President Report May 2014

Recreation and Function Centre Opening

The formalities are completed! Thankyou to community members shared in this important who including the occasion. junior netballers in their fantastic new uniforms who undertook demonstration matches to christen the courts.

The Hon. Tuck Waldron officially opened the Beverley Function and Recreation Centre and the Hon. Paul Brown MLC officiated the opening of the playground and netball courts. Along with community our guests also included the Hon. Darren West MLC, President's and CEO's from surrounding Shires and Collins, Manager Wheatbelt Sport Recreation. who were impressed with what has been achieved and the flexibility in how the building has already been used.

Mainstreet SA conference

A recent one day conference in South Australia was attended by the Shire President, CEO and Shire Planner to seek information and gain ideas around progressing possible redevelopment of the Vincent St mainstreet precinct. An overarching and integrated strategic approach needs to be developed which strengthens sense of place, includes economic benefit, tourism linkages, social and cultural benefit and consideration of other proposals such as the Trails Masterplan. existing Streetscape Plan and UWA projects etc. Whilst Students potentially a long term project ... Town Street Water Harvesting

Rural and Regional Heritage

The Shire continues to lobby in raising awareness of the issue of Rural and Regional Heritage and the additional cost to Local Government and managing maintaining Heritage assets, particularly that which has State significance and for which there is no specific funding to assist Councils in undertaking this important task.

The Shire agreed to become responsible for the impressive collection of historical agricultural machinery in the museum at Avondale to ensure it remained intact and was not disbursed in the transition of the property from the Department of Agriculture to the National Trust in 2009. Since that time both the National Trust and Shire have had difficulty in attracting any significant funding for the property and museum to rectify vears of inadequate asset management prior to that changeover.

The Museum Collection was established as part of the 1979 sesquicentenary anniversary European settlement in Western Australia recognition in of Agricultures' importance development of the State.

Christmas Roundabout and Decorations Feedback Welcomed As mentioned in the April Blarney Council is interested in your thoughts and comments around the possibility

of a round-a-bout in front of the town hall and also a proposal that daytime Christmas decorations not replaced however there be a focus more Christmas lighting. Thankyou for feedback provided to date.

Railway Wheatbelt Retention Alliance

The Shire of Beverley is a member of the Wheatbelt Railway Retention Alliance and is represented at meetings by Cr Alexander. The Alliance seeks to support the Agricultural industry and Wheatbelt communities by keeping grain on rail.

The Shire of Beverley recently held a meeting with representatives from the WA Country Health Service (WACHS) to discuss services provided at the Beverley Hospital and the future of the Beverley Hospital.

Outcomes:

- The purpose of the Beverley Hospital is to keep a patient safe and provide the best possible service.
- Individual Doctors are required to sign a Medical Service Agreement with the West Australian Country Health Service (WACHS) to attend to emergency and admitted patients at the hospital. This agreement makes sure that patient safety standards are in place.
- Dr Remi Adeyabo and Dr Nora Kalibbala have an agreement with the Beverley Hospital. If the local doctors
 are unavailable or unable to attend Electronic Telehealth Services (ETS) will be utilised either from the
 Perth office or Northam Emergency Department.
- ETS Northam, are available on weekdays 8am and 5pm and from 11pm to 8am every night of the week.
- ETS services from the Perth centre are available each weekday evening from 5pm to 11pm. On Friday's and weekends this service provides cover from 8am to 11pm. The medical officers who work in these centres are very experienced emergency doctors.
- When you present at the Beverley Emergency Department you will be assessed by a qualified Registered Nurse. This Registered Nurse is competent in Emergency Triage and will consult with a medical officer to determine the treatment needed for the patient.
- The ETS medical officers cannot admit a patient into the hospital without a local Doctor being present in the town. If it is determined a patient requires hospital admission and a Doctor is not available, the patient will need to be transferred to another facility.
- A patient is unable to remain in the hospital over the weekend unless there is a Doctor in town, or the Regional Medical Director and Health Services manager are in agreeance the patient can safely remain and there is an appropriate medical care plan for the patient.
- St John Ambulance called within the Beverley Shire, will in the majority of cases, first go to the Beverley Hospital. A patient will be assessed and then if required, transferred on to another hospital.
- Due to a number of incidents and concerns within the local community, investigation has been underway regarding the reopening of the morgue or a similar facility. A Body Holding Facility (BHF formerly known as the morgue) is due to be re-opened. WACHS is undertaking some work prior to this occurring and the Shire is also assisting to provide safe access to the facility.
- The responsibility for maintaining the function and security of the BHF will remain with WACHS.
- The Beverley Hospital is to undergo a significant upgrade to become compliant with today's building regulations and standards and to improve the emergency and clinical care of patients.
- When the planning is completed to the 50% of the entire design there will be an opportunity available for the community to have input and make comments.
- The new design will allow the Beverley Hospital to become more functional and will have two critical care beds and better consultation rooms for Allied Health.
- WACHS and the Shire of Beverley propose to hold a Health and Hospital Community Information Forum later in the year.

PLEASE FOLLOW THESE STEPS TO MAKE COLLECTION EASIER:

- 1. Place bulk waste NEATLY on the street verge.
- 2. Similar waste to be grouped SEPARATELY, eg green waste, furniture/timber for recycling purposes.
- 3. **DO NOT** obstruct footpath.
- 4. **REMOVE** fridge doors and **DRAIN** oil from machinery parts.
- 5. Please **DO NOT** place your bulk waste out **UNTIL THE WEEKEND PRIOR** to the collection date. This constitutes littering and is liable to incur a penalty.
- 6. Any items **NOT REMOVED** from your verge, **PLEASE REMOVE** or a penalty may be incurred.

COLLECTION OF USED OIL FROM FARMS PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The objective of this project is to identify and collect used oil from farms in WA.

While the ability to collect this oil has always been there, locating and identifying the amount has not, resulting in many litres of oil being held or disposed of on farms, and that oil is a direct threat to the environment.

By establishing a simple recording method through local shire councils it is hoped a large amount of this oil can be recovered and treated properly.

IT IS ENVISAGED THAT MOST OF THIS RECOVERY CAN BE DONE FREE OF CHARGE AND THE ROLE OF THE SHIRES WOULD BE MINIMAL.

Disability Pensions: as per TV and media reports.

- It is expected New Laws that the family home will now be considered as part of one's assets for pension eligibility.
 - Disability pensioners will be sent independent doctors to be reassessed as to pension eligibility. Apparently, those who fail the 20 point test, will go on to Newstart Allowance, which is around \$500 per fortnight. TV cases, televised in April 2014; Case 1. A lady who is wheelchair bound who, worked part time some 3 years ago for a short time, due to her disability was put onto the disability support pension. She is currently having cancer treatment, in spite of all this, at end March 2014, she was told by Centrelink, that she should look for a job and was put Newstart Allowance. Case 2. A male person also on the disability support pension, who has one carbon fibre leg was told, that he is fit for work and he should try to get a job. He also on to the Newstart Allowance. If one can take these two cases as an example, then the question is to human resources, who can qualify for a Disability Support Pension? My comments based on facts; some years ago, to qualify for a Disability Support Pension one had to seek the support of a medical team, backed up by x-rays, medical reports showing the level of incapacity to work or to carry out normal daily functions i.e. walking, dressing, sitting, bending standing and serious mobility problems plus chronic pain was a key issue.

Wait till the May budget to find out more.



Then everyone had a go at doing what we had just been given information about. Largely natives were attempted but some exotics were also attempted. For those of us attending it was a most interesting day. Even with the dry times we've had and the garden looked in good heart. Thank you from all of us Hazel.



May means Mother's Day. If your Mum's a gardener think of bulbs (for pots and gardens), a fruit tree, new secateurs, mulching hay or straw or wood chips, or

even a big bag of dynamic lifter. For those lucky ones with a shearing shed think of a few bags of sheep poo! No money to spare? A few hours weeding or tidying up will be really appreciated.

All winter vegies must go in now so hop to it! Cabbages, cauliflowers, brussel sprouts, leeks, beetroot, broad beans, broccoli all lettuces (sheltered, maybe in a big pot near the back door).

Some of the many flowers that may be planted now include foxgloves, alyssum, cornflowers ,delphiniums, everlasting daisies, hollyhocks, nemesia (very tough) and stocks.

As the cold weather approaches think of the tender plants that may need to be moved into a sheltered position. Remember that pot plants need less water in the cold weather. Feed all plants with a high potash fertilizer to build them up for the winter.



Updates:

- ABORIGINAL RESERVE, DUFFIELD I. STREET, BEVERLEY: Mal Roberts met and discussed the matter of erecting a cultural centre on the reserve, with Professor Grant from UWA, who was at a function at the recreation centre at Beverley recently. The current position is Professor Grant intends to follow this matter up with both legal advice and indigenous affairs, on a one to one level and get back to me.
- II. If the reserve project does fail, I will tentatively be suggesting to Crana committee, consider setting up a monument, which, will both honour and recognise the past residents who did reside on the reserve. This recognition, will of course, take great care to consider to respect: country, culture and the spirit people. The final intention would be to suggest and request that the Aboriginal flag be flown on the reserve.
- III. Erecting a monument, will never the less require consent from our local Shire of Beverley, Indigenous Affairs and from the Crown (crown grant) Commonwealth Government.
- IV. Culture and identity: Respected elders see these factors as life lines to indigenous people with their relation to the land (mother earth). To support what has been said, last week on ABC national radio, one most highly respected indigenous elder from the Northern Territory, informed the listeners, about the very sad and tragic news, that 16 children took their own lives in a matter of 10 days. The children's age some being as young as ten. The elder stated, that one of the main reason for this sad loss of life is the loss of culture and identity. They also had virtually no social or family life, lack of funding, no back up or community support programmes. The TV media have been very silent on this matter, I wonder why?



PARLIAMENTARY INQUIRY - PATIENT ASSISTED TRAVEL SCHEME (PATS)

The Standing Committee on Public Administration commenced a parliamentary inquiry into the State Government's Patient Assisted Travel Scheme (PATS) in Western Australia on February 26, 2014. PATS provides travel and accommodation subsidies to eligible rural and regional patients that have to travel long distances for specialist medical care or treatment.

This inquiry was triggered after the Parliamentary National Party raised concerns that the scheme was no longer responsive to the needs of patients required to travel for specialist medical care.

As part of the inquiry process the Committee invites members of the public to make written submissions addressing its terms of reference. The Nationals WA support the evolution of a fair, modern and equitable travel and accommodation subsidy scheme for regional and remote patients. For this reason I encourage your organisation to join individuals in making a submission to the Committee before May 16, 2014.

The terms of reference for the committee inquiry include:

- The level of funding applied to the transport and accommodation subsidies provided;
- Eligibility for PATS funding;
- The administration process; and
- Whether there is consideration of exceptional circumstances.

Working with Warriors Looking After Ourselves in Busy Times

Now that the Easter and ANZAC break has come and gone, we are now entering one of the extremely busy times of the year with seeding knocking at the door. One of the most important things to consider looking after, during this time, is our most valuable resource, "US"!

Because of this time pressure we can sometimes take short cuts, and if we take short cuts regarding our wellbeing it can increase our risk factors dramatically. It is a time when accidents can happen, relationships come under pressure and our physical health is ignored.

Risk Taking!

What blokes in particular don't do well is consider the consequences of risk taking. It won't happen to me! Consequences are something we must live with, so in your seeding preparation limit your personal risk, and if what you're planning is an overstretch, reconsider your options.

Wellbeing Guidelines

In addition to the usual seeding preparations perhaps we should follow the lead of other industries, such as mining and construction, where clear guidelines on safe parameters for work have been implemented.

Some things to reflect on when considering your wellbeing include:

- Well briefed work crew; (often our partner and family) Keep those working with you briefed on daily activities, unfortunately with farming this doesn't happen as well as it could which often leads to unnecessary disputes and increased tension and frustration.
- Fatigue management; limiting your working time to no more than 14 hours in a 24 hour period. Seeding might be over a relatively short period but this work strategy should not be compromised. The only solution to fatigue is taking a break and SLEEPING. Getting off the tractor and doing other jobs is not good enough, you need to sleep.
- **Factored in regular breaks**; this also reduces the impact of fatigue and increases our capacity to beat boredom, which often leads to expensive mistakes and machine damage.
- **Pre start exercises**; I would be surprised if many farmers begin a shift with some limbering up exercises. It is a known fact that this type of start to the day significantly reduces muscle injuries.
- **Suitable dietary needs**; how often are you eating and what are are you snacking on? It is not just about good meals it is also about good snacks that are nutritious and correctly timed. A good meal is very beneficial at the beginning of a shift and a light meal at the end is beneficial in helping to promote good sleep.
- Adequate sleep; for most people this is about seven to eight hours in every twenty four hour cycle. It is not possible to reduce this and still function properly. Remember this is "sleep" not just being in bed!

Seeding is hectic, a controlled and planned approach will pay dividends.

Enjoy seeding, it is a great time. If we look after ourselves most other things will fall into place.

Small Landholder News

With Jodie Whitfield, Manager Small Landholder Information Service Department of Agriculture and Food, Western Australia

Autumn is here and as we still wait for those rains to come, it is important to preserve your soil health, minimise erosion and meet the nutritional needs of your livestock.

It is the perfect time to be sowing new pastures or making sure your existing pastures are in great shape. A crucial step in this process is to ensure you are achieving good weed and insect control.

All weed control will require several years of repeated effort to reduce the seed bank. It is best to use several methods of control as relying solely on herbicides (especially if you are not rotating chemical groups), can result in a build-up of herbicide resistance which should be avoided.

Weeds that are common pasture pests in winter include variegated thistle, Paterson's curse and Cape tulip. For more information on declared weeds and control methods visit agric.wa.gov.au.

If you do have areas where there are significant bare patches in your paddocks, spreading some form of straw over the top can be an option to prevent wind and water erosion. If paddocks are bare also consider placing stock into one paddock and supplementary feeding them in a confined area.

It may be necessary to continue to supplementary feed animals for 6-8 weeks after the rains come and to keep animals in the confinement paddocks in order to allow the pasture to establish.

When re-introducing animals that have been maintained on dry supplementary feeds to green pasture, it is best to do it when their stomachs are full. Some stock may experience digestive problems, so be sure to monitor them closely.

It can take 2-3 weeks for a ruminant's stomach bacteria to adjust to green feed. Continuing to supplement their diet with hay can help with the transition from dry to green feed.

Any pregnant or lactating animals will have higher nutritional needs, so it is important they are given access to enough feed.

Dealing with any concerns you have about your property before they get too big, will keep you on track to developing the property of your dreams.



Yet another fantastic rally was held for our members on the 13th of April. It was a bit warm for our rally however everyone coped with a super day of activities. It was great to welcome back Georgina and Grace for 2014, with Grace riding Primrose for the first time—welcome back Primrose!

Well done to Jess who did a super job of building the show jumping course Marika had designed for the riders. Surprisingly, the Welsh Mountain group, with a visit from Georgina, managed to jump the highest for the day, and the riders were very excited when they told that they had jumped 65 cm! Watch out to the Arabians and Warmbloods.

The afternoon was full of games after a very informative talk by expert saddle fitter Gary Johnson from Saddles Plus. It was great to see so many members making the most of the opportunity to have their saddles fitted to their mounts—for a more pleasant experience for both horse and rider.

Some interesting points from Gary's talk were

- When riding, we reduce the blood supply by 60 80%
- We ride (in motion) at between 1.5 & 3 times our own body weight
- Horses muscles start to spasm after 20 30 minutes of riding For horses to move in a round frame, i.e., engage their hindquarters and lower their head naturally (not jammed in) they will lift through the back, which is the correct position for proper muscle development.
- Horses like us to ride light and balanced. To do this we need to have a reasonable fitness level, and a saddle that fits correctly


