

President Report September 2014

Shire Rates Due by Monday 8th September 2014

Payment of your rates is required before or on Monday 8th September as after this date penalty interest will apply. Rates paid in full by this date receive a 10% discount.

Local Government Convention

Crs Pepper, Davis and Ridgway along with CEO Steve Gollan attended the recent Local Government Convention in Perth which presented a good opportunity for networking and information gathering. Among the notable conference speakers were former Prime Minister John Howard and Rabia Siddique, a criminal and human rights lawver and former terrorism and war crimes prosecutor. Another treat for those walking or driving along the Terrace were the Local Government Banners, with the Beverley Banner located right out the front of Council House.

Hon Dean Nalder MLA, Minister for Transport; Finance visits Avondale

The Minister for Transport visited Beverley at the end of July and following a brief tour of the Avondale Heritage Precinct met with Shire Councillors, senior staff and the Hon Mia Davies MLA at the Avondale homestead. This provided an opportunity for candid discussion between the Minister and meeting representatives regarding a variety of transport related issues.

<u>Health Services in Beverley – a</u> United Approach

Whilst the health sector is not core business for Local Government, the community looks to Council for advocacy, advice, leadership and financial commitment (such as retention of a local medical practice). To define an appropriate role for Councils' interface with the health system and more broadly, a report funded by Medicare Local has been commissioned from Virtual Health by Council to provide clarity regarding the Shire of Beverley's overall role in health and aged care, and on a

range of issues and opportunities within the Shire.

Also a variety of activities and events have occurred during 2014 sound aimed at building а relationship between the Shire, Beverley Health Service, Beverley Medical Practice and community:-

- most recently being a presence at the Beverley Show by the three parties
- quarterly meetings between the Shire President, CEO, Health Services Manager and Beverley Medical Practice
- reactivated Local Health Advisory Group, chaired by Cr Keith Murray, who has also become a member of the District Health Advisory Committee
- "Body Holding Facility"(former morgue) soon to be available for St John Ambulance use
- collaboration between the Shires of Beverley, Brookton and Pingelly with a view to progressing sustainable aged care planning, services and support within and between our communities

Water Harvesting

Several meetings have now been held with a view to progress the concept of street water harvesting in the Beverley town site. Investigations are underway regarding assistance to implement such a plan through the Department of Water, Community Water Supply Program.

Fire-break Order

Don't forget to attend to your firebreaks as per the information contained in the Shire of Beverley Information Booklet sent out with the rate notices. Relevant firebreaks need to be installed by 1st November and maintained until 15th April. A reminder also that paddock burns require a firebreak completely surrounding the area to be burnt. The Firebreak Order is available on the beverley.wa.gov.au website.

APPLICATIONS FOR PLANNING APPROVAL

All development, including a change in the use of land, unless exempt, requires the prior approval of Council. An Application for Planning Approval is required for:

- Single houses in Town Centre, Rural Residential, Rural Townsite and Farming Zones;
- Industrial and commercial buildings;
- Sheds and other outbuildings in all zones;
- Modifying the natural landform such as by earthworks, dams and drainage works;
- Changes made to an existing use of land and/or buildings, which may not include any construction, such as a panel beater proposing to occupy an existing building;
- Development on sites listed in Council Municipal Heritage Inventory, including demolition and renovations; and
- Use of rural land for intensive agriculture, such as irrigated plantations and pasture, feedlots, piggeries and aquaculture.

Some development proposals might be exempt from requiring an Application for Planning Approval. Please check with the Shire Planner to determine whether this is the case for your proposal. Please note, that even though the development proposal might be exempt from obtaining Planning Approval, it might still require a Building Permit. Examples of exemptions include:

- Single dwellings in Residential zones that comply with all Town Planning Scheme No. 2 and Residential Design Codes requirements;
- Carrying out of internal works on any buildings that do not alter the external appearance of the building;
- Patios, carports and verandas proposed to be attached to a dwelling that complies with the Town Planning Scheme No. 2 requirements.



Cleaning tips

The following tips will help to ensure your difficult-to-clean eligible farm chemical containers will be accepted for recycling at your local drumMUSTER collection centre.



Suspension concentrates (Atrazine, Simazine, etc)

- Rinse your container immediately after use to ensure any chemical residue does not dry
- *****
- Use methylated spirits to remove dried residue. If this doesn't work, fill the container with water and soak for at least 24 hours before rinsing.
 - Oil-based chemicals (ULVs, LVs)



Follow specific instructions on the product label or contact the manufacturer for further assistance

Other chemical residues



- Rinse container immediately after use as all chemical residues are much harder to remove when dry
- Some containers may require additional rinsing (more than three rinses)



A brush or high pressure hose may be required to clean stubborn or dried chemical residue

ELIGIBLE CONTAINERS WITH DIRT, RUST AND DYE STAINS ARE NOT CONSIDERED HAZARDOUS AND ARE THEREFORE ACCEPTED AT drumMUSTER COLLECTION CENTRES

Australian farmers are well recognised as environmental stewards, owning, managing and caring for 61% of our countries land mass.

COLLECTION OF USED OIL FROM FARMS PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The objective of this project is to identify and collect used oil from farms in WA.

While the ability to collect this oil has always been there, locating and identifying the amount has not, resulting in many litres of oil being held or disposed of on farms, and that oil is a direct threat to the environment.

By establishing a simple recording method through local shire councils it is hoped a large amount of this oil can be recovered and treated properly.

IT IS ENVISAGED THAT MOST OF THIS RECOVERY CAN BE DONE FREE OF CHARGE AND THE ROLE OF THE SHIRES WOULD BE MINIMAL.



WWI Project - Remembering Them: Naomi Lam from WA Museum has reported that our panel information has been forwarded to the Royal Western Australian Historical Society for an accuracy check.

Beverley District High School



Disability - Aged Care - Carers Centrelink payments:- To qualify for any types of benefits, the criteria if getting more difficult to understand and the forms are getting increasingly difficult to complete. The range of questions incudes car trailers, age, make value, licence and the same applies to cars, boats and other vehicles etc. Therefore take extra care when you are filling in any type of forms for either Centrelink or Veteran Affairs and all attachments, when requested, should be certified by a IP or other qualified witness. Please ensure that you hold onto the original documentation and certificates.

Impounding of vehicles/fines infringements by Police Authorities under the Road Traffic Authorities Traffic Act: First phone the Northam Police and seek direction as to how to go about these matters: I have been informed that some of these forms/affidavits need to be witnessed by a Justice of Peace or a court officer and remember that the storage for the vehicle is calculated on a daily basis. this will be over and above the fine imposed. As these matters usually end up in court, seek legal advice before you proceed. Remember on all such matters, the authorities have access to background checks. Fill in paperwork very carefully.







Beverley Health Service Profile (Aug 2014)

Below you will find all the health services provided by Beverley MPS and other health service organisations to provide a comprehensive service to meet the needs of the local community.

Emergency Services:

Emergency department is staffed 24/7 by triage competent Registered Nurses. These nurses are supported by General Practitioners (GP) and the Emergency Telehealth Service (ETS) for immediate assessment, care planning, stabilisation and further treatment, dependent on triage or urgency category. The ETS service is run by Emergency Department Specialist Physicians.

Emergency and urgent transport is provided via SJA/RFDS/Rescue Helicopter.

Outpatient Services:

Staffed by nursing staff and services provided include wound dressings, blood pressure monitoring, removal of sutures, blood tests, ECGs, continuation of antibiotic therapy. Minor procedures may be undertaken by the GP from Beverley Medical Practice.

Pathology Services:

Supported by Western Diagnostics at Beverley Medical Practice. Urgent pathology can be transported to York or Northam.

Pharmacy:

There is a resident pharmacist in the town. The Health Service is supported by the Chief Pharmacist based at Narrogin Hospital.

Residential Aged Care Service:

Beverley MPS has a low level residential care facility called Alex Miles Lodge with 12 low care beds.


There are also 4 high care residential beds at the hospital. Beverley MPS can also accommodate care for clients awaiting placement at another facility.

Palliative Care:

Some palliative care is provided in the community and in the hospital when the patient and families care needs are higher. The MPS work in collaboration with the Wheatbelt Cancer and Palliative Care Support Service. They are also able to access specialised equipment loans through Northam Hospital.

Aboriginal Health:

Advice about and access to the Wheatbelt
Aboriginal Health Services (WAHS) is available
through the Aboriginal Health Worker based at
Quairading. Social and Emotional Wellbeing
Services are provided by WAHS in Northam who
also run the Boodjari Yorga Program and No More
Nyumree Clinics.



Child Health:

Weekly visits from a child health nurse who provides services including immunisation, growth assessments and information for parents. A School Health Nurse also visits the Beverley Schools. All Child Development Team referrals are processed through Northam Regional Hospital.

Community Aged Care Services:

The Home and Community Care (HACC) program, through the wellness approach, provides basic support services to some older people, people with a disability and their carers. This service is to assist them to continue living independently at home. This includes:

- support to participate in social activity in a group or one-to-one setting
- day centre two days a week which is also supported by volunteers
- assistance with everyday household tasks
- assistance to enhance nutrition, function, strength, independence and safety
- assistance to support client independence in personal care activities such as showering and dressing
- assistance with essential activities, shopping, banking and social contacts.

Current staffing includes a HACC Coordinator, Day Centre Assistant, Activities Officer, as well as nursing and carer support through hospital staff.

Extended Care Services:

This is provided in the community by nursing staff.

Mental Health Services:

- Mental Health Services appointments can be arranged at Beverley Health Service (including telehealth consultations)
- Counselling Services: Service provision as required, delivered by Holyoake Counsellors who are based in Northam
- Alcohol and Drug Services are also available on an as needs basis
- Needle and Syringe exchange program is provided on site

Health Promotion and Education:

Services/facilities are available from the Wheatbelt Public Health Unit include Aboriginal Health, Alcohol and Drug, Child Health, Continence Management and Education, Diabetes Management and Education. Services are provided as needed in clinic rooms, community settings and via video conference.



Allied Health Services:

All appointments and referrals processed through Beverley Health Service.

- Speech Therapist fortnightly (Wednesdays)

Tribute to Beth Hutchinson

from the Beverley Historical Society

It is with regret that we mourn the passing of founding Beverley Historical Society member, Beth Hutchinson who died unexpectedly on 25 July.



In 2011, Beth found time to document her memories as a child in the Beverley district. She was born Elizabeth Ann Edwards in 1929 in the Beverley Maternity Hospital. Her first home on the farm, out Bally Bally way, was a mud batt house with a bullnose tin roof.

Beth was educated first at the Convent school, then by Correspondence and, when the school bus service was introduced, at Beverley State School before a final three years at boarding school in Katanning.

She married Bob Hutchinson in 1952 and moved to the West Dale where they farmed for 30 years, raising three children, before retiring to Hunt Rd in town.

Her family says she was resilient, forgiving & loving. Her friends say she had a wicked sense of humour and could be fiercely independent.

Beth was the founding Treasurer of the Historical Society for seven years from 1976 to 1982, the Secretary for three years 1986 to 1988 and served the Society again as President for three years from 1992 to 1994.

Many of the younger generation who experienced an "Olden Days" morning at the Dead Finish Museum will remember Beth's instruction in "washing the old-fashioned way". Beth called on her own experience as a child to give practical demonstrations of washing routines before the ready availability of electric washing machines.



Beth devoted over thirty years to the Historical Society and the Dead Finish Museum, and we celebrate her enthusiasm for local history and her animated efforts to pass this interest on to the children of Beverley.

Beth was a remarkable member of our Society and an outstanding citizen of our community.

Warriors Wellbeing Article Looking after your Mates (...are you okay??)

On the back of the Regional Men's Health Initiative delivering a paper to the National Suicide Prevention Conference in Perth last month, we thought it was appropriate to talk about suicide from a primary carer's point of view. As a community we have to be able to talk openly and frankly about suicide, because without using the word suicide we can't talk about it and make a difference.

Caring for ourselves and each other is a primary responsibility for all human beings. Sometimes we are so busy with our lives that we fail to see signs of despair, hopelessness, desperation and depression in those we live and/or work with. Failure to recognize these signs could have life threatening consequences.

When we consider that 80% of suicides in Australia are men, it is important to develop an understanding of "life problems" in our own lives and the lives of others around us. Suicide is not a standard list of risk factors, it is always contextual and personal. Suicide prevention is everyone's business.

When dealing with "intense" life problems, thoughts of suicide can be a "normal" reaction and become part of the problem solving process. Research tells us that most of us will have "suicidal thought" during our lives, but we will not harbour them. It is when people can't get rid of bad thoughts and ideas that it becomes a problem. Suicide can affect anyone, anywhere, at any time.

Three things you need to commit to memory about suicide are:-

- 1. People don't want to die, they want to stop the pain.
- 2. It is safe to talk about it.
- 3. Know where to go for help (Lifeline 131 114, Mensline 1300 789 978)

Our educational programs' philosophy is to assist and encourage men to be able to identify who their mates are. Our experience, based on research and anecdotal information, is that many people, particularly men, in our fast moving society have not identified key people in their lives who they can turn to in times of distress and crisis.

The Regional Men's Health Initiative promotes the simple slogan "before it all gets too much...Talk to a Mate" or talk it over. This slogan is the basis of all our initiatives. Suicide awareness is mentioned and part of every education session we present, but not the focus.

We do however have one 2 hour education session titled, "Looking after your Mates (... are you okay??) that does focus on suicide awareness and primary care.

"Primary Care" is ordinary people looking after "Their Mates". We promote an inclusive responsibility that everyone is a primary carer of family, friends and neighbours. Our focus is always on "ordinary people caring for people" appropriately supported by good medical and psychological services.

Most of us will not know how others around us are feeling unless we care enough to ask. Warning signs may not be obvious but any changes from the normal in respect to appearance, behaviour and/or conversation may provide a vital clue.

World Suicide Prevention Day is on the 10th September, let's have that conversation and if you are concerned about someone ask "how are you going?"
