warden

Over Size Over Mass (OSOM) Load Under Traffic Escort

Rear Pilot

Heavy Vehicle Pilots (Pilots) are used to provide advanced warning to other road users that an oversize vehicle is approaching and facilitate the safe movement of the oversize vehicles by directing traffic in their vicinity.

Directions given by the Pilots are lawful directions and must be obeyed.

Pilot Vehicles are easily recognised by a large yellow reflective sign with the words "Oversize Load Ahead" and amber flashing warning lights mounted on the roof.

Pilot Vehicles escorting loads in excess of 4.5 metres in width will also display white flashing lights on the front of the vehicle.

The number of Pilots accompanying an oversize vehicle will vary depending on the complexity of the load and their positioning will vary depending on where they are needed to safely manage traffic.



Traffic Escort Wardens manage the safe movement of larger oversize vehicles, typically oversize vehicles in excess of 5.5 metres in width and/or 40 metres in

Traffic Escort Vehicles have red and blue flashing lights on the roof and have "Traffic Escort" displayed on both sides of the vehicle. Most Traffic Escort Vehicles now have a blue and white sign with the words "Oversize Escort".

Oversize vehicles often travel in convoys, meaning there will be two or more oversize vehicles travelling together, as shown in the above example.

The number of oversize vehicles allowed to travel in a convoy depends on the road terrain. Typically, only two oversize vehicles can travel in convoy, however three oversize vehicles often travel in convoy on Great Northern Hwy north of Wubin, and four oversize vehicles often travel in convoy on Great Northern Hwy north of Newman.

Sharing the Roads with Oversize Vehicles

Slow down as soon as you see a Pilot Vehicle or Traffic Escort Vehicle and **be prepared** to pull off the road and stop if necessary.

Many oversize vehicles take up more than half the road width, or they may need to travel towards the centre of the road to avoid power lines, trees or other roadside items.

Under the Road Traffic Code 2000, you must follow the directions given by a Pilot and a Traffic Escort Warden when facilitating the movement of an oversize vehicle. So, **always follow directions** given by Heavy Vehicle Pilots and Traffic Escort Wardens, as the directions are being given for your safety.

Take care to ensure you only pull back onto the road or move through an intersection when you are sure all vehicles in the oversize vehicle convoy have passed.

Do not risk overtaking an oversize vehicle. **Be patient** and wait for the oversize vehicle to move aside and the Pilots and Traffic Escort Wardens to clear traffic.

If the rear pilot waves you past or calls you over the UHF radio to advise that it's safe to overtake, proceed with extreme caution. As the driver, you are still responsible for ensuring it is safe to cross the centreline and overtake.



Stay alert - you can't always see what's ahead, so it's important

 Slow down - seeing a Heavy Vehicle Pilot or Traffic Escort Warden vehicle is a warning that there's something big up ahead.

you drive to the road conditions.

 Move left - oversize loads and large agricultural vehicles can take up more than half the road or may need to travel in the middle of the road to avoid power lines or other roadside items

Prepare to stop and follow directions - Heavy Vehicle Pilots and Traffic Escort Wardens are there to provide directions on how to safely navigate the oversize load.

Road transport is essential to Western Australia's economy.

Due to constraints for oversize vehicles, such as overhead structures, drive over structures, road side furniture etc., they are restricted to the roads they can travel on. If you see them on your local roads, it is because they need to use these roads to manoeuvre through the area.

It is important to be patient when sharing the road with oversize vehicles.

If you need to communicate with an oversize vehicle, the Pilots or the Traffic Escort Warden, they can be contacted on UHF Channel 40.

Brian's Teaching Journey Lives On: Retirement Is Just a New Beginning

At Beverley Community Resource Centre, every story of connection and growth reminds us why we do what we do. One such story is Brian's—a retired teacher whose journey with us is a shining example of community spirit and the power of sharing knowledge.

Brian first came to the CRC seeking practical support: internet access, emails, and IT assistance. It wasn't long before our team discovered his deep passion for teaching science and astronomy. With funding available from State Library of Western Australia and Backyard Cricket we attained funding for STEM education, especially in hands-on workshops, we invited Brian to lead after-school STEM sessions for our local children.

The impact was immediate and heartwarming. Brian quickly built a warm, trusting rapport with the kids. They eagerly looked forward to workshops exploring the Leeuwin boat, the mysteries of magnetism, and more. Encouraged by this enthusiasm, we explored a new opportunity—a focused astronomy series led by Brian. What made this special was Brian's commitment not only to the wonders of the stars but also to the rich Indigenous astronomy stories passed down through generations of our First Nations people. This blending of science and culture brought a unique depth and respect to the learning experience.

Due to the success of these programs, the CRC secured funding and Brian launched a six-week 'Learn about Astronomy' series tailored for children aged nine and above. His hands-on approach captivated the kids, sparking curiosity and wonder that went beyond the classroom. The workshops became a space where learning was alive, interactive, and deeply meaningful.

While the children's excitement and growing knowledge are wonderful outcomes, what touches our team most, is the transformation in Brian himself. Retirement brought many changes, but his love for teaching has not faded—it has been reignited. Each session ends with a smile of pride and fulfillment on Brian's face, knowing he is making a meaningful difference in the next generation's lives. This sense of purpose and value is the heart of the most significant change.

Brian's story embodies the spirit of Beverley CRC. It reminds us that community is not just about services delivered, but about connections nurtured and lives enriched. When one member of our community finds joy and purpose in giving back, the entire community shines a little brighter.

At Beverley CRC, we are proud to be part of these journeys—where support meets passion, and where every person, regardless of age or stage, can continue to inspire and be inspired. Together, we create lasting change.






Teaching Aide of the Year Awards
