President Report October 2014

Town Planning Scheme Amendment 21 and Stocking Rates Policy

Many Beverley property owners in the R2, R2.5 and R5 residential zonings currently enjoy having animals on their properties, in fact the space may well have been the very reason they initially purchased their land. There has been some alarmism in the community which is thinking that Council is trying to get rid of or make it more difficult to have animals in these zonings, however rest assured this is quite the contrary.

The Shire of Beverley Town Planning Amendment Scheme 21 recently gazetted, thus enabling Council to grant consent for a "Rural Pursuit" (ie keeping of livestock) to lawfully occur on the R2, R2.5 and R5 coded areas of the residential zone. To ensure the keeping of livestock does not impact detrimentally on the health and/or amenity of adjoining landowners or management of the land, a Stocking Rates Policy - Residential and Rural Living Zoned Land has been developed and endorsed by Council.

The Shire is trying to be as accommodative as possible. Without a planning scheme amendment and forth flowing stocking rates policy the "rural pursuit" land uses in these residential zones would have remained unlawful, always with the lingering possibility of enforcement and litigation.

SEAVROC

The Shires of Cunderdin, Quairading and Tammin have formally withdrawn from the South East Avon Voluntary Regional Organisation of Councils (SEAVROC) to form their own grouping. SEAVROC was initiated in 2006 and in 2007 the 5 original Councils of Beverley.

Brookton, Cunderdin, Quairading and York entered into an MOU "with the intent of developing an alliance that responds proactively to the environment changing while maintaining individual their identities". The MOU recognized SEAVROC's role "as a strategic regional management team" of the respective Councils with "a particular to support sustainable focus development". Tammin was a later addition. The remaining Councils are now due to meet in February 2015 to discuss the next phase SEAVROC.

<u>Beverley Heroic Bike Ride and</u> Beverley Town Ride

On Sunday 5th October 2014 the Beverley Heroic will celebrate the former Perth to Beverley bicycle race which ran for over 100 years. This time it's about participation and enjoying the scenic Avon Valley region rather than winning a race. While the Heroic cyclists are out on the country roads between Beverley, York and Northam, locals are encouraged to participate in an afternoon of self-guided cycling around the town of Beverley in the tradition of a car rally. Declining Mobile Coverage

Following an increased number of remarks and complaints filtering through from our local community regarding erratic and declining strength of mobile phone and data coverage, correspondence has been forwarded to relevant state and federal politicians to raise these growing concerns, request investigation as to why this is occurring, and seek a solution on behalf of residents and business in the region to have the situation rectified.

You could also reinforce this contact by registering your own concerns to relevant politicians.

Beverley Townsite Scheme Water

The Water Corporation has advised that they are in the process of developing plans to increase the water pressure into the Beverley townsite.

Council recently sent out surveys to 45 property owners along Hamersley St, Langsford St and Simmons Rd seeking their feedback regarding Council consideration of an extended scheme water connection within the Beverley townsite boundary to properties that currently do not have such a connection. Of the 21 replies the majority of property owners were not keen on such a proposal due to the expense already incurred in providing their own infrastructure.

<u>CRC Welcome to Beverley Morning</u> Tea

The recent Community Resource Centre initiative of holding a morning tea to welcome newcomers to our community was a great success. Representatives from the CRC, Mens Shed, Meeting Tree and Shire were on hand to meet new residents and share information about Beverley.

Congratulations to all participants in the recent Interschool Athletics Carnival which was hosted by Beverley District High School. The skillful organization of the event drew many favourable comments, as did the magnificent condition of the town oval.








The good news is due to our forensic officers attendance we managed to obtain a DNA (Deoxyribonucleic acid – worth a fortune in Scrabble that one!) sample which led to the successful arrest of one of the offenders. He has been charged and bailed and is awaiting a court appearance. What is slightly worrying is that from one of the burglaries a firearm was taken which brings me onto my next point......

Operation Dust Off

In the Wheatbelt District we have over 12,000 registered firearms licence holders. The number of firearms which have been getting stolen has got to the stage where we have to take robust action. As a result Wheatbelt District officers are currently carrying out visits to as many of our licence holders as we can. I won't go into official timescales but for Beverley this will be an ongoing operation.

We aren't trying to catch anyone out but some of our visits will be ad-hoc, spur of the moment ones. This isn't because we have our suspicions it's usually just a case of we carry around a large file with us and if we realise we're on the street where a certificate holder lives then we'll give you a knock. As I said, if we call unannounced it's nothing sinister.

We'll be looking at firearm security so your cabinet will be scrutinzed and we'll do a check of the firearms listed on your licence. If all is good and after we've drunk our third cup of coffee we'll be on our way. If biscuits are provided then we may stay longer. If there's cake then you'll have to call the police to get us out of there.

On a serious note though, firearm security is so important I cannot stress it enough. It's an individual responsibility which goes with the territory. If you've got a gun you've got to look after it and its security. If it gets into the wrong hands then we're all in trouble.

Roads Policing

We've dealt with quite a few accidents recently where inattention has been one of the main causal factors. I've been there, seen it and done it. What am I talking about? **Driving tired**. It's probably one of the scariest things that's ever happened to me whilst driving. If you've ever driven and not remembered long stretches of the journey then without knowing it you've probably experienced micro-sleep. It's an awful thing and something I'm not keen on experiencing again. I know we suffer from the tyranny of distance here in WA but the bottom line is, if you're tired, pooped, knackered, call it what you want then **STOP**, park up and have 10 minutes. So what if you're going to be late. It's got to be better than being The late......

Anyway, that's it for this month, nearly......

If you see me running around the oval and sweating profusely it's all for a good cause. My trousers have asked that I go on a diet as they can't seem to fit around my waist anymore. For years I've been blaming it on the cut of those trousers but that excuse is now wearing thinner than I was when I was 13 (which if my memory serves me right wasn't very thin anyway). What finally swayed me was my new ID card picture. What do you think?

OK, that's all folks. Take care everyone, look after each other and if you need us for anything don't hesitate to get in touch.



Culture/Languages





Spring has sprung and activities should be well underway for getting your property ready for summer.

As we head into bushfire season there are a number of actions you should take to protect your family and property from the threat of fire. You can protect your house by installing wire or metal flyscreens, placing seals around doors and windows, cleaning out your gutters and using fire resistant insulation in the ceiling.

It is also recommended that you have a store of personal protective equipment including long trousers made from natural fibres, cotton or woollen long sleeve shirt, hat, gloves and safety glasses. Many fires start from burning-off operations which get out of hand. Make sure you know what you are doing – check first with your local government.

A vegetable patch and orchard, while not only supplying you with wonderful fresh produce, can also make a green firebreak. Locate it on the side of your house most at risk from a bushfire and make it part of your bushfire protection plan.

With sheep, scouring is showing up and regular worm egg counts should be maintained to assist you in identifying when you need to drench your flock.

If you own alpacas and have not shorn them this year, now would be a good time. If you do not shear them, you run the risk of wool becoming contaminated with weed seeds and the animal suffering heat stress over summer. While your alpacas are restrained, check if their nails need clipping.

Pastures are starting to dry-off so you may need to think about buying feed. When considering purchasing hay keep in mind that it is often a common way for weeds to spread. When purchasing hay request from the supplier that it is Annual Rye Grass Toxicity (ARGT) free. A test is available. Check your stored hay regularly as heat can build-up between bales and start fires.

Regular control of rabbits is also recommended. Rabbit control options can be found on the Department of Agriculture and Food Western Australia website (agric.wa.gov.au).

The Farm Diversity website recently launched by the Rural Industries Research and Development Corporation (RIRDC) is a free and easy to use resource which offers options for diversifying enterprises. You can enter your postcode and a 'shortlist' of industries that may be viable in your area will be displayed. For each plant and animal essential information such as production status, growing region maps, risks and challenges, regulatory considerations, publications, resources and contact information for industry bodies are provided. Beverley Community Information and Referral Services

As per our previous publication in the Beverley Blarney, BCS does not publish legal information; this is due to constant to various laws and other regulatory bodies.

COMMUNITY INFORMATION

Aged Care Residents: TV reports tell us that most residences have a rating system and the top rate at 5 star. All the research that is carried out on a regular basis, tells us, as recent as last week, that some 5 star homes, which, show some 40% of age care residents who had passed away did face some form of malnutrition and dehydration problems. These figures, are for the over all aged care sector.

As the whole Age Care System is so complex and involves various proceedings, agreements, Centrelink, and may lead to selling ones home, it is more than advisable and to protect ones family, is to seek legal advice and get your lawyer to ask relevant questions re:- background checks and as this will also apply if you want to purchase into an aged care facility/complex some units can cost as much as \$300,000 plus. The question is, how much money can it be sold for when, one passes on? These are the legal questions that a lawyer can help out with.

Legal Aid: Apparently I am led to believe, by applicants, that they have been rejected, when it comes to family court matters, including separation and divorce. In these cases, first request to speak to a lawyer over the phone and then go to the CRC and get help to load the required forms from the Government Access computer. Take due care when you fill in these forms and affidavits, as some documents, may lead you to a court appearance. Be truthful and careful in what you write and say under oath in court. False evidence is seen as perjury and the penalty imposed by the courts could be a custodial sentence. It is always a good idea to consider court matters seriously and to seek legal opinions when in doubt or preparing legal documents.

Research: Thanks to a local resident who remembers her neighbours from early 1940s, we were able to discover Frank and Kate Hayman had lived in a little timber house in Hunt Rd. They had emigrated from England & their two daughters were born here. Mr Hayman worked in East Beverley for a time. Mr and Mrs Hayman & one daughter are buried in the Anglican Cemetery. They are remembered as lovely people & good neighbours.

- A former resident who now lives in Switzerland was delighted by photos of Susannah Edwards hand-crafted **Butter Stamp** on display in the kitchen

Halls, Homesteads, Schools & Views - A Beverley Historical Society Field Trip

Leaving the Dead Finish Museum on Wednesday 10 September 2014 a small convoy of cars headed out to Bally Bally. We met others there before taking a look at the old "Bally Bally" homestead of the Kilpatrick family. Built before 1908 the side verandah retains the original exquisite stone façade.



Across the gully is the site of the family's first mud brick home with only the step remaining.



We had morning tea at Bally Bally Hall, a Registered Heritage building opened in 1904 by local MLA Charles Harper.



From here we went south to the Qualandry Crossing where plenty of water was seen in Yen Yenning Lake & in the Avon River.



Back along the roads we were taken to "Uralla" homestead, former home of John & Della McLean. One hundred years after settlement, the family had erected a commemorative plaque in 1997.



Returning to Bally Bally we stopped at the old school site. This school opened in 1914 and closed in 1936. This was also the site of the Bally Bally Tennis Club & the pupils had the advantage of the use of three tennis courts during play times.



Further along the Bally Bally County Peak Road on the left is the site of the Bally Bally Rifle Range. It opened in 1917 & closed in the 1960s. There were three shooting mounds in front of the natural peak & a couple of dozen shooters would gather on a Sunday morning for practice & competition.

By now it was lunch time & we were kindly invited to make use of "Sheihalean" another former Mclean home. This lovely home dates from 1908 & the charming dining room is currently being renovated.



Not far from the homestead is the site of an old goldmine. The main shaft went down for 30 feet and one side passage led to another shaft going towards the surface. Gold was worth 3 pennyworth a ton early in the 20th century which was sufficient for the mine to be worked for a time. All that remains now is a gravel pit.



Next was a look at Quajabin (or County) Peak and marvellous views to Yen Yenning Lakes & other rocky outcrops across the green paddocks. Wildflowers too.



Quajabin Peak was first noted by Ensign Dale in 1830 along with the campfires of the Aboriginal people along the lakesides.

Down the road is the site of the County Peak School that operated from 1910 to 1933.

From there we drove across to the Morbinning School site that only opened for 5 years -1909 to 1914. Our final halt was the Morbinning Hall, a large corrugated metal hall built after WW2 & recent home of the national award-winning Morbinning Landcare Group.

We were so lucky to have some very special guests come to Beverley on Saturday 13th September, and their knowledge of the natural environment was unbelievable. Eric and Margaret McCrum and Kevn and Peg Griffiths. These fantastic people started the Darling Range Naturalists Club many years ago. Kevn is a leading expert on Native Fungi and has even written some books on this fascinating group of plants that are very important to our bushlands by assisting keeping everything healthy. There are many different species and they all perform different tasks in the bush for example the big orange Bracket Fungi is feeding on dead timber which helps the dead wood to break down.



Eric has a huge knowledge on plants, insects, birds and everything relating to our Natural Environment. A couple of things we learnt was the mosquito is the main pollinator of the Greenhood Orchid and he showed us Native Bees with pollen sacks under their back legs and some little Native Fly's. Insects play an important role in our environment they are food for wildlife and they also pollinate our native flora. We were also shown the smallest little Drosera it was so small that we have walked over it many times and not noticed it before. He also knew all the birds and their calls and what the calls meant that were around the Reserve. Eric could also mimic their calls.

We are hoping to organise another Bush walk in early November and are hoping to have Eric, Margaret, Kevn and Peg as our special guests. We will go to the Salmon Gum stand. We will let you know the date everyone is most welcome.

Some interesting things from Dottie and my bushwalks we have a naturally occurring hybrid orchid this is a cross between the Cowslip orchid and Pink Fairy Orchid, this is a very beautiful orchid. Dottie also photographed the tiny little Zebra Orchid and also a very large white Spider Orchid. Nature has turned on a brilliant display with Wildflowers the best we have seen for a few years.

We have started packing up the office and have moved the Herbarium and the Library and we have to pack up the things in the old holding cell at the Court House, clean it and lay the floor coverings I got for the floor. Thanks Angie, Reese and Dottie for the muscle to shift the shelves and Tim did the most important job making us coffee and making sure we did not bump into any wall and doors. Ralph Sweeney 7/7/1927 - 14/9/2014

Eulogy read by Graeme Blight at Ralph Sweeney's funeral on Thursday 18/9/2014.

Ralph, Ralphy, Sweeney, Mack, the Irishman – all names when mentioned leave no-one in doubt about who we were talking of. I think Sweeney's legacy is evident in the people present to mourn his passing, but also to celebrate his life.

We all pass on our condolences to his family – Rosalie, the children and grandchildren – but in doing so we remember a man who was a husband, father, father in-law, grandfather, brother, brother in-law, relative, neighbour, work mate or friend or a combination of some of the above. Talking to Rosalie last night, she said to put in he was a great lover also, although I can't vouch for that.

I personally cannot think of Ralph without cracking a smile or having a laugh. He was that sort of person – a character and we call all be thankful for having known him.

I am honoured to have been asked to give this eulogy to a good mate of mine and a friend to all.

Ralph Sweeney was born 7th December 1927 in County Donegal, Ireland.

He was one of 13 children. In his early twenties he worked in Scotland for two years before deciding to migrate to Australia. Ralph left Southampton aboard the "Mooltan" 6th June 1951 and arrived in Fremantle, 6th July 1951. On arrival in Western Australia he stayed at Point Walter Migrant Camp for a few days.

Ralph then caught a train to Beverley and from there he went on the school bus out to the Dale to commence work for Ossie Valentine, where he stayed almost two years.

Ralph then made his home base at Clarrie Hobb's old house. Ralph learned to shear so he worked around the Dale area as a shearer & farm labourer working for Jack Strange, John Hobbs, Jim Strange, Ernie Bartram to name a few.

He also did contract clover harvesting for Lou Bailey over two seasons.

It was while shearing at Ernie Beecroft's, Ralph met Rosalie Squires (Ernie's niece) August 1958. They married 3rd December 1960 at St Francis Xavier Catholic Church, East Perth.

For the first year of their marriage they lived in a cottage on the farm of John Hobbs.

In early 1962 they moved to a farm owned by the Ferguson's, before shifting to 'Strathlene' (John & Lesley Scott's farm) on Butcher Rd – early 1963.

Two year's on 1965 Jack Strange bought "Bedford Meadows" in the Brookton Shire and asked Ralph to be manager for him, which he accepted. Ralph & Rosalie worked there until late 1966 before moving to a farm house owned by Keith Barrett-Lennard which he rented to them.

Ralph mainly worked for Jim (Allen Richard) Strange at this time and in the spring of 1967 Jim sold Ralph a small corner portion of his farm (26 acres). Ralph had a house built on his piece of ground and in May 1968 he & his family moved in.

Ralph had worked seasonally at "Romilly" over the years and the last 12 years of his working life he was there working for Stan Dorman before retiring December 1993.

Ralph & Rosalie had five children: Margaret Anne, Karen Patricia, Kathleen Teresa, Lisa Maree and Michael John.

The Sweeney children all attended West Dale Primary School and from there went to Beverley District High School. Michael attended the Narrogin Agricultural College.

Ralph and Rosalie also have 9 grandchildren.

Ralph and Rosalie moved to Brookton 19th July 2014.

I was privileged to have been a neighbour of the Sweeney's for 30 of the 46 years they lived in the house on the hill in the Dale & enjoyed the hospitality that was extended – there was always a cuppa going & Rosalie always had a 'sticky bun' to go with this cuppa. I would like to share some stories with you about our Ralphy.

Most of the stories came as a result of personal experience, but quite a few I learned while enjoying a beer after work in the shearing shed. When I first met Sweeney, he was shearing for "Big Jim's" (Jim Strange) with Fred Gillham & I was the roustabout. In the early times he mainly talked about his time in the Dale & the people he worked for or knew. Later when he was

due to go back to Ireland for a holiday with Margy he mainly talked about Ireland & Scotland.

Ralph became an Australian Citizen on 13th May 1983 but never lost his Irish brogue.

He went to Ireland for a holiday in the years 1983 and 1986. After spending a night at the pub with rellies who said that they couldn't understand Ralph. Margy said that she couldn't understand a word they were saying & Ralph said 'Neither could I".

I must admit that I have struggled with some of these stories because, besides trying to clean them up, I am also trying to keep them "politically correct".

It occurred to me whilst writing this that I was doing it at the wrong time. I should have been telling these stories last week when he as alive to enjoy them & I know he could have added to them.

Here goes – when he was working for Ossie, he was asked (by Ossie) to transport some of his workers to Brookton on the back of the new Austin truck. All was going well until he came to a corner a bit fast and hit the brakes, and they worked better than he thought and the workers all went sliding down the tray amid a chorus of "are you trying to kill us Irishman", there is more to the story, but I think I had better leave it at that.

The house that they built on the 26 acres was originally located in Northam and Sweeney intended to transport it "as is" to the Dale – unfortunately this house was too wide to transport and had to be disassembled and re-built. I can remember a lot of talk? About how the Government was making it too hard for an Irish battler.

On the 26 acres the Sweeney's ran pigs, milk cows, a horse and of course the chooks and sheep. Sweeney was very good with pigs and used to mate sows and sell the weaners, occasionally saving a killer. The sows always produced a litter of 11 or 12, which annoyed me because my pigs only produced 7 or 8. If any of his litters suffered because of numbers, Rosalie used to go and feed them porridge. I always told him it was the Catholic influence in his big litters. At one stage I had a pet kangaroo and it used to run with my milk cows. The cows got used to it & didn't mind it at all. One day the roo decided to visit Sweeney's cows and it happened when he was milking his cow. The roo jumped up behind the cow and made a noise, which scared the cow & she took off demolishing the bale. Sweeney was left there with the bucket and the cow was gone. He came up to my place to tell me what happened – unfortunately I saw the funny side, which did not improve his mood.

On another occasion which my father remembered til he died, Sweeney was explaining to Dad the risks that hay bale strings provided. Sweeney told Dad that he was carrying a bucket of milk to give to the pigs and he trod on a bale string & put his foot in the other end – "And the bloody bucket passed me".

There was always plenty of "Irish Jokes" being told and Sweeney used to counter with the story of how you need an IQ of about 45 to be able to tie your own shoe laces – that's why most Australian's wear thongs.

On another occasion he told me off for building a windmill close to where his windmill was. With a twinkle in his eye he told me there was not enough wind for two mills.

Part of the enjoyment I received in writing this was remembering the stories I couldn't tell.

If I refer back to the listing of the Sweeney children we see that the birth of Margy in 1962 and Karen in 1964 are both on "Paddy's Day", confirmed the importance of Paddy's Day for years to come. Kathleen missed by about 6 weeks and then Lisa wasn't even close, but she was born about the same time as my son, which meant they both started school the same day at West Dale. I believe there was tension between the Blight's and Sweeney's that day when Lisa sat on Alan's lunch. Then after four girls Rosalie and Ralph had a son Michael - after a while Michael became Sweeney's shadow and forever after referred to him as that 'Blessed Boy' and I could tell a few stories relating to that.

All of these children are here today along with their spouses and children. I know that they all have great affection for both of their parents and I also know that Ralph and Rosalie shared that affection and a great pride.

To this family I can say it's sad that you have lost the physical presence of Ralphy, but what I have said is only a very small part of the memories you have not lost.

I received an email from Margy last night & decided to conclude with what she wrote - we've had some tears and some laughs in the last few days. One was when Mum was putting together some clothes to dress Dad up in (in the coffin), Karen bought in a white hanky for his suit pocket & asked me if I knew how to fold it. I was tempted to tie a knot in each corner & put in on my head, I do remember Dad wearing a white hanky like that. Then Michael said that we should also have some bailing twine. Dad always preferred to wear the baling twine rather than a belt. I remember buying Dad a new belt several years in a row, never saw him wear it, but did see the bright blue baling twine sticking out below his shirt, bless him.










August, October and December had the highest number of presentations during 2013/14.






It would appear that on average the number of ED presentations is higher from Friday to Sunday inclusive for 2013/14.



The highest number of ED presentations were treated and referred to their GP, followed by treated and no referral required and treated and transferred to hospital.














Year 3/4... a sustainable world!

"On with your rubber gloves and let's get this waste audit underway!"









Cervical Cancer Prevention in the Wheatbelt

Did you know that regular pap smears can save 1,200 Australian women from developing cervical cancer each year? Only 52% of Wheatbelt women aged 18-70 have had a pap smear in the last 2 years.

Cervical cancer is one of the most preventable of all cancers, and can be detected by having regular pap smears. Yet three in every four women who develop cervical cancer have either never had a Pap smear or have not had one in the last 5 years.

Pap smear provider and nurse practitioner in the Wheatbelt, Ange Patras says 'Pap smears are quick and simple procedures that are effective in the prevention of cervical cancer, and can give women peace of mind that they are protecting themselves'. Pap smears detect cell changes before they become cancerous.

Cancer Council WA and Wheatbelt Public Health Unit in partnership with a number of other health agencies received a grant to run activities from April to October aimed at promoting cervical cancer screening. These activities will be delivered in towns where screening rates are low.

If you are aged 18-70 and haven't had a Pap smear in the last 2 years or have never had one, we encourage you to book an appointment with your GP to have one done.



Lyme Disease. Department of Health reports on Lyme disease

Earlier this month, the Chief Medical Officer (CMO), Professor Chris Baggoley released a Progress Report following the disbanding of the Clinical Advisory Committee on Lyme Disease (CACLD). The report is now available for downloading from the Department of Health website. The report indicates that the CACLD was unable to reach a conclusion about the existence of Lyme disease in Australia and that the Department of Health's investigations would be ongoing. Some medical publishers and commentators seized upon one statement, "There is still no routine finding of Borrelia spp in ticks in Australia" to broadcast misleading headlines like: "No evidence of Lyme disease here". Whereas a more accurate interpretation is that the CMO's review process has been inconclusive to date and the need for considerable further research has been highlighted. Some patients have been disappointed and angered because they feel the report "did not go far enough" in acknowledging Lyme disease is here in Australian patients and lacked recommendations for direct and immediate action to assist existing patients. Patients not should be too disheartened by the report and should remain mindful that processes of change involving government rarely move quickly. In a cover letter introducing the report, the CMO acknowledges "the patients suffering from a Lyme disease-like syndrome" and this, in itself, is a very positive shift away from the attitudes patients faced with medical authorities two years ago. Throughout the Progress Report we can see many areas in which the submissions made by patient groups and individuals have been able to exert a considerable shift in the way Lyme disease is being considered and discussed.

Clearly, all our hard work earlier in the year was not entirely wasted. As well as some of the negative or misleading media articles our doctors may be reading, the release of the CMO's reports has seen a number of high-profile media reports that can be seen as being very positive from a patient perspective.




