

# **President Report** April 2013

# Youth Forum Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> May for **Local Youth**

A Youth Forum for all local 11 - 18 year olds is to be held in Beverley on 3<sup>rd</sup> May (last Friday of the School Holidays). This exciting initiative includes entertainment opportunity for our youth to present and workshop ideas that will inform future Council decision making Youth Initiatives regarding Beverley. Information is included on page 30 in the Blarney and we look forward to participation by the vounger members of our community.

#### Avondale

A reduction sale of machinery and equipment is occurring at Avondale on 6<sup>th</sup> April.

To allay some of the concerns I have been hearing of in the community lately this sale does not include any of the Vintage Machinery Collection which the Shire became custodian of in 2009 when Avondale was transferred to the National Trust. There is also no plan nor discussion relation to relocating the Collection.

As mentioned in the March Blarney the Shire of Beverley is working to ensure the retention of Avondale as a publicly accessible facility. Further to that, the Farm Management currently involved Group overseeing the changes at Avondale have been advised by the National Trust CEO that proceeds received from the reduction sale will be available for reinvestment back into Avondale.

Tax deductible donations are also being received by the National Trust to be used specifically for urgent restoration works magnificent 1890's Clydesdale stables.

## **Annual Budgeting**

The 12/13 Budget review has recently occurred.

Staff are working on the 13/14 budget. Councils are required to develop Integrated **Planning** Documents which have been guided by local priorities. They include such the Strategic plans as Community Plan, Long Term **Financial** and Plan Asset Management Plan and are used to inform and develop the draft annual budget that Council will review in the next few months, and then endorse early in the 13/14 financial year.

Council has supported the Beverley Community Resource Centre who are proposing a Feasibility Study to their current services, review resources and facilities and to plan for future ascertain and

community requirements and expectations of the CRC.

I would like to thank Ken Kennedy for all his efforts once again and Matt Mildwaters for allowing me to operate with my heart and encouraging me to take our Pool to a new level each season.

Next year will be slightly different if the promised 30k comes from the Nationals as I will get hot water for the showers as well as other major improvements. Our 50<sup>th</sup> year was in a word, memorable. Onwards and upwards from here on and please have a safe and warm winter, see you all again next season. Brad M.

#### SHIRE OF BEVERLEY AGED CARE PLANNING

The Shire of Beverley has committed to participate in a Regional Aged Care Planning process to develop and assist in the implementation of an Integrated Wheatbelt Aged Care Plan.

The Plan will build on our existing services and infrastructure while finding methods in which our residents can age in their homes and communities for longer.

Funded through a partnership between the Wheatbelt Development Commission, the WA Country Health Service's Southern Inland Health Initiative (SIHI), and Local Government, the Wheatbelt Integrated Aged Support and Care Solution/s (WIASCS) is a proactive process which will produce Shire specific Needs Studies and an overall Wheatbelt Integrated Regional Aged Care Plan.

The Plan will look at all facets of Aged Care from Aged Friendly Communities, Aged Persons Housing, Community Care and Residential Care.

Melbourne Consultants Verso have been appointed to carry out this work and have prepared a summary of aged housing and care needs for our Shire. Verso would like to present these findings to the community to receive our thoughts and inputs, this will also provide a more accurate account of what will work and what is important to our community.

This is an invitation to all community members who access Aged Care services or have experienced the delivery of Aged Care services in our community to attend.





# BEVERLEY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

Our first formal meeting of the year was held on Monday 11 March with 9 people present (including one new member) and 3 apologies.

As is usual after a three month break there was much correspondence and many donations.

We received a paper from York written by a descendent of <u>Iohn</u> William Feeney who owned the Settler's Arms (now Dead Finish) from 1882 -1907. He was there when the infamous Hackett Murder occurred in 1884. In 1892 (presumably in response to a downturn in business caused by the coming of the railway) advertised free rides from the station to the hotel.

Family research for the Caruso family. who worked in the Dale in the 1940s, revealed they were known to local residents & contact information was made available for the Caruso family to follow We were also provided with information about charcoal burning in the Dale in 1940s from a paper written some time ago by Geoff Hutchinson. Enquires were also made about the Elliot family who had quite a large farm in the Mt Kokeby area early in the last century. A request through Beverley Tourist Information enabled the Price family from Liverpool, England to get in touch with long lost cousins in Perth.

#### Donations included:

- A copy of West Australian newspaper article March 5 1962 with photo & story of the opening of the Beverley Memorial Swimming Pool by Premier David Brand - same day he opened extensions to the Beverley JHS.
- Clippings from the Beverley Times Ç. 1967 of The Hackett Murder, prepared by H T Edwards after investigations at Perth Public Library where he had access to files of the WA Inquirer. Hymn book & psalter for use by church organists.
- A gas lighting system for ducted Ç gas lights in a home or building with tank, lamp & shade.

# **News Straight from the Broomstick!**

The two ginger kittens I mentioned a couple of months ago went down to the vets, where we learned the dark ginger was actually a female. Everyone was very excited by this information because female ginger cats are very rare especially with her vibrant and unique markings. The pale ginger is male and both have found two loving homes and are now sterilised, micro chipped and vaccinated.

Remember everyone has just over 30 weeks until the new cat laws come into effect. These include all cats being sterilised, micro chipped and registered. A female cat costs about \$200.00 to sterilise and a male around \$50.00 (will vary depending on which vet you go to) and micro chipping is about \$50.00. Personally I believe in the new cat laws and hope that over time it will reduce the number of feral cats and kittens around.

One of my recent calls was to a little female euro in Brookton who was so freaked out I had to put her on valium for 5 days. This worked a treat as she has now settled in really well inside and is starting to go outside under supervision. I named her Gretel and she is a real character who is very adventurous and is always getting into trouble, which always makes us laugh. We all hope one day she will be independent and experience life like a normal kangaroo.

On a happier note after 12 months in care our bobtail was successfully released. This bobtail was run over by a car between Brookton and Beverley at the end of February 2012. She has extensive damage to her head but an x-ray revealed no broken bones. She was also lucky enough not to have any brain damage though she had a lot of tissue and muscle damage. As soon as we got her we had to give her fluids by tube for several weeks as she was unable to eat or drink on her own. Once she was able to eat food without our assistance she improved rapidly, though still required many months of hand feeding. She stayed around for a few days but haven't seen her since, we are all hoping that she has a long and happy life back in the wild where she belongs.





# **AVONDALE REDUCTION SALE**

The National Trust took over management of Avondale Discovery Farm from the Department of Agriculture and Food in 2009 to keep it in public ownership and promote the conservation of this significant heritage place. Since then the Trust has been responsible for range of conservation and repair works to heritage buildings, the natural environment and the farm. A major planning report - The Avondale Master Plan - was prepared and numerous applications for funding to implement its recommendations have been made. While minor grants have been secured the absence of major funding has led to the current situation where the farming operation at Avondale has been leased out.

Working in partnership with the Shire of Beverley, the National Trust continues its management Avondale as a community asset, although with reduced public access in the short term.

As a consequence the opportunity has arisen to reduce the levels of farming machinery and equipment.

All proceeds from the Reduction Sale will be returned to Avondale to help ensure its long term conservation and viability.

The National Trust is fortunate to have the support of an active and dedicated group of experienced local volunteers in guiding management of Avondale and with them is looking forward to securing a more certain future for this valuable community and educational asset.

Visitors to the Reduction Sale can make donations to help fund for urgent works to the roof of the 1890s stable and National Trust membership applications will also be available at the sale.



The exhibition by past Artists-in-Residence 2007 - 2012 is now dismounted and now hanging is an exhibition by current artist-in residence Nada Murphy until the  $2^{nd}$  April, followed by works of Ruth Halbert until the end of the month.

# Artist-in-Residence

As we say goodbye to Mike Vandeleur who as always made himself so at home in Beverley and conducted a great beginners workshop for two of our up and coming talents, we see the arrival Nada Murphy who will be artist-in-residence until 2<sup>nd</sup> April, conducting a three day live-in workshop for three on 22<sup>nd</sup>/23<sup>rd</sup>/24<sup>th</sup> March Catching the Light "en plein air". Ruth Halbert will then be in residence until 30<sup>th</sup> April. Ruth is a Western Australian artist who works with textiles and installation. Textiles give a wonderful range of materials (fabrics, threads, fibres and dyes), with lots of different techniques (stitching, knitting, felting, weaving, lace, piecing, knotting...), and a fascinating cultural and historical legacy.

She utilises two main approaches for making work. The first is to use specific textile techniques to explore mathematical forms, for example to crochet hyperbolic planes which look like organic coral shapes. Depending on the materials and methods used, the resulting pieces may be eye-catching and lively, or very simple and contemplative.

The second approach is to investigate an idea, often based in a place or relating past and present, and to explore the research around the idea by dyeing, piecing and stitching cloth, or by making cloth by felting, spinning or knitting. The work that Ruth will continue to do while at Beverley will be based on my family connection with colonial Western Australia, the Wheatbelt environment and on using local materials.

Ruth is looking forward to exploring the town and surrounding countryside, as well as having a very productive time in the studio. She will be showing the resulting works-in-progress at the Beverley gallery from 25th to 28th April.





Our Interschool team has been busy preparing for the Interschool carnival being held in York on Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> March.

#### Year 7 - 10 Science

During our combined science classes on Mondays, students have been studying the science behind soft drink. We started the term by looking at the ingredients that make up soft drinks, and how they contribute to the properties of soft drinks. The temperature of the liquid




- The flavour and variety of confectionery

# View from the Shed Who We Are and What We Do

The Regional Men's Health program has been operating now for nearly four years, and although it is reasonably well known I am often asked "what is this program about"?

Primarily we do three things: -

- 1. Community education presentations;
- 2. Fast Track Pit Stops; and
- 3. Advocacy Work.

It is about holistic wellbeing, which means the whole person. When we consider the complexity of the individual we are more than physical and mental, the often neglected element, the important requirement to know and understand, is our inner self, or as we say our "social and spiritual" needs. Sadly most people connect spiritual with religion, but the truth is we all need to understand our "spirit."

To be happy and healthy there is also a need to consider a range of social determinants or issues that contribute to our wellbeing. If we worry excessively about world events, or have to deal with economic or other issues beyond our control, this can lead to conflict in our domestic life, all these things contribute to developing symptoms of illnesses, both physical and mental

We try to help individuals and communities to understand some of the consequences of these "social determinants" on their lives and take steps to protect themselves from the consequences of the things they are going through. Men in particular struggle because they think they are failing, rather than realising they are battling issues beyond their making or control. Men like to be in control of their situation, and when they are not they are vulnerable to making bad decisions.

Because we believe local people know what works best in their area, we do not organise events but we do go to community events when we are invited. We can provide community education sessions on a wide variety of topics which include general men's health and wellbeing tips (both physical and mental), communication styles and farm progression.

We try to connect people to appropriate services that can assist people deal with their underlying concerns. Often services are available but men in particular resist seeking help. Our underlying motto is "... before it all gets too much ... Talk To A Mate". Our mates can be in all sorts of places so seek them out as a problem shared is usually a problem halved. 

Hello All,

There have been a number of complaints with regards to a small handful of motor bikes riding around on Railway Street, Forrest Street, Lukin Street and Bartram Street. Unregistered vehicles are not permitted to be on the road under any circumstances. The road on Railway Street is partially gravelled; it is still a road and therefore if you are caught riding you will be summonsed to appear in court. I understand that there are a couple of you that are not necessarily behaving recklessly, however it is disturbing others and so therefore it is an issue that police will now act upon.

With Easter upon us and also school holidays coming up it is timely to give you some Crime Prevention Advise.

#### Tips when leaving your home:

- 1. At night, leave inside lights on which would normally be on if you were at home;
- 2. Consider using electronic timing devices that turn the TV, radio or lights on and off at selected times;
- 3. Keep doors and windows locked at all times and activate alarm systems when leaving your home;
- 4. Consider installing movement-activated external lighting; and
- 5. Make windows more secure by fitting locks, security screens or external roller shutters.

#### Tips when leaving you vehicle:

- Always lock your vehicle
- Never leave keys in the ignition even when filling up with petrol or popping into the shop
- Ensure windows including sunroofs are closed

If you leave cash, GPS units, CD's, bank cards, handbags, laptop computers, cash, and mobile telephones in your vehicle you increase the risk of your vehicle being targeted by an offender. Remove valuable items from your vehicle to avoid being a victim of crime.

Remember that preventing crime is everyone's business, by taking a few simple precautions you can make life harder for criminals and protect yourself, your belongings and your home.

Telephone and email scams are becoming more of an occurrence and you need to be vigilant about giving your personal details to people. Giving you credit card details or bank details to organisations over the phone or by email may see you become victim of these scams. My advice to you is to be wary of anyone asking for these details. Confirm the details of the person you are dealing with. This may mean ringing the company they say their phone and confirming their details. If you have any concerns regarding these scams, contact Consumer Protection on 1300 30 40 54.

Just remember that if it is too good to be true. Then it probably is.

# **HOME AND COMMUNITY CARE (HACC)**

#### **About HACC**

The HACC Service is part of the Beverley Health Service Multi Purpose Service (MPS), in which the Commonwealth funding for residential aged care, HACC and State health care funding have been combined with the aim of providing flexible health services to meet the health needs of the local community.

While there are HACC Program Guidelines, an MPS HACC Service has the ability to be more flexible in the way that it provides services to the community.

#### **Access to Services**

The HACC target population comprises of persons living in the community who, in the absence of basic maintenance and support services, are at risk of premature or inappropriate long-term residential care, including:

- (i) older and frail persons, with moderate, severe or profound disabilities;
- (ii) younger persons with moderate, severe or profound disabilities; and
- (iii) their carers.

Referrals for HACC Services can be made by anyone in the community on behalf of a potential client.

Ladies Day Tuesdays 10.00am – 2.30pm Mens Day Wednesday 10.00am – 2.30pm

Held at the St John Ambulance building in John Street, Beverley.

Eligible clients can either arrange their own transport to and from the DC or can request to be picked up and returned home, in our coaster bus.

Meet for morning tea and social interaction.

Lunch is also provided by the MPS kitchen and served at the DC.

Various activities are organised for the day.

Once a month, a day trip is organised which may be a trip to Perth or another country town to a special function or for sightseeing.

In the coming months we will be programming guest speakers, demonstrations, movies, visits to local attractions in Beverley and neighbouring towns, picnic lunches or lunch at a local café.







In the mining and other sectors Warren Mundine the chairperson for "Generation One" stated on ABC Radio 20 March 2013 – he has spoken to Mining Companies and the joint goal is to employ and train around 40,000 Indigenous persons in this Industry.

He is also seeking support from the Federal Government to fund job training programmes. Once these workers are skilled, this may reduce the Overseas workers coming in on a 457 Visa (Permit to work or operate a business in a special field of skilled work).

The main objective of "Generation One", which was founded three years ago, is to negotiate with Employees and Governments to train, employ and generate jobs.

#### Job Experience:

The general opinion from many seeking work — Indigenous or non-Indigenous — is that the first question that employers ask is "What experience have you got and/or have had". How can one get experience or training on the job, when you are not given a job. Every school leaver faces this problem. Unless job training/apprenticeship programmes are funded and subsidised by various Governments the plight of school leavers and the unemployed in our society will not change.

This month, April, we are touching on matters that are very close to a broad range of community members:

# Wills, Enduring Power of Attorneys and Estate Matters:

1. Some proven facts — for private individuals to execute a Testor's Will is not a simple matter. The legal role of the executor is quite complex, apart from the time spent, the family and legal issues has often left most in a very stressful and traumatic state. The last 18 years or so many have taken on these tasks not realising the full extent of managing a deceased estate and have therefore approached me to help out. Over the years this has been happening more often, in spite of estates being managed by Trustees and Lawyers.

Some months ago, at the RSL Hall, a lawyer from Northam offered some advice on these matters:

- The Testator should make sure that the will is drawn up correctly and covers all legal aspects of his/her wishes
- If relatives are put in as the Executors, to ensure their capability.
- 2. EPA The Donor authorises the Donee to act as their attorney. As circumstances change, not all Enduring Power of Attorneys should be

The Authority usually kicks in when the Donor no longer has the ability to manage his/her own affairs.

The advice given is that Wills and EPA's should be monitored from time to time with a view of updating the Testators or the Donor's choices and wishes.

These days almost every Department or another are seeking identity checks to be witnessed by a 'qualified' person and the requirement includes all Land transfers (Landgate) transactions. Therefore, in my line of work I do have first hand experience relating to the witnessing of 'ID' documents.

From my role and experience in community issues, we are all living in a Legalistic era. Everyone including family members all seem very keen on arguing their case in a Court Room. As a Sitting Justice for some 10 years in a Beverley Court, the last thing I would want for myself or others is to be facing a Magistrate in Court. I suppose one could truly say that times have really changed.

We often see cases being drawn out on TV – there is always that 'someone' else who is to blame.

#### Law, Order, Justice – update:

Many are confused as to what this is all about and who makes the laws:

- 1. The Police are the Law **Enforcers**
- The Courts only administer, interpret the laws and their intentions.
- The Parliament drafts and makes the laws and put into legislation

What I am trying to say is that the police and the Courts do not make the law. Therefore, in future when someone loses a court case try to understand the roles of the Police and the Courts.

#### VISA'S

TV reports show that Spouse/Fiancé Visa costs will double in May 2013 to around \$4,400.00 – and conditional and are on a time limit.

Visas 457 for Business Mining, Fruit pickers, Health, Hospitality, etc. –

(changes – fees not disclosed). All visas are conditional – e.g. No Government benefits for 10 years – no medical cover

Tourist Visas – not permitted to work. Those who break the condition may be deported as soon as possible.

Those who have had experience in sponsoring and visas costs tell me that to sponsor a future partner or one's extended family the expense could go to well over \$10,000.00 per annum. There are cases where the partner wants to return overseas as they are facing serious financial problems in Australia. This creates serious problems with immigrants from other countries. You come into Australia on one name and arrive back overseas with a married name, holding a foreign passport and being a foreigner in your own country, confused – so am I.

#### **SPONSORSHIP**

It is a very serious business when sponsoring anyone from abroad, as it carries strong legal and monetary responsibilities, the following needs to be taken into account and considered:

- Medical Bills
- Groceries
- Housing
- Insurance
- Visa Fees

I have been told that it could work out to just under \$15,000.00 for the  $1^{st}$  year.

A word of advice from those who have been there and done that KEEP ACCURATE RECORDS AND THINK CAREFULLY BEFORE COMMITTING YOURSELF TO OVERSEAS SPONSORSHIP

# Do you have any remnant vegetation that you want to protect or extend? Do you want to connect any fragmented native vegetation in your landscape?

NEWROC, SEAVROC & WEROC are seeking expressions of interest from land managers across the WA Wheatbelt wanting to expand native habitats on their properties through a coordinated revegetation, fencing and baiting project using biodiverse plantings of local species. 





> There was a total of 14 teams The end results are:


