

### **President's Report** 24th March 2011

### **Grant for Recreation Ground Facilities** <u>Upgrade</u>

The Shire has received notice that it will receive \$576,655 from the recent Community Sporting and Recreation Facilities Fund (CSRFF) funding round. This is very welcome news, and following confirmation of other funding sources, will assist Council to commence redevelopment of facilities at the town oval.

### **Platform Theatre Gala Opening**

Congratulations to the Beverley Art Gallery Society on the fantastic event organised for the Gala Opening of the Beverley Platform Theatre. Many favourable comments have been received relating to both the event and the redeveloped Railway Station Precinct. Minister Brendon Grylls MLA, Minister for Regional Development and Lands who officiated the opening of the Platform Theatre was most impressed by what has been achieved in this community driven project.

### 10/11 Road Programme

The works supervisor has advised that the 10/11 road programme is on track for completion within the financial year. A section of the York Williams Rd which has received gravel sheeting is proposed to be sealed in 11/12. Further sections of this road and Greenhills South Rd are included in the 10 year road programme for sealing, as is widening of the Morbining Rd.

### Beverley Art Gallery Annual Art **Purchase Exhibition**

Preparation is underway for the 43<sup>rd</sup> Art Exhibition, opening on Thursday 21st April for 6 days over the Easter break. This has in the past been a very worthwhile exhibition to view and purchase from, and each year the breadth and quality of works has amazed many a visitor to our town. The Committee have been successful in attracting Max Kay AM, President of the National Trust WA as a guest to speak at and open this year's exhibition. (Max Kay was widely know in his role as an entertainer associated with the Civic Theatre Restaurant).

### Local Planning Strategy Review and **Strategic Planning Workshop**

Thankyou to everyone who participated during the day and evening of Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> February, providing valuable input and comment to guide the Planning reviews which are currently underway.

### **Bethany Farm Lease**

Due to the exorbitant lease being charged on this property by the Department of Planning and Infrastructure, Council has resolved that it would relinguish the lease to DPI unless the lease fee is altered to more accurately reflect the value of what can be achieved from sub-letting. These requests in the past have been unsuccessful. Additionally,

Council has been unable to justify as to why it should retain the lease of this particular block. If you wish to provide feedback on this decision please do so to Cr Lew Shaw, Cr Keith Murray or Cr Dee Ridgway.

As all brochures were handed out it will be interesting to see how many more visitors are in our town over Easter!

### FARM VEHICLE CONCESSION CODE 525 UPDATE

Vehicles granted a farm concession (525) may be driven on public roads provided that they are being driven between different areas that the owner farms and that those areas are located in the same or adjoining Shire.

Vehicles owned by a farmer/grazier are used almost exclusively on the owner's farm, and are exempt from vehicle licence duty and vehicle licence fees and pay a reduced third party premium. The farm concession (525) is granted on the basis that these vehicles make limited use of gazetted roads.

Farm vehicles may be driven on public roads only in the following circumstances:

- to travel between one portion of land and another portion of land that are both farmed by the vehicle owner, provided that those portions of land are located within the same or adjoining Shire boundary; or
- for the purposes of fire prevention and fire control; or
- to travel to the nearest practical place for repair, or
- to cart water for stock or domestic purposes in declared drought affected areas.

Farm vehicle owners that use their vehicle contrary to the above conditions may be prosecuted for driving an unlicensed vehicle, and their vehicle may not be covered by compulsory third party insurance in the event of a crash.

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### **Independent Public Schools**


A public meeting has been scheduled at school to inform the Beverley community about the possibility of Beverley District High School becoming self-determining as an Independent Public School.

### Seatbelt and Child Car Restraints



### The current issue

There are still quite a few people that have not fully understood what the changes to the Seatbelt and Child Car Restraint mean for everyone in the community.

On the 1<sup>st</sup> of October 2010 the changes of the Seatbelt and Child Car Restraints came in to effect. This means that no one will ride in a motor vehicle without wearing a seatbelt and if there is only five seatbelts in a vehicle then that means only five people can ride in that vehicle. A child, no matter what age is a person. So a child car restraint will occupy the place and seatbelt of that vehicle.

This mean that there will be <u>no unrestrained</u> children or adults riding in any motor vehicle.

The children must be in an approved child restraint, for their age/weight as below.

- From birth to age 6 months (birth to 9-12kg) children must be in a rear facing restraint.
- •From 6 months to 4 years (9 12kg to 18kg) children must be restrained in either a rearward or forward facing child restraint with an in-built, 5-point harness.
- •From 4 to 7 years (18-26kg) children must be in a booster seat restrained by a correctly adjusted and fastened lap sash seatbelt or a child safety harness.
- •Child safety harnesses (used without a booster seat) are available for use by children between 26-32kg.
- Children outside weight / size guidelines for existing restraints will be able to use restraints suitable for younger or older children.
- •Children under 4 years are not allowed to travel in the front seat of a vehicle with two or more rows of seats.
- •Children between 4 years up to their 7th birthday are also <u>not allowed</u> to travel in the front seat of a vehicle with two or more rows of seats, unless all other back seats are already occupied by children under seven years of age.

Also on the 1<sup>st</sup> of October 2010 WA also tightened up on the legislation that does not permit the carriage of more passengers than available seat belts within the vehicle. In short that means if there is five seat belts in a car that means only five people and that includes a child or baby, a child or baby is a person.

### Census Recruitment Continues in Beverley

In the weeks leading up to 9 August, tens of thousands of Census Collectors carrying yellow bags will be dropping off Census forms to every house in Australia.

Census District manager for the Wheatbelt, Hayley Preistley, explains that making sure everyone in the Wheatbelt is counted on Census night will mean that the region is able to receive all the funding it's entitled to as well as help plan for the future.

Hayley has been busy interviewing

applicants for Census Area Supervisor positions in Beverley and surrounding areas over the last few weeks and is excited about Collector recruitment that's about to commence.

"I'm hoping we get people from all walks of life applying for Census Collector positions in the Beverley area," she said.

Applications for the part-time positions will open on 9 April and successful applicants will be employed between 1 July and 8 September.

Census data are used by all levels of government as well as private

industry for a wide range of planning purposes such as schools, hospitals, the provision of services to the elderly, transport and roads.

It also determines electoral boundaries, the number of seats each state holds in the House of Representatives and the distribution of GST.

The Census takes place once every five years and the 2011 Census figures will update the 2006 data collected for the Shire of Beverley which included:

- The number of people counted on Census night was 1,562.
- 4.9% identified as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander
- There was 58 more men than women
- 18% of Shire of Beverley residents were 14 years of age or younger and 39% were 55 or older
- There was more than twice as many 5-14 year olds (188) than there was 15-24 year olds (93)

Ms Priestley explained, "Hiring local Collectors, particularly in regional areas, is one of the most important elements to collecting full and accurate Census data."

The majority of Census Collectors will earn between \$1,100 and \$2,300 for the part time work.

To be eligible to apply you must be an Australian citizen or permanent resident, be 18 year of age or older, and have access to a vehicle and telephone.

### "New Venue for Breastfeeding Education Classes in Northam"

Breastfeeding classes for pregnant women and their partners are now held at Northam Hospital

Pregnant? Thinking of breastfeeding? Prepare to succeed! is the message the Australian Breastfeeding Association (ABA) sends. The Northam group of the Australian Breastfeeding Associations has Breastfeeding Education Classes for 2011 at a new venue—-Northam Hospital, Day Hospital Unit, Robinson St Northam. The first class for this year is on Saturday 19th March 2011 from 1pm to 4.30pm. "It's wonderful to have the support of the Northam Hospital and Primary Health Service in providing the venue for classes. Timely information and support would help these mothers breastfeed for as long as they wish. By coming to a breastfeeding education class before you have your baby, you can learn how to help your baby breastfeed from birth, using instinctive behaviours. Many mothers make a birth plan, and this class will help them make a breastfeeding plan and combat some of the myths out there about breastfeeding.

Participants will leave with a take home pack, and 12 months subscription worth \$65.00 to the Australian Breastfeeding Association. This will give them access to ongoing local support at group meetings. Subscription also includes a book, *Breastfeeding...naturally* plus a bimonthly magazine, *Essence*, allowing the family to learn about different breastfeeding experiences before the baby arrives. The cost of the class is great value at \$85 per cou-

Hello Beverley,

After not having an article in last month's Blarney, there is plenty to talk about. I want to start with personally thanking Kerry Brindle for an outstanding job of organising and running the Drought to Flood Benefit Concert on the 26<sup>th</sup> Feb 2011. Without her commitment to the community this concert would never have happened and those that attended had a great time. Thank you also to the other people that helped Kerry with making the concert a success, especially the Shire, for their funding and support.

February saw a few local people picked up for drink driving offences, this tells us there are a few growing a little complacent and still thinking it is okay to just sneak around the corner after a couple of beverages. Police are around all of the time, just because you haven't seen them for two hours, certainly does not mean that when you pull out of the pub that they won't be there. The local police have taken people home on many occasions at the end of the night; we want to see people get home safely. There is a courtesy car in town that does a wonderful job for next to nothing. Take advantage of this option or just walk if you know that you are going to have a few drinks, ITS NOT HARD.

Speeding and failing to wear seatbelts are also an increasing occurrence lately. These factors when driving lead to an increase in serious injury or death when involved in a traffic crash. We want to see everybody safe and sound in town, so be careful when you are driving around town. We will be around and will issue infringements to those not doing the right thing.

A few people have asked about the current law in relation to registration stickers for vehicles. As you know that when you register your vehicle you know longer receive a registration sticker to place on your windscreen. This was a way to remember when your licence was due, however now that you don't have them the onus is on the owner of the vehicle to ensure that the vehicle is licensed. Unfortunately there is no exception to the rule and if you fail to renew your vehicle licence and drive that vehicle you risk being caught and charged. It is not an infringement and you have to go to court. This is also the same for people that drive the vehicle knowing that it is un-licensed. If you are unsure when your vehicle license is due you should contact Department of Transport on 131156.

As for registration stickers, the law in relation to displaying an expired registration sticker is still in force. If you are displaying one of these stickers you will receive an infringement of \$50.

### **STOCK THEFT ON THE RISE**

There has been a recent rise in stock theft throughout the Wheatbelt region. Whilst this problem has been around for years it has now been more common because of the high price of sheep. Police are urging everyone to be more vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour on yours or your neighbour's property. To also help with reducing stock theft police will also be stopping and checking vehicles that are carrying any livestock. So please make sure your waybills are with you and they are filled out correctly. Police have recently been bogged down with an increase in the instances of bullying amongst our young people. Parents please sit down and chat to your kids about what types of things are happening for them at this time. As for the young people, you do not need to interact with others that you do no like or get along with, but you do have to respect yourself and others however. So if you're on facebook (give it a rest for a while), if you see somebody you are not getting along with, do not interact with them.

Be aware of the way you speak to your teachers and your parents, it's beginning to get a little out of hand,

so take a deep breath and move on. Whilst the law gives young people a chance if they make a mistake, there comes a point where enough is enough and then you maybe charged for your actions. This has a detriment for you in the long term with employment and overseas travel. So if you don't won't to have those restrictions placed on you when you're older you need to start making adult decisions. Parents also need to be aware of the dangers of taking matters into their own hands in trying to (defend) your child. I DO NOT condone these actions and if you become involved in these matters I will investigate and where there is something unlawful in your actions you will be charged.

Kerry and I are contactable and here to assist to ensure these matters do not get out of hand and to offer advice. You need to either speak with us, or if something is happening at the school you need to speak with the principal of whichever school it is occurring at.

While on the subject of young people, we are unimpressed to hear that two boys were seen inside the station gallery property after hours, having gone into the storeroom and splattered black paint all over the walls and the floor. Not only that but also making a mess of the memorial garden. Police have been given descriptions of those involved; you will be caught and dealt with appropriately. This behaviour is unacceptable, show some respect. As far as those that wait for the school bus on Vincent Street in the mornings, it has been brought to our attention that the behaviour of the older boys in particular is getting out of hand, resulting in a window at the memorial toilets being broken. Police are aware of this issue and are watching the children at random times to ensure they are behaving correctly. Police now know who was responsible for breaking the window, that person will be spoken to.

### Don't be a fool, change your smoke alarm battery this April

Fire and Emergency Services Authority of Western Australia (FESA) together with Duracell are urging all WA residents to make April Fool's Day (Friday April 1) the day to change their smoke alarm batteries this year.

Each year more than 50<sup>i</sup> families across Australia lose a loved one as a direct result of a house fire, with the majority of deaths occurring between 9pm and 6am when the household is asleep. During sleep the vast majority of people do not register the smell of smoke – in fact during the deeper cycles of sleep they don't register smells at all.

Smoke alarms are essential to wake people if a fire breaks out; they give household members an early warning, and time to evacuate safely – but only if they work.

"When asleep our sense of smell is greatly diminished. When we enter the deeper stages of the REM sleep cycle, our brain dramatically slows in receiving input from the olfactory nerves (our sense of smell) which is why people don't wake to the smell of a burning fire," said sleep scientist Chris Bunney of Home Sleep Studies Australia.

"When asleep, we may not smell smoke but we will hear a smoke alarm. A working smoke alarm can literally mean the difference between life and death," added Bunney.

Fire authorities recommend the use of photo electric smoke alarms and say that not changing your battery and failing to maintain your smoke alarm can be just as deadly as not having one at all

Fire and Emergency Services Authority of Western Australia (FESA) District Manager Craig Waters says: "I see devastating house fires every year. In fact, one in five Australians experience a house fire. Sadly, not everyone gets out safely. In some cases, this is due to smoke alarms not working properly as they have been disconnected or have a flat battery. Worse still, some homes don't have a smoke alarm installed at all.

"Only working smoke alarms help to save lives, so we are strongly encouraging all WA households this April Fool's Day to not be a fool and make Friday April 1 the day to change their smoke alarm batteries. We recommend using high quality, long-lasting 9V alkaline batteries such as Duracell to ensure year round protection.

"All homes, whether permanent or holiday, need to be equipped with fully functioning smoke alarms – this includes caravans and cabins. Maintaining alarms and replacing batteries is also essential, particularly at properties that are not primary residences.

"It is especially important to replace batteries now as we move into the winter months, because the increase in usage of heaters and other electrical equipment leads to more house fires. Together with Duracell, the Fires Services message is simple; Only Working Smoke Alarms Save Lives."

The Fire and Emergency Services Authority of Western Australia (FESA) recommend you to:

- ☐ Test your smoke alarm once per month to ensure the battery and the alarm sounder are operating and clean with a vacuum cleaner annually to remove particles that will affect smoke alarm performance
- ☐ Replace the battery annually with a long-lasting Duracell alkaline battery
- □ Install smoke alarms in positions that will wake all occupants in the home and give them time to evacuate. E.g. outside each sleeping area with additional smoke alarms installed inside bedrooms where doors are closed at night and along evacuation routes if bedrooms are located upstairs

Smoke alarms are designed to protect you while you are sleeping. Visit www.changeyourbattery.com.au or your local fire service authority for more information on where to place smoke alarms in your home.

In 2010, FESA attended nearly 1,000 household fires in WA. There were 6 fatalities which could have been prevented.



### Little Possum's Rescue

On the 29<sup>th</sup> of January, Beverley experienced one of the worst storms we had seen in a long time with significant damage to houses, public infrastructure and many trees. As we tried to come to terms with this event and clean up, the story of a little female possum and her young joey came to light. She had lost her home in the storm and had found her way into a damaged shed where she laid huddled, too traumatised to move for four days until she was

discovered by the owner securing the shed. After a phone call to me, she was delivered to us for rehabilitation and care. She was so thin that she had lost her milk to preserve nutrients, so her little boy was starving. He was losing about 20 grams a day. We decided to try feeding her up with a special high protein diet, hoping her milk would return so we wouldn't have to bottle feed her joey. After a day and a half the happiest sound was the little joey slurping the milk from his mothers pouch. He never looked back and neither did Matilda as she had become known as.

After five weeks of care, Matilda and Ned were ready to go back to the wild. They were taken to a specially picked out site and given a gentle release with food and security until they can face things alone. Even though storms are a natural part of life, our wildlife like us, sometimes need a helping hand to rebuild their lives. It's wonderful to know that some people take the time to help. I would like to thank Corrie and Kerry Luk for bringing Matilda and Ned to us. Tim and Ange for offers of help and support for these two very special possum, they also offered them a wonderful, secure home on their property.

# View from the Shed March 2011

As we are all aware certain problems we face cause significant distress in our lives. At the top of the list is the loss of a loved one in unexpected or tragic circumstances.

Other significant things on the list include relationship breakdowns, moving house, loss of employment, being diagnosed with a serious illness and one we often overlook struggling with financial problems.

We often overlook how significant financial issues can impact on our overall wellbeing. Research tells us that when we are having difficulties financially it can lead to some of the other issues that are on the list.

Financial stress is in many ways similar to the impact of the dry season; it is more insidious than a significant dramatic event like the earthquake or the flood. Those events have immediate consequences that are highly visible as a reason for our distress or grief.

The gradual insidious creep of financial distress, like a drought, slowly erodes our passion for our work and eats away at our confidence. This can lure us into a sense of hopelessness that with time erodes our get up and have another go attitude so necessary in farming.

Given these problems it is important to be realistic about your budget, be optimistic but keep within the realms of reality, maybe give thought to other options because if your enterprise isn't projecting reasonable returns, given an average season, it could be your chance to consider change.

We know that if these matters are not addressed our wellbeing is impacted in so many ways. Our physical health and our relationships with our partners and children suffer.

Remember it is the insidious things that often have greatest long term effects on our health. They are also often the things we ignore and hope they will dissipate by themselves, most times they don't they just fester and get worse.

Look after every aspect of your wellbeing, it's the things we ignore or neglect that give us the most grief.

# Trucking industry urged to have its say on proposed law changes.

Transport Minister Troy Buswell has called on trucking operators to have their say on proposed national heavy vehicle laws.

Mr Buswell said while he supported the principle of national harmonisation, it was important to note that he would only support changes which were in the best interests of Western Australia.

"Road transport and logistics are hugely important in a State as big as WA and these industries are vital to the State's continued prosperity," he said.

"The WA environment poses unique demands for heavy haulage operators and there are a number of issues arising in the draft legislation that need to be carefully considered by the industry and across government in WA.

"Protection of our current local productivity variation, system of fatigue management and heavy vehicle accreditation are some of these key issues."

The Minister said the draft law, released for public comment by the National Transport Commission, reflected the current national system of fatigue management that is not currently in place in WA.

"Changes to the current system will only be considered if they are of benefit to Western Australia, and industry feedback will be vital in assisting the State Government in our negotiations with the Council of Australian Governments (COAG)," he said.

"It is important to note WA does not currently participate in the National Heavy Vehicle Accreditation Scheme but maintains our own system of accreditation developed to suit our needs."

The proposed National Heavy Vehicle Regulator (NHVR) National Law is available for public comment at <a href="http://www.ntc.gov.au/">http://www.ntc.gov.au/</a>. The new law is due to commence on January 1, 2013.

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# DEALING WITH PERSONAL DIFFICULTIES AFTER A STORM

One of the frustrating things about personal recovery after any storm in our lives, either real or emotional, is that there is often no one to blame. When we try to work through such situations we ask ourselves all sorts of questions about what we could have done differently, and all the "what if" scenarios flow through our heads and tend to create additional frustrations. We try our best to guess the future, particularly what will happen next and when, but our guesses often lead to extra stress and frustration.

It is important to realise that we can find ourselves creating additional problems by taking out our frustrations on those nearest and dearest to us. Often this behaviour is unintended but can lead to us alienating ourselves from those who are in the best position to give us emotional support, our families and friends.

We react to worries and distress in many different ways. Sometimes putting our foot in our mouth! I know I have done it with people I care about and it can be embarrassing and damaging to relationships. Be quick to say sorry if needed.

There are things we need to consider if we find ourselves lashing out at people unnecessarily. We

need to understand that we all like to shift responsibility for difficult "before storm" situations to someone else. We often hear people cursing God when things go wrong but this doesn't do much good because God doesn't answer back. Blaming others or growling at our loved ones is often an indication of our own frustration with ourselves in not being able to fix the problems.

When we fail to deal with a misdirected outburst we often alienate the person who has borne the brunt of our frustration. When this happens it can have a detrimental impact and makes it very hard to restore the trust needed to get things back together again.

As we face the problems created by any storm it is important to realise these things can impact on our wellbeing.

Remember a few key points:

- Share with others how you are coping. (hurt, angry, worried, vulnerable or stressed etc).
- Accept responsibility for communicating how you are.

If we make a mistake or lose your temper act quickly to rectify that mistake before it festers into something major.

Remember our catchcry, TALK TO A MATE .....before it gets too much. Storms create pressures in all sorts of different ways, don't let it get between you and those that

matter most in helping to deal with the problems.

The first big day will be Easter Saturday. The Patchwork Group will be showing their quilts, having stalls and invited groups.


At the first meeting we had three new members, which will make so much difference when we have tours and general weekend duties. Their new input will be very good.



"Around 28% of falls among older people occur in the bedroom, 21% in the family or living room and 13% in the kitchen. 10% happen just outside the home, near the back or front doors. The other 17% of falls occur in the laundry, hall or other places around the home."

Last week Amy spoke to the Northam Day Hospital Falls Group about common hazards and how to reduce the risk of falling by removing possible hazards. This group is for people who have fallen in the last six months and would like information on how to reduce their risk of falling again.

The group stated "Having a fall takes away your confidence" and they would like to warn others in the community about common hazards to prevent them from falling and losing their confidence.

"Be careful of gravel" the group said. "Out of all of us here today five out of eight slipped on gravel. Also lifted pavement can be a trip hazards. We have learnt that you can buy strips of grip for stairs, which is a good idea."

Another main message the group wanted to let others know was to "Remove clutter from the floors in your house. Remove matts with curly edges or use matts with rubber backing, Clark Rubber in Midland is a good place to go for them. Make sure you're wearing safe footwear too, that is a big part of preventing falls."



# NORTHAM WEIGHT ACTION GROUP LEARN HOW TO DRAW THE LINE ON WEIGHT GAIN

The twelve week Northam Weight Action Group started last week for people who are overweight to learn how to 'Draw the Line' on weight gain. No more feeling hopeless, no more fad diets, for these people it was the start towards building a healthier lifestyle.

Brie Elson, Dietitian, explained to the group why fad diets don't work and can actually cause weight gain, "Restrictive dieting sends a signal to the body that there is a food shortage and the body thinks its own survival is threatened. It responds by slowing down the rate at which the body uses energy. This means that fat loss slows down and it becomes harder to lose weight."

Brie went on to explain that, "When people diet, the body responds by conserving fat, as it thinks the body is going into starvation. The weight people do lose when on fad diets is mainly muscle and water. When your body loses muscle, it further slows down the rate at which the body uses energy."

"Fad diets can be harmful to the body because they do not supply adequate energy and nutrients for the body to function efficiently. Fad diets are often not maintained as they are too restrictive and research has shown 95% of dieters actually regain the weight after the diet is over, and often regain more than they actually lost", said Brie.

Brie emphasised to the group "The healthy way to lose weight is by eating smaller portions, eating lots of fruit and vegetables as well as eating less fat and sugar."

The group were also encourage to be more active and sit less by Elizabeth Dow, the Physiotherapist supporting the group." Finding at least 30 minutes of physical activity that slightly raise your heart rate everyday, is what everyone needs for good health" said Elizabeth.

"A way to achieve this is my making physical activity apart of everyday. Choose activities that are enjoyable and vary these activities to keep motivation high. Being active with your friends, family or partners also all help with motivation." said Elizabeth.

The Northam Weight Action Group made a healthy lifestyle goal to assist them to Draw the Line on weight gain. If you have made a New Year's resolution to lose weight, perhaps it is time to reassess your progress and lifestyle changes.



From 1 January 2011, there will be further changes to Youth Allowance and ABSTUDY.

You may be affected by these changes if:

- you are receiving or thinking of claiming Youth Allowance or ABSTUDY, or
- your family home is in an outer regional, remote or very remote area of Australia.

#### About the Independence rules

If you apply for Youth Allowance or ABSTUDY you will be assessed as dependent or independent.

Being independent for Youth Allowance or ABSTUDY means that your parents' income and assets are not taken into account when determining your eligibility or rate of payment. If you are already considered independent for Centrelink purposes, then changes to the independence criteria probably won't affect you.

#### Age of Independence

From 1 January 2011, the age of independence will change from 24 to 23 years of age. This means if you receive Youth Allowance or ABSTUDY as a full-time student or an Australian Apprentice, you are automatically independent when you turn 23 years of age. The age of independence will then change from 23 to 22 years of age on 1 January 2012.

#### Independence through workforce participation

If you have supported yourself in full-time paid employment for at least 18 months in one or more jobs, within a period of two years, then you may be considered independent for Youth Allowance or ABSTUDY. Full-time employment means that you have worked an average of 30 hours per week throughout the 18 months. The hours that you work each week can be averaged over periods of no more than 13 weeks.

From 1 January 2011, if you are a full-time student and you need to live away from home to study because your parents' home is in an area considered to be Outer Regional Australia, Remote Australia or Very Remote Australia according to the Australian Standard Geographical Classification, you may also qualify for independence if you:

- have worked part-time (at least 15 hours a week) for at least two years since leaving school, or
- have been out of school for at least 18 months and have earned at least 75 per cent of the maximum rate of pay under Wage
  Level A of the transitional Australian Pay and Classification Scale or the relevant modern award generally applicable to trainees in
  an 18-month period.

To be assessed as independent under these arrangements, you must also satisfy the following criteria:

- you are a full-time student
- · you need to live away from home to undertake full-time study, and
- your parents' annual income is less than \$150 000 in the applicable tax year.
