Shire Presidents Report July 2012

Structural Reform

Rate payers and residents should have by now received an information letter from the Shire President giving a brief description on the structural reform process being investigated by the Beverley Council and fellow South East Avon Regional Transition Group members. If you didn't receive a copy and would like one please contact the Shire.

The "securing our future" website www.securingourfuture.com.au provides further regularly updated information, a frequently asked question section and allows for questions to be submitted. The free to use government access computer at the Community Resource Centre can be used to view this website, as can the seniors computers. Council has also requested a printed copy of website content to be made available in the town library.

Recent meetings of the SEARTG board have covered the topics of Rating Strategy, Operational Costs -Current vs Future State and Place Management plans for each of the towns. As mentioned in the June

Blarney a decision regarding amalgamation has been deferred until the end of August to allow time for completion of the Business Plan -Future State, Service Delivery Plans and community information sharing. It is hoped there will be a community workshop within the next month, the date yet to be confirmed will be advised in the weekly Beverley Bulletin. (Contact the Community Resource Centre if you would like to receive the BB by email).

Dawson St Villas

Beverley had its own "backyard blitz" thanks to the Shire's Garden Crew who created a new garden for the villas just in time for open day!

There was a great deal of interest amongst approximately 80 visitors who took advantage of looking through stage one of the Dawson St villas on Friday 15th June. Councillors Pepper, White, Murray, Foster and Ridgway were in attendance to take on feedback and comments.

Council's preference is for these units to be taken up by someone locally, however will market them more widely at the end of July if needed. It is planned for another 6 villas to be built on the lot following sale and occupancy of the first two and expressions of interest in the project and Lease for Life conditions can be obtained from the Shire office in Vincent Street or by calling 9646 1200.

National General Assembly of Local Government

In June the CEO and I attended the National General Assembly of Local Government in Canberra. Over 90 of the 800 delegates were from Western Australia, with the Wheatbelt well represented. Interaction amongst councils, both from WA and interstate was evident, and included several of the Councils visited during our recent deputation to the South Australian amalgamated local governments. Whilst the conference itself involved much "political and bureaucratic" speak, RTG representatives also had an array of meetings which included Senators Mathias Corman and Barnaby Joyce and representatives from NBN, Energy Efficiency and Climate Change and Simon Crean's office. The clarity provided by these one on one meetings was worth the effort from our end, and our delegation involving the 5 SEARTG councils coming together for joint meetings and common topics was noted favourably on several occasions.

Recreation Project Tenders

Tenders for the town oval Recreation building project close on 28th June. Following an evaluation process the tender will be awarded and Council is anticipating works to commence toward the end of August.

Kerbside Recycling Service

Various options are being investigated for provision of a fortnightly household recycling collection service in Beverley. The current landfill site has a limited lifespan and the inclusion of this service, whilst arguably environmentally responsible, also has the potential to extend the life of our pit. Council will be aiming for this service to be provided at a modest cost for householders with details yet to be confirmed. Based on experience elsewhere, waste disposal when the current landfill site fills will come at a much greater cost to householders.

Beverley Clydesdale and Vintage Day at Avondale

What a fabulous day for the many (many!) visitors in attendance at Avondale. Congratulations to the Avondale Farm Project Association and their band of volunteers for a very successful event.

GOOD YEAR

As a resident of Beverley I am concerned with the Minister for Local Governments wish to amalgamate Local Government Authorities.

I support the process undertaken by the Shires of Beverley Quairading Cunderdin Tammin and York in the development of a Regional Business Plan under the joint name known as the South East Avon Regional Transition Group.

The findings of such a comprehensive report will, in a number ways be of individual benefit to the Shires involved and improve regional cooperation.

Having read the Current State document relating to the plan, I firmly believe that any advantages emanating from a formal amalgamation of Shires, would be far out weighed by the potential negative effects the creation of such a large and diverse area governed under one Authority may have on the future of the district of Beverley and its residents.

My three main concerns requiring a definitive answer from both the Council and the Minister are.

- 1 Will the residents of Beverley be disadvantaged in any way in the short or long term as a result of amalgamation?
- 2 Will the current level and types of services the people of Beverley now enjoy, be maintained within the district under the proposed arrangement and what services might go elsewhere?
- 3 How will the people of Beverley be guaranteed of rates stability and a fair share of regional money and representation into the future?

I strongly urge residents who are concerned with regards to Beverley being part of a greater amalgamated group of Shires, to ask your Councillors in your Ward where they stand on the issue and write to the Council informing it of your opinion as well as asking any questions you have. I strongly urge residents to be well informed so that the Council knows your views before voting.

I also strongly urge residents to request the Council to conduct a poll, at the appropriate time, so as to give each of us the opportunity to voice our opinion and advise the Minister as to whether or not we wish to be amalgamated with another Shire or not.

Such a poll would require at least 50% of the population to vote against amalgamation for the result to have any bearing on the Ministers decision.

YOUTH REPORT JUNE 2012


By the time you read this report I have been travelling through Kuala Lumpur, Cambodia and on my way to see my brother in Thailand - oh well someone has to do it!

Air race helps local pilot raise funds for RFDS

Local Beverley farmer, pilot and father of four, Alan Sattler is fulfilling his dream of travelling Australia and in doing so, is helping to raise much needed funds for the Royal Flying Doctors Service.

The Worley Parsons Outback Air Race 2012 will be held from 27 August to 8 September, and Alan has nominated his one man team [Team 17 'Atom'] to join in this important fund raising initiative.

Alan, a keen flying enthusiast has been flying since 2005 and after building his very first aircraft, has amassed over 400 flying hours. What started out as a hobby has turned into a passion for this busy farmer, and Alan is excited to see more of the country from the air in his Vans RV6 aircraft during his first participation in the race.

The competition is a GPS based navigations time trial throughout the remote outback of Australia and with team names like 'Biggles and Bertie', 'the Bald Eagles' and 'the Two Flying Willies' the competition sounds like a lot of fun. The race starts off in the South Australian coastal town of Ceduna, landing and staying in towns such as Innamincka, Longreach, Cloncurry and Mataranka along the way, with planes touching down for the finish of the competition and the Racer's Party in Darwin. The race rules state 'Flying Safely – Fun – Frivolity – and Fundraising' are the name of the game. The race distance is over 2,000kms.

The Outback Air Race began in 1996 and since that time, competitors and spectators have raised over \$1.2 million for the RFDS. These much needed funds go towards outfitting RFDS aircraft with essential medical equipment and enable the RFDS to help



save lives and to continue its vital service in transporting and treating critically ill patients who require urgent medical assistance in regional and remote Australia.

Alan will be joined by other Western Australian pilots, and in particular a team of Wagin farmers with team name 'The Flying Cockies'. Each team will be raising funds and you can help. PREPARING FOR STORM SEASON

STORMS MAY BRING HEAVY RAIN, DAMAGING WINDS, LIGHTNING, HAIL, FLOODS AND TORNADOS TO THE SOUTHERN HALF OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA BETWEEN MAY AND OCTOBER EACH YEAR. HOWEVER STORMS CAN OCCUR DURING THE WARMER MONTHS SO IT IS IMPORTANT TO STAY PREPARED ALL YEAR. HERE ARE SOME SIMPLE STEPS YOU CAN TAKE TO MINIMISE THE RISK FROM STORMS TO YOU AND YOUR PROPERTY

PREPARE - HOW TO PREPARE

Preparing your family and home for a storm is your responsibility.

- Check your roof and gutters for damage or loose material
- Clear gutters and downpipes of leaves and blockages
- Trim branches near your home and hire a contractor to clear trees from powerlines
- Clear rubbish from your yard or patio and put away any loose objects
- Prepare an emergency kit with portable radio, torch, spare batteries, first aid kit and family emergency plan
- Ensure your family understand storms and the risks
- Prepare an emergency plan including a relocation plan in case your home becomes flooded.
 Consider what you will do with your pet

DURING A STORM -

- Close your curtains and blinds and stay inside away from windows
- If caught outside find safe shelter away from trees, powerlines, metal objects, storm water drains, rivers and streams
- If there is lightning, unplug electrical appliances and do not use landline telephones
- If there is flooding you can create your own sandbags by using plastic bags or pillow cases filled with sand
- If driving in heavy rain take care on the roads:
 - Slow down, turn your lights on and keep a safe distance from other drivers
 - If you cannot see, pull over and park with your hazard lights on until the rain clears
 - Do not drive into water of unknown depth and current

AFTER A STORM -

- Assess your home and property for damage
- Check on friends and neighbours to see if they need help
- · Keep children away from flooded rivers, streams and waterways
- . Keep away from fallen powerlines as they are dangerous and should always be treated as live
- · Be careful of fallen trees and damaged buildings
- If driving slow down, keep a safe distance from other drivers and take care in areas that have been flooded
- Do not drive into water of unknown depth
- Avoid gravel roads as surfaces will be slippery and muddy, and vehicles could become bogged



National Farm Safety Week (16th – 21st July 2012)

2012 National Farm Safety Week aims to raise awareness of farm safety issues in rural communities across Australia.

This years' National Farm Safety Week theme is "Farm Safety - Fix it for Everyone".

This theme continues to highlight the importance of business and industry working together to achieve the Farmsafe mission/vision statement of improving the well-being of Australian farmers through improved attention to health and safety.

Farm Safety Week has been running successfully for the past 15 years and provides a national focus on farm safety.



There has been a significant reduction in farm fatalities over the last 20 years from a yearly average of 146 deaths to approximately 60 in 2011 (subject to final verification based on coronial data).

In 2011, quad bikes eclispsed tractors by a ratio of almost 2:1 as the leading cause of non-intentional farm injury death. Of the 23 quad bike related fatalities identified through the media, 18 occured on farms. Already in 2012 (May), there have been eight quad bike related fatalities, two of which were to children aged 5 and 9 years.



Beverley Naturalists Club

With all the recent storms around the place I started to think about how our wildlife copes with these severe weather events which seems to be more frequent than before, I realised they don't always fair well and sometimes need our help.

Have you ever wondered about these beautiful big old habitat trees that go down in storms and how many species of wildlife calls it their home. These big 100 year old trees are like a multi story apartment building with wildlife in all levels of the building. Some of the species affected are possums, ducks, bats, reptiles, cockies including the endangered Carnaby's black cocky and many other species of birds. When these birds, reptiles and animals lose their homes they are vulnerable to predators such as foxes and cats and exposure to the elements just like we are if we lose our homes. Like us they need help to get their lives back together because there are a limited amount of suitable trees available to these animals so they can't just simply move to another tree.



How can we help?

By putting nesting boxes up near where the big trees go down will ensure they always have a place to sleep in their own territory.

If you are going to remove trees try to save the habitat trees because planting a tree to replace it will take at least 100 years to grow into another habitat tree.

If any wildlife is injured called a wildlife carer for help and advice. If you don't know any wildlife carers you can call the Wildlife hotline on 94749055 and they will put you in contact with people who can help in

Any fallen timber from trees if possible should be left on the ground as this is habitat and protection for some species of wildlife like the Bush stoned curlew.

Plant of the month

I have chosen the very fascinating and beautiful Wandoo wattle (acacia lasiocarpa v sedifolia). It gets its common name by the location of where it grows which is under wandoo trees, it is also classified as an understory wattle. It is a widely distributed through the South west WA from Kalbarri to Esperance and grows in many different soil types. It is a shrub that grows to a maximum height of 1.5 metres but is usually smaller around Beverley. It will grow quite well in part shade where it is hard to grow some other plants. This beautiful wattle would make a great edition to any garden around Beverley with its lovely flowers, drought tolerance and its small spikes to help protect that area of your garden from unwanted visitors. When it is young it will need to be protected from the frost but when it is older it becomes able to handle the frost.

Wildlife Stories straight off the broomstick!

On the 29th of May I received several distressing phone calls regarding an injured kangaroo on the Dale Kokeby Rd. Sally and Erica gave up some of their morning to assist in the search for the roo. Once we located her I sedated her to assess her injuries. which unfortunately she would not have been able to recover from. her Sadly only option was euthanasia. I then checked her pouch which had a little female joey within, which thankfully was viable (any joey over 200gms is considered viable with a struggle) since she weighed in at 345gms. Her eyes were still closed and her ears were only just starting to lift from her head. For the past few weeks she has been staying in my humidicrib and is 4 hourly feeds and continuing to gain weight. Her eyes are now open and her ears are nearly fully erect. This little joey which is now named Erica will be in the humidicrib for the next few months (until she can maintain her own body temperature) but will continue to be bottle fed for at least another 14 months.

Thanks to all the people who took the time to call and try and get help for this mother and her baby.

A special thank you to Sally and Erica who sacrificed their time and help us locate her.

Lastly a thanks to the people who have enquired about the welfare of this little joey.







Community Tree Planting Program 2012

By Colin Cable, President.

Well it's on again with more tree planting in the York and Talbot Brook areas.

The Talbot brook Land Management Association will be involved in two tree planting projects in 2012. The first site will involve a 12ha of water logged and degraded site, and will be planted out with 20.000 native seedling stems through funding from Lottery West on the 28th July 2012. This area is the upper reach of a small tributary, which flows into the Talbot Brook and then into the Dale River systems, which has an impact on the Avon, and Swan Rivers.

The second site is a degraded tributary of the Boyanning Creek which restoration and tree planting has been carried out in previous years. This site will be an educational experience for High School students to understand the environmental value of bushland rehabilitation in the wheatbelt – from increasing biodiversity to reversing salinisation to nutrient loads to erosion prevention. The Talbot Brook Land Management Association has formed a partnership with HotRock, a not-for-profit organisation that works with high schools to develop engaging sustainability education projects (http://www.thehotrock.org.au). HotRock's 'Seed 2 Tree' program invovles high schools propagating and planting native seedlings that are endemic to the area of the Wheat belt. Their 15,000 seedlings will be planted on this site by the school groups on three separate occasions. The first group will plant their seedlings on the 31st July to 1st August and they are students from Australind SHS and Manea Senior College. Planting on the 6th and 7th August will involve Comet Bay College and Maranatha College students. The final group will plant on 9th and 10th August and involve students from John Wallaston Anglican School and Perth Waldorf School.

These groups will comprise of 60 students per group camping at the Talbot Hall on the above dates. This will be an educational learning activity as well as a hands-on planting of their own propagated seedlings, which were grown at their schools. The students will be able to experience working at a site that was planted last year, view the growth of one year old trees, and then follow the progress of their seedlings over the coming year.

In future the Talbot brook Land management Association, as part of a partnership with HotRock will provide technical advice and support on native vegetation species for different soil types and also support future funding proposals for the propagating equipment for High Schools involved in this program. We hope to promote further schools in the Wheat belt to take up this opportunity to actively propagate their own seedlings to plant in their own environments.

The Talbot Brook Land Management Association has been actively engaged in major tree planting programs since 1993 and worked in partnerships with the Department of Water Northam, the Wheat belt NRM and the Swan River Trust. Our Association has won The State Bush, Land, and Waterways Award 2009. The Water Rats, and Living Streams State and Territory Award 2011. Semi Finalist Land Corp Environmental Sustainability Award 2009.

Our Community tree-planting program will be held on the 28th July 2012, meeting at the Talbot Hall on Talbot Hall Road via York at 8.30am and traveling to the planting site in convoy. Morning tea and Lunch will be provided also a social evening that night with a BBQ supper. Bring your own drinks.

We are always looking for environmentally minded volunteers to join our Association and to help with our tree planting programs.





BEVERLEY PARALEGAL COMMUNITY AND REFERRAL SERVICES (BCS)

AGED CARE: Our May Publications (Blarney) has received some noteworthy comments of praise and appreciation from: some in Beverley, York and Quairading. In each instance, they have one of their family members/loved one who are currently residing in Age Care Nursing Residences. Frequently asked questions relate to:

- How much does one have to p a y t o g e t i n t o Residential Care?
- Do you have to pay more for High Care residents? And if so, Why?
- What happens to the bond/ accommodation charges?
- Who gets the pension?

As the publication indicated, all these matters are complex, seek info from any Age or Commonwealth body. It is not uncommon for me to hear of sad cases, where a family member goes to visit a loved one in an Aged Care Residence; only to find that one day this loved one has No recollection of who you are. These are some of the tragic examples that we may all have to face; some to a lesser degree than others and yet others are blessed with a good memory during their twilight years.

OLD AGE has a habit of touching on each and every family; be it in Oz or Global. Having quoted a fact of life; is it too much to ask of one to spare a kind thought for the Elderly, even though some are frail, not as Communicative, fit or not so fit, each and everyone has their own dignity and they all deserve love, respect and support from their families and the general community.

HOMELESSNESS/HOUSING SHORTAGE: Some Radio National reports; There are over 100,000 homeless people in Australia.

At any given time in one day there are 15,000 homeless who sleep rough. To highlight their plight on the 21st of June, Vinnies organised 1,000 CEO's around Australia will sleep outdoors at night in card board boxes, newspapers and sleeping bags including the Federal Minister O'Connor who; will sleep outside the Canberra Art Gallery. Beverley is not immune to this problem, as a person can be a statistic in an instant

due to no fault of their own, for example: domestic disputes, disputes where a mother and 4 small children are forced out of their home, at times only with the clothes on their back with no money and no ID It is said that single mothers and children are among the majority of this homeless figure. According to Mrs Judi Moylan. "there are 90% of single parents who are living below the poverty line." How can this be, one may ask. The average rent per week in Perth is now officially \$600 p/week, many who pay such high rent fall into this category, some single parents become homeless, sleep in cars, parks, on the floor in friends and families lounge rooms etc. This is True to Life Reality. I have touched on this topic, as in my brief, from time to time I have had to deal with similar cases in real life, it saddens me to reflect back, what makes it more tragic, when there are sick children, who have had to leave their medications behind e.g. Asthma sufferers and their puffers.

SICK CHILDREN: Once again in my line of work, I have been approached by young single parents, to offer some support and assistance, which I offer, in the form of referrals to various organisations etc.

On a personal level I support Children's Organisations that mainly cater for the sick, such as: Starlight foundation & Save Our Children Foundation. Their records indicate that every ONE minute of each hour and every day one sick child is hospitalised. i.e. 1,440 sick children each day are hospitalised in Australia.

CENTRELINK RECEPIENTS: I am led to believe as from July 1, single parents will no longer be entitled to benefits once their child reaches the a g e o f e i g h t (8). If you are travelling overseas, it is advisable to inform the authorities about your trip, failing which your benefits maybe stopped; if it was later found that you did not comply with the Social Security Act.

FORE CLOSURES: Avoid this by keeping payments up to date and negotiate when you are financially strapped.

BEVERLEY POLICE: Many Thanks to Officers sgt Darrell and Snr Constable Kerry for their prompt assistance on Firearms Applications. It can be honestly said, from the voices that I speak for, these two

In June, our delegates attended a meeting at the Amenities Building coordinated by 'South West Aboriginal Land and Sea Council'.

HEALTH: 90% of children in some Indigenous settlements have serious Hearing Impairments. (R.N. Radio reports)

In closing, final observations on Native Title and Reconciliation-as time progresses, there appears to be more and more support from all quarters to reach mutual resolutions as early as possible. Never the Less; there is still a long way to go before any mutual negotiations can be satisfactory between the First Peoples and other bodies.




