



Local Government Elections

A definitive response from voters at the recent Local Government elections has resulted in newly elected Councillor Darryl Brown and re-elected Councillors Keith Murray, Lew Shaw, David White and Dee Ridgway making their Declarations of Office at a Special Meeting of Council on Tuesday 20th October 2015 before Mr Fred Bremner JP. The election of Shire President and Deputy Shire President for the ensuing two year term and respective Declarations of Office was also undertaken. Councillor Ridgway was re-elected as Shire President and Councillor Murray elected Deputy Shire President.

Draft Urban Design Proposal

Thank you to those who have provided comment following an initial round of community consultation toward a draft urban design proposal for the Vincent street precinct. From this feedback a revised draft will be developed for community discussion in 2016.

Roadworks on Westdale Road

Without impacting too much on harvest traffic, and following works to stabilize and widen a section near Luptons road, upgrades continue on Westdale road from the Great Southern Highway end, which had a large culvert replaced and widened last year.

Aeronautical Museum Open Day

An aeronautical museum open day was held on Sunday 11th October 2015 with heritage consultant Michelle Slarke who has been engaged to provide a significance assessment report on the collection. The workshop attracted 8 participants, 5 being former volunteers at the museum. CHECKLIST PREPARING YOUR PROPERTY PAGE 1 OF 3

Prepare your home and property for the bushfire season. It is everyone's responsibility.

STARVE THE FIRE	FILL THE GAPS	
Reduce the fuel loads around your home so that embers will have less chance to start a fire when they hit the ground. This will also help reduce the damage caused by the fire.	Houses usually catch fire when embers get into the roof space, a wall cavity, on to ledges or under the house. Prevent sparks from entering your house by blocking all the gaps.	
For at least 20 metres around your home and other buildings: Cut long grass and dense scrub. Remove dead material. Remove all rubbish and rake up leaf litter, twigs, bark and material that may catch fire. Maintain a minimum two metre gap between your house and tree branches. Make sure that no trees overhang the house. Prune lower branches (up to two metres off the ground) to stop a fire on the ground spreading to the canopy of the trees. Do not clump shrubs, ensure that there is a gap. Shrubs should be planted at a distance of at least three times their height at maturity from buildings. Other actions you will need to take: Keep your gutters free of leaves and other combustible material. Create a mineral earth firebreak, with no vegetation along your boundary. Build your paths adjacent to the building and have your driveway placed so that it maximises the protection to the house. If possible, plan your garden so that your vegetable garden, lawn, pool or patio is on the side of the house likely to face a fire (where the bush is). Store firewood away from the building. Ensure that your gas bottles are secured and positioned so that it will vent away from the building if it is subject to flame contact or radiant heat. Ensure fences are non-combustible so they can help to shield your home from a bushfire and radiant heat.	Block any gaps under floor spaces, in the roof space, under eaves, external vents, skylights, chimneys and wall cladding. Place metal fly wire mesh on all windows, vents and install an ember protection screen on evaporative air conditioners to keep sparks and embers out. FIX THE FIRE TRAPS Do not pile wood against or near the house. Remove any timber, rubbish and old junk lying around. Move all fuel containers into a shed away from your house and have a firebreak around it. Keep gas cylinders on the side of the house furthest away from the likely direction of a fire (where the bush is). Ensure the pressure relief valve is directed away from the house. Store gas cylinders upright and secure them with a metal chain to a secure, non-combustible post to prevent cylinders from falling over. PROTECT YOUR ASSET Have a sufficient independent water supply of at least 20,000 litres and a petrol, diesel or a generator powered pump capable of pumping 400 litres per minute. Check that your home and contents insurance cover is adequate. Take into consideration renovations, fixtures and additions such as swimming pools, sheds, gazebos, luxury fittings or new appliances.






CHECKLIST PREPARING YOUR PROPERTY PAGE 2 OF 3

BUILDING PROTECTION ZONE (CIRCLE OF SAFETY)

- Create a minimum 20 metre building protection zone around your home and other buildings. Reduce the fuel load in this area by removing all rubbish, keeping grass cut short, and raking up leaf litter, twigs, bark and material that may catch fire.
 - Prune lower branches (up to two metres off the ground) to stop a ground fire spreading into the canopy of the trees.
- Create a mineral earth firebreak along the boundary of your property. Make sure you meet your local government's firebreak requirements.
 - Cut long grass and prune the scrub so that it is not dense, and does not have fine, dead aerated material in the crown of the scrub.



- Do not pile wood against or near the house
- 2 Install a fire or heat radiation shield such as a solid fence
- 3 Place metal fly wire mesh on all windows, vents and install an ember protection screen on evaporative air conditioners to keep sparks and embers out
- Block any gaps under floor spaces, in the roof space, under eaves, external vents, skylights, chimneys and wall cladding
- Create and maintain a minimum two metre gap between your 5 house and tree branches
- Rake up leaf litter and twigs under trees 6
- 7 Remove shrubs and small trees under and between larger trees
- Ensure garden mulch is kept away from the house and grass is 8 kept short
- Ensure all gaps in external wall claddings are sealed
- Keep roof gutters and valleys clear of leaves and bark

- 11 Keep gas cylinders on the side of the house furthest away from the likely direction of a fire (where the bush is). Ensure the pressure relief valve is directed away from the house. Store gas cylinders upright and secure them with a metal chain to a secure, non-combustible post to prevent cylinders from falling over
- 12 Block any gaps in the roof space
- 13 Hoses must be long enough to reach all parts of your house. Use metal hose fittings for taps as they are less likely to melt
- 14 Remove flammable materials and store them away from the house
- 15 Have a sufficient independent water supply of at least 20,000 litres and a petrol, diesel or a generator powered pump capable of pumping 400 litres per minute.

Cockatoo and Bat Monitoring Project with Men's Shed and NRM



October is Pink Ribbon Month and 'Girls Night In'

Every day in Australia, around 50 women are told they have breast or a gynaecological cancer every day and sadly around 12 Australian women will die from a women's cancer.

Breast cancer is the most common cancer for women. Breast cancer can occur at any age. It is more common in women aged over 60 but nearly one-quarter of women are younger than 50. In WA in 2012, 1569 women were diagnosed with breast cancer (31% of all cancers in women).

Gynaecological cancers. In WA in 2012, 461 women were diagnosed with a gynaecological cancer (9% of all cancers in women). The most common gynaecological cancers are Uterine (womb), Ovarian and Cervical cancer. Cervical cancer is the most preventable due to the National Cervical Screening Program.

Signs and symptoms of breast and gynaecological cancers

- Abnormal vaginal discharge or bleeding, (particularly after menopause)
- · Pain after or during sexual intercourse
- · Nipple sores, nipple discharge or turning in
- · Skin of the breast dimpling, rash or red swollen breasts
- Unusual lumps or changes such as severe itchiness, lump or changes such as burning, soreness, swelling,
- . New lumps or thickening in the breast or under the arm
- Changes in bowel/bladder function ie, constipation, diarrhoea, need to urinate more
 often
- Excessive tiredness/fatigue
- Indigestion
- · Leg pain or swelling
- · Low back pain, abdominal or pelvic pain
- Menstrual irregularities
- Lower abdominal swelling and/or discomfort (pressure, bloating, feeling full even after a light meal,)

If you have had any of these signs or symptoms, tell your doctor. It doesn't mean you've got cancer – usually they turn out to be something less serious. But it's important to tell your doctor and get them checked.

Remember, if it is cancer, the earlier it's found, the earlier it can be treated.

Healthy Body - Healthy Mind

Fermenting is Fun. Fermenting your own foods can be a healthy, fun, and nutritious hobby. I feel that anything you can make at home is much better than commercialized foods.

The Power of Microbes. We live in a world dominated by microbes however our civilization is but a pale comparison to the invisible world of microbes that surrounds us. Our ancient ancestors did not live in a sterile environment. It is likely that they ingested various microbes found naturally in their food; some were beneficial to their life while others caused infections and disease. Our intestines have evolved into a perfect microbial farm. We provide these microbes with plenty of natural food; in return, they produce beneficial nutrients and help defend us from pathogens. About a thousand years ago, our ancestors began to experiment fermenting their own foods with beneficial bacteria strains to prevent spoilage, fight infections and increase absorption of nutrients. This action further allied our bodies with the microbial world.

Benefits of Fermented Foods:

In the early 1900's research discovered that yoghurt was a major contribution to benefit the human. Today, if you search the internet on probiotics, you will find an almost endless supply of reasons why "good bacteria" are good for you. In this section of my writing I hope to convince you that fermenting your own foods is cheaper, more fun, and better for you than just popping a pill of freeze dried bacteria. If there is anything that the microbial world does well, it is detoxifying things. Europeans used wine as a source of clean, durable water. Bulgarians perfected the art of detoxifying and preserving milk by removing the lactose and predigesting the proteins and transforming it into yoghurt and cheese. The Caucasians used Kefir grains for the same purpose: detoxifying milk products to make Kefir. Vegetables were also fermented to preserve them from spoilage. Most of the pickled products found on our grocery shelves were at one time fermented product: pickles and sauerkraut. Competition

between microbes can be fierce. The good bacteria that are normal inhabitants of our intestinal tracts will fight off many foreign intruders. They are the first line of defence in the war of infection. Fermented products are a great source of amino acids, vitamins, and minerals and must be alive when you eat them in order to reap their benefits. It does no good to ingest dead, good bacteria. Furthermore, good quality probiotics are often very expensive. We all know how to pickle food. Pickling and fermenting is NOT the same. Foods that are pickled are those that have been preserved in an acidic medium. In the case of various types of supermarket pickles on the shelf, the pickling brine comes from vinegar. This is not fermenting. Vegetables that you preserve in jars and let ferment in your kitchen using only a starter, salt and good water create their own self preserving acidic liquid that is a by-product of the fermentation process. This lactic acid is incredibly beneficial to digestion when consumed along with the fermented vegetables or even when sipped alone once the vegetables are eaten. In other words, homemade fermented veggies are both fermented and pickled.

Please use Caution:

Before we get too far into fermenting your own foods, I want to emphasize two caveats of fermentation. First, the process of fermentation is only good for you if it occurs outside of your body. It means that if you ingest foods that provide an abundance of sugar and growth media for bacteria, they will ferment those foods inside of you. An overgrowth of fermentative bacteria in your body can cause all kinds of medical problems, including candidiasis and irritable bowel Syndrome. So the key is to pre-ferment your foods, that is to say, ferment your milk before you drink it. Secondly, do not eat spoiled fermented foods. In some rare instances, fermentation can be overtaken by mould or become spoiled. In these cases, throw out the result and start anew. There is heaps of information on the Internet, so take your time to peruse this topic at your leisure. It will do you much good, it will heal your gut problem and you will be much better once you have got used to this. I am coming to the end of this series. Next month I will write up a summary.

SUCCESSION PLANNING - A SERIES OF COMMENTARIES [6]

In my previous succession planning commentaries, I briefly addressed some matters that I recommended be considered by the owners and operators of farming businesses in Westem Australia. I now propose, over the next few commentaries, to look at, and comment upon, some of those matters in more detail so I may guide you as to the particular matters that need to be addressed and the order in which they should be addressed.

The family meeting - business succession plan

In our view to commence the process properly, the first meeting of the family should include all of the following, namely:

- The senior members of the family
- The "on farm" children and their spouses
- The "off farm" children and their spouses

It is our recommendation that an independent and trusted advisor of the family farming business (**Business**) be engaged to facilitate the first meeting. It may be appropriate to use the Business's accountant as the facilitator or, as I have become aware, a facilitator in the succession planning department of your banker. I am aware that one of the major rural banks in Western Australia has set up a succession planning department with the goal of assisting Businesses in succession planning.

Expectations of the generations

It is self evident that each of the abovementioned generations will have their own expectations and there will be differing expectations not only between the generations but within the generations. Accordingly, the very first step we recommend be taken at the first meeting is to allow each member of each generation to express openly and clearly their expectations for the Business.

Some of the common expectations which we have observed are as follows:

- Clear communication
- Clarity of expectations
- Security





Lyme Disease Association of Australia Murdoch University Tick Research raise new questions

The Australian Department of Health has been waiting for results from Murdoch University and the Karl McManus Foundation funded Sydney University research programs. University have just released their findings which raise more questions than they answer making the Sydney University Research even more significant.

The study identified novel candidate pathogens that warrant further scrutiny in the context of investigating so-called "Lyme-like disease" in Australia. Borrelia relapsing fever and "Candidatus Neoehrlichia" pathogens are being identified in new geographic regions throughout the world and their medical importance is well recognised. The aetiological agent of Australian "Lyme-like" illness has been a source of unresolved debate for many years and the discovery of these organisms in Australian I. holocyclus ticks may provide insights into this medical conundrum. Given the widespread presence of endosymbionts in arthropod vectors of disease, together with the fact that such symbionts may be resident in high numbers, our findings also highlight the potential for discovering important novel arthropod-associated bacteria that are in relatively low abundance.

The research must identify the causative agents of Lyme Disease in Australia. Lyme Disease Association with Ticks and other vectors must be resolved.

The results raise new questions about tick-borne pathogens in I. holocyclus ticks. In Australia A Lyme Disease suffer could be diagnosed with Attention deficit disorder (ADD), Bell's palsy, Bipolar, Brain tumour, Chronic fatigue syndrome (CFS), Chronic pain disorder, Colitis, Crohn's disease, Depression, Diabetes, Alzheimer's disease, Eczema, Encephalitis, Fatigue, Fever, Fibromyalgia, Fifth's disease, Flea bite, Flu-like symptoms, Gastroesophageal Reflux disease, Headache, Hives, Hyperthyroidism, Hypothyroidism, Infectious arthritis, Insect bite, Interstitial cysts, Irritable bowel syndrome, Juvenile arthritis, Lupus, Ménière's syndrome, Meningitis, Migraine headache, Multiple Sclerosis (MS), Osteoarthritis, Parkinson's disease, Peripheral neuropathy, Poison ivy, Prostatitis, Psoriatic arthritis, Psychiatric disorders, Raynaud's syndrome, Reactive arthritis, Relapsing fever, Rheumatoid arthritis, Scleroderma, Sjögren's syndrome, Sleep disorders, Sunburn, Stiff neck, Thyroid disease, Thyroid disorders, Vitamin B12 deficiency. These are just a few of the diagnosis that Borreliosis or The Australian Lyme Like **Illness** can present as.

This is why Australian research into Lyme Disease and Lyme Like Illness needs funds to determine the causative agents and promulgate proper diagnosis. (Thanks to Karl McManus Foundation for this information). ADF announces investigation into Lyme disease!

The Australian Department of Defence announced last week that there will be an investigation conducted by the Repatriation Medical Authority into Lyme disease and its effect on military personnel.

The inquiry will specifically look at "How Lyme disease may be suffered or contracted, or death from Lyme disease may occur, and the extent to which Lyme disease or death from Lyme disease may be war-caused, defence-caused, a service injury, a service disease or a service death".

Warriors Wellbeing - Men & Violence

An important question we all need to be asking ourselves as a community member is "how can we reduce overall societal violence"?

We need to take into account that the majority of violence in our society is men on men and it goes largely unreported to the police and has limited exposure in the media because it is too common a subject. Why is all the focus on male violence to females and children when all violence is abhorrent, evil and sick?

Under the umbrella of societal violence, men on men violence, statistically is the largest category and until this is recognised, talked about and addressed, all the other statistics relating to violence, in particular family/domestic violence, will be hard to change.

This is a tough conversation to have but it needs to be had. The historical background of our society, through thousands of years, has defined men by events that have condoned, championed, accepted and normalized violent actions. Many historical and current events are horrific and violent, such as the invasion of other countries, civil war, ethnic cleansing, and sporting contests both in the gladiator/roman days and today with modern day cage fighting as an example. This type of violence, usually men against men, is often called entertainment. Society justifies and supports it every day!

Traditionally for blokes our flight sequence is fear (we all have some) anger and then aggression. When we are talking with angry young (and old) men we need to continually put into place positive strategies substantiating that physical aggression and violence against **anybody** is not condoned and should not be part of modern society.

Family/Domestic violence can happen in any relationship and can happen to anyone. Victims can be men, women or children, perpetrators can be men or women. Family/Domestic violence encapsulates not just physical abuse but also emotional or psychological abuse, verbal abuse, sexual abuse and financial abuse. Recognising that you are in a violent relationship is an important first step. Things will not change for the better if you do nothing.

There are many commentators on family/domestic violence and it is disappointing that the majority ignore men and children. Do people realise that one in three victims of reported domestic/family violence is male? Therein lies the philosophical problem when we don't balance out the whole discussion. Random violent acts are being broadcasted by social media thus delivering instant gratification and adoration and promoting this violence in society as acceptable.

Just to repeat family/domestic violence is a subset of the total picture of violence, and in my opinion we will struggle to stop family/domestic violence without discussing the bigger picture. We need to be having an ongoing holistic community discussion on the broader issue of men and violence.

All of us men need to be having a discussion about tackling violence in our lives and saying yes to stopping violence against each other, against women, against children, and against the community.
