SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S NOTES



Shire 2026/27 Budget – Council adopted the 2026/27 Shire of Beverley Budget at its Ordinary Council Meeting on 22nd July 2026. A program of initiatives which supports services and economic growth within our community while maintaining a responsible level of expenditure was endorsed. Council agreed to an overall rate increase of 6 percent. Dependent on Valuer-General valuations, the increase may reflect differently to individual properties. Balancing delivery of services and facilities for our community with current cost of living pressures was firmly in mind, while addressing increasing costs for the Shire in areas such as waste collection, insurance, swimming pool contract, staff wages and regulatory compliance requirements. Budget detail is available with rate notices and in the 2026/27 Budget document.

Rates paid in full by 2nd September 2026 receive a 10% Discount – the service date of rate notices is 12 August 2026. Rates paid in full within 21 days of that date are eligible for a 10% Discount. The discount is available up to close of business on 2nd September 2026. Don't forget your rates envelope will include the new rubbish tip pass for 26/27.

Shire of Beverley Community Grant Program Increased – Funds available through this grant program have been increased. Beverley focused, incorporated not for profit community organisations are eligible to apply. Details for the current funding round are available in the Blarney, Shire website, and from the Shire Office.

Local Government Funding – Local Government receive untied funding from the Federal Government known as Financial Assistance Grants. A recent update from the Australian Local Government Association (ALGA) commented that the value of Financial Assistance Grants as a share of national taxation over the past 30 years has halved, from 1 percent to just 0.49 percent in 2026/27. Local Government are closest to the community and are being expected to do more by other levels of government without compensation to do so amid rising costs, and rate payers alone should not be carrying this burden. Local Government responds to local priorities, maintain and upgrade infrastructure, provide services and facilities for their communities, and should be properly resourced to keep Australian communities running.

Census Night 11th August 2026 – don't forget! - Information collected can benefit our rural and regional communities if we all make the effort to be a part of the census. It can mean better funding for the regions in areas such as health services, housing, schools, childcare, roads, infrastructure, communication, emergency services. The opportunity only happens every 5 years.

Citizenships – A citizenship ceremony was conducted at the Civic Centre on 3rd July at which four new Australian citizens were welcomed.

The Beverley Market - I had the pleasure to attend the launch of The Beverley Market. Congratulations to Robyn Anderson for establishing the initiative and to the small sellers stores for being part of the co-operative model. The concept is a terrific use of the building whilst also remaining home of the Monthly Beverley Markets.

Beverley River Care Group

Our clearing of invasive perennial veldt grass along the town fire break/walk trail down to the river continues with great success. Our small group of dedicated helpers has been bolstered by a young crew of four coming from the city for the day, the Northam-based Noongar Land Enterprise Group (who are donating plants from their nursery), and our own Beverley High School cadets.

The veldt grass knows its time is up. It can no longer choke out native plants and grasses or add to the fire hazard. We're currently working on a pilot patch of 1ha and will review progress before moving further along the trail. We remove the veldt grass physically, using sharp trowels, knives and hoes, with minimal soil disturbance. Bridal creeper is rife too and being controlled as best we can.

Helpers should bring sensible safety gear, including gloves, water and boots.

Our busy bees run fortnightly on Wednesdays, 8:30am to 10:00am. Meet at the end of John Street, past the school, down near the river.

5 August, 19 August, 2 September (AGM), 16 September, and so on until we stop over summer.

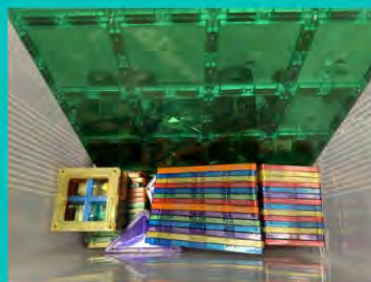

Magnetic Tiles



The aim of magnetic building tiles for kids is to support learning through hands-on play. They help children develop a range of skills, including:

- Creativity and imagination: Children can design and build their own structures, vehicles, animals, and other creations.
- Problem-solving skills: They learn to plan, test ideas, and figure out how to make their designs stable.
- Fine motor skills: Picking up, connecting, and arranging the magnetic pieces strengthens hand and finger muscles.
- Hand-eye coordination: Children improve coordination as they manipulate and position the shapes.
- Spatial awareness: They begin to understand shapes, sizes, patterns, symmetry, and how objects fit together.
- Early STEM learning: The toys introduce basic concepts in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics, such as geometry, balance, magnetism, and construction.
- Language and social skills: When playing with others, children practice communication, sharing, teamwork, and explaining their ideas.
- Confidence and perseverance: Successfully completing a model encourages self-confidence and resilience when facing challenges.

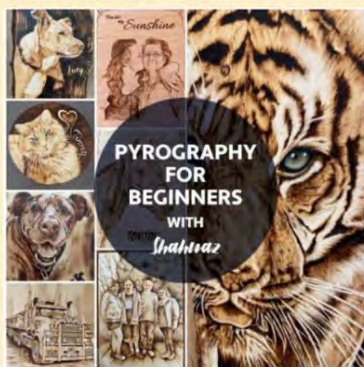

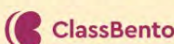

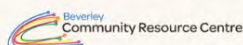

A huge thank you to Cliff and Murray who have built a fantastic new structure that will soon support our passion fruit vines. We can't wait to watch them grow and thrive.

We're also adding more colour and life to the garden, with 20 flowering native seedlings now planted to attract birds, bees and other beneficial pollinators. With another 30 - 40 still to go in, our native garden is really starting to take shape now.

Hard working volunteers have also given the shade house a complete reorganisation, making it more practical and easier to work in. Around the garden, fresh mulch has been spread through the native garden, helping to keep it looking neat while protecting the plants through the cooler months. The garden shed has also had a much-needed clean-out, another great team effort!

You may notice the new "do not pick signs", they're protecting some very special vegetables that we're hoping to exhibit in this year's Beverly annual show. Fingers crossed they'll be award-worthy!

Bowel Health – It's Worth Giving a Shit!

The bowel is an important part of our digestive system, but what is it, and what should we be aware of when weighing up our overall bowel health?

The bowel is made up of 3 parts:

1. The *small intestine* is around 6 meters in length and is the narrower (small) section of the bowel. It absorbs the nutrients in the food we digest.
2. The *colon* and rectum make up the larger intestine, it is much shorter but thicker. Its role is to reabsorb fluid and process the waste material.
3. Finally, the *rectum* is where the waste material is stored until we go and *drop a log* so to speak.

What comes out and the frequency of our bowel movement is something else we should take note of. Our poo or stool should be soft, sausage shaped and should not require too much effort to pass. The frequency can depend on individual habits, changes to our diet, but the main thing to remember here is a sudden change in your poo routine could indicate other issues.



What's *not* normal?

Signs of Blood: Bright or fresh signs of blood on the toilet paper could be the result of haemorrhoids (usually a result of constipation or straining too hard) or wiping too hard and frequently can cause small cuts/tears on the anus. Blood in the poo (especially darker blood) could mean bleeding further up the bowel and should be discussed with a doctor immediately.

Constipation: Dry or hard poo sometimes associated with cramping or bloating in our lower abdomen (something we have all probably experienced) can often be resolved with some lifestyle changes i.e. drinking plenty of water, eating a diet high in soluble fibre (fruit/vegies/oat bran/lentils/beans) and an increase in physical activity.

Diarrhoea: We have all probably had a mean curry that has caused us to frequent the loo, but diarrhoea is usually caused by our intestine becoming inflamed and irritated affecting the reabsorption of water from the waste material. This can be caused by numerous factors such as: illness/infection, food poisoning, drinking contaminated water, ulcers, stress and certain food intolerances.

Leakage: Accidental leakage or incontinence can be associated with severe diarrhoea but can also be caused by weakness or damage to the muscles around our bowel and anus. The Continence Foundation of Australia is a great resource to get assistance, advice and support if you are affected by incontinence.

If any of these issues are having an effect for more than 2-3 days, a visit to the doctor is recommended. A prominent cancer is bowel cancer and can remain undetected until well advanced. Participate in the free bowel cancer screening test from the age 45 onwards – it saves lives!

Remember good bowel health and our digestive system is often compared to being just as important as brain function, just at the other end of the body. Remember it is worth giving a shit about!

HOW TO PREPARE ROSES FOR SHOWING

If you have roses in your garden but have never entered them into the Rose Show because you are unsure of what is expected or how to go about it, below is some hints/tips on preparing roses for exhibition.

When picking roses, it is best done in the early morning, as this is when the plant will be holding the most water.

Select blooms that are partially open. If the blooms have not opened at all, then you risk them staying that way.

If you pick them when they are fully open they are going to deteriorate rapidly and possibly won't last for the 2 days of the show.

The exception to this is when the Section/Class requests full blown roses.

Use a sharp cutting tool, secateurs are best. Cut the stem on a 45 degree angle and put straight into a container of lukewarm water. Try to maximise the length of the stem when cutting which allows the rose to sit up out of the bottle for a better display.

Don't overcrowd the container, to allow for air circulation

Store the roses in a cool dark place overnight. If you are storing them for a longer period, then they can be put into the fridge. This ensures that the flower does not open any further and they can be stored refrigerated for a few days. However, don't put them in with any fruit/vegetables and the temperature of the fridge should be between 1-5 degrees Celsius.

All single roses entered in the show are displayed in glass bottles that are supplied on the day. These bottles come in 2 sizes; they are old cool drink bottles. You can prepare your entries for the single rose classes, at the rear of the hall on Friday 23 October from 7am and must be registered by 10am.

What do judges look for?

Judges examine a single rose for its typical shape, looking for a symmetrical and balanced bloom. The petals should unfurl in a spiral from a central point. The colour should be rich, vibrant and consistent throughout the bloom, with no fading or discolouration. Stems should be straight and strong with no pests or disease evident.

The rose should be fresh and as far as possible free from blemishes, diseases or wilting.

Why not "give it a go" and be part of our beautiful annual Rose Show.

EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

ALL CLASSES

Exhibitors are responsible for maintaining the cleanliness and tidiness of their roses. This means that if a rose has any damaged leaves or petals they should be removed.

Entries are open from 7am until 10am sharp. No entries will be accepted if they have not been registered when the clock strikes 10am.

Please bring your entries around to the rear of the Town Hall. The front doors will be locked until 12.30pm.

Bottles for Single rose entries are supplied on the day. There are 2 sizes small and large. If you know the name of your rose, please let the ladies on the registration desk know.

All arrangements in Section B must be in your own containers. There will not be any bowls or vases supplied for this section. It is expected that you will assemble these entries at home and drop them off at the rear of the hall before 10am sharp.

STRICTLY NO LATE ENTRIES

SECTION A

- Single stem roses should only have one or two petals under the flower and no other leaves on the stem. Leaves must not be in water.
- Any insects or damaged petals should be carefully removed.
- A bowl is a vessel that is wider than it is high, and a vase is taller than its width.
- Arrangements should be balanced in their respective containers.
- Generally the arrangement should be 1.5 times taller than the height of the bowl/vase. For example a container 10cm tall should have an arrangement of 15cm above the top of the container. The combined height of the arrangement once put together would be 25cm. These are just guidelines and you can arrange your roses however you please.
- Fully blown roses mean completely open and all roses in the container should be fully blown.

SECTION B

- A MODERN FLOWER ARRANGEMENT is one that has negative space. Statement roses are grouped together to create clean lines. Container is generally plain and not fussy.
- A MANTLEPIECE ARRANGEMENT should have a flat back so it can sit on a mantle. Mechanics (oasis or wire support) used in the arrangement should be covered with foliage and must not be visible.
- UNUSUAL CONTAINERS must have oasis or a jar/vase as a water source. Wrapping the stems in wet cotton wool then covering with foil or plastic is not allowed.
- TABLE CENTRE ARRANGEMENT will be viewed from all angles and as such must be beautiful all the way around. Again don't forget it needs to be balanced.
- POSY OF ROSES must be done without wiring the stems of the roses. The stems can be tied together with string, ribbon, twine, even elastic bands. Posy must be able to be carried.

Don't be a tosser: Aquatic weeds

August 2026



The jar of *Salvinia molesta* intercepted by a proactive member of the public; close-up image of an individual plant where the waxy hairs are visible on the upper leaf surface; and a previously discovered infestation in a Byford waterway.

Recently, on a beautiful winter's day on the Canning River in Perth, the sun was shining and a lucky few were out enjoying the amenity of our stunning river. One such person was kayaking when they saw something suspicious – someone hurling an object from the Nicholson Road Bridge. The quick-thinking member of the public retrieved the mystery projectile, an open container jammed to the brim with one of the world's most devastating aquatic weeds, salvinia! Fortunately, no plants escaped into the environment due to this person's fast intervention and prompt reporting to nearby DBCA officers.

What is Salvinia and why is it of concern?

Salvinia (*Salvinia molesta*) is a [Weed of National Significance \(WONS\)](#). It is an extremely damaging freshwater aquatic weed which would cause havoc to agriculture and the environment if it became established in water systems of Western Australia. Salvinia can reproduce at an explosive rate; it prefers still or slow-moving water with a high nutrient content. It grows in both tropical and temperate regions. Salvinia will readily form a mat completely covering the water surface. It blocks lakes, dams, drains and irrigation channels. The mass of green material may transpire considerably more water than would be lost by normal surface evaporation. The decaying debris pollutes and de-oxygenates the water, endangering fish and other

wildlife. The water becomes unfit for livestock or human use. Infestations of salvinia often make wetland areas useless as retreats for native waterfowl. Salvinia was most likely introduced to Australia as a pond and aquarium plant. Infestations have previously occurred in some wetland areas in Western Australia, with isolated populations discovered as far south as Denmark and north to Kununurra. Salvinia is sometimes found in aquaria or ponds, but this is illegal, as it is prohibited throughout Western Australia. We remind people that weedy aquatic plants are not the only risk to agriculture and the environment. It is of the utmost importance not to empty any aquarium or fishpond contents into natural water bodies or irrigation channels; alien organisms can negatively impact our native aquatic life, and fish can spread disease and affect native fish stocks.

What to look for and how to report

Report any unfamiliar floating plants or illegal dumping of aquatic material in our waterways to our Department or via CrimeStoppers. Please provide the location and photos of the suspicious material so it can be investigated. Salvinia and other declared aquatic plants are also illegally traded on platforms such as Facebook Marketplace and various hobbyist forums. This recent close call highlights just how important the community is in our fight against invasive species.

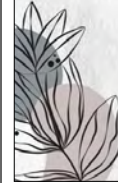
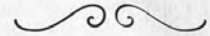
