## President's Report 21<sup>st</sup> April 2011

### Draft Strategic Plan

Council has been developing a draft strategic plan and look forward to presenting this to the community in the near future and obtaining your comment. There is an announcement included as a separate item in the Blarney in regard to this.

It will also be an important time to confirm the vision and values of our community for the Consultant undertaking the Regional Transition Group Business Plan for the Shires of Beverley, Quairading, Cunderdin, York and Tammin.

### Constitutional Recognition for Local Government

Council resolved to provide a letter of support to the WA Local Government Association in relation to Constitutional recognition for Local Government.

### Wheatbelt Land Use Planning Strategy

The WA Planning Commission has developed a Draft Wheatbelt Land Use Planning Strategy to guide future planning for the region. This can be

viewed at [www.planning.wa.gov.au](http://www.planning.wa.gov.au) or by requesting a copy from the Shire Planner. Feedback to Councillors prior to June would be welcomed.

### Recreation Ground Facilities Update

As mentioned in the April Blarney, the Shire was successful in receiving \$576,655 from the Community Sporting and Recreation Facilities Fund (CSRFF) toward the renewal and refurbishment of facilities at the town oval. Other funding sources are currently being confirmed and Council is hoping there will be community contribution, both financial and in kind. The plans are displayed in the window of the shire office.

Repair of the Amenities building has been delayed due to the requirement of a structural engineer report and there has been much debate and discussion as to whether this building should also be replaced at this point in time due to the storm damage.

With the current project supporting new male and female change and ablution facilities, kitchen, multifunction/crèche room, several store areas, first aid post and refurbishment rather than replacement of the current Amenities building to improve its usability, the most feasible option has been to undertake the insurance repair and proceed as

planned.

Like the community, Council is disappointed at the delay in getting the Amenities building repaired and back into action, and are very aware of the many community groups who are being inconvenienced by the current situation, which we are working toward having rectified as soon as possible.

### Avondale Draft Masterplan

The draft Avondale Masterplan is available for public comment, albeit only for a short time due to grant timelines. It is anticipated there will be a future community briefing.

### Beverley Community Resource Centre

Congratulations to the Management Committee, volunteers and staff from the Beverley Community Resource Centre on the recent Re-branding and Relocation event officiated by the Hon. Mia Davies MLC. The support being provided to Resource Centres by the Department of Regional Development and Lands has created many new services and opportunities for rural communities and thanks to the enormous amount of work undertaken by the Committee over the last few years Beverley has been well placed to take advantage of these.

The former Beverley student and now Greater Western Sydney Giants midfielder, returned to Guildford Grammar School to receive the scholarship alongside aspiring physical education teacher Corey McGuire, from Northam.

As the first two graduates of the Trevor St Baker and Richard Wilkes Indigenous Scholarship Foundation ("ISF") the pair were formally recognised for completing their studies.

ERM Power founder and Chairman Trevor St Baker along with his wife Judith presented them with \$10,000 each.

In attendance at the presentation

were three of the four directors of the ISF, including Mr St Baker, former banker and current company director Tony Iannello and Nyoongar Elder and ISF co-founder, Richard Wilkes.

ISF provides support for indigenous students in communities close to ERM Power stations across Australia.

## 60,000 free seedlings needing homes

Imagine your farm with more trees on it – and that you did not have to pay for the seedlings or for the planting of them.

Men of the Trees has 60,000 free seedlings still looking for a home for this winter's planting. Seedlings are a variety of native species suited to biodiverse plantings that can double as Sandalwood hosts on the right sites or as buffers along creeklines in well drained locations.

With the challenging seasons, revegetation is usually the first thing that is dropped off the list of jobs to be done around the farm however it is just when soils are most exposed that the need for more perennial vegetation in the landscape becomes clear. There is nothing like greenery across a brown paddock to lift the spirits on a hot summer's day when the dust is blowing.

The seedlings available through Men of the Trees are free of charge to any land manager who can plant a minimum of 12 hectares. Men of the Trees will not only pay for the seedlings but also for site preparation and planting and will work with each land manager to ensure the seedlings go into the farmscape where the farmer needs them most, so they fit in with the farming operation and future plans.

Second year weed control and any infill plantings in year two are negotiable under certain conditions – too good to be true?

As with any gift of this type there is also something required in return – the actual carbon in the trees will belong to someone else. Men of the Trees is working with Carbon Neutral who have raised the funds to grow and plant the seedlings. The land still belongs to the farmer, the trees will be doing all of those good things in the landscape, it is just the actual carbon in the trees that wont belong to the individual.

Perfect however for plantings on sites that should never have been cleared and will never be cleared again. If the seedlings are used as Sandalwood hosts, then the planting of the Sandalwood seeds is the responsibility of the land manager – but then the Sandalwood will also

belong to them.

How does it work? Contact the Manager of Men of the Trees' Revegetation Centre, Erin Lee (9274 4842, [mottplanting@menofthetrees.com.au](mailto:mottplanting@menofthetrees.com.au)) to book a site visit. A Men of the Trees Revegetation Field Officer will work with each land manager to design the planting and help with arranging site preparation and planting. The land manager will need to sign a legal document with Carbon Neutral that relinquishes the carbon rights to the actual trees and promise not to clear the site for 100 years.

The trees are then yours to protect your land, provide habitat, utilise excess water in the landscape and to enjoy.





Thank you to all of our volunteers who give their time every week to open the doors and give as much help as they are able to, about our town.



## Environmental Revegetation of Tributaries 2011

This year we have a very busy tree planting weekend schedule, which is on the 23<sup>rd</sup> & 24<sup>th</sup> of July, and involves some 30,000 native seedling stems, to be planted along 3 to 4 degraded creek lines within the York Shire.

During the year we have been busy preparing sites, - ripping, fencing, constructing numerous riffle lines and obtaining funding for these projects.

Sponsorship has been sourced from Bendigo Bank, York, for 10 seedling carrying trays valued at \$1,000 and Wheatbelt NRM Northam for 3 planting implements valued at \$1,020.

Wheatbelt NRM & Dept of Water Northam provided funding for the upper reaches of Boyanning Creek, which will revegetate and join large sections of this tributary from Ovens Road down to Talbot Brook, which flows into the Dale and Avon river systems. This project involves some 10,000 native seedlings.

Swan River Trust & Dept of Water Northam have provided funding for another project along the Southern Hwy on a tributary which flows into the 6 Mile Creek, and involves 12,000 native seedlings.

Lotterywest funding will be used to revegetate a section of 6 Mile Creek, with 10,000 seedlings, which will connect to other sections of this tributary that have been revegetated by our Association in previous years. This project is down Helena Road York, between the Southern Hwy and West Talbot Road.

The aim of these projects is to stabilise sediments and filter fertilizers, chemicals, detergents and other contaminants from entering the Avon and Swan River systems, helping recreate biodiversity, which once existed along these tributary systems. Leaving a healthy legacy for future generations.

The involvement of the Dept of Water Northam, Wheatbelt NRM, Swan River Trust, have been a great

benefit to our Talbot Brook Land Management Association, and the York and Talbot Brook Catchment.

Those people wishing to come along and plant trees, and interact with our group on the day, and other environmentally conscious people, lunch, morning tea, afternoon tea will be provided on the day. A BBQ dinner at night will be held at the Talbot Brook Hall, meat will be provided, and BYO salads and drinks. Camping facilities available at the Hall and toilets.

If volunteers have any tree planting tools, could you please bring along on the day, as limited amount available.

## **BEVERLEY EVENTS 2011 AT AVONDALE**

Avondale Discovery Farm is a unique living agricultural museum and a modern working farm. ## View from the Shed

### Staying Safe at Seeding Time

Seeding time is one of the busiest and most critical times of the year. So much depends on getting the crop in the ground in a short window of opportunity. Because of this pressure it is also a time when accidents can happen or our relationships come under pressure and even our physical health can be affected.

What can we do to minimise the risks during this high pressure time? I guess the most important thing is to be as well prepared as possible. Our previous experiences give us lots of capacity to be well prepared for unexpected eventualities, but there will always be the unforeseen event no one saw, or could predict, coming.

No matter how good our preparation the truth is it cannot predict what will happen when we start the task. I am a big fan of V8 car racing and it doesn't matter if you follow Ford or Holden all teams prepare their cars to win races, the real test comes during the race when the preparation is applied during the race.

Like a car race our preparation will be tested during seeding, and like a race adjustments to plans will need to be made for all sorts of reasons.

The things that are critical that make a difference during seeding are fairly obvious, well prepared and serviced machinery, adequate supplies of fuel and fertilizer, and a well developed plan of attack.

The less obvious part of the program is a well briefed support crew (often our partner and family). Like a car race the pit crew need to know the strategy, unfortunately with farming this doesn't happen as well as it could which often leads to unnecessary disputes and increased tension and frustration. When this happens the probability of accidents or mistakes increases dramatically.

The final thing that makes a difference is you, the operator. Staying focused and alert is probably the most significant element. As with car racing you can have the best car in the world but without a top driver it isn't going anywhere.

It is critical that you and your other operators look after your physical and mental health during seeding. The three major issues are

good nutrition, exercise and adequate sleep. These things have a significant impact on how well your seeding program will go.

Make sure you are eating wholesome well balance meals regularly (one of the traps is not eating regularly). Lack of regular exercise also impacts our digestive system, go for a short walk (5 or 10 minutes) at least three or four times a day to keep your system working well.

Also have snack food and drink with you that is nutritious (dried fruit and nuts, fresh fruit and water) and limit your alcohol. If you have an accident, even on your own property, and you are above the legal limit it will be a problem.

Fatigue is the other big issue. Everyone needs about 7 or 8 hours good sleep, not 7 or 8 hours off the

tractor! Also, make sure you have things to keep you alert during those difficult hours one of which is mid-afternoon. Take regular short breaks. CD's you like and even a talking book to listen to will help. If you haven't tried a talking book pick one or two up from the library its surprising how much choice there is available.

The last thing to remember is that if things do go a bit out of shape don't panic, again like a car race most problems can be solved if we stay calm, take a deep breath and consider the solutions.






