President Report March 2013

Recreation Project

In February the Project Manager and Builder provided Councillors Pepper, Foster, Fregon and White and executive assistant Ali Lewis with a tour of the new building works.

The ongoing issues of inadequate power supply and consolidation of title boundaries still continue. Staff are working hard to have these resolved to ensure there is no delay when the time comes for building handover from Badge Construction upon completion of the works.

The netball court tender has been let to Badge Construction. Council was delighted when advised the Beverley Netball Club would make a contribution of \$30,000 towards the new courts.

Avondale

Some changes have been occurring at Avondale in relation to the farming operation over the last few months, and whilst they could appear negative, particularly when a very good article about Avondale ended up in the real estate section of the Farm Weekly, I view the current activity as an opportunity to move forward with a fresh approach.

The National Trust has leased the property for 12 months to a local farmer. A farm management group has been formed which is overseeing clean up of the property and a reduction sale of excess equipment. Continuing implementation and review of the Farm Management Plan is occurring. Whilst there is talk of the property being prepared for sale, which Council will be working hard to ensure does not happen, the current activities are long overdue.

Capital funding continues to be a crucial issue in relation to progressing the Avondale Masterplan, however Council has gained the support of neighbouring Shires for inclusion of Avondale in our 13/14 regional Country Local Government funding round.

Plant and Works Committee


Council did not hold a monthly meeting in January however the Plant and Works committee remained busy, reviewing and updating the preliminary 10 year road and 5 year plant replacement programmes, which now require endorsement by Council. A road inspection is scheduled for March, which will include visits to Bally Bally County Peak, Carrs, Sheehan, Maitland and Mandiakin Roads. If you have issues which require attention please contact the Manager of Works Steve Vincent. Councillors Alexander (chair), Foster, Gogol, Shaw, Pepper and Murray sit on the Plant and Works committee.

Youth Forum

Council is proposing to hold a Youth Forum in May to investigate local youth initiatives. A meeting was held with the Beverley Student Councillors to seek their thoughts on the proposal and ideas are now sought from local 11-18 years olds for discussion at the Forum, which they will also be invited to participate in. Further information can be obtained from the shire office.





HOME AND COMMUNITY CARE (HACC)

About HACC

The HACC Service is part of the Beverley Health Service Multi Purpose Service (MPS), in which the Commonwealth funding for residential aged care, HACC and State health care funding have been combined with the aim of providing flexible health services to meet the health needs of the local community.

Who can access to Services

The HACC target population comprises of persons living in the community who, in the absence of basic maintenance and support services, are at risk of premature or inappropriate long-term residential care, including:

- (i) older and frail persons, with moderate, severe or profound disabilities;
- (ii) younger persons with moderate, severe or profound disabilities; and
- (iii) their carers.

Referrals for HACC Services can be made by anyone in the community on behalf of a potential client or by the client.

About Our Services





Southern Inland Health Initiative

Emergency Telehealth Service - Saving lives in the country

From time to time, technology provides a major boost to medical care – and this is proving to be the case with the Emergency Telehealth Service (ETS).

The ETS uses high quality videoconferencing technology to enable emergency specialists based in Perth to examine patients in country hospitals. Launched in August 2012, the ETS has now helped over 700 country emergency patients.

"This technology is saving lives. It is linking small hospitals to specialist emergency physicians who can now give accurate diagnoses, prompt advice and guide local nursing staff through treatment options," said Dr Felicity Jefferies, Executive Director of the WA Country Health Service.

"It is helping to give patients prompt and thorough medical care, reducing unnecessary transport to metropolitan hospitals and helping to enhance the skills of our regional staff."

The success of the service has seen several expansions to the service, which now links to 19 hospitals and operates every day of the week.

"We've had an excellent response from nursing staff and patients, and we have also received a lot of interest from specialist emergency physicians in Perth, who are keen to be involved. It's a true success story for the SIHI project," said Dr Jefferies.

Local hospital emergency departments have been fitted with high-quality video-conferencing equipment in resuscitation bays, with feedback from nurses, patients and the specialist emergency doctors saying that it is almost as good as having a doctor in the room.

This has been made possible through the Royalties for Regions-funded Southern Inland Health Initiative's \$36.5million investment into Telehealth.

The ETS runs from 5pm-11pm Monday to Friday, and 8am-11pm on Saturday and Sundays.



THE DEAD FINISH MUSEUM

Located on the corner of Hunt Road and Morrison Street, this building was originally built as a hotel in 1871.

At that time it was the centre of Beverley but with the arrival of the railway line some fourteen years later drew the town towards the station leaving the Dead Finish on the outskirts of the main street.

Today the museum is run by the Beverley Historical Society with the gardens being maintained by the members of the Beverley Tree and Garden Society. The old-style garden gives visitors a fascinating insight into the early days of settlement in Beverley.

For the Easter period the Museum will be featuring "Hand Made: The self-sufficiency of early settlers" there will be significant pieces of locally made furniture, tools, gifts, clothes, quilts & kitchen utensils.





I'M BACK. So after 4 months off and time spent with the wife and daughter it's back to the grindstone and my job of keeping this community safe.

Before I get started I want to thank Karen Berry for looking after Beverley whilst I was away. She did a fantastic job and I know she enjoyed her time in Beverley.

Karen and Ian have been keeping me informed of what has been happening in Beverley during the last 4 months. But what she didn't need to tell me was the amount of people driving and using mobile phones, not stopping at Stop signs and the increase in burnouts around the town. I have seen all these myself whilst walking or driving around town. It is amazing what you see when your not in uniform.

Take more responsibility in your driving manner. It could mean the difference between arriving safely at your destination or arriving at the hospital in an ambulance, or worse. The choice really is yours. Now of course if you make the wrong choice, Ian and I will be here to remind you of your responsibilities when driving on the roads.

SUSPICIOUS BEHAVIOUR

Over the last week somebody has been getting around Beverley and peering over the fence into people's backyards. It has occurred a couple of times where young children have been playing in the backyard. This is where we need your help to keep aware of what is happened in the community and reporting suspicious behaviour to the police.

This person that we want to talk to is described as male about 25 years old, solid build, blonde hair wearing a red coloured shirt, black jeans and faded orange/red shoes. He is riding around on either a mountain bike or bmx. If you have seen this person or may know who it is then give us a call at the police station.

NEIGHBOURHOOD DISPUTES

It is becoming more increasing the incidents of neighbourhood disputes in Beverley, where either neighbours or people in the community have had a falling out for whatever reason. This is always likely to occur and whilst I don't expect everyone to be friends with everyone, what I do expect is if you have an issue or problem with someone else. You sort it out like rational adults and not resort to stealing or damage the other person's property. This is petty and also illegal. This means police will get involved. Obviously that would be something everyone would want to avoid. So if you don't like someone in town it is very simple. Stay away from them and don't talk to them or about them.

STOCK THEFT

There has been a recent rise in stock theft in the Beverley area. Police are urging everyone to be more vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour on yours or your neighbour's property. To also help with reducing stock theft police will also be stopping and checking vehicles that are carrying any livestock. So please make sure your waybills are with you and they are filled out correctly. If you see anything suspicious call Beverley Police on 96463333 or if you want to email us with any information regarding suspicious behaviour you can on beverley.police.station@police.wa.gov.au

EASTER

Yes it is only around the corner. With the extra couple of days break there is always more people in or around town. So please make sure you lock up your house and vehicle. Ian and I will be out and about over this time so it is a very highly likelihood that you will be stopped. So make sure you drink responsibly and don't drink and drive.

Take care and we will see you around town. Darrell and Ian


