SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S NOTES



Stage 2 Beverley Swimming Pool Precinct – stage 2 of the Swimming Pool project includes a new building requiring around \$7M to complete. Significant funding external to the Shires loan capacity and reserve fund allocation will be needed for Council to have confidence to proceed. Grant applications are being submitted; however, they are competitive and can be scaled back.

Is our community prepared to get behind this project with fundraising to assist bringing it to fruition? I am also interested to hear from anyone who might support a tax-deductible fund if established specifically for this project.

The new complex will be located, and entered, from the western side of the pool. It will include ablution and change rooms, improved vision of the pool area from the office/kiosk, first aid room, storage, community room and a modern gym facility with visible creche space.

Shire Budget – the budgetary process continues, with Council at its June meeting considering the current list of non-rateable properties, wages and salaries increases, and the 2026/2027 Fees and Charges. Minutes of Council meetings and verbal recording of these meetings are available on the Shire website.

Local Public Health Plan – under the Public Health Act 2016 every local government in WA is required to prepare its own Local Public Health Plan, which aligns with the State Public Health Plan 2025-2030. The Beverley Local Public Health Plan 2026-2031 will be informed by responses to an on-line Survey, which is advertised on the Shire website and in this edition of the Blarney. Hard copies of the survey are available from the Shire Office for those who require one. Responses from a broad range of age groups in our local community would be most useful, please ask your family and friends to participate.

The Local Health Plan will be used to inform the Shire's Strategic Community Plan, Long Term Financial Plan, Annual budgets and Disability Access & Inclusion Plan. It is intended to be a flexible and living document, allowing new opportunities to be added as they arise over the life of the Plan.

Rubbish Tip Access – there has been some angst within the community about gardening contractors not being able to access the tip during the week for garden waste. The shire is proposing to provide an area where contractors with garden waste (only) can be accommodated during the week in a separate enclosure without needing to enter the main refuse site. Security will be installed to discourage and detect those who do not respect rules for the refuse site.

Responsible Dog Ownership – use of oval area – dog owners are reminded that dogs should not be on the town oval when the oval is being used for sport, or when oval maintenance is underway. In the new financial year following Council consideration of costs to establish a fenced dog exercise area behind the water run off dam near the pool, Community feedback will be sought on a proposed plan.

Visitor Feedback – positive feedback is often received from our visitors staying at the RV stopover across the road from the river park, negative feedback is rare. Comments left by a group at the end of May "We stayed in a group of 4 vans. Wanted to congratulate your Council on providing such a lovely site for us to have a short stay in. The facilities across the road were spotless for the start of the weekend. The locals we encountered were very friendly and informative. And the venues we visited were most lovely and the food enjoyable. We appreciated having the opportunity to explore your pretty town".

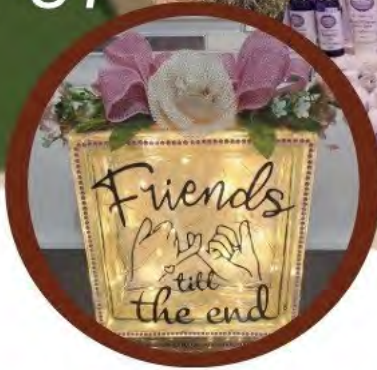

A Remarkable Woman of Beverley

Ivy Grace (1) Smith (2) Human (nee Sandwell)

1901 - 1998

Ivy Grace Sandwell was born in England & came to WA as a 12-year-old in 1913. In 1922, aged 21, she married Hubert David Smith of "Chocolate Hills" in Jolimont after a farewell from the boarders at the Railway Hotel in Beverley. They had six children: Philip, June, Beryl, Ronald, Leon & Patricia. HD Smith died in 1941. In 1949 she married again to William Human, manager of the Avondale Research Station. Bill retired in 1952 & the couple moved into a house in Hunt Rd. Bill died in 1956. Ivy Grace was a widow for the second time at 55 years old

Community Involvement



From her earliest years in Beverley, Ivy made significant contributions to the community:

- She was an accomplished & popular singer at community events and weddings.
 - She put entries in the Beverley Show almost every year from the 1920s, also in St Mary's flower & rose shows & in CWA cookery & craft shows.
 - RSL Women's Auxiliary – President 1930s-1950s; WA State Vice President 1936. Radio interview 1935
 - Winning race horse owner in 1949 with "Hubert's Hope" – born & bred at "Chocolate Hills".
 - CWA – President 1942; Vice President 1944, 1948; President 1964 & President again 1977.
 - Vice-President then President of CWA Avon Valley Division 1962 – 1965.
 - Candidate in 1969 CWA's Country Woman of the Year award.
 - Founder of the Beverley Choral Group which rehearsed in the CWA Rooms 1961.
- Chairperson of the Miss Australia Quest committee 1963.
 - One of Beverley's ten Honorary Game Wardens 1969.
 - Ladies Bowling Club – player, member, roles.
 - One of the Adult Advisers to the Junior Farmers Association.
 - Member Beverley Children's Court 1967.
 - First Woman Justice of the Peace in Beverley 1972.

Mrs Human was presented with an attractive shoulder spray by her grand-daughter Linda, on behalf of the family; and a small bouquet from her many friends.

A lively programme of entertainment kept moving by jovial compere, Mrs W. Robins, with all present participating in a number of quizzes and competitions, occupied the time until later in the afternoon when a lovely afternoon tea was served – and during which a tasty and beautifully decorated birthday cake was cut.

A presentation to the guest of honour, on behalf of those present, was made by Miss M. McDonald, who expressed the gathering's hearty good wishes, and remarking on her long and happy years of acquaintance with Mrs Human.

The latter feelingly responded, thanking everyone for the gift and the kind thoughts be-

hind the party.

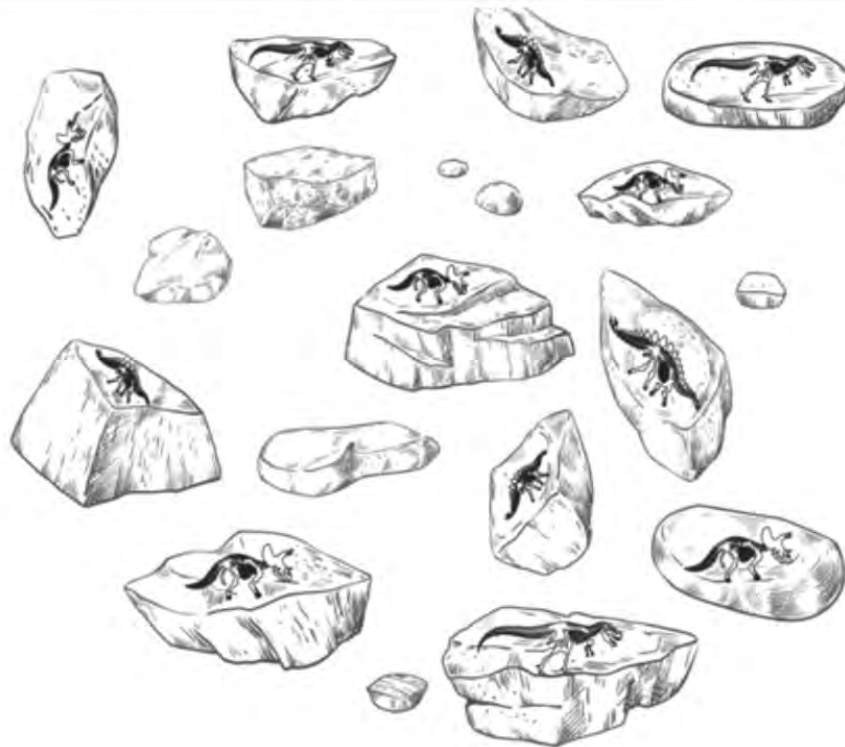

The Beverley Community Garden relies on the community involvement to be able to provide a relaxing, nourishing, informative, friendly environment and sincerely gives thanks to those who provide their time, donations, and support.

Beverley River Care Group

Our next hands on project will be a trial clearing of the invasive perennial veldt grass from the town fire break/walk trail down to the river. It's unsightly, contributes significantly to the fire risk and chokes out the native species of grasses, fire restrictive saltbushes and other plants.

This is not a once off event but one that will require ongoing rework each year to stop regrowth and maintain the area. To start we will target a small area, approximately 50 metres along the trail so we can manage the workload and use that as a test of the concept to see if we can make a difference. We are hoping the outcome will be a better view of the river, less invasive weeds and reduced fire risk. Overall this will improve the river environment, bit by bit.

We are thrilled to have the interest of the Noongar Land Enterprise Group Rangers and the Beverley

High School Cadets join us in this project and look forward to these collaborations.

Our busy bees will be fortnightly on Wednesdays 8:30am to 10:00am.

8 July, 22 July, 5 August, 19 August, 2 Sept, 16 Sept
And so on until we stop over summer.

Meet at the end of John Street past the school down near the river.

Our plan is to physically remove the veldt grass with minimal soil disturbance. Sharp trowels and hoes will help plus sensible safety gear, gloves, water, boots.



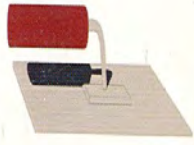

EMERGENCY COMPANION — ANIMAL RESPONSE TEAM —



I would like to introduce this new group to everyone.



Has anyone thought about what happens to people and their pets if an emergency evacuation is called?



Remembering, that pets and animals are not permitted at an evacuation centre.



We have a solution.



Troy Granville – the Beverley and York Community Emergency Services Manager (CESM) realised that statistically, people with pets are less likely to evacuate or evacuate too late, placing the pets, the owners and the emergency services personnel at risk. Troy recognised this and came up with a plan. He took his idea to the Shires of Beverley and York, who supported the concept in principle. Troy was successful in obtaining funding to develop 2 x trailers with animal cages, beds, along with items needed for a stand-alone emergency evacuation area for people and their pets.



As Troy's role is to manage the emergency, he would need other people to manage the evacuation trailer. That is where our group comes into place. We are called **ECART – Emergency Companion Animal Response Team**. We have a small number of people that totally support this project. We are now in the process of becoming an incorporated body – this will assist us to manage the trailers and to be ready to deploy in an emergency situation. One trailer is located in Beverley and the other is in York.



We will be keeping the community updated with our progress as events follow.

STATE GLIDING CHAMPIONSHIPS AT BEVERLEY

Hosted by the Beverley Soaring Society

The 2026 West Australian Gliding Championships were flown at the Beverley Airfield over a 10 day period from the 8th to the 14th of February and were hosted by the Beverley Soaring Society.

The Beverley Soaring Society was established in 1974 and is the largest gliding club in Western Australia, with over 100 flying members and almost sixty gliders on site. There are two other gliding clubs based in Western Australia at Narrogin and Cunderdin.

Twenty four gliders competed in the Championships and each day a different task was set for the gliders. Usually a triangular course to be flown over a set period often of three hours, always returning to the Beverley Airfield. Distances to be flown depended on the performance of the gliders with the higher performance gliders having to fly further. Tasks varied between 300 km and 500 km depending on the weather forecast on the day. The fastest glider on handicap receiving 1000 points for the day and the other gliders points depending on their speed over the three hour period.

If a glider landed in a paddock, outlanded in gliding terminology, the pilot had two options, to call for a towplane to land in the paddock, only with the permission of the farmer or to call for his dedicated trailer which would require a few helpers to take off the wings and the tailplane and store them in the trailer with the fuselage for the return trip to Beverley.

In the end the Competition was won by Ashley Boyle from the Narrogin Gliding Club with 4470 points, Karsten Bojesen from the Beverley Soaring Society was second with 4396 points and Greg Beecroft also from the Beverley Soaring Society was third with 4346 points. A very close competition with very few points separating the top three pilots, in fact separating the top six pilots.

The Competition winner, Ashley Boyle, is now a 36 year pilot having learnt to fly at Beverley as a 15 year old, when he lived and went to school in Beverley. He now lives with his wife Sam and their three children at North Dandalup which is closer to Narrogin than Beverley. In real life Ashley drives Road Trains for Cropline Haulage carting grain, fertiliser, lime and livestock pellets around the wheatbelt and Ammonium Nitrate to the mining industry.

Ashley has had previous success in the State Gliding Championships having won in 2024, second in 2025 and now winning in 2026. Ashley was also fifth in the Australian Open Class Gliding Championships which were held at Leeton in New South Wales in January where 44 gliders competed in three different classes based on their wing span.

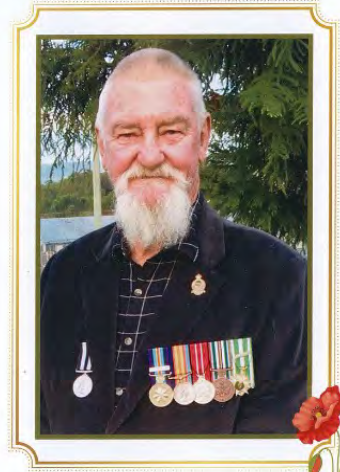

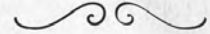
