President Report November 2013

Beverley Council

At a special meeting of Council on Tuesday 22 October 2013 Declarations of Office were undertaken by re-elected Councillors Jim Alexander, Peter Gogol, Chris Pepper and David White along with new Councillors Tom Buckland and Don Davis before Mr Fred Bremner JP. The election of President and Deputy President occurred at the meeting with Cr Dee Ridgway re-elected as Shire President and Cr Chris Pepper re-elected as Deputy Shire President for another 2 year term, also undertaking their Declarations of Office before Mr Bremner. Council Committees and community representations will be advised prior to the end of the year.

Rail Closure

The Deputy CEO attended a meeting convened by Mia Davies MLA to discuss the Quairading – York Tier 3 rail closure. It is proposed to arrange a further meeting between various stakeholders, including CBH to further discuss the issue.

Recreation Ground Playground

Installation of a new playground at the

recreation ground is due to commence by the end of October with the aim of completion by the end of the year. The Shire was successful in receiving grant funding from Lotterywest to assist with this project.

UWA Beverley Design Studio

The UWA Beverley Design Studio Project has presented some extremely interesting perspectives regarding our town, and it's exciting that the Shire of Beverley has been able to provide the backdrop for such an important stage in the student's assessment. A copy of the work will be held by the Shire of Beverley and may be used to inform future projects. Council wishes the students well in achieving a positive outcome as their portfolios undergo final appraisal.

CMCA Caravan Rally

The Shire has received very positive feedback and many thankyou's from participants at the recent Caravan Rally held in Beverley over the September long weekend. This is the third large event to utilise the upgraded facilities at the recreation ground since August and follows the Beverley Agricultural Show and Avon Football Association Grand Final. Three very different events which have shown how versatile our new facilities can be.

Beverley Rose Show

What an amazing display of beautiful roses. Congratulations to all the clever gardeners who entered the recent annual rose show, displaying their delightful roses for the rest of us to enjoy. Thank you to the St Marys

The Beverley hospital morgue was closed in 2011 following an assessment which concluded it no longer met current occupational health and safety standards. The cost of refurbishment was not considered feasible when measured against funds required for clinical service upgrades. Since then a series of occurrences has caused a great deal of community distress. The closure issue has been raised by community members, Shire and the Local Health Advisory Group with Mia Davies MLA and WA Country Health Service. ATTENTION ALL STANDPIPE USERS

Please be advised that as of the **29 November 2013** the standpipes located at Baty's Road and Barnsley Street will be permanently locked.

As of the 1st December 2013 the standpipes located at Brooking Street and Balkuling will be operated via a Swipe Card System.

Therefore, to enable you to obtain water from either of these standpipes you will be required to come into the shire office **after the 18 November 2013** to obtain a swipe card. There will be a 'one' off payment of \$15.00 to obtain this card to enable you to be registered to use this system. (Replacement cards will also cost \$15.00).

The billing system will remain the same at the moment, ie invoices will be sent out at the beginning of the following month. Eventually we hope to go to a fully 'pre-paid' system.

How prepared are you for a bushfire?



CHECKLIST – PREPARING YOUR PROPERTY

The majority of houses can survive most bushfires with preparation and planning. There are many ways that you can improve the chance of your property surviving a bushfire even if you aren't there to defend it. Use this checklist as a guide to preparing your home.

STARVE THE FIRE

Clear around your home so that embers will have less chance to start a fire when they hit the ground. This will also help reduce the damage caused by the fire.

- Cut long grass and dense scrub.
- Regularly rake up leaf litter and twigs under trees.
- Prune lower tree branches (up to two metres off the ground) to stop a ground fire spreading into the canopy of trees.
- Remove shrubs and small trees under and between larger trees.
- Clear vegetation along the boundary of your property to create a firebreak. Make sure you meet your local government's fire break requirements.
- Keep roof gutters and valleys clear of leaves and bark.

CREATE A BUILDING PROTECTION ZONE

Within your building protection zone:

- Create a 20 metre building protection zone around your home and other buildings. This area needs to be cleared of all rubbish, long dry grass, bark and material that may catch fire.
- Create and maintain a minimum two metre gap between your house and tree branches.
- If possible, plan your garden so that your vegetable garden, lawn, pool or patio is on the side of the house likely to face a fire (where the bush is).

FILL THE GAPS

Houses usually catch fire when embers get into the roof space, a wall cavity, on to ledges or under the house. Prevent sparks from entering your house by blocking all the gaps.

- Block any gaps under floor spaces, in the roof space, under eaves, external vents, skylights, chimneys and wall cladding.
- Install a stainless steel open weave mesh cover over your evaporative air conditioner and metal fly screens on your windows.

FIX THE FIRE TRAPS

- Do not pile wood against or near the house.
- Remove any timber, rubbish and old junk lying around.
- Move all fuel containers into a shed away from your house and have a firebreak around it.
- Keep gas cylinders on the side of the house furthest away from the likely direction of a fire (where the bush is). Ensure the pressure relief valve is directed away from the house. Store gas cylinders upright and secure them with a metal chain to a secure, non-combustible post to prevent cylinders from falling over.

PROTECT YOUR ASSET

- Have a sufficient independent water supply of at least 20,000 litres and a petrol, diesel or a generator powered pump capable of pumping 400 litres per minute.
- Check that your home and contents insurance cover is adequate. Take into consideration renovations, fixtures and additions such as swimming pools, sheds, gazebos, luxury fittings or new appliances.



Building Protection Zone

- Create a minimum 20 metre building protection zone around your home and other buildings. This area needs to be cleared of all rubbish, long dry grass, bark and material that may catch fire.
- Prune lower branches (up to two metres off the ground) to stop a ground fire spreading into the canopy of the trees.
- Clear vegetation along the boundary of your property to create a firebreak. Make sure you meet your local government's firebreak requirements.
- Cut long grass and dense scrub.



- 1 Do not pile wood against or near the house
- 2 Install a fire or heat radiation shield such as a solid fence
- 3 Install a stainless steel open weave mesh cover over your evaporative air conditioner and metal fly screens on your windows and vents to keep sparks and embers out
- 4 Block any gaps under floor spaces, in the roof space, under eaves, external vents, skylights, chimneys and wall cladding
- 5 Create and maintain a minimum two metre gap between your house and tree branches
- 6 Rake up leaf litter and twigs under trees
- 7 Remove shrubs and small trees under and between larger trees
- 8 Ensure garden mulch is kept away from the house and grass is kept short
- 9 Ensure all gaps in external wall claddings are sealed
- 10 Keep roof gutters and valleys clear of leaves and bark
- 11 Keep gas cylinders on the side of the house furthest away from the likely direction of a fire (where the bush is). Ensure the pressure relief valve is directed away from the house. Store gas cylinders upright and secure them with a metal chain to a secure, non-combustible post to prevent cylinders from falling over
- 12 Block any gaps in the roof space
- 13 Hoses must be long enough to reach all parts of your house. Use metal hose fittings for taps as they are less likely to melt
- 14 Remove flammable materials and store them away from the house
- 15 Have a sufficient independent water supply of at least 20,000 litres and a petrol, diesel or a generator powered pump capable of pumping 400 litres per minute.

When you ring 000, they will ask you the relevant questions to get the ambulance to you in the quickest time possible.





BEVERLEY PARALEGAL COMMUNITY INFORMATION SERVICES - BCS

WITNESS: A qualified witness is a Justice of the Peace (JP), who can and is authorised to witness legal and other documents;

PASSPORTS: Application forms have specific regulations. The person that witnesses the photo and the application is referred to as the GUARANTOR and NOT a witness. The condition specified is that the applicant must be known to the guarantor for at least 12 months. Before applicants come to me, please check with your local post officer or the Australian Passport Information Services on 131 232. A guarantor does not have to be a JP.

PRISONER RIGHTS AND VISITATION:

I have been asked for some information, which I have obtained from former prison staff.

1. First phone the respective prison duty officer for information: Give your identity, name the reason etc. Date: (time allowed in minutes) will be allocated.
2. Visitors: Checked out by metal detectors and sniffer dogs. Only jewellery allowed to be worn a chain/cross. Other jewellery are to be placed in a provided locker and key. If the sniffer dog sits next to you or a metal detector beeps and a forbidden item is found on your person. Then you are escorted out and barred from re-entry for at least 1 or 2 years depending on the case.
3. Those who first go in, come under the supervision of a case manager. Within 3 to 4 weeks, one receives a written statement showing: custodial sentence, eligibility for parole, less good behaviour (in some cases one third off, if you do not receive this statement, then ask for one. (This is for criminal cases).

COMPENSATION CLAIMS: Unable to carry out daily functions; Legal costs - disability - fraud charges: In a recent TV case cited. A person was charged with fraud. The investigators filmed this person's every move for a number of days. The films displayed no evidence of any disability; in walking, standing, carrying heavy shopping bags and even driving a car. Court fine was \$36,500/- to cover legal and other costs. The amount of money involved was only \$3,600/- (for such a small amount, one has lost their reputation and a hefty court order).


