Beverley St John Ambulance Sub Centre – Congratulations! The Beverley SJA Sub-centre team were awarded “Sub Centre of the Year” at the 2026 St John WA Awards night. Thankyou to an amazing group of volunteers who provide such an important service for our community.

Census 11th August 2026 – If you haven't yet done so, please complete the 2026 census. Information collected provides important data about our community which supports provision of services and assists when seeking external funding. There were some reports of households not receiving a census letter/ information on what to do. You can still participate by contacting 1800 181 227 or census.abs.gov.au

Regional Housing Support Fund Success – The Shire of Beverley has been awarded \$2.17m from the RHSF program following a successful grant application to progress construction of four essential workers houses at the Chestillion Crt sub-division (97 Hunt Rd). This was very exciting news! A separate project is

underway to complete headworks and services for the subdivision.

Works Crew – Maintenance grading has recommenced in the eastern section of the shire, shouldering on Kokendin rd is underway continuing to Talbot West rd. The outside crew have been attending to potholes and curbing in the town site, dug several graves, and undertaken preparation work at the rec ground in readiness for the Show.

Bridge 3195 – Between 27 August – 23 September 2026 work is due to commence at Waterhatch rd Bridge 3195. There may be width restrictions for vehicles exceeding 2.5m, please follow the directions of traffic management.

Noongar Land Enterprise Group – The NLE Rangers have been assisting local groups with landcare based projects in and around Beverley. This includes the Beverley River Care with weed control and planting on a trial project along the Avon River, cultural burning in the Dale River Reserve as part of the Protecting WA Black Cockatoos – Revegetation Project, and more recently at the Carolling Bally Bally Reserve assisting Phyllis Facey and the Naturalist Club planting trees where there is evidence of salt affected areas. All projects rely on volunteer assistance if you are interested in joining any of the teams.

Western Power Helicopter Work – Western Power has advised that helicopter-based maintenance of insulators is continuing in the area. To maintain the safety and reliability of the network the essential maintenance addresses issues like dust and pollution that can build up on insulators.

Beverley Show 2026 – Thankyou to the Ag Society committee and their volunteers for the huge amount of effort that goes into planning, preparing and presenting such an enjoyable day for family, friends and visitors to enjoy. Another great day in Beverley!

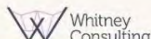
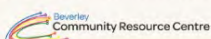

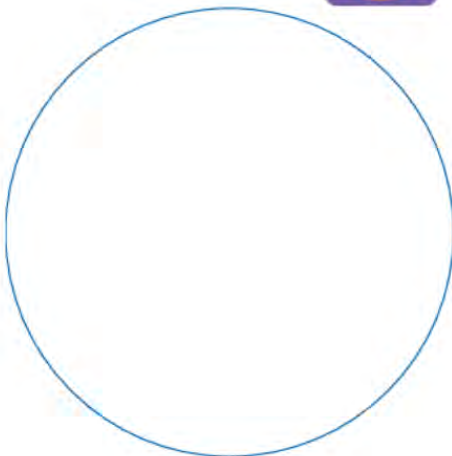

Beverley Men's Shed



Tuesday morning in the workshop

August has been an active month for the Beverley Men's Shed with a training seminar for workshop supervisors, an annual zone meeting of WA Men's Shed Association [WAMSA], collecting, processing and delivering wood and the usual activities around the Shed.

Our Shed Boss, Eric Beer and member Chris Kloss attended a workshop on 21 July at Cunderdin, along with about 24 Men's Sheddors from around the Wheatbelt and beyond. The training focused on woodworking and was partly sponsored by Australian Men's Shed Association [AMSA]. The session prioritised use of different woodworking power tool found in virtually all Men's Sheds. It quickly became apparent to Eric and Chris that measures needed to be introduced at Beverley to ensure the safety of members when working on projects—some were basic, logical and easy to implement, while other aspects are legislative requirements. Eric and Chris agreed the training was very useful and informative. Having the benefit of

WAMSA and AMSA membership provides Members with awareness and access to a variety of important issues that we Seniors should take on board.

On Friday, 7 July, members of the committee attended a zone meeting at Pingelly. Presentation on activities throughout the zone which included Narrogin, Corrigin and others were presented by each Shed. A representative of AMSA was able to provide information on insurance which will save out Shed in the vicinity of \$2,000 a year. Presentation on health and wellbeing issues followed and following a lunch the days wrapped up with an informative presentation on the care required when using lithium powered equipment. Members considered the day was well with the effort as many ideas will be considered for incorporation into our Shed operations.

With the cold mornings and evenings we experience at this time of you, the demand for wood has continued, keeping the wood team busy. The wood team has bought in several trailer loads of green wood that has been cut and split to dry out for next year. We have a good stock of well seasoned wood which is available calling Graham on 0407 445 363.

Each month we run a raffle in the Apex shelter adjacent to the IGA. One month we raise funds for our Shed and the alternate month we raise funds for the RFDS. Our July raffle was for the RFDS and we were able to forward \$349 to RFDS Western Operations. Additionally we emptied the donation tins around the town and an additional \$138.50 to the RFDS. We thank the businesses of Beverley that allow us to place donation tins on their counters and the residents of Beverley for their continued support of our raffles. Our member Merv Menz deserves a mention for his intrepid support in fund raising, particularly for the RFDS. Not only is he committed to the raffles but the wood team would be lost without his ability to move wood around that many of us could not raise from the ground. We really appreciate your dedication Merv.

With the AGM out of the way, the new committee has had a meeting where a plan was set out to address issues around financial management, with a focus on control of costs, insurance being a major burden. A programme has been initiated to have a thorough clean out of the workshop which will include disposal of equipment that is no longer utilised. Clearing unused items will provide a cleaner and safer working space for our members.

If you are interested in joining us, our weekly meeting is held in the shed behind the Old Beverley Fire Station at 146 Vincent Street on Tuesday morning from 09:00 to noon. Other activities are scheduled from time-to-time.

Show Categories & Key Guidelines

Section A: Single Cut Roses

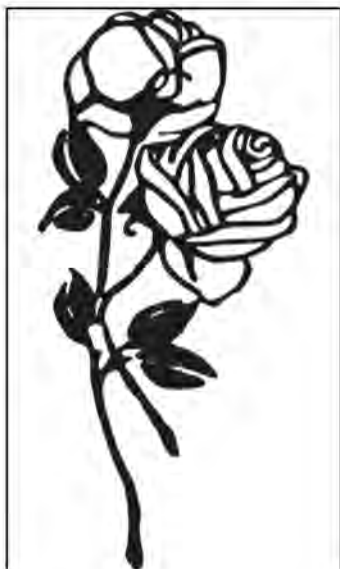
- **Single Stem Entries:** Should feature a straight, strong stem with only one or two petals under the flower and no leaves submersed in water. Glass display bottles (old cool drink bottles) are supplied on-site in small and large sizes.
- **Fully Blown Roses:** Entries in this class must be completely open, and all roses within the container must match this stage of maturity.

Section B: Floral Arrangements

Exhibitors must assemble these entries at home and in their own vases/bowls or containers.

- **Modern Flower Arrangement:** Focus on negative space and clean lines, utilising grouped statement roses in a plain container.
- **Mantlepiece Arrangement:** Designed with a flat back to sit neatly on a mantle. Ensure all support mechanics (oasis or wire) are completely covered by foliage.
- **Table Centre Arrangement:** A balanced, multi-dimensional display designed to be viewed beautifully from all angles.
- **Unusual Containers:** Must incorporate a functional water source, such as oasis or an internal jar/vase. Wrapping stems in wet cotton wool or foil is prohibited.

Tractors in Beverley

The first International Harvest Company advertisement for tractors appeared in the local newspaper in August 1912, followed by an item advising farmers to follow Andrew Carnegie's wise example in December 1912.

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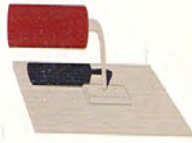

During emergency situations where Evacuation Orders are necessary it is vital that residents evacuate early as directed.



Where this becomes complicated is when people have companion animals that they cannot leave behind.



Residents need to have the confidence that if they evacuate early with their pets then there will be facilities to care for these animals at an Evacuation Centre.



Animals are not allowed inside an Evacuation Centre but using the services of ECART they can be cared for in an area outside of the Evacuation Centre.



The ECART trailer has cages and enclosures, gazebo shelters, leads, bowls, and other essential items to cater for traditional companion animals.



ECART is looking for volunteers who are willing to meet monthly to assist in deploying the trailer to Emergency Evacuation Centres when an Emergency is declared. They will also help to promote the service at Community Events where possible.

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Beverley's Best Kept Secret

Step inside one of Western Australia's oldest community landmarks

For more than 120 years, a historic building in the heart of Beverley has quietly stood watch over the town, witnessing generations of local history, friendship and community service. On Saturday, 19 September 2026, the members of Beverley Lodge No. 73 will open their doors to the public and invite residents and visitors alike to discover what lies behind one of Beverley's most intriguing buildings.

Doors will **open at 9.30am for a 10.00am start**, offering a rare opportunity to explore the Lodge, learn about its remarkable history and meet the people who continue its traditions today.

The story of Beverley Lodge began in February 1905, when its first meeting was held in the Methodist Church Hall. The meeting was attended by the Grand Master of Western Australia, distinguished visitors and local founding members who shared a vision of creating a lasting institution in Beverley. Just a few years later, in 1909, the current Lodge building was completed and has remained a prominent part of the town ever since.

Over the decades, the Lodge has been expanded, restored and preserved by dedicated members. It has weathered changing times, survived the challenges of age and continues to stand as a testament to the commitment of local people who valued community, friendship and service. While many people recognise the distinctive building, few have had the opportunity to step inside and discover its history, architecture and traditions. The Open Day aims to change that.

Explore the historic Lodge building.

Learn about the history of Beverley Lodge and its role in the community.

Discover the values and traditions of Freemasonry.

Ask questions in a relaxed and welcoming environment.

Meet local members and hear their personal stories.

The men of Beverley Lodge come from many different backgrounds and professions but share a common desire to contribute positively to their community. 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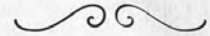
