ANZAC Day Lest we forget



It is truly hard to believe that in March, Beverley was going to lose their local RSL branch, due to lack of veteran and community interest, closure of the branch was imminent. The thought of not being able to attend a service on the 25th April in our community obviously did not sit well with many people. The extraordinary meeting held on Monday 25th March saw an outstanding turnout and many community members put their hands up to volunteer to run events, become office bearers and due to these people, we were very fortunate to be able to pay our respect to the soldiers that fought for our country and for our freedom.

The dawn service attracted a bigger than normal crowd of 150 all gathering at 5.45am to watch the march and pay tribute. Mr Wes Gliddon, RSL President led the proceedings with great ease and pride. This service was followed by the Gunfire Breakfast at the RSL Hall.

The Official mid morning service did not disappoint with a strong gathering of the community attending. The veterans marched proudly from the RSL on Forrest Street down Vincent Street toward the War Memorial. The Official ceremony included the District High School Student councillors Jade Holland and Vernette McKelvie reciting a poem followed by the Year 4/5 classes singing a beautiful version of *'Lest We Forget'* accompanied by Mrs Judy Moulton on the organ. The address by Cr Dee Ridgway was moving as was the prayer's lead by Joan McQuinn. This year's ceremony portrayed the true ANZAC spirit as the Australian National Anthem was followed by the New Zealand National Anthem sung by four New Zealanders visiting Beverley especially for the ceremony. Congratulations to the Beverley RSL Sub Branch on hosting a memorable ANZAC Day Commemoration Service for the community.



Council was delighted an invitation to the Hon. Judi Moylan, retiring Federal Member for Pearce, was accepted to visit Beverley in April. Council was able to thank and recognise her support to our community over many years and in many ways, which has included individual cases, grant applications for non profit organisations, phone calls following the recent storm event and most notably in assisting Council of the day in retaining Dr Gogna from deportation due to bizarre visa restrictions, an event from which saw a policy change in government management of visas for overseas doctors. Having been the Federal Member for almost 21 years has seen Judi involved in 7 federal elections,

Christian Porter, the Liberal candidate for the Pearce electorate also attended and the day included a visit to the Men's Shed, a tour of the Station Gallery and Platform Theatre and lunch with Councillors prior to the April Council meeting.

Cr Fregon Resignation

Local Government Elections 2013

Council regrettably accepted the resignation of Councillor Vicky Fregon in April. Councillor Fregon's participation was highly valued by her peers however other commitments have precluded Vicky from continuing in this capacity. Whilst this creates a vacancy in the South Ward, Council will now apply to the Electoral Commissioner to fill the extraordinary vacancy at the forthcoming October Local Government Elections. Council is also investigating the removal of wards, however if this goes ahead it would not be enacted until the 2015 Local Government Elections.

Thanks also goes to retiring FCO's David (Slab) Adams, Kokeby West Brigade and Garry (Brutus) Miller, Kokeby Brigade for the contribution they have made in this capacity over many years and to John Barrett-Lennard, Avondale Brigade who is aiming to retire prior to the forthcoming summer season.

The Fire Control Officers are reviewing the number of Bush Fire Brigades in the Beverley Shire with a view to merging the current 10 to a lesser number of brigades. 45th Art Purchase Exhibition

The Beverley Art Committee are once again to be commended and congratulated on the presentation of another outstanding exhibition and highly successful opening night. Such is the popularity of this event that a decision by the committee to reduce the number of paintings each artist could enter still attracted around the same number of paintings to hang due to the interest of many new exhibitors. The five day exhibition brings many visitors to our town.

<u>Avondale</u>

The Avondale Reduction Sale created much interest and was well supported. Thank you to those who assisted both with preparation and on the day and to Geoff Rayner, Primaries representative, for advice and assistance ensuring a good outcome was achieved. Proceeds from the reduction sale are to be reinvested into Avondale with priorities yet to be set. Urgent maintenance works to the farm reticulation system have finally commenced.

Correspondence has been forwarded to the new Heritage Minister seeking a meeting to discuss Avondale in terms of its significance, retention as a publicly accessible place for future generations and visitors to WA, and risks to this being achieved.

Bulk Recycling Bin

For those yet unaware of the change, the bulk recycling bin has been relocated to the refuse site. This has followed commencement of town site household recycling. Continued contamination of the bulk recycling bin with non recyclable rubbish or recycling rubbish being deposited in bags was still occurring. These issues create a problem with sorting and in some instances caused the whole bin to end up in landfill, which of course defeats the purpose. The refuse site is open Saturday – Monday.

At the request of landowners outside the town boundary Council is currently investigating the provision of private purchase recycling wheelie bins.

SHIRE OF BEVERLEY AGED CARE PLANNING

The Shire of Beverley has committed to participate in a Regional Aged Care Planning process to develop and assist in the implementation of an Integrated Wheatbelt Aged Care Plan.

The Plan will build on our existing services and infrastructure while finding methods in which our residents can age in their homes and communities for longer.

Funded through a partnership between the Wheatbelt Development Commission, the WA Country Health Service's Southern Inland Health Initiative (SIHI), and Local Government, the Wheatbelt Integrated Aged Support and Care Solution/s (WIASCS) is a proactive process which will produce Shire specific Needs Studies and an overall Wheatbelt Integrated Regional Aged Care Plan.

The Plan will look at all facets of Aged Care from Aged Friendly Communities, Aged Persons Housing, Community Care and Residential Care.

Melbourne Consultants Verso have been appointed to carry out this work and have prepared a summary of aged housing and care needs for our Shire. Verso would like to present these findings to the community to receive our thoughts and inputs, this will also provide a more accurate account of what will work and what is important to our community.

This is an invitation to all community members who access Aged Care services or have experienced the delivery of Aged Care services in our community to attend.

The community consultation will be held on Tuesday 14 May 2013 at 9:30am in the Lesser Hall.



- 1. <u>Emergency</u>: people who are seriously ill or severely injured due to accident or illness. NO AUTHORISATION NECESSARY
- 2. <u>Non-emergency</u>: people who need medical/surgical/ convalescent stretcher transport.
- 3. <u>Elective</u>: people needing the care or skills of an ambulance officer in transit and for whom no other form of transport is medically appropriate. AUTHORISATION NECESSARY – BY A DOCTOR OR HOSPITAL

Family membership - \$77 annually Single membership - \$47 annually Please note, when you turn 18yrs of age you are no longer covered by your family cover and will need to get separate coverage.

BEVERLEY NATURALISTS CLUB NEWS

Have you seen the Salmon gums lately and how spectacular they look? There colour is stunning it looks like they have dropped their summer drab and now have their winter fab. We have a wonderful Salmon Gum stand in Beverley the largest remaining intact in the Wheat belt. This is across the road from the motocross track on the rubbish dump road there is also a large native grass land in there next to the Salmon gum stand. Wonderful bird songs can be heard long before you realise you are at the Salmon gum stand. Salmon gums don't support much understory being what is known as open woodland but many species of wildlife still call it home. Birds like the Rufus tree creeper can be seen and heard clearly around this area. The night birds such as owls and frogmouths and bush stoned curlews are clearly heard hunting and I have witnessed the mating dance of the Barn Owl. I must say the female seemed very un impressed but he must have won her over eventually because they did have babies, I think she was playing hard to get.

Next to the motocross track in an area that is classified as a Threatened ecological community which means it has very unusual combinations of Native Flora and it is also a seasonal wet land which supports a huge variety of species of wildlife including the endangered Red-tailed Phascogale and possibly the native water rat. This area is very special and we thank the Shire of Beverley for protecting it for future generations to enjoy. I have my wildlife cameras out there and we are able to keep adding to our wildlife species list for the area. This is very exciting.

These areas are fenced to protect the native Flora and Fauna from activities such as motor bikes, quad bikes and motor vehicles and horses that do significant damage to the vegetation including some very rare plants indeed. Some of this vegetation is so rare that they cannot be replaced if lost though illegal activities. So remember if you see native vegetation please do not pick it. Please admire it and photograph it but do not disturb it as many of these plants are very sensitive. Before the bush was fenced an extinct orchid was found it was photographed and before a positive identification was possible a motorbike smashed the area apart and the orchid has never been seen since, this is very sad but hopefully it will re-appear one day.

The Beverley Naturalists' Club have a wonderful Herbarium with specimens of native vegetation that are from around Beverley reserves and this is a wonderful tool for identifying any flora that you see out and about. Just record any info like the area and colour other vegetation around the area and you will be able to find it in our collection. Anybody wishing to see our Herbarium can ring me and I will gladly show you it. We will be having an information day later in the year for people wishing to lean about the Herbarium how it works and how important it is for future generations.







Beverley District High School


Hello and a big welcome to the school holidays for both students and staff. It has been a long 11 week term and towards the end of the term, students and staff alike were feeling very tired. On a brighter note, 2nd term is only 9 weeks in duration!!!!

We have had a very smooth start to the year with both staff and students settling in very well.

Some of our classes have already gone on excursions. Follow are the sentiments of the Year 4 class as some of the students recount their day at AQWA.







During Term One, the Year Four class have been learning all about the coral reef ecosystem.

We went on an excursion to the Aquarium of Western Australia to experience all the weird and wonderful creatures which survive in this beautiful 'underwater rainforest'.

AQWA - Harrison Bowden

On the 28th March the Year 4 class went to AQWA to learn more about the coral reef. The first thing we did was to get to Beverley and then get on the bus to Perth. Mr Ireland drove us via the Great Southern Highway. On the way Sam, Grace, Declan, Jack, Josh, Miss Meade and I played car cricket. Sam won on 120 points. I had to add up all the cars- 1pt, utes- 4pts, trucks - 6pts, trailer- 4pts and motorbikes 2pts. Red cars were out. I got out on 91 points. Jack got out on only 18 points.

Then, when we got out of the bus we went and sat down on the grass to eat recess. Mum went to get some coffees and she came back with three gigantic muffins. She split hers in half and gave some to me. I shared it with my friends. Then we got into our three groups and a lady called Shae took us inside. I was in a group with Nigel, Annie, Abbey, Alyssa and Declan. Mum was in my group as well.

After that Shae took us past the touch pool. There was a stingray swimming past us. Then we went to the information centre where Shae showed us sharks, sea cucumbers, moray eels and lots more.

We also learnt that the reef has gardeners, farmers, cleaners and residents. Shae told us

that open ocean fish have silver and blue colours, streamlined bodies and their bodies don't have the right shape to turn quickly whereas reef fish are the opposite.

Then we went to the touch pool. I found out that sharks have rough skin, so do stingrays. I felt a sea cucumber. It was very slimy. Then we went to stingray bay. On the way we saw the AQWA coral reef. Two people were swimming with a lot of fish I recognised from the movie "Finding Nemo." Every now and then big jets of oxygen came out of big water pumps.

After that, at Stingray Bay there was a man feeding the stingrays by hand. By shaking squid in the water, the stingrays swam over his hand and took the squid. Abbey and Annie spotted two enormous stingrays. Both were black and heading towards the man feeding them .After that we went back to the AQWA coral reef. This time instead of going straight we turned left. Instead we saw the underwater version of the reef. This time it felt like we were actually inside the tank. The jets of oxygen were above our heads. It felt like we had dragons breathing white fire above our heads. There were also schools of black and white fish. Then we went to the danger zone where my favourite animal was the blue ringed octopus.

Then we went to the Far North with crocodiles, coral polyps and lots of little rainbow fish in a round tank. The crocodile had scaly skin and black eyes. Next we saw sea horses and sea dragons at the South Coast. We also saw pineapple fish (that looked like an upside-down pineapple). In the entire South coast my favourite animal was the leafy sea dragon.





PRIMARY CARE What is it? Where does it start?

Primary Care is about developing a culture of caring for each other, which sometimes needs support by professionals.

Research shows that around 90% of suffering, through traumatic experiences in our lives, can be resolved by having a cuppa, a hug and a talk to a caring friend or other ordinary human being, who knows how to listen.

Is that something all of us can do? It is worth remembering "a problem shared is mostly a problem halved."

Given the rural climate at the minute which is tough for farmers, agribusiness and agri-link industries, the most effective care always starts from the bottom up.

An example of this is the Crossroads Breakfasts that are happening in and around Merredin. These were started and continue to operate under the guidance of good Samaritan, Mal Willis and his team. These breakfasts take place literally at a set of crossroads in different parts of the eastern Wheatbelt. They start just after dawn and enable men to catch up to talk over life on the land.

The benefits of an event at the grass-roots level like this are many, some of which are:

- a sense of mateship and the feeling that you are not out there on your own;
- maintains important social contact to keep both the mind and spirit in good health; and
- it's blokes talking about bloke's stuff.

There are many other grass-roots events that we attend which are also a great basis for primary care.

These gatherings occur when many rural people are at the crossroads in their life. People in the bush have always faced tough times, and now is no different.

I would like to quote a snippet from

Albert Facey's book "A Fortunate Life" "He wrote about his life as if it were a journey. Along his route, crossroads offered crucial choices - in some cases his survival was at stake - and the tracks he followed led to learning, pain and enrichment."

What a story, I thoroughly recommend it, it is a fantastic read for all.

The important message is this: start to talk about some of the pain, don't suffer alone. Remember
