Shire President's Report November 2012

Recreation Building

The building works at the recreation ground have commenced at a great pace.

The Shire has been fortunate to secure the services of Badge Construction to undertake this project following advice that Briklay were not in a position to do so. Since the formalities have been completed with Badge, things have moved quickly. This has included a day of community input to cart sand for the site. Thank you to all involved for your equipment and labour to condense such a mammoth task.

Council is still working with the Department of Regional Development & Lands and the WA Planning Commission to rectify historical zoning and cross boundary issues at the oval. Discussions and negotiations also continue with Western Power and the Department of Water to ensure utilities are adequate for the site.

Vincent St Revitalisation Project

Thankyou for the feedback and ideas submitted in relation to proposed planning for Vincent Street (Hunt Road to River Park). A response sheet was included with the rates notices which can still be submitted to the Shire office during November. This is a very early phase of a long term project and there will be future opportunities for input and public consultation.

Local Planning Strategy

The draft Local Planning Strategy is available for public viewing, details in this Blarney. Your feedback is welcomed by Council and we appreciate there are many in our community who provided input toward the development of this document.

WA Local Government Grants Commission

Members of the Grants Commission recently visited Beverley, providing an overview of the methodology used in determining Financial Assistance Grants (FAG's) to Local Governments and what funding Beverley can expect from the process. These funds are received annually from the Federal Government and consist of General Purpose Grants toward operational expenditure and Road Grants for maintenance and reconstruction costs. They are an important component of most rural Local Government budgets.

In order to protect this direct federal funding for community services and infrastructure, the Australian Local Government Association (ALGA) is seeking financial recognition of Local Government in the Australian Constitution via a referendum at the next Federal Election. In the lead up to the Election there will be more information regarding this.

Central Country Zone

The Shire of Beverley recently hosted a successful regional golfing event for representatives and sponsors of the Central Country Zone of Local Governments.

Disappointment

It is a great disappointment to see that some of the newly planted lavenders in the garden bed along the path near the Shire Office have been removed. The garden staff work hard on behalf of the community, to keep the town gardens looking attractive and are often complimented on the garden maintenance around the town centre and Caravan Park. If anyone has any information regarding the theft of these plants, please let the Shire know.

Draft Shires of Beverley and Brookton Local Planning Strategy

The Shire is pleased to advise that the draft Local Planning Strategy is now open for comment until 31st January 2013. The Strategy will set out future directions for planning, development and land use in the Shire for the next 10 - 15 years.

We live in a wonderful part of the world and there is a need to keep our community special. We also need to consider important decisions about the future direction of

our community. This includes whether or not to promote new development, where people should live, creating job opportunities and considering how we look after the environment.

In response to the above, some of the important proposals in the draft Strategy include:

- Planning for the growth of the Beverley townsite. Along with supporting additional subdivision in the Beverley townsite, the Strategy allocates generous new areas for residential development to cater for a wide range of lot sizes and housing;
- Identification of considerable rural living land (called Rural Residential and Rural Smallholdings) of between 1 40 hectares near the Beverley townsite;
- Expanding the industrial area and supporting a resilient local economy;
- Support for appropriate development in the "noisy activity precinct" south to south-east of town. This includes supporting the retention of the Beverley Airfield and the development of motorsports and associated uses:
- Supporting tourism uses on the old race course site;
- Limiting the creation of additional lots in rural areas, however supporting boundary adjustments and farm rationalisation;
- Seeking servicing and infrastructure improvements from State Government agencies; and
- Conserving the district's heritage and its landscape qualities.

Many community members provided the Shire with preliminary comments in late 2010 and early 2011. I trust the draft Strategy builds on these comments. I urge everyone to familiarise themselves with the Strategy which can be viewed at either www.beverley.wa.gov.au, the Shire Administration Office and the Community Resource Centre.





Flora Survey in the Avondale Reserve

The WA Wildflower Society carried out a flora survey in the Avondale Reserve for four days early in October. They

have recorded the species in several quadrants (similar to those surveyed in 1980) and have taken the species back to the Perth Herbarium to confirm the identification. This will take place 31 Oct 2012. A report will follow. Several comments were made with regards to the good condition of this example of Wheatbelt granite outcrop habitat.



How prepared are you for a bushfire?



CHECKLIST – PREPARING YOUR PROPERTY

The majority of houses can survive most bushfires with preparation and planning. There are many ways that you can improve the chance of your property surviving a bushfire even if you aren't there to defend it. Use this checklist as a guide to preparing your home.

STARVE THE FIRE

Clear around your home so that embers will have less chance to start a fire when they hit the ground. This will also help reduce the damage caused by the fire.

- Cut long grass and dense scrub.
- Regularly rake up leaf litter and twigs under trees.
- Prune lower tree branches (up to two metres off the ground) to stop a ground fire spreading into the canopy of trees.
- Remove shrubs and small trees under and between larger trees.
- Clear vegetation along the boundary of your property to create a firebreak. Make sure you meet your local government's fire break requirements.
- Keep roof gutters and valleys clear of leaves and bark.

MAKE A SAFETY ZONE

Within the safety zone:

- Create a 20 metre circle of safety around your home and other buildings. This area needs to be cleared of all rubbish, long dry grass, bark and material that may catch fire.
- ☐ Create and maintain a minimum two metre gap between your house and tree branches.
- If possible, plan your garden so that your vegetable garden, lawn, pool or patio is on the side of the house likely to face a fire (where the bush is).

FILL THE GAPS

Houses usually catch fire when embers get into the roof space, a wall cavity, on to ledges or under the house. Prevent sparks from entering your house by blocking all the gaps.

- Block any gaps under floor spaces, in the roof space, under eaves, external vents, skylights, chimneys and wall cladding.
- Place metal fly wire mesh on all windows, vents and evaporative air conditioners to keep sparks and embers out.

FIX THE FIRE TRAPS

- ☐ Do not pile wood against or near the house.
- Remove any timber, rubbish and old junk lying around.
- ☐ Move all fuel containers into a shed away from your house and have a firebreak around it.
- Keep gas cylinders on the side of the house furthest away from the likely direction of a fire (where the bush is). Ensure the pressure relief valve is directed away from the house. Store gas cylinders upright and secure them with a metal chain to a secure, non-combustible post to prevent cylinders from falling over.

PROTECT YOUR ASSET

- ☐ Have a sufficient independent water supply of at least 20,000 litres and a petrol, diesel or a generator powered pump capable of pumping 400 litres per minute.
- Check that your home and contents insurance cover is adequate. Take into consideration renovations, fixtures and additions such as swimming pools, sheds, gazebos, luxury fittings or new appliances.



CIRCLE of SAFETY

- Create a 20 metre circle of safety around your home and other buildings. This area needs to be cleared of all rubbish, long dry grass, bark and material that may catch fire.

- **1.** Do not pile wood against or near the house
- 2. Install a fire or heat radiation shield such as a solid fence
- 3. Place metal fly wire mesh on all windows or vents to keep sparks
- 4. Block any gaps under floor spaces, in the roof space, under eaves, external vents, skylights, evaporative air conditioners, chimneys and wall cladding
- 5. Create and maintain a minimum two metre gap between your house and tree branches
- 6. Rake up leaf litter and twigs under trees
- **7.** Remove shrubs and small trees under and between larger trees
- **8.** Ensure garden mulch is kept away from the house and grass is

- 9. Ensure all gaps in external wall claddings are sealed
- 10. Keep roof gutters and valleys clear of leaves and bark
- 11. Keep gas cylinders on the side of the house furthest away from the likely direction of bushfires (where bush is)
- **12.** Block any gaps in the roof space
- **13.** Hoses must be long enough to reach all parts of your house. Use metal hose fittings for taps as they are less likely to melt
- **14.** Remove flammable materials and store them away from the house
- 15. Make sure there is water it is likely you will lose water and power supplies during a bushfire. It is important you have an alternative water supply. You will need a petrol, diesel or generator powered pump to draw water from dams, pools or a water tank



Since our last year's AGM in August 2011 a lot has been going on in the centre and I thought I'd highlight monthly events to keep you all updated with the workload that was achieved.

2011

July: The CRC commenced compiling and the printing of the bulletin was started. As well as placing them around town we started sending them by e-mail, saving on paper and printing costs.

August: Amor has allocated time in her busy schedule to start working on the Shire's webpage, which she will continue to do so keeping it up to date.

September: Wild Women of the West was started to be organised by Sam Fricker and Amor for the big day in December.

Sam volunteered to do the Tax Help program at the centre as Mr Slater was retiring.

New public access computers and NAS Drives were installed.

Rodney Boyle took on the mentoring role for those interested in the ancestry.com Club and it's been a real success.

Work is in progress for the Christmas (Street) Banners.

October: Designs for banners approved, so these can be started in time to display in December.

Some members of the committee attended the opening of the Quairading CRC. While there Mr Brendon Grylls spoke to Gemma, asking her to make an autobiography of her CRC journey as a trainee, as he wanted to present this to parliament.

Gemma was also nominated for the Wheatbelt Trainee Awards 2011. Gemma was placed runner up, in the ATSI category. Congratulations from all of us.

November: Advertising of the Wild Women of the West commenced, with mail outs, radio advertising, and even personal promotion by Sam & Amor when it looked like tickets were not going fast enough.

We sold tickets for the Art Gallery and it was a good money raiser. Unfortunately the Art Gallery decided that future ticket sales would be done over the internet.

Printing the programs for the Harvest Festival was also a great opportunity for the centre to be recognised, with 300 programs extended to 600.

We held a big breakfast at the Centre to celebrate the network's 20th Anniversary. We sent invites to all the local businesses, Shire reps, and staff and committee to celebrate with us. We had 30 people attend which was very satisfying for us. The video link up which Amor was waiting for never happened as the gremlins took over; we missed out on showing our centre to the 65 that were on line.

Christmas banners arrived, and we were very impressed with the designs and quality of work.

Steve Gollan with a consultant visited us to photograph the cracks in the walls and check the floors; with the understanding we would be having an engineer coming in for more checking.

December: Wild Women of the West went off extremely well. Some small glitches went into the "now we know better for next year's event". Congratulations to Sam, Amor and all the helpers in making it a huge "mark on the calendar" event for the Beverley CRC and the Beverley Community for the future events they hold.

Gemma was invited by the committee to be a trainee for a second year and to go on and complete Certificate III in Business and Administration, she is also expected to go one day per week to gain more experience in the offices of The Shire of Beverley.



2012

February: The back office was completed and is being rented out to Max Employment and a travel agent. We are hoping for more use by other businesses in the future.

The centre is being opened on Mondays now and with the Business and Strategic Plan being signed off we hope this enables us to receive higher funding and a higher rating.

Talks began with the Shire about having access to the Playgroup room for storage space and in future budgeting include it for a make-over for us to utilise it for craft, school holiday programs and cooking workshops.

March: Cracks in walls and flooring problems inspected and awaiting results from the Shire as to what we need to do in the future. We will probably need to do this in the 2012-2013 Business Plan.

April: Possibility of the CRC producing the Beverley Community Phonebook was raised in general business. Costing needed to be assessed so if we were to take it on we will be able to include it in next year's Business Plan.

Interviews of the applicants for a second trainee took place.

May: Our new trainee Christine Sazanov "Chrissy" commenced employment on the 2 May.

Compiling the Beverley Blarney was accepted by the committee.

As you can appreciate the Beverley CRC has had a huge year with lots of community support, which can be seen in the larger workload

In finalising my report, thanks must go to the Co-ordinator Amor, Bookkeeper Sam, and staff Gemma, Rodney and Chrissy, to the committee (past and present), Treasurer John, Secretary Lynette, you all make the role as Chairperson so much easier than it could be otherwise.



Wildlife Stories Straight off the Broomstick!

I was shocked and saddened early October when we were called out to a fox, whose back leg had been caught by an illegal steel jawed rabbit trap This fox had been stuck in this trap for several days, he was severely dehydrated, emaciated and had a very serious infection on his leg. Although foxes are taking people's chooks, ducks and other animals all around town, I still do not understand how anyone in Beverley could inflict such cruelty on this fox. These steel jawed rabbit traps have been illegal in WA since 2002 because of the cruelty component; if you are caught using one a fine of up to \$5000 will be imposed. A lot of people probably wonder why I am making a big fuss over a fox but what if it wasn't a fox that was caught, what if it had been wildlife such as possums, ducks, bobtails or birds. It could have just as easily been someone's pet dog, cat or even your child. This trapped fox was found at the tourist information bay down by the water with the chain caught in reeds when he went down to get a drink. I received several phone calls from concerned citizens regarding this fox. We ended up taking this poor fox home where he was shot to finally end his suffering. You can buy legal soft hold rabbit traps for under \$50.00 so there is no need to use these brutal, barbaric and cruel illegal traps. I then contacted the RSPCA, DAFWA, Police and the local ranger and we are asking if anyone sees or hears of any of these traps being set to contact either the authorities like the ranger or myself. It is only illegal to use these traps not to own them; in fact you can sell them as collector's items for up to \$400.

On a happier note our little possum Hush is growing so fast and will be ready for release in the next couple of months.

We also have taken on two little female euro's from their previous carer. They are settling in well but are very mischievous and always finding trouble.

We also had a native crested pigeon brought into us that had been hit on Westdale road and unfortunately had to be euthanased by my vet due to spinal injuries. With Summer and the fire season here we all need to think about fire safety and how our actions can cause destructive bushfires, injuring and killing many native animals. It is so important that we all do what we can to prevent these fires by minimising the fuel load on our own properties and any bush around you. So let's all think about fire safety and help stop innocent wildlife getting impacted by these devastating fires. Wildlife lose their homes and their food sources in the event of a fire which can last more than a few months until they can find new homes and new food sources.

BEVERLEY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

At the General Meeting members heard reports on some research into the railway & more about scouts.

Arthur Rolph from NSW visited the Museum searching for information about the building of the Great Southern Railway in the early 1880s. His grandfather, Charles Wardley, came from England to Beverley in 1884, lived in a tent with his wife & baby at Main Camp, and worked on the railway pumphouse. We were able to find the pumphouse on a plan & pinpoint where in Beverley it was built (between Shed St & Vincent St) plus a photo of the tank stand that stood by the pumphouse until the 1960s. In return Mr Rolph provided family stories about some of the Wardley's interesting experiences here. We hope to share those soon.

We also heard from Scout researcher, David Hanscomb of High Wycombe, who sent information re the establishment of **Beverley Scout Troop 30** by Rev Weaver as well as the WW1 records of three Beverley lads - Bert Edwards, killed at Gaza in 1917; Bert Bolton who won the Military Medal; & Canon Groser's son, Noel, born in Beverley.

- 1. Some lovely baby clothes from the 1940s including a blue satin dress sent from the Middle East in WW2.
- 2. A large boy doll in a blue romper suit & white beret.
- 3. A beige linen riding outfit of

jodhpurs & coat worn by a local lass in 1915.

- 4. Booklets and papers relating to Cadet Service in WW1 and Volunteer Defence Corps in WW2.
- 5. Two Petrol Rationing Coupons from 1940s.
- 6. A Rent Book for a house in Forrest St that showed the rent per week in 1920-1922 was 5/- (50c).
- 7. Souvenirs from England of the Royal Wedding of William & Kate; and the Queen's Diamond Jubilee.



Time is moving fast and it is strange to think we only have six weeks left of school and then we will be moving to Pre Primary. We have also moved on at lightning speed.



BEVERLEY COMMUNITY PARALEGAL INFORMATION AND REFERRAL SERVICES (BCS)

BCS

Provides legal information and referrals to Solicitors and to other organisations, both Government and Non Government. These matters of concern; do normally relate to issues that we all face in our daily life.

LITIGATION - LEGAL ACTION

The whole legal system is both varied and complex. The novelty of ONE having their day in court; that's how it all starts. Most litigations do not see the perils, risk and costs/court fees, till it is too late. Where cases run on for years and where the courts rule in favour of one party, these costs may result in forcing the other party to sell their home to pay the demanded amount.

Recently the trend to take legal action in order to have One's day in court is increasing by the week. This is so, even after I have provided information as to court procedures; Supreme Court and High Court: These are the two highest courts. All matters to name a few; such as:

Wills, Estate, Grant of Probate, Appeals. Where a client has to hire the services of a Barrister, Senior Counsel, Queen's Counsel, Junior Counsel/Solicitors and so on. Bear in mind, where a number of witnesses, experts and so, are called, resulting in additional costs. All court matters, due to take a reasonable amount of time to run; the problem starts when one party decides to contest a case, this is where the time drags on and costs mount up. It is fair to say that Beverley residents like any other do have matters pending in the Supreme and other Lower Courts.

NEIGHBOURHOOD DISPUTES

They take up over 40% of the Civil Courts time; These disputes in one form or another appear to be on the increase. Over the years I have Litigants say to me, that they want to pull out half way through a case resulting in very painful and financial loss (legal and court costs).

There are many of the above civil cases which, end up in both courts, e.g. where overhanging branches have, due to weight, caused damaged to your fence. Instead of

mutual dialogue or settlement; threats are made to assault one's neighbour. The Police are then involved. This matter very likely can end up in a Civil and Criminal Court.

IMMIGRATION

A current fiancée sponsor leads me to believe; that the time and procedure for overseas application Visas etc could take around 2 years and entail around \$10,000 to \$12,000 /- depending that all paper work is in order. And Air Trips Involved.

SUPERANNUATION

TV Reports some two weeks ago, their CEO's are of the opinion that if one is to provide for their retirement they need to have \$600,000 in their funds to earn them \$600/-per week.

WELFARE

This issue lies in a very sensitive area. To many Australians who; do face hardship and financial difficulty are of the opinion that: Much has been said, promises have been made; but very little has been done to ease their pain and suffering; The National Welfare Agencies, last week; found (by survey results) 100,000 Homeless in Australia: Some boarding houses charge the homeless \$250 per week to share the space with 110 other homeless people.


40% Of Home Loan Borrowers between 2008 and 2012: The loan is worth more than their home. By the time they pay the mortgage, rates, cost of living, they are not left with much. This group are also facing serious financial hardship. The legal centres receive 15,000 calls from these desperate people to save their homes.

<u>Sole Parents</u> around 100,000 who, go onto Newstart Allowance, may loose approx. \$100 /- per fortnight when their child turns 8. Some may even have to look for work. If so, how could they afford Child Care?

POVERTY

1 in 8 Australians are on welfare benefits cited by Anglicare; this group are living in poverty, are unable to put food on the table for 1 day (24 hours per week). To those that have children: Means no food in the children's lunch boxes to take to school.

SLANDER LIBEL DEFAMATION-MALICIOUS GOSSIP

These matters come under the Law of Torts - Common Law - very complex and attract huge payment and court costs when, witnesses give evidence and where written material, circulated proves to be damaging e.g. Business financial and citizen's name when defamed. The higher the profile, the more the pay outs.

RECENT COURT CASE

TV Reports - One 14 year old pet sheep named "BAH". The metro council won an order from the court to have the 14 (fourteen) year old sheep removed from the owners property. It took two years at the cost of over \$200,000. The owner is lodging an appeal to the High Court. It is expected that if the owner looses; then he could be up for around \$300,000. He may have to sell his property. N.B. The vet states that BAH the sheep has only one year to live.

Neighbours in dispute: Some two years ago: Overhanging Orange Tree Branches; damage to the fence – oranges thrown at one another – It turned out to be the cases were 1. for assault 2. recover cost of fence; The amounts; around \$40,000 and \$30,000. The sad part in this case; the neighbours were 2 sisters, and one had to sell or mortgage her house to pay the legal and court costs.

In closing, from what has been said, one can come to the conclusion that there are No Winners in Court Cases; especially when you look at the stress, trauma and time spent.

On a final note: all those who face financial hardship, the legal advice from solicitors are to negotiate and offer a payment plan, which states your intention to pay or see me for assistance/referrals.



LEGAL AID FOR INDIGENOUS PEOPLE I have been involved, in the first person, for 28 years, matters relating with Indigenous concerns in Beverley and the surrounding regions. It has now becoming more difficult as to the criteria to meet Legal Aid requirements. The said criteria applies to both indigenous and non-indigenous citizens. The Aboriginal Legal Services using this system, i.e. most civil cases do not qualify for assistance; where as not all criminal cases do, only where; there is a possibility of a prison sentence, then they do qualify. Of course other cases do so on merit. What I am trying to say here that there is no automatic right to legal assistance even if you are on a low income.

LOCAL PONY CLUBS CELEBRATE 50 YEARS

Sunday the 14th October was perfect weather to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the Gilgering Pony Club. A number of founding members of the Gilgering Pony Club were present to enjoy a



wonderful day of celebration and the opportunity to catch up with old friends and current members.



Organisers of the day decided it was fitting to hold a combined ride for the current members of the Beverley and York Pony Clubs, symbolic of the members before them. Both Clubs rode from their own direction to meet at Avon Ascent Park Gwambygine for a picnic lunch and ceremony. Beverley Members rode approx. 12km starting at the old York-Williams Rd rail crossing.

The formation of the Gilgering Pony Club was largely due to the determined efforts of Mrs Lesley Barrett-Lennard of Beverley and Mrs Roberta Fleay of York. These two horsewomen were keen to see the Pony Club movement introduced to the district. In 1962 they, along with other supportive local horse enthusiasts, established the Gilgering Pony Club.



The first rally was held in 1962 at the Gilgering Railway Siding approximately half way between Beverley and York. After two short years the Gilgering Pony Club had grown to over 80 riders with members attending from as far away as Quairading and Brookton.



At the end of 1964 Gilgering Pony Club separated into Beverley and York Pony Clubs and since then the two clubs have continued to provide instruction to hundreds of children. The two Clubs have enjoyed a great rapport over the years and looked forward to this combined event to commemorate the 50th Anniversary.

Mr Tim Jurmann, President of the York Pony Club, commenced the official proceedings with a great speech about the learning outcomes a child can gain from horsemanship and riding and thanked the Gilgering Pony Club founders for their foresight in establishing this worthwhile movement for children in our district.

Mrs. Fleay then spoke to the gathering and recalled "that in those days there weren't many floats and horses were either trucked or ridden considerable distances to attend rallies".

Mrs Barrett-Lennard then spoke of the enjoyment Pony Club had provided to many children, and their parents, and the friendships made which was evident by the older members reminiscing together over a selection of old photographs on display.

Mr Cyril Screaigh, original Secretary of Gilgering PC, recalled that with a membership of over 80 riders it was not possible to even have all riders on the 5 acre grounds at Gilgering riding at once.

Mrs Jenifer Petchell, President of the Beverley Horse & Pony Club then spoke of her involvement; firstly as a child, then as a coach and committee member. "Pony Club

is where you go to be with other people who share your passion for all things equestrian and you get to learn from people who are just as passionate as yourself. It's a place where lifelong friendships are grown; not only from within your own club, but as you venture further afield with other people from your zone and around the state"

Jenifer then thanked Mrs Barrett-Lennard and Mrs Fleay for their outstanding contributions and continued passion to Pony Club on behalf of herself, the riders before her, the current riders and the riders yet to come. She acknowledged that without their dedication and commitment over the years, we would not have the successful Clubs we have today. The gathered crowd gave a warm round of applause in appreciation of Jenifer's thoughtful words.

Mrs Barrett-Lennard and Mrs Fleay, who are now the honoured Patrons and Life Members of their respective Clubs, presented commemorative certificates to the riders who had participated in the combined ride. The riders thoroughly enjoyed the ride and now understand how dedicated those early Pony Clubbers were who had ridden each month to the rally at Gilgering.

Thank you to Mr Les Paige who kindly donated his property as a parking area for the floats, which the horses were tied to during the lunch and ceremony, his generosity is greatly appreciated.

float, dodging all the show traffic and then find the appropriate


