President Report - March 2015

New Grader

At the time of writing Council was due to accept a tender at its February meeting for replacement of grader BE001, used mainly for construction works. Council contributes annually to a plant replacement reserve to even out the "big ticket" purchases within the 10 year plant replacement programme.

Town Hall Roof Replacement

The long awaited and much needed replacement of the town hall roof is due to commence in March.

Old School Remediation Works

Remediation works on the Old School Building from which the Community Resource Centre currently operates are underway. Whilst the CRC had proposed to scale back their business during this time and still remain open, they have unfortunately been required to close for a short period due to public access safety issues.

Beverley Airfield Emergency Services Lighting.

Installation of lighting at the airfield for the Royal Flying Doctors Service and emergency services is now moving ahead. Impressively the cash component of this project has been fully funded through community fundraising initiated by our local St John Ambulance and a grant through the Regional Airports Development Scheme(RADS) which is administered by the Department of Transport and funded through the State Government's Royalties for Regions program.

Aeronautical Museum Significance Assessment

An application has been submitted seeking funding through the Regional Community Chest Grants Scheme to have a Significance Assessment undertaken for the Aeronautical Museum. This will support future funding applications and interpretation planning.

Recreation Precinct

A small universal access public toilet has arrived for installation near the oval playground. Other works to be undertaken in completion of a prior grant include an electronic scoreboard, multiuse storage shed and picnic area.

Multipurpose Building Update

Thankyou for the Community submissions received in relation to the proposed Multi-purpose Community Centre project. Comments will be noted when design plans are finalized and the project will only be progressed subject to successful Federal and State funding which is currently being investigated.

Western Australian Local Government (WALGA) Country Reform Policy Forum

This Forum has now been disbanded. In the wake of the recent developments in the Metropolitan Reform program the purpose for which it was established has altered. WALGA President Troy Pickard is proposing to redirect resources toward sector wide initiatives aimed at analyzing, improving and developing Local Government sustainability.



PADDOCK BURNS: At any time throughout the year, where landowner intends to burn paddocks, the following must be provided to prevent escape of fire

- A fire-break 2.2 meters wide clear of all inflammable material completely surrounding the area to be burnt.
- An operational fire fighting unit having a capacity of not less than 650 litres.

All issuing of burning permits will be at the discretion of your local fire control officer.

Please be reminded that the permit holder is responsible for checking the weather condition prior to lighting a fire.



Cleaning tips

The following tips will help to ensure your difficult-to-clean eligible farm chemical containers will be accepted for recycling at your local *drumMUSTER* collection centre.




Suspension concentrates (Atrazine, Simazine, etc)

 Rinse your container immediately after use to ensure any chemical residue does not dry



Use methylated spirits to remove dried residue. If this doesn't work, fill the container with water and soak for at least 24 hours before rinsing. **Oil-based chemicals** (ULVs, LVs)







Other chemical residues

Rinse container immediately after use as all chemical residues are much harder to remove when dry

- Some containers may require additional rinsing (more than three rinses)
- A brush or high pressure hose may be required to clean stubborn or dried chemical residue

Department of Arriculture and Food Small Landholder Information Service



Say goodbye to summer for another year! Now it's time to start preparing for the cooler weather of autumn and winter. Weed control at this time of year is all about planning. Before the break of the season it is important that you give some thought to your winter weed control strategy. From last year's paddock records you should have a good idea of what weeds were present in the pasture and it is useful to consider what the paddock will be used for and the weed burden that may be present.

Ensure fallen any or unmarketable fruit is removed and/or destroyed to reduce pest and disease pressure and and maintain your baiting monitoring programs for Mediterranean fruit fly.

If you own livestock it is important practice good personal to hygiene when working with your animals. Some animals carry pests and diseases that can be transmitted to humans. Infectious diseases that are able to be transmitted between animals and humans are known as zoonosis. To reduce your risk of catching diseases like scabby mouth, Q fever and leptospirosis from cattle and sheep, wear gloves where possible and do not handle any stock that have lesions without gloves. Wash vour hands and clothing thoroughly after tending to your stock, keep any cuts and sores hygienically covered and wear protective equipment when medicating your stock.

If you notice unusual signs of disease in your stock or have unexpected deaths, contact your private vet, DAFWA vet or the Emergency Animal Disease hotline on 1800 675 888. Pregnancy toxaemia (twin lamb disease) and hypocalcaemia (milk fever) often affect lambing ewe flocks at this time of year and have similar signs but different causes. These diseases can be providina avoided bv adequate nutrition and minimising herding and yarding of ewes in late pregnancy.

Order soil amendments and fertiliser now so that they will be on hand to apply during winter. If you are going to employ a contractor to apply your fertiliser or soil amendments book them early as they can become booked out.

Feral animals will be at their hungriest until autumn rains bring new growth. Ensure protective fencing barriers around native tree plantings are secure and continue to exclude rabbits and other pests.

It is important if you own dogs that they are not permitted to wander your farm neighbouring or properties. Dogs can kill young or small stock, frighten larger animals and cause serious injury. Concerns about strav dogs and dog attacks on your property should be directed to your local shire ranger.

Telehealth – a brave new world of technology

The Southern Inland Health Initiative is at the forefront of modern medical technology, with a significant investment in Telehealth.

For rural and regional communities, this technology will bring a number of benefits:

- increased and reliable access to health services
- reduced time and travel costs for country patients
- better access to education, training and support opportunities for the community and for health professionals
- improved collaboration and communication between health care providers.

A new Emergency Telehealth Service piloted under SIHI is breaking new ground in delivering safe, sustainable and equitable emergency health services in the country. The ETS uses high-quality videoconferencing technology to link emergency patients in the country to specialist emergency physicians from some of the State's busiest Emergency Departments; giving country patients more equitable access to emergency care. More than 2500 patients have now been examined and treated via the Emergency Telehealth Service since it commenced in August 2012.

The use of Telehealth to link country patients to metropolitan-based specialists and allied health professionals is also increasing rapidly. More than 1500 patients have used the Ambulatory Telehealth Service for appointments and have reduced the time, expense and negative health effects of long-distance travel to visit with specialists.

What about residential aged care and dementia care?

One of the biggest challenges facing health care across the country is the ageing population.

This is true for rural communities, with statistics showing a four per cent increase in the number of residents aged 65 years and over in the southern inland catchment.

Smaller communities face many barriers in the provision of quality residential aged care and dementia care, including small populations dispersed over large distances, increased building costs and significant workforce challenges. The Southern Inland Health Initiative is investing more than \$20M to attract private providers to expand options for residential aged care and dementia care across the southern inland area. SIHI has completed market sounding to determine the level of interest in the investment opportunity and expects a contract to be in place by 2014.

SIHI is also participating in the Wheatbelt Integrated Aged Support and Care Solutions (WIASC) project, which aims to develop and implement a series of integrated solutions for aged care within the region. The WIASC is a partnership between the Wheatbelt Development Commission, 26 Wheatbelt shires and SIHI.



Warriors Wellbeing

We are not the same! Is it embedded in our masculinity?

Quite often as blokes we have been told to get in touch with our feminine side. What an affront and insult to our intelligence, over time this has been part of the language barrier that has put blokes positive approaches to wellbeing issues in reverse.

There are three parts to our health; physical, mental and social/spiritual wellbeing. The latter is where we find: our identity, our individuality, our own sense of self, our sense of belonging, our passions and interests and our emotional context (not a feminine side!)

We are the same species but putting it simply men have evolved differently than women. Our DNA is 99.6% similar but it is that 0.4% difference that we need to talk about and address, because it helps explain why blokes have a warrior attitude to life and that we seek help differently than the ladies.

There are three main areas of difference that we talk about in the work we do:

- Communication.
 - On average blokes will talk one third less than ladies per day (7000 words to 21,000 words) this starts from a young age from boys through to men. Anyone with a wife, mother, and mother in law, daughter, and partner will know this. But this is a good thing for the ladies as it helps them talk about a whole lot of issues that blokes don't.
 - \circ It is perfectly normal for blokes to talk in dot points and even just grunt!
- Risk-taking.
 - Blokes are hard wired to take risks from an early age. Some of this is linked to our brain development. The brain development stage for a lady is roughly finished between the age of 18 to 20, whereas for a bloke it is between the age of 25 to 28 (some may say 45 to 50!)
 - \circ As we get older we get wiser but are still hard wired to take risks
- Winning. (a really important part of the warrior culture)
 - $\circ~$ The majority (90%) of Aussie men think winning is important (a trait that can be traced back to our true warrior days for survival)
 - An alarming stat is that 50% of blokes think winning is all that matters. So quite often blokes don't take a backward step when it comes to finances, relationships and/or business matters.

Due to the importance blokes place on winning, explains why a loss event and/or a sense of loss becomes problematic and can be really hard to deal with.

Combine this with the lack of understanding about our emotional context and we can have a ticking time bomb.

As blokes we need to be more aware of our emotional context and that it is alright to show it. That is we all experience emotional times, so we can show it (maybe a hug or a cry) and/or to use language that is foreign to us to express our emotional context i.e. I am sad and/or I am struggling here.

Talk to a Mate!! It is beneficial and you will realise that you're not alone, it's not just you and there's a lot of other blokes feeling the same way.

We welcome all new people to town and as usual will be pleased to catch up with old friends.

Gardening has taken a back seat whilst we cope with the extremes of weather but autumn is around the corner and while we are pruning and mulching, we dream of the seed packets and seedlings.

Now is the time to cut off the flower heads of the agapanthus and as soon as it gets a bit cooler they can be separated and replanted. They are tough little citrus and can sit in a bucket of seasol until a cool day occurs. Mine have been there since I came back from Albany, and look healthy.

The only thing in the vegie garden is a surfeit of zucchini and beautiful basil. Pesto, pesto and more pesto, Such a lovely fresh condiment. Beautiful with pasta but pretty good on toast too.





Ticks are nature's dirty needles so to avoid getting sick, avoid tick bites. Avoid walking in long grass and thick low lying bush with overhanging shrubs and small trees, especially after a rainy or humid day.

Ticks wait on the leaves of shrubs and small trees with legs extended, questing for hosts. They can detect heat emission and carbon dioxide from their host and latch on to them. They prefer warm, moist environments on the body (eg behind the ears, armpit or head).

IF SYMPTOMS OCCUR

It is normal for a tick bite to remain slightly itchy for several weeks. A short course of the less sedating oral antihistamines (1-5 days) such as, desloratadine, fexofenadine, loratadine, cetirizine and levocetirizine

(e.g. Aerius, *Telfast*, *Claratyne*, Zyrtec and *Xyzal respectively*), can be taken to relieve symptoms of swelling and itchiness.

If you are highly allergic to tick bites, it is recommended you carry emergency medication such as EpiPen (an adrenaline autoinjector). Please consult with your doctor.

If other symptoms develop 3-7 days post tick bite e.g. headache, fever, malaise, muscle and joint tenderness or a bull's eye rash, **then a doctor should be consulted immediately.** Sometimes symptoms develop long after the tick bite (weeks), if this occurs it would be worthwhile mentioning the tick bite to your doctor.

Ticks secrete an anaesthetic in their saliva so you will not feel their bite or their attachment.

For tick removal

1) Aerostart Spray

This is an anti-knock and anti-corrosive starting fluid for engines (which contains benzene) and is not registered for use in humans but there is anecdotal evidence in those with serious tick allergies (possibly applied to tick on a small patch of skin created by a hole in a band aid to minimize skin contact).

2) Wart-Off Freeze and Elastoplast Cold Spray

These products have been used in a limited manner and anecdotally reported to be effective. As more experience is documented advice will be updated.

Do not squeeze, tweeze or scratch ticks to remove as this forces tick saliva into the bite site.

Healthy Body – Healthy Mind

In the coming month I will introduce a new series of articles focusing on ways to improve your knowledge in regards to food and health. The articles will cover everyday actions to make changes in your diet, take steps to introduce new ideas and what you can do to find your ideal weight without restricting your intake of nutrients. More and more people are terrible concerned about the produce on sale in shops and supermarkets. De-natured food is one of the main causes of sickness and wellbeing of the human body. Latest research has shown the fastest growing area of food is the demand for organic/biodynamic produce. This ranges from fruit and vegetables to grass-feed meat products. Many people think it is good enough to have free range products but this is a delusion, because even if poultry is running on a patch of grass and has access to fresh air, they are still fed with pellets and supplements. I am not saying all free range products are produced this way but this label is very open to misuse.

During my extended break from my earlier contribution to the Blarney, my thoughts have ripened while I am working in our organic vegetable garden or sitting in the orchard and listening to the sounds of the birds, chooks and the wind. I have received much inspiration from meditating on such things and the vibrations have turned into thoughts. I feel this year is the year of action and it is time to bring them to paper and share them with you. It also helps me to release the pressure in my head in a good way. So bear with me. This is a work in progress. I don't know the outcome yet, but I am sure it can only be good.

Here is a breakdown of the things to come.

I will focus on being raw or not, juicing, smoothies, fermented/probiotic foods such as rejuvelac, sauerkraut, fermented milk (kefir); making your own nut butter, make gluten free breads and noodles from buckwheat (which by the way is not a wheat therefore is gluten free), de-hydrating your surplus, creating lovely raw crackers and breads in your de-hydrator. I will go into the healthy fats such as coconut butter/oil, and whole unsalted old fashioned butter. Our over stressed brain cells need all these wholesome fats to fire up and keep you on top of all the so called 'new technology'.

I am going to write extensively on the so called 'Super Foods' which are mentioned almost in every magazine and publications and are supposed to be good for you. I will include many recipes for you to try.

I do not know where this will lead as this is an open progress. I can only speak for my husband and myself because we live the way I am writing for more than 15 years. I am inviting you to follow my ideas as good as you can. Never say it can't be done, you don't know where you can go without trying. I think it is very important to challenge ourselves otherwise we get easily stuck into a rut and if this happens, we stop living! To quote Jeffrey Hodges the writer of the wonderful book 'Natural Gardening in Australia' "Only those who see the invisible can reach the impossible". Why not experiment with some of the ideas and see what is happening!

This New Year might be a big challenge to all of us, however we can all try our very best to make it work for us. I wish you all much happiness and good health for a very challenging 2015.
