President Report

Multipurpose Community and Visitor Hub – "Beverley Cornerstone"

The grant application for Round 3 of the highly competitive Federal National Stronger Regions under the project title of "Beverley Cornerstone" was submitted during March 2016. A separate application to the Wheatbelt Regional Grants Scheme was also completed.

Register of Interest – BBP Aged Housing Project

The Beverley, Brookton & Pingelly (BBP) shires are currently working with the Wheatbelt Development Commission to develop a Business Plan for Aged Housing in our communities. Exact details for the project are yet to be determined. The Shire of Beverley proposes to establish a register of interested residents who wish to be placed on a waiting list for age appropriate housing in Beverley. No personal or financial information is required other than contact details at this time. Please contact the Shire Office as soon as possible to register.

Water Harvesting Project

Work is almost complete:

- The plastic liners have been laid in both retention basins.
- The permanent link mesh fence has been booked to be completed prior to Easter.
- Laying of the return water line to the dam has begun, all the poly pipe is on site.

An official opening is expected towards the end of May or beginning of June.

Sowing the seeds for road safety

With seeding season on the way, motorists in Beverley should be aware of increased heavy freight traffic and towed farm equipment on local roads.

Drivers should be alert on local roads. Expect more heavy traffic on roads that may normally have little traffic.

Trucks, utes and farm machinery are likely to be on the roads, crossing roads and exiting in unusual places. Many of these will be oversize vehicles, and they will need some or even all of the other side of the road. It is important to give them room to pass safely.

Shire of Beverley advises all motorists to use their headlights during the day time as we head into autumn and winter, so that other road users can see them in poor light.

CEO Stephen Gollan said, "Current dry conditions means that there is dust on country roads, and this will affect vision of taillights and judgment of distances. With burn-offs and when the rain starts, smoke and spray will also affect vision. Don't overtake if you can't see through dust, smoke or spray."

"For farmers who are often working into dusk and night time, it is important to have all flashing lights on machinery and vehicles in working order to ensure maximum visibility to other road users," he said.

Farmers are encouraged to check the updated *Guide to the Movement of Towed Agricultural Implements in Western Australia*, which is available from <u>www.transport.wa.gov.au</u>, or ring 13 11 56 for guidance on their responsibilities.

It is also important to consider the risk of fatigue and take extra care when driving home after working long hours in the paddock.

We have a shared responsibility for safety on our roads, so all drivers need to be careful and vigilant in this busy season.

Terms and Conditions Showerhead Swap



Before removing your showerhead, it is important you read the Terms and Conditions below.

- In accordance with the *Residential Tenancies Act 1987* (WA), if the property where the showerhead/s is to be installed is rented, both the landlord and tenant must agree to the replacement of the existing showerhead/s with the water efficient showerhead/s.
- If you need assistance with installing the showerheads, we recommend you contact a licensed Waterwise Plumber. You can find a list of licensed Waterwise Plumbers on our website at **watercorporation.com.au**
- If you experience any product faults with your new showerhead/s, call the supplier Methven on 1300 638 483. The Water Corporation provides no warranty regarding the performance of the showerhead.
- The Water Corporation is not responsible for the removal or installation of the showerhead/s, or any associated costs incurred by participating in the Showerhead Swap program.
- Listed distribution points will act as a distribution point only for the showerheads on behalf of the Water Corporation. Distribution points will not be responsible for any potential issues arising out of the swap arrangements such as installation or warranty problems.
- Each household is able to swap a maximum of two showerheads. A Water Corporation account must be presented at the time of the swap. The old showerhead/s swapped will be accepted by the distribution point and they become the property of the Water Corporation and cannot be returned to the customer. The old showerheads will be recycled and the scrap metal will be used to make other products.
- This offer is only valid whilst stocks last or until 30 April 2016.

Locals are invited to get active through new program

BEVERLEY, it's time to get active!

Thanks to the Shire of Beverley and the Department of Sport and Recreation, residents are being encouraged to get moving through a free active lifestyle program called ActiveSmart.

ActiveSmart is a behaviour change program designed to increase people's activity levels and change long term habits. Residents are encouraged to become more active and connected to others in their community.

Participants will be able to access personalised telephone coaching, as well as a range of information about opportunities to get active in the local area. This tailored approach moves away from the traditional focus on exercise, catering to different lifestyles and making getting active accessible for all.

"We're really excited to be part of ActiveSmart because we hope it brings people's health to the front of their minds," says Community Development Officer, Kathryn McLean from the Shire of Beverley. "We'd like to encourage residents to sign up to this program which has had great success in other regions such as Geraldton, where 4,000 households took part in the program. Through ActiveSmart Geraldton, residents increased their physical activity by 15 minutes per day."

The program is being rolled out across 12 local government areas: Beverley, Dowerin, Goomalling, Koorda, Merredin, Moora, Narrogin (town and shire), Northam, Toodyay, Wyalkatchem and York.

"We're excited and proud to be collaborating with the State Government to bring ActiveSmart to our community. We're all working with a common goal but it would be great if BEVERLEY residents joined together and showed the rest of them just how ActiveSmart we are!"

ActiveSmart was conceived and created by the Department of Sport and Recreation and has already been successfully received in Rockingham (2009) and Geraldton (2011). It was staged in Cockburn (2014) and more recently in Wanneroo (2015), where 90% of participants made plans to get active and 80% of those had either taken small steps towards being more active or had achieved their goals.

Discounted 12 month gym memberships will be available to all participants of the Activesmart program (NB a doctor's certificate, gym induction session and payment of key bond must be completed prior to becoming a gym member)

LiveLighter Beverley Triathlon 2016

The second triathlon for Beverley was held with great success on Saturday March 12. One hundred years ago, after Gallipoli, Australians troops were fighting in the First Battle of the Somme, suffering huge losses at locations in Northern France such as Fromelles & Pozieres.

The following thirteen men from Beverley were killed in 1916:

Sydney Ignatius Campbell enlisted from He had no known relatives. He named his Beverley on 7th October 1914. He was 21 best friend, years of age, 5 feet 7 inches tall with fair Locomotive Shed, Mt hair and brown eyes. He was a Roman Next-of-Kin. He made Henry William Afric Catholic and described himself as a Farm Tanner, farmer, of "Waimering", Beverley, Hand.

Battalion, given the Service No 1111 and the Orphanage, Victoria Park, Perth. initial rank of Private. He was later made Lance Corporal. He trained at Blackboy Hill, Greenmount; was then sent to Melbourne to embark on HMAT 'Thermistocles'A32 on 22nd December 1914.

He arrived in Egypt on 7th January 1915. The famous photo of the 11th Battalion mostly Western Australians - on the Cheops Pyramid near Cairo, was taken on 10^{th} January 1915. It is possible that Sydney Campbell is in that photo.

He received a gunshot wound to the right arm in the Somme Valley & was transferred to England where he died on 28 November 1916 at Birmingham General Hospital. He is buried at Lodge Hill Cemetery, Birmingham. He was awarded the 1914/14 Star; the British War Medal; the Victory Medal; and the Memorial Plaque and Scroll.

William Bailey also served in the AIF and received the Military Medal.

MEDIA RELEASE – Building homes for endangered Wheatbelt critters

Sheds across the Wheatbelt are rumbling to the sounds of woodwork and sweat as specialised nest boxes are being prepared for threatened species to shelter in.

There are 20 Men's Sheds in the Wheatbelt – unique and inclusive places where blokes can work side by side on meaningful projects in a safe, friendly and welcoming environment.

Five of these sheds are now working with regional NRM group Wheatbelt Natural Resource Management, to build nest boxes of various shapes and sizes that appeal to a mixture of native bird and mammal species.

Men's Sheds taking part in the project so far include Beverley, Kondinin, Wongan Hills, Wyalkatchem and Goomalling.

"The Men's Sheds are invaluable to this project – bringing practical skills and local on-ground knowledge," said Terri Jones, biodiversity project delivery officer with Wheatbelt NRM.

"They are helping build nest boxes, plus they are providing advice on which species are around, and where to place the boxes for easy-to-access monitoring by community.

Endangered species such as Carnaby's White-tailed Black Cockatoos and Red-tailed Phascogales will benefit from the boxes, along with several species of parrots, owls, pardalotes, microbats, and possums.

The biggest boxes are for the Carnaby's at over one metre in length, while the smallest are for phascogales with an entrance hole less than four centimetres wide.

All boxes are being made from natural materials such as untreated wood and marine ply and will be installed in nature reserves by professional aborists, tree surgeons and local shires.

Ongoing monitoring will be done by local school students and community members who will help provide monthly observations over the next two years.

Monitoring will take place from ground level by listening for sounds in the boxes, watching for movement in and around the site, and using sensor cameras and Go Pro cameras.

"One of the greatest things about the project is the collaboration between the Men's Sheds and local schools and the sharing of knowledge between the generations", said Terri Jones.

Community Information Witnessing of legal documents

Changes

In the last two years there has been changes, to the document structure, ID requirements, fees and charges and police clearances. Changes have occurred to paperwork Centrelink, Veteran Affairs, Superannuation withdrawals and Landgate.

Did you know that, when applying for government jobs you may be requested to attach documents such as educational qualifications/ degrees, police clearance and copies of working with children cards to be certified by a qualified witness such as a Justice of the Peace. Please note - requirements may vary depending on the department.

Superannuation

I have received information from applicants who are beneficiaries in an estate. When they are withdrawing funds they have had to get the deceased person's drivers licence witnessed by a JP. Some super companies have requested that I witness all documents for funds withdrawal in a BLUE pen and not black pen.

Incomplete submission of documents: I have been made aware and have six (complete sets) of documents which all have had to be re-certified and re-witnessed, as the time limit had expired. Some applications contain 4 forms, others may contain 54 attachments. (120 including certified copies).

Some suggestions from those who had to resubmit is: always check from the sender as to what needs to be signed, certified and witnesses.

In the meantime I have gone through 3 rubber stamps (JP).

The Aeronautical Museum is open to the public on days that I offer a JP service to the community.

Warriors Wellbeing

Political Correctness – is it a strain on our wellbeing?



Political correctness is a doctrine "which holds forth the proposition that it is entirely possible to pick up a turd by the clean end". In my opinion, political correctness is a major inhibiting factor when interpreting and applying bureaucracy and common sense (often the ingredient missing of lots of decision making) into our daily life. This ultimately can affect our wellbeing.

Bureaucracy on its own does have its place, however at times it can limit how we do things because of the many layers of rigid rules that may complicate getting the job done on the ground. This occurs in everyday life whether completing tedious processes, filling out pages of paperwork, or dealing with a system that appears to be more focused on processes rather than helping achieve an outcome.

When a disaster strikes (catastrophic fires late 2015 and early 2016) and other personal health and safety issues arise in our life, layers of bureaucracy are not always helpful, they can exacerbate an already tense environment. We have spoken to many blokes who feel both frustrated and restricted in their reactions to these disasters because of the many layers of procedures that had to be adhered to. Common sense was taking second place!

The point about the effects of this political correctness doctrine, is that it enshrines both bureaucracy and common sense and quite often masks/dilutes what should be done and said and can also inhibit robust discussions.

Blokes, by our own nature are hard wired to be action orientated, i.e. we want to solve problems, and we want to do stuff now. Once this is stifled by political correctness, a few things can start to happen:

- normal stress can become distress;
- short cuts can be taken (with increased risk);
- we inhibit our natural problem solving process;
- blokes shut down and stop seeking help (we go into our cave and don't come out).
- It creates an "us versus them" mentality.

So where have we gone wrong and how can we make changes?

- Don't allow political correctness to mask what should be done and said. Sometimes we have to be critical and blunt about our processes to keep them relevant and up to date.
- Bureaucracy should facilitate what we do, not dictate how we do it (not create barriers and thus frustrate people who are trying to deal with a challenging situation at the coal face).
- The **common sense** rule should be applied to everything we do. I repeat, apply it to everything we do.
- People/communities have the innate ability to band together and deal with stressful situations. This should be fostered thus empowering individuals and communities rather than disempowering through micro-management and removing them from vital decisions regarding their own lives and local community.
- **"Language**" is always important. Appropriate language that can be understood needs to be used. A robust discussion is vital to air all points of view and to prevent the same mistakes being made again.

Remember at the end of the day we are responsible for our own wellbeing. Hopefully these suggestions, encourages communities to claim back some responsibility and ownership. This would bring about positive change not only in blokes lives but the whole of the community.

BLUETOOTH PAIRING TO YOUR CAR STEREO

With the road toll in the country areas increasing, one way you can be safer on the roads is to connect your mobile phone to your vehicle via Bluetooth. Bluetooth is wireless technology that allows for seamless hands free calling. If your car is not equipped with this you can buy a hands free car kit. Bluetooth Here are the basics for connecting to your compatible car stereo:

- Initiate pairing on your car's stereo. This process varies from vehicle to vehicle (it maybe be located in the hands 1. free calling system) you may have to answer a few questions and then complete the setup process on your phone.
- 2. On your phone go to the settings menu - Android phones select wireless & networks / Apple Bluetooth
- 3. Ensure the Bluetooth setting is open, then go into the sub menu.
- 4. A list of available devices will appear, locate your stereo and select it.
- 5. Enter PIN, you'll be prompted for a PIN (which varies from vehicle to vehicle) this will pair the phone to the car stereo.
- 6. You do have the option of enabling media. The entry on the Bluetooth device list should read "Connected to phone and media audio"/ If not then press and hold on the stereo's name until this appears and check the box next to media
- 7. Enjoy your music and call and answer your phone hands free.

ChemClear is heading to Western Australia in June 2016 and is urging chemical users to register their surplus or unwanted agvet chemicals for safe disposal before 22 April 2016.

"We encourage WA farmers to seize the opportunity to use our program this year as it will be another two years before we head back across the Nullarbor," said National Program Manager Lisa Nixon.

Since the program was established 16 years ago, ChemClear has undertaken five regional collection runs across Western Australia and retrieved in excess of 61 tonnes of obsolete agvet chemicals.

The program uses local council sites to collect from waste holders who have registered their chemicals for retrieval. The collection process is quick and easy, and waste holders are given an appointment time to meet the ChemClear retrieval team to drop off their registered chemicals for safe disposal.

"Our program operates like a milk run and visits every local government region that we have received a registration in, even if there is only one or a handful of waste holders in that area," said Ms Nixon. "We are required to obtain licences for the transportation and removal of hazardous waste, therefore each waste holder must take an inventory of their obsolete chemicals before registering for the program."

WAFarmers Chief Executive Officer Stephen Brown believes ChemClear is critical for maintaining a safe working environment for farmers.

"Our organisation is committed to ensuring farmers are provided with safe working environments and we're proud to support the ChemClear initiative which works towards this goal," he said.

"Unused chemicals on rural properties can pose occupational safety and health risks for farmers, so we encourage all our members to work sustainably and dispose of obsolete chemicals through this environmentally safe method."

ChemClear collects APVMA currently registered chemicals produced by 121 manufacturers supporting the Industry Waste Reduction Scheme. Chemicals classified as Group 1 are collected free of charge.

As an additional service, ChemClear collects what is classified as Group 2 chemicals. This category covers deregistered, out-of-date, mixed, unlabelled or unknown agvet chemicals produced by a manufacturer not signed to the ChemClear stewardship program.

There is a cost for disposal of Group 2 chemicals which is quoted to the waste holder once their registration has been processed.

To register for the WA June collection, please take an inventory of your product and call 1800 008 182 or visit <u>www.chemclear.com.au</u>.

It is recommended that waste holders do this as soon as possible as registrations CLOSE ON 22 APRIL 2016

PETITION FOR MOBILE BLACK SPOT FUNDING

A Kojonup veterinarian is calling on **Beverley** residents to join her fight for increased funding to improve mobile phone black spots after her partner was tragically killed.

Katharine Marsh is spearheading a petition aimed at the Federal government to increase mobile phone black spot funding and commit to a deadline to rectify currently identified locations.

"I am campaigning for this issue after my partner, Mick, tragically passed away following a motorbike accident which occurred in a mobile phone black spot, delaying emergency assistance for 20 - 30 minutes," Miss Marsh said.

"My experience is not an isolated incident - others have been affected in a similar way. Recent bushfires in late 2015 - early 2016 have also highlighted the problems of mobile phone black spots preventing access to emergency services."

There are more than 6000 nominated mobile phone black spots throughout Australia, including near capital cities, along major highways and transport routes and in whole towns and villages. WA has 570 black spots registered.

Miss Marsh said where there is a black spot, there is no mobile network coverage and emergency services like

"If you are faced with a life-threatening emergency and are in a mobile phone black spot area you will not be able to obtain emergency assistance. This could be the difference between life and death," Miss Marsh said.

"The technology exists to eradicate mobile phone black spots – it is simply a matter of further funding."

The Federal Government has committed \$160 million, with the Round 2 locations expected to be announced at the end of this year.

"After this current round, there are no further plans for funding for mobile phone black spots, yet current funding is like to leave at least 1000 black spots still unaddressed," Miss Marsh said.

"If mobile phone black spots in your area miss out this time there is no guarantee as to when they will be resolved."

Lyme Disease Association of Australia

What is Lyme disease?

Lyme disease is an infection caused by a bacteria known as *Borrelia*. The bacteria, a spirochete, is transmitted when an individual is bitten by a vector e.g. tick. Lyme disease can impact many bodily systems and organs and can in some cases mimic other illnesses e.g. Lupus. As well as giving people Lyme Disease, the ticks often also transmit other diseases (co-infections). Thank you to the Canadian Lyme Disease Foundation for their list of symptoms.

What are the symptoms of Lyme disease?

Lyme Disease is generally categorized into acute and chronic stages of disease, each with varying symptoms.

Acute Lyme disease

- Flu like symptoms such as headache, fever, muscle soreness & unexplained fatigue.
- Fewer than 50% of people with Lyme Disease develop the "bulls-eye" (or Erthema Migrans) rash a few days or even a few weeks after their tick bite (if they remember the bite).

Chronic Lyme disease

The following symptoms can be attributed to Lyme Disease when it has reached the Chronic stage of disease.

Head, face and neck. Eyes and vision. Ears and hearing. Digestive and excretory systems. Musculoskeletal system. Respiratory and circulatory systems. Neurological system. Psychological well-being. Mental capability. Reproduction and sexuality. General well-being.

- Unexplained hair loss
- Headache, mild or severe, Seizures
- Pressure in head, white matter lesions in brain (MRI)
- Facial paralysis (Bell's Palsy, Homer's syndrome)
 Tingling of nose, (tip of) tongue, cheek or facial flushing
- Tingling of nose, (tip of) tonStiff or painful neck
- Stiff or painful neck
 Twitching of facial or other muscles
- Twitching of facial of
 Jaw pain or stiffness
- Dental problems (unexplained)
 - Sore throat, clearing throat a lot, phlegm (flem), hoarseness, runny nose

Beverley IT Making IT Simpler

Protecting your information

In my previous article I explained about different types of viruses and what you should do to protect against viruses. This month I will be talking more generally about protecting your personal information.

Password Protection

Login passwords or PIN codes: are not very effective at protecting your information. They are designed to stop someone easily entering your device (PC, tablet or smart phone) when you are not around. They are most useful for preventing casual access, e.g., in offices, public places or to prevent children from accessing a device that isn't child safe. If your device is lost or stolen the password/PIN will not stop people getting at your information.

Protect your passwords: Someone can easily watch you putting in your Password/PIN, especially with so many cameras around).

Website Passwords: Most websites that hold personal information now require passwords, e.g. Facebook, banks, email. Use different passwords for each website you use. If a criminal gets hold of a password then the damage is limited.

Password Management: With so many passwords it is impossible to remember them all. Keep the passwords in an encrypted, password protected file, or use one of the many password management programs available. Some are free. Keep a backup of the password file.

Protect Passwords: Do not keep passwords in plain text file on your device – always encrypt password files (see below). Never write down your passwords and leave them easily accessible, e.g. next to your computer!

Do not use easily cracked passwords: E.g. your name. Use a phrase or sentence and modify it by changing letters to numbers or vice versa. A long, strong passwords with more than 20 random characters will currently take thousands of years to crack Use a password manager to generate and manage these passwords.

Computer and Information Encryption

Encryption is the only way to fully protect your information. The information is scrambled and it needs a password to unscramble it. Because the Internet is so open many devices are now protected by encryption. However you must never lose the password, or you will lose information – forever! New Window 10 PCs, new tablets and new smart phones are protected by encryption by default. Older PCs (including those upgraded to Windows 10) and other devices, are not encrypted, but encryption can be added. Backup discs can also be encrypted,

Many software apps can create encrypted files, for example in Microsoft Office apps (Word, Excel, PowerPoint etc.) when you select to "Protect with a Password", the files are also encrypted. Encrypt all files containing personal information.
