Round-a-bout feedback

Thank you for responses following a request for feedback regarding the concept of a round-a-bout in front of the town hall. Varied responses both for and against the idea were received, and an array of valuable comment was also provided. The matter will now await development of a Vincent St Master Plan before progressing any further. Community consultation will be included as part of that process.

Industrial Land Development

Ongoing delay to the progress of the De Lisle St industrial development is an immense frustration which has resulted in many missed opportunities. The delays have effectively been going on for nearly two decades. Correspondence has again been forwarded to the Minister for Regional Development & Lands expressing our concerns.

Youth Activity Area

Council has resolved to focus on youth initiatives as proposed in the 2010 Youth Action Plan rather than proceed with development of a Youth Activity Area at this stage. A review of the Youth Action Plan is to occur in 2014/2015.

Heritage Buildings

Remedial works are required on the Courthouse and Railway Station and the Shire has also been advised to engage a structural engineer to report on the condition of both buildings. Ongoing works to the hall has included town refurbishment of the performers change rooms prior to the "Calendar Girls" stage show and an allocation of \$150,000 in the 14/15 budget to replace the roof.

Beverley Station Arts

Congratulations and thankyou to the Beverley Station Arts (BSA) for the work they undertake in fostering culture and arts in Beverley and the wider region. This has included another successful summer season of events and activities at the Railway Station and Platform Theatre and the ever popular Easter Art Exhibition. An agreement is now in place between the Shire and BSA for management of the Railway Station Cultural Precinct on behalf of the Shire and Community.

Cemetery Signage

To alleviate confusion for visitors

new signage has now been installed at the respective entrances of the Anglican, Catholic and Methodist/ Uniting cemeteries.

Oval Lighting

Installation of the remaining lighting towers at the Beverley sports ground is underway following a successful Department of Sport and Recreation Grant. This will greatly enhance night use of the oval.

Movement of Towed Agricultural Equipment

To provide advice and assist those in the agricultural industry who need to move equipment around the district on public roads the Transport Department of has "A produced Guide the Movement of Towed Agricultural Implements in Western Australia". COLLECTION OF USED OIL FROM FARMS PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The objective of this project is to identify and collect used oil from farms in WA.

While the ability to collect this oil has always been there, locating and identifying the amount has not, resulting in many litres of oil being held or disposed of on farms, and that oil is a direct threat to the environment.

By establishing a simple recording method through local shire councils it is hoped a large amount of this oil can be recovered and treated properly.

IT IS ENVISAGED THAT MOST OF THIS RECOVERY CAN BE DONE FREE OF CHARGE AND THE ROLE OF THE SHIRES WOULD BE MINIMAL.

Further update to warning on dangerous solar isolating switches

Energy Safety has issued an update on the public warnings about dangerous switches used in some solar systems, issued on May 21 and May 23.

The supplier of Gen3 and SPM branded dc isolators has now announced a replacement program to replace all dc isolators with the following model numbers: GEN3DC-25, GEN3DC-32, SPMDCISO25 and SPMDCISO32.

The dc isolators are required to be replaced. If you have identified one of these isolators within your solar system, please contact Uniquip on 0457 505 122 or prp@uniquip.net.au to schedule a replacement.

What should consumers do?

If you have not yet done so, shut down the system immediately by following the shut-down procedure located in your main switchboard or near your invertor. If you are unsure or cannot identify the types of isolators you have, check your operating manual or invoice. If you are still unsure, contact the company that sold the solar system for further advice.

You do not need an electrician to shut the system down. However, you should seek assistance from the solar company if you are unsure of how to carry out the shut-down procedure safely. The system will only be electrically safe once it is shut down.

Do not attempt to get up on your roof to check the switch as there is no need to do this.



June Meeting: There were 9 members in attendance with 5 apologies.



Cemetery Signs: All our three cemeteries now have new signs thanks to the Shire of Beverley. Each sign gives the name of the cemetery & the location of the other two. This will greatly assist tourists, those researching family history & especially those who have a funeral to attend. There are also church cemeteries at the Dale and Edwards Crossing.

WWI Project – Remembering Them:

Work is proceeding on the three Beverley panels and a first draft is to be sent before the end of June. We have located a Murdoch University Honours Degree Thesis written by Stephen Anstey in 1980 - *The Impact of the Great War on the Beverley, Toodyay and Murchison Goldfields Communities of WA, 1914-1917* which has provided invaluable details as to what was happening here at home.

The diary of **James Isaac Mann** who served at Gallipoli has also been made available to us, thanks to the family. The service documents including pay books & discharge paper of **Milford Desmond Smith** have been lent to the Museum for our display next year, thanks again to the family.

Disability Service Pensions: In recent weeks a lot of legitimate concerns have been raised with me, as to current comments being made by senior federal ministers, who, may I say are adamant to reduce the overall pension benefits by 13.6 billion dollars from pensions of disabled Australians. According to T.V. reports the intended plan is more or less on these lines:-

- 1. All Disability Support Pensioners (DSP) must work, if they can whether it is 2hrs or up to 15hrs per week.
- 2. The plan is to appoint a team of doctors to re-assess all DSP recipients, starting with those who are below 35 years. According to the PM's words 'or any others'.
- 3. Recipients who fail the assessment (it is expected that a large number will fail, otherwise how else could the savings for the budget be made?).
- 4. TV reporting shows us that investigations are already quite active, otherwise how else would they capture, how far a person can walk, bending positions, carrying shopping bags, driving and getting out of cars. One station reported that police/authorities have cameras that can zoom in from around 1,800 meters. The advice from a veteran, whose application for a pension was knocked back (he was earning to much) he says 'be careful what you do—they will get you'. This person had a war related injury.
- 5. The general consensus from all the community and welfare organisations say, that if the new social security policies are implemented, there will be a large number who, may be forced to live in poverty, live in shelters/ parks and even lead to homelessness. Those CEO's have been interviewed on TV, including DS pensioners. What they are saying are in reality issues and raise real concerns to the most vulnerable Australians (DSP).
- 6. Social security Act Jan 2012. This covers the 20 points—Centrelink requirements eligibility. The following is only a part of a 53 page document. Info only examples:a) A 35 y/o woman with cerebral palsy earns 30 points.
 b) A 40 y/o male amputee with one arm, 10 points.
 c) A 25 y/o amputee who has no legs and wheel chair bound, difficult to get around and needs to help to get in and out of wheel chair and personal care. 20 points.
 d) A 50 y/o woman with osteo arthritis with disc degeneration of lumber spine, functional impairment experiencing pain for more than 15 minuets, 10 points.

My personal comments: From July 1 2014, the qualification/eligibility to get on the DSP will be extremely harder. Note: T.V. reports never show about all the good work that DSP do for others as volunteers. For some 20 years I have been assisting those on the DSP with paperwork and liaising with Centrelink, I may not be able to carry on this function. This month we had a very truncated meeting and after a cuppa we adjourned to the verandah of the Dead Finish and enjoyed a mosaic workshop, ably instructed by Colleen McAdam and helped by Val Lamb. We had a great time smashing tiles and crockery and then proceeded to decorate our chosen articles. Most members did an earthenware pot but there was a very classy shovel emerging at one of the tables. Chris Alabach helped with the difficult bits (that's like opening the liquid nails thingo and providing a big plank to smash crockery on). Thanks Chris. Several passersby stopped for a look and a cuppa and very welcome they were too.





The garden at the Dead Finish is looking in good heart. The busy bee last month tidied it up considerably and new plantings have gone in. We have replaced a mandarin tree that was not flourishing and after first aiding the site (heavy clay) by adding some gypsum another one was planted. It is worth a stroll around to have a look at the garden. Even the scarecrow has a new shirt!

Now to other local gardens. Remember our show in August and try to have just one thing to exhibit. Herbs and peas and greens put in now will be ready for the Show.

It is time to plant that old standby. Yes rhubarb and also time to plant asparagus crowns. Asparagus loves the climate here and it's a real luxury to be able to pick the vegetable every year with very little work once it is planted. Just cut it back and feed it once a year and it will reward you with lovely fat spears. Globe artichokes also like this climate and is very near indestructible. Such a lovely architectural plant that can have the pups cut off every year and made into other plants. Even it you don't eat it, the flowers are gorgeous.

Broad beans, cabbages, lettuce, peas, spinach and shallots may also be sown at this time.

For flower seeds you may need somewhere warm to germinate but poppies will be Ok and hollyhocks too.

Remember if you are planting bare root roses it helps to soak the plant in a Seasol solution for a couple of hours before planting.

Bulbs are to go in as soon as you get delivery of them and they will be poking their heads up in no time.

Members are reminded that next month's meeting will be at the CWA rooms and a casserole lunch will follow.

We have a bus trip planned for August and will be going to Toodyay and visiting a winery and the Emporium and, of course, the nursery. Please book with the Secretary or President if you want a seat. We plan on going on the 28 August.

I nearly forgot....keep on top of your weeds. Just a little a day does get there in the end. It just doesn't seem to.



Hi Everyone,

By the time you're reading this I would have returned to my posting in Northam and Sergeant Ian Connell would have returned from a well-earned holiday. As usual I've thoroughly enjoyed working in your town; it really is a little piece of paradise.

Well winter is certainly upon us with a number of chilly nights resulting in ice on the car windows in the morning! We've also seen some very foggy nights and mornings which brings me to the subject of fog lights. The following information was provided by Constable Timms of York Police:-

Fog Lights can only be used in misty/foggy weather or heavy rain. To use fog-lights at any other time does attract an infringement notice. Fog lights are wired separately from your normal lights and it is very important that you know where the switch is in your car (if in doubt see your car manual or the internet). Fog lights are different from your normal driving lights as they are situated lower on your vehicle and are designed to emit a lower and flatter beam of light to go under the mist/fog which then enables you to see further on the road surface. The correct way to operate fog lights in day time is with your PARK lights only. At night you may use your normal head lights. However do NOT use high beams at any time in fog/mist as not only does it blind you and reduce your sight range but it also makes it very difficult on other drivers.

Spot Lights are designed to be used in hours of darkness to illuminate the road and surroundings. Spot lights should be wired to only work with the high beams settings on your car. It is important to note that you need to dip your spotlights if you are within 200 metres of any other car or pedestrian as it is an offence to dazzle other road users. Obviously if you are turning a corner and notice a car just after the turn, you just need to lower them as soon as possible. Be aware that Halo Spotlights are illegal in this country unless you are off-road. If the Halo ring illuminates when you have your headlights on then you will need to remove them from your car. Also Spotlights need to be mounted in pairs and only in the forward third of your vehicle. Any spotlights that are situated behind the driver's compartment are mounted incorrectly.

LED Light Bars are very similar to spotlights and illuminate the road surface better. They must be mounted in the forward third of the vehicle and be wired with the headlights. However they do not need to be mounted in pairs. See Figure C for an example.

Running/Driving Lights A new great safety feature being put across new car designs now. They are small LED lights that are mounted under or near your headlights and are very bright. They are designed to assist other motorists in seeing your vehicle during day time hours particularly sunrise and sunset; however they should turn off when you activate your headlights as they are too bright for night time driving. Be aware if they are not mounted on your car from the factory and you wish to apply them to your vehicle, you will need to get it done professionally and get an engineering permit for them. This permit will have to be in your vehicle if you are stopped by Police.

SCAMS - In the last Blarney Ian made reference to an email scam he had received. The Western Australia Police Major Fraud Squad combined resources with the Western Australian Department of Commerce to combat relationship fraud - Project Sunbird. They have identified that each month approximately 600 to 700 victims are sending a total of \$600K to \$1 Million through a combination of money wire transfers and EFT to fraudsters. To report a scam phone 1300 304 054 or go on line www.scamnet.wa.gov.ay/ProjectSunbird.

HOUSE/LOT NUMBERS Such a small thing can literally mean the difference between life and death in an emergency situation. Emergency services can waste precious minutes trying to find a house or lot number when responding to an emergency. Please take the time to ensure you have your number clearly displayed so your property can be easily identified, especially in some of our more remote and rural locations.



Thousands of lives saved in bowel cancer screening roll out

At least 70,000 Australian bowel cancer deaths will be prevented in the coming 40 years thanks to a five-year plan to finalise the national bowel cancer screening program announced in the recent federal budget.

Cancer Council WA said it's pleased that a commitment to complete the program has finally been made, after being introduced more than 10 federal budgets ago.

Cancer Council WA's Bowel Cancer Education Coordinator, Dayna Cenin, said the complete roll out of the program is both welcome and timely.

"Bowel cancer is the number one cancer for Western Australian men and women and kills more people each year than breast or prostate cancers, yet most cases can be cured if detected early," Ms Cenin said.

"What's more, bowel cancer is one of the most preventable cancers, especially when it's caught early - and screening help us to do exactly that, which is why Cancer Council is so pleased that we will soon have a fully implemented screening program."

60 year old Linda Nicholls of Beverley said she knows all too well how important screening is, after undergoing surgery for bowel cancer five years ago.

Mrs Nicholls said after a string of tests, she was eventually diagnosed with bowel cancer, but in hindsight she wishes she had done the test.

"It's so easy, it's a simple test and there's no need to be embarrassed," Mrs Nicholls said.

The National Bowel Cancer Screening Program (NBCSP) currently screens

eligible Australians aged 50, 55, 60 and 65 with an immunochemical faecal occult blood test (iFOBT).

The complete implementation of the NBCSP will mean that two yearly screening with iFOBT for those aged 50 to 74, will be in place by 2020.

"This is an important and exciting time. Right now there are thousands of Australians in apparently good health who have an early-stage bowel cancer or a pre-cancerous polyp who show no symptoms of the disease," Ms Cenin said. "By screening all Australians aged 50 and over every two years, we'll be able to pick up a significant number of those cases when they are relatively easy to treat.

"The iFOBT is a non-invasive test that's easy to do in the privacy of your own home, but this simple test could save

"Of course, it's important to know the signs and symptoms of bowel cancer, such as bleeding from the back passage or any sign of blood after a bowel motion, changes in usual bowel pattern (constipation or diarrhoea), abdominal pain and bloating, and unexplained anaemia.

"But it's equally important to know that bowel cancer often develops without symptoms which is why regular screening for bowel cancer is essential," Ms Cenin said.

Linda Nicholls can attest to that.

"Bowel cancer is very silent; this test is a simple way to know at an early stage if there are any signs of the disease. "There are times that you just need to look behind," she said.

Eligible people will receive an invitation in the mail from the Federal Government, and shortly after will receive the FOBT kit, which is completed in the comfort of your own home and sent off to a pathology lab for analysis.

If the FOBT finds blood, which only occurs in about 7% of cases, further tests are needed (usually a colonoscopy).

Those who screen for bowel cancer using FOBT are more likely to have their cancer found at an earlier, less advanced stage, which means the treatment is less invasive and the chances of survival are better.



My Health and Wellbeing Who's Responsible?

Quite often we get told to get ourselves off to the doctor and he will deal with our health and/or wellbeing issue? How wrong! The doctor will often give a diagnosis, treatment, options and/or assistance, but it is us as individuals that has to ultimately make decisions which then drives the outcome.

Some American research has been conducted highlighting that our medical system quite often only repairs damage caused by poor lifestyle choices impacting on our health. It points out that:-

70% of our health status is about lifestyle;

10% is genetic;

10% is environmental; and

10% is the health system.

Undoubtedly the major impact is lifestyle choices. This substantiates the message that "it is our health".

On all three health and wellbeing fronts (physical, mental and social/spiritual) the individual is the driver. Whether it be situational distress, a cancer diagnosis, a diagnosed mental health issue, a social/spiritual wellbeing issue (surrounding our identity, individuality or sense of belonging), the doctor will only provide the framework to follow (from diagnosis to treatment options) but decisions and changes ultimately need to be made by us.

All of our life we have to make informed decisions on a variety of issues to do with our family, work and social activities, why then should our health and wellbeing be any different? Blokes in general are decision makers, that is how we are hardwired. The warrior attitude is an admirable attribute especially when dealing with sporting and business challenges. However, this same attitude can cause us to neglect/postpone important aspects and not correctly prioritise decisions around our health and wellbeing.

Some familiar comments we often hear from blokes when discussing health and wellbeing issues are:

- it won't happen to me;
- we know the issues, but we don't want to show ourselves as the "only one" with a problem;
- I will just see how that pain in my back goes (for 6 years!)

Resilience seems to be the buzz word at the minute, but in how we deal with our health does come down to our resilience and ability to cope with the unexpected. I heard it summarized like this, "life is tough, but we can cope".

The buck stops with us "as blokes" to be the decision maker on our health and wellbeing, it is our health not the doctor's, wife's or mate's, but ours. Small Landholder News

Winter is certainly here! As the rain and cold weather settle-in over the next couple of months there are a number of things you will need to keep on top of.

If you haven't already done so now is a great time to check dams, water courses, tanks, drains, gutter and rooves. Dams and water courses can become contaminated with faecal matter, debris and even chemical run-off during winter rains.

By checking to see if tanks, drains, gutter and rooves are working correctly, you can minimise flooding problems when more significant rain is received. Also by inspecting for blockages, damage, rust or other problems you can expect to capture all the rain to come without incident.

Too many times we forget that safety should be our number one concern. In Australia in 2013 there were 59 on farm deaths reported and 17% of these were children. Quad bikes and tractors are the main cause of fatalities and injuries on farms. Last year quad bike related deaths were reported most frequently (15), followed by tractor incidents (9). Take the time to know how best to handle these vehicles and make sure you keep them well maintained (see SLIS's 'Handling ATVs on small properties' available at agric.wa.gov.au/slis).

Safety should also be taken seriously when dealing with livestock. Many small producers or livestock owners are unaware of the importance of biosecurity and if you run any number of livestock, you need a biosecurity plan.

A biosecurity plan should cover the steps you would take when bringing animals onto your property (e.g. inspection, identification), managing the biosecurity risks already present on your property (e.g. monitoring animals, restricting visitors) and the steps you would take when moving animals off your property (see SLIS's 'Biosecurity plans for small landholders' available at agric.wa.gov.au/slis).

For those landholders interested in learning more about running a horticulture enterprise, the Small Landholder Information Service recently launched *The Horticulture Handbook – a reference guide for establishing horticulture enterprises in Western Australia. This time of year is also a great time to incorporate organic manures into your soil, as there is less risk of fly breeding in July.



Lyme Disease....Prevention

Prevention when outside near bush or grassy areas

- Wear long sleeve shirts, enclosed shoes, long pants, & tuck the pants into your socks (even though it looks daggy)
- Spray an insect repellent on your clothes that contains DEET* (make sure you wash your hands and any areas that may have had exposure to the DEET¹ when you return inside, or before you eat).
 After you come inside, check your clothes, hands, hairline, neck, & behind your ears for ticks (do a tick check)
 Spray an insect repellent on your clothes that contains DEET* (make sure you wash your hands and any areas that may have had exposure to the DEET¹ when you return inside, or before you eat)
- <u>DEET</u> is N,N-Diethyl-meta-toluamide, abbreviated DEET, is a slightly yellow oil. It is the most common active ingredient in insect repellents. It is intended to be applied to the skin or to clothing, and is primarily used to repel mosquitoes. In particular, DEET protects against tick bites, preventing several rickettsioses, tick-borne meningoencephalitis and other tick-borne diseases such as Lyme disease. It also protects against mosquito bites which can transmit dengue fever, West Nile virus, eastern equine encephalitis, and malaria.

Found a tick already attached to your body?

- Remove them carefully with long nosed tweezers or pronged tick removers that are designed to go under the body taking out at the head. It is very critical that you avoid squeezing the tick and it's toxic contents into your blood stream:
- Do not cover the tick in methylated spirits, rubbing alcohol, bi-carbonate of soda, Vaseline, any other substance
 or burn it with a match this will make the tick release bacteria-containing Lyme disease (as well as other
 organisms and disease) into your blood stream; and
- After you have removed the tick you should go to your General Practitioner and get a course of prophylactic antibiotics (100-200mg of Doxycycline twice a day, plus flagyl twice a day for 6 weeks) (don't forget it is vital when taking antibiotics to take a good pro-biotic 2 hours after you have taken the antibiotics so that the good bacteria in your gut can be maintained and side effects of the antibiotics reduced). This prophylactic course of antibiotics dramatically reduces (but does not eliminate completely) your chances of going on to develop disease.

If you find ticks on your clothes, pick them off with tweezers and put them in a plastic zip lock bag & freeze if you can't post immediately. To prevent ticks from drying out add a couple of moist cotton wool balls to the bag. Mark the bag with date & location where the tick was found & include the state. Mail to Ann Mitrovic. Tick Borne Disease Research Unit. Room 294, Blackburn Building. DO 6. The University of Sydney. NSW 2006.

Don't limit yourself to ticks. All blood sucking arthropods (insects) such as mosquitoes, fleas & lice are of great interest to the research unit.

Or contact Jeff & Wendy Murray & we will gladly send on tick for testing as it will take an infected tick to be found for this disease to be accepted as being in Australia & we would so pleased to see that happen.


