# SUMMARY

An application for planning approval for the construction of two retention basins, as part of the Beverley Water Harvesting Project, Lot 34 John Street & a section of Edwards Street Road Reserve, has been received. The application will be recommended for approval.

# BACKGROUND

The Beverley Water Harvesting Project Planning Report, states the following:

'A sustainable water supply is a strategic outcome for the Shire of Beverley. This project aims to achieve real, visible and sustainable improvement in the water supply by allowing for "runoff (to) be stored for re-use as a second class water supply for irrigation" (2003/08, Curtin University, Department of Civil Engineering, Beverley Drainage Study).

'The Beverley Water Harvest Project will involve construction of two retention basins that will capture storm water from town site streets and then, over a period of 4.9 days (at a full capacity of  $3,000 \text{ m}^3$ ), pump the water to the town dam. The basins will be sized to match a 30 - 40 mm rainfall event at each location.'

The subject properties are described as follows: Site for Retention Basin #1: Lot 34 John Street Zone: Reserved for *'Recreation and Open Space'* 

Site for Retention Basin #2: Section of Edwards Street Road Reserve (please refer to the locality maps in the attached *Project Planning Report*)

### COMMENT

Under the Shire of Beverley's Town Planning Scheme No. 2 (TPS 2), when an application for planning approval is made in respect to land within a Reserve, the Council shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the Reserve.

The proposed arrangement of civil works is such that Shire Planner submits that no negative effect will be had in regards to the ongoing use of the respective Reserves for their originally intended purposes, and henceforth the application will be recommended for approval.


Please find attached our certificate of title and a copy of the map showing the location of said land, and we would also appreciate knowing whom ownership of said land belongs to.



# SUMMARY

An application for planning approval for the establishment of a training facility for gun dogs in conjunction with an approved Kennel Facility (boarding & training facility) on 2369 (Lot 150) York-Williams Road, Dale had been received. The application will be recommended for approval.

# BACKGROUND

Council, during its meeting of February 2014 approved a kennel facility for boarding & training on 2369 (Lot 150) York Williams Road. The subject site is approximately 46ha in area, zoned *'Farming'* and contains an existing house and outbuildings.

The application at hand proposes to introduce training of gundogs at the same premises within a designate area, as described in the application documentation.

# The Development Proposal:

The applicants submit as followings:

'Training gundogs requires the use of firearms. As we have applied for a corporate license, WAPOL has informed us that we require a letter from the council stating that it knows that a business is being conducted at the premises which requires the use of firearms. For the most part the training of a dog does not require live ammunition.

'It progresses from starters pistol (cap gun) to .22 ramset powered dummy launchers to 12g primers only then to 12g field trial blanks. All of this initial training would be conducted in the designated training area as depicted on the site map.

'Gun training would not be commenced prior to 10am on any day and would be for no more than an hour per day. Dogs are initially trained on pelts then progress to pelt covered dummies and finally onto actual game. This being rabbit, fox and cat.

'The actual shooting of game could occur anywhere on the property. This holds true for any property owner who is shooting for the humane destruction of feral animal species. I honestly cannot give you times or exact locations that this will occur as we are shooting live animals which may present anywhere on the property. Obviously a shot would not be taken where there was a concern that the projectile would cross the property boundaries.

# COMMENT

Under the Shire of Beverley's Town Planning Scheme No. 2 (TPS 2) the proposed use is a *use not listed*. Clause 3.2.5 of TPS 2 states that where a land use is not listed Council may:

- a) Determine that the use is not consistent with the objectives and purposes of the particular zone and is therefore not permitted; or
- b) Determine by absolute majority that the proposed use may be consistent with the objectives and purpose of the zone and thereafter follow the advertising procedures of Clause 6.2 in considering an application for planning consent, following which Council may, at its discretion, permit the use.

Given that the proposed use will not preclude agricultural use of the property and will provide a much needed service to the community, it will be recommended Council determine that the proposed use may be consistent with the objectives and purpose of the Farming zone.

# **Consultation & Advertising**

In compliance with Clause 6.2 of TPS 2 the application was advertised for a period of 21 days. A total of 2 submissions were received comprising of no objections. A summary of the submissions received and officer's responses are detailed in the table below.

# Conclusion

As mentioned in the previous report to Council during February 2014 Shire Planner is of the opinion that a valuable service will be rendered by the establishment of this facility. The proposal, siting and design of the facility are regarded as being sensitive to the site constraints and to possible receptors in so far as noise pollution and other factors are concerned. It is also considered that the extension of the use to now also include the limited training of gundogs will further add value to the land use and the venture generally. It will be recommended that, given the deliberations above, the application be approved with minor modifications and appropriate conditions being imposed to address any relevant or anticipated concerns.

It will also be recommended the proposal be considered a land use that is consistent with the objectives of the Farming zone and Council grant planning approval.

# STATUTORY ENVIRONMENT

Subject to Council determination by absolute majority, as discussed above, the application may be considered consistent with the Shire of Beverley's Town Planning Scheme No. 2.





# How firearms are used in training dogs

Training gundogs requires the use of firearms. As we have applied for a corporate license, WAPOL has informed us that we require a letter from the council stating that it knows that a business is being conducted at the premises which requires the use of firearms.

For the most part the training of a dog does not require live ammunition. It progresses from starters pistol (cap gun) to .22 ramset powered dummy launchers to 12g primers only then to 12g field trial blanks. All of this initial training would be conducted in the designated training area as depicted on the site map.

Gun training would not be commenced prior to 10am on any day and would be for no more than an hour per day.

Dogs are initially trained on pelts then progress to pelt covered dummies and finally onto actual game. This being rabbit, fox and cat.

The actual shooting of game could occur anywhere on the property. This holds true for any property owner who is shooting for the humane destruction of feral animal species. I honestly cannot give you times or exact locations that this will occur as we are shooting live animals which may present anywhere on the property. Obviously a shot would not be taken where there was a concern that the projectile would cross the property boundaries.

# Calibre

We are mindful of the noise aspect of firearms and that it may impact on people. It is a rural area in which the culling of feral animals is occurring all the time. This having been said we have chosen the lowest powered firearms which are capable of completing the humane destruction of the mentioned feral species. We will not be using or discharging high powered centrefire rifles on this property.

The calibres we will use are: Shotgun either 12g or 20g .22LR rim fire .17HMR rim fire.

None if these firearms are particularly loud. Any work with the dogs at night under spotlight conditions would be no more than an hour or two duration and where possible sub sonic ammunition would be used. In the case of the .17HMR it would be a rarity if five shots were fired in a night.

As to why we train dogs for this type of work please see already submitted description of the business model. To do this properly would be a first for WA if not Australia.

Training dogs to be steady to shot is one part of our business. We still will be a boarding facility and still be training dogs for the general public in a wide variety of disciplines which don't require firearms.

# Detector dog for feral animal location and control.

# Overview

The use of dogs as a part of a feral animal control program is nothing new. Many countries inclusive of Australia have used dogs as part of a control program.

In the first part of this paper we discussed the Feral Animal CRC guidelines as to needing to know species left as compared to the older style of what was removed. That having been said there are many areas where, if baiting was done, it could have a significant impact on the environment and the community. With urban sprawl a continual problem effective and selective means of control of three main feral species, being the rabbit, the fox and the cat, will be required.

Problems Solved n Solutions Found Pty Ltd has implemented a combined approach to the control of feral animals in sensitive areas. Sensitive areas include areas close to housing, waterways or any other area where the use of 1080 baits would be potentially dangerous. Our premise may be considered to be old fashioned.. but historically it has also been shown as highly effective as a control measure. Eradication of feral species on the mainland is accepted as not being possible.

# Rabbits

To control rabbits we utilize a combination of factors. If warrens are present we use teams of ferrets and if in close proximity to dwellings use nets to capture the rabbits. We avoid the use of male ferrets due to their ability to catch and kill rabbits or any other species which is located in a warren. Once in the piano nets which cover the exits from the warrens the rabbits are humanely dispatched. This method is highly effective when poison or shooting would not be safe to complete.

There are times where warrens are under structures where no obvious exit holes are apparent. In these situations ferrets can still be used but would be supported by shooters and trained dogs. In this situation the rabbit is flushed from the warren by the ferrets and the dog remains by the shooters side until sent to retrieve a shot rabbit. We do not support or condone the use of a coursing dogs.

In the advent of significant cover trained dogs can be used to flush the rabbits from cover and then assume a passive response, i.e. sit. Allowing for the game to be shot and then the dog directed to retrieve. In this situation only shotguns of either 20g or 12g would be used due to their limited range.

Finally further pressure in more rural areas could be put on rabbit populations by shooting with a .22LR under spotlight conditions. Again trained dogs would complete the pickup work which is particularly vital if the rabbit has only been wounded to effect humane dispatch.

# Foxes

The control of foxes would be a two pronged affair. The main reduction of foxes would be by spotlight and shooting with a .17HMR. This small calibre is highly effective with foxes out to 150m. This is the most powerful calibre we intend to use. In addition to this we have trained a mid-range dog to locate and passively indicate the location of fox dens. This would allow for trapping of the den residents if the area was not suitable for shooting or baiting, or the shooting of the foxes where suitable by sitting around 100m from the den using either night vision scopes or

traditional spotlights. This method of control is particularly valuable when it is used in the breeding season. Dens can be located during the day and shot over in the early evening.

## Cats

We have also trained long, mid and short range dogs to detect cats. The long range dog will passively indicate the presence of a cat by going on point and remain in contact with the cat until a shooter moves up beside the dog and asks it to flush. On flushing the dog will sit to enable the handler to safely shoot the cat. 12g shotguns would be the firearms used. Mid and short range dog would actively hunt for cats between 15 to 75m either side of the handler subject to the density of the cover. In dense cover the cats will most likely be treed. Again the weapon of choice would be a 12g due to its limited range.

These measures when used in conjunction with our indicator species detection will provide the most specific data available with any feral animal control program. As such it has use for both private and government use where not only the control of the feral species is required but to also address the environmental impact of the removal of the feral species. It is our opinion that showing the environmental impact is the only way in which private organizations and government organizations can effectively show the benefits to our environment that will occur when feral animals are controlled

- (a) the common seal of the local government is affixed to it in accordance with subsections (2) and (3); or
- (b) it is signed on behalf of the local government by a person or persons authorised under subsection (4) to do so.
- (2) The common seal of a local government is not to be affixed to any document except as authorised by the local government.
- (3) The common seal of the local government is to be affixed to a document in the presence of –
- (a) the mayor or president; and
- (b) the chief executive officer or a senior employee authorised by the chief executive officer, each of whom is to sign the document to attest that the common seal was so affixed.
- (4) A local government may, by resolution, authorise the chief executive officer, another employee or an agent of the local government to sign documents on behalf of the local government, either generally or subject to conditions or restrictions specified in the authorisation.

- (5) A document executed by a person under an authority under subsection (4) is not to be regarded as a deed unless the person executes it as a deed and is permitted to do so by the authorisation.
- (6) A document purporting to be executed in accordance with this section is to be presumed to be duly executed unless the contrary is shown.
- (7) When a document is produced bearing a seal purporting to be the common seal of the local government, it is to be presumed that the seal is the common seal of the local government unless the contrary is shown.

### SUMMARY

Council to endorse the proposed relocation of the Transwa Bus pick up and drop off point.

### BACKGROUND

The current pick up and drop off point is located on Queen Street. Several incidents have occurred where cars have parked too close to the intersection, blocking the bus and allowing it to make a safe turn.

At the October Council Briefing session it was suggested that the Information Bay may be a more suitable location.

### COMMENT

Shire of Beverley representatives met with Transwa representatives at the Information Bay on Wednesday 11 November to discuss moving the pick-up and drop off location.

It was agreed to move the location to the southern entrance of the Information Bay.

The bus will enter from the northern entrance, pass the information bay signage and pull up just before Council Road. This location was selected for a number of reasons; shade and shelter under the trees, the height of the curb and access for people with disability.

If Council is agreeable, a small footpath (concrete) will be required to be built. Transwa have supplied grant information to the Community Development Officer to apply for bus shelters, as they no longer provide them.

The proposed move was mentioned at the Annual Electors Meeting and received favourable comments.

### SUMMARY

Council to consider co-hosting the ActiveSmart program in partnership with the Department of Sport & Recreation, Wheatbelt.

### BACKGROUND

Mrs Jenifer Collins and Ms Ellie Jones from Department of Sport and Recreation attended the office on Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> November to invite the Shire of Beverley to support a new initiative called ActiveSmart - a healthy lifestyles program initiated in response to the numbers reported around obesity, diabetes and other health issues in the Wheatbelt.

ActiveSmart provides highly personalised information and support that motivates people to enjoy more active lifestyles in their local community. While the program will be branded with the Shire name, the project is facilitated and implemented by the Dept. of Sport & Recreation, with the Shire acting as a local source of promotion and contact for the Project Leader.

ActiveSmart will be advertised locally from December 2015/January 2016 with recruitment to the program beginning in April 2016.

### COMMENT

The Shire of Beverley is reported at 54% being insufficiently physically active and 77% overweight or obese. The Shire also has the highest level of diabetes within the 12 Shires invited to participate in the program. Results from the program to date include a 15 minute increase in physical activity per person per day, with 20% of participants moving from insufficient to sufficient physical activity levels. Increased participation in local clubs is another benefit.

Participation in this program will help to provide local access to support services that will enhance the community at both an individual and collective level.
