Amendment 19 to Town Planning Scheme No.2

Notice is hereby given that the local government of the Shire of Beverley has prepared the abovementioned town planning scheme amendment for the purpose of:

- 1. Remove clause 3.2.6 which allows a prohibited use to be approved.
- 2. Remove Rural Townsite from the Zoning Table.
- 3. Modify Clause 3.5 including inserting objectives into Farming zone provisions.
- 4. Modify Clause 3.6.2.
- 5. Insert new Clause 3.6.3 to allow property rationalisation of contiguously owned lots.
- Making the provisions relating to single dwelling development in sewered 6. Residential R10 zoned land, consistent with grouped housing development.
- 7. Inserting requirements for accompanying material for development applications.

Documents setting out and explaining the town planning scheme amendment have been deposited at 136 Vincent Street, Beverley, and will be open for inspection during office hours up to and including 8.30 am to 4.00 pm

Candidates Profile Local Government Elections Regulations 1997 Reg. 24

The profile of a candidate required by section 4.49(b) of the Local Government Act 1995 – a) Is to be in the English language and is not to contain more than 150 words (not

- counting the words needed to comply with paragraph (d); b) Is to be confined to biographical information about the proposed candidate and statements of the candidate's policies or beliefs and is not to contain information that the Returning Officer considers to be false, misleading or defamatory;
- c) Is to be hand written, typed or printed on a single A4 page, or if it is delivered electronically, is to be capable of being printed on a single A4 page;
- d) Is to include the proposed candidate's full name (in the form in which he or she has asked for it to be included on the ballot paper) and the details of where and how he or she can be contacted; and
- e) Can include a recent photograph (not larger than the size used in passports) of the proposed candidate's head or head and shoulders if the photograph was taken less than 6 months before the date of the nomination form or the RO considers that the photograph shows a reasonable likeness of the proposed candidate.

Changes to Cannabis Legislation

Tough new cannabis laws come into effect on the 1st August 2011 in Western Australia.

"The government is really cracking down on cannabis use with these new laws" stated 1st Class Constable Alan Parker, the Wheatbelt Alcohol and Drug Advisor.

"It will be illegal for cannabis smoking implements such as bongs to be displayed in shops or sold" stated Alan.

"More importantly a person found in possession of 10g or less of cannabis (previously 30g) will receive a Cannabis Intervention Requirement notice. This means they are required to book and complete a counselling session within 28 days or elect to have the matter heard in court" stated Alan.

Jackie Darby from the Wheatbelt Community Drug Service Team stated that "In the past, most people caught with cannabis elected to pay a fine rather then attend counselling."

"As from the 1st August that option will not exist and people caught with cannabis must attend a one on one counselling session with an alcohol and drug counsellor. The offender may elect to continue with counselling following the initial mandated educations session" stated Jackie. The laws outline participation in a counselling session can be offered only once to adults offenders, but twice to juveniles aged between 14 and 17 years. Subsequent offences will results in charges.

Alan emphasised this scheme does not apply to offences involving the possession or cultivation of cannabis plants, or possession of any quantities of cannabis resin (hash), hash oil, or other cannabis derivatives. These offences can still be prosecuted through the courts.

Local Health Promotion Officer Rachael Biddulph agrees these changes are for the better. "These mandatory sessions will help users really understand the health risks associated with using cannabis" stated Rachael.

Research reveals frequent or even occasional use of cannabis can cause anxiety, depression, paranoia and psychosis in those people who have a vulnerability to mental health problems. Frequent use of cannabis can also affect the brain by decreasing the user's ability to concentrate, remember things and can also impact on learning ability.

General Information from Beverley Paralegal Community Referral Services (BCS)

Immigration Laws: The following comments are based on real cases and current TV Reports.

Case (1) Prison Resident; served 6 months in prison (traffic offence in 1980) - served 18 months awaiting sentence on alleged criminal charges. He had six lawyers and now has no legal representation. The Immigration Department wrote to the resident stating their intentions, which is to deport him as he has served two years in prison. A deportation notice was placed on the cell door. The resident arrived 47 years ago on his mother's passport at the age of 1. Has no relations in the country of birth.

Case (2) A lady arrived in WA aged 16, who is now 96 years of age and case in point, she is on the point of being deported for being an illegal migrant (TV Report) To 'stay' a deportation order can only happen if you either seek ministerial intervention or hire a brilliant S.C. Immigration lawyer.

On prison matters, I seek help from a former prison superintendant/ director who is an expert on prison procedure.

<u>Selling Motor Vehicles</u> as an agent, on behalf of a mate or family member, a company or car dealer. Frequently I am approached to seek information. In all such cases make sure you sight authority to sell, current licence papers and road worthiness. Check with REVS - Department of Consumer Affairs where the owner of a vehicle is oversees, interstate or up north, and where the ownership is in question. Please seek legal advice in preparing an executed document, where in the sellers' signature can be compared with the signature on the vehicle transfer form. This procedure may protect all the parties involved. Establish the bonafide owner. Where a person or a company sells a vehicle, which was entrusted with them for repairs without the owners knowledge, and the purchaser has lost monies, once again, one should seek the services of a lawyer, the police and maybe the Consumer Protection. Finally, all buyers beware, when in doubt, always seek legal advice on above transactions.

It should be noted that I do not provide legal advice, I offer information based on good faith and it is not obliging for any person to act on such information.

<u>Aged Care</u>: As from July 2011, the Federal Government and the Nursing Homes have worked on an agreement, where in the chairperson of the Aged Care Council states the cost to care for high-care patients may be means tested. This creates a two tier care system. I.e. the more money you have, the more you pay. This refers to TV reports 2 weeks ago. I have been requested by concerned family and I am looking into this matter and will seek further clarification from the Aged Care Council and maybe a Federal MP.

Gwambygine Caves

The afternoon was clear, crisp and sunny; perfect weather for clambering round an exposed hillside south of York. A close inspection of the historic Gwambygine caves complemented by information provided by the Aboriginal owners of the land was our reward. Several members of the Beverley Historical Society and the broader Beverley community had an interesting and enjoyable tour of the caves, and the surrounding hill, thanks to current owner and custodian, Justin Kickett.



First, on the eastern side, we entered two boulder caves: great hollow spheres with enough space for a family group to shelter from the weather. We saw where the fire had been lit, and the art on the walls. From there we walked across the curved slope and climbed between the rocks to the much larger, though more exposed, shelf cave now known as Dale's Cave.



This cave faces east and is more than halfway up a steep rock cliff. Ensign Dale, on his first expedition through the valley, noted the distinctive caves in his 1830 journal.

The cave is several metres long and has the feel of a verandah. The rock of the ceiling has a spur that provides an archway towards the centre of the shelf. On the protected southernmost wall is a representation of the moon, crosshatched with a network of lines. About the moon are hand and arm prints. Viewed from the northern end, the moon is exactly in line with the top curve of the midway arch.

We were then taken further up and over Cave Hill. There is a traditional area for women on one side and another for men on the other side of the hill. From the open space above Dale's Cave we looked east out over the Avon Valley in all its green glory after recent rains.



Looking northwards from this spot, the curve of the hillside, back to the boulder caves, is dominated by great stacks of rocks forming castle-like towers.

It was at this spot, in times past, that the roaring stick would be swung in circles: the call being passed on from hill to hill, up and down the valley, to gather at Gwambygine for ceremony, song and dance.



Just before we came down, right up on the rocks and boulders of the highest point, we saw two large kangaroos calmly surveying the scene. "First time I've seen them for two years!" Justin commented.

Our afternoon finished around the campfire, with tea and biscuits provided by members of Justin's family. A wonderful experience, never to be forgotten.

View from the Shed The Good things in Life

With so much going on in our busy world, people going hard seven days a week just to get everything done, it is sometimes easy to forget that there are many little things that give us pleasure.

The most used sprouts

Before I continue with information on sprouts I would like to acknowledge my dear friend Isabel Shipard from Queensland. She has given me permission to use her wonderful books and DVD's on Sprouting, Herbs and Survival Food which I have purchased last year. You can go into her website at www.herbsarespecial.com.au These books and DVD's make wonderful gifts. If you would like to look at this material before you buy you are welcome to see me. This is also the place where you can buy seeds for sprouting on line. She has a wonderful selection of sprouting seeds. Some health food shops and organic shops have whole seeds for sprouting too. Besides teaching courses on herbs, speaking at schools, herb and garden clubs, permaculture and organic growers groups, expos, organisations interested in natural health, and as a guest on radio and TV, Isabel has written articles for numerous national magazines. The books and DVD's make fantastic gifts for people who have everything except good health. Take the time to peruse the existing material for your own benefit. There are wonderful photos in them as well.

In this final section I will describe only a short version of the most used sprouts. There are too many minerals and vitamins to mention in this space. The books also contain their medicinal and culinary benefits with recipes for cooking, making tea's and drinks.

Alfalfa (Lucerne) – Medicago sativa

This is one of the most popular of sprouts for eating, and one of the easiest to grow. Seeds are kidneyshaped, golden-brown, and a little smaller than a pinhead.



Chiaseed - 1tbsp = 1 full plate.

Fenugreek – Trigonella foenumgraecum

Growing and eating them is one of the most valuable things we can do for increasing energy, health and wellbeing. Fenugreek has been a universal panacea, time-honoured in many countries and cultures of the world. It is the herb for every ailment under the sun. It is one of the oldest recorded medicinal herbs, highly esteemed by both east and west, and has been regarded as treatment for just about every ailment known to man. Fenugreek has a beneficial action of cleansing the blood.

Mung Beans – Vigna radiata

Sprouting mung beans is just so easy. They are always out to please you, by booming away in 2-5 days into crisp, delicious morsels.

Lentils – Lens esculenta

Lentils are sometimes added to a mixture of small legume seed varieties such as alfalfa, fenugreek, mung and adzuki beans for sprouting and the mixture looks and tastes great when sprouted.

Chick Pea – Cicer arietinum

Chick Pea's are good for the heart, may be added to salads or made into hommus.

Adzuki Beans – Chinese Red Bean, Red Japanese Bean

Similar to chick peas, lentils, and mung beans and beneficial to the heart.

On a personal note: I sprout every whole grain from brown rice, quinoa, buckwheat, millet, barley, chia seed, any kind of beans, and wheat. My sprout trays are always full of fresh and yummy nutrition. We eat the sprouts on flat breads, in salads and soups, and in cottage cheese. I urge you to look and learn for your own benefit.
