SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT REPORT - NOVEMBER 2016



15/16 Annual Report

The Audited 2015/2016 Annual Report was received by Council at its recent October monthly meeting. Copies of the Annual Report will be available on the Shire website or from the Shire Office.

Annual Electors Meeting Tuesday 15 November 2016

The Annual Electors Meeting is scheduled to be held on Tuesday 15 November 2016, commencing 6pm at the Lesser Hall. Elector's questions requiring research would be appreciated prior to the meeting.

Policy Manual

Council has recently reviewed the Shire of Beverley Policy Manual. The Policy Manual was originally adopted in September 2014 to provide clear guidance to Council, Management, Staff and Residents in relation to Council matters.

Beverley Cornerstone Project

The Beverley Cornerstone application to National Stronger Regions Round 3 was unsuccessful. Whilst disappointing, the highly competitive \$126.5M federal funding round received 479 applications Australia wide of which 67 were successful. During a teleconference feedback session the strength and quality of Beverley's application was noted, with advice provided that of a required 33/35 scoring on eligibility requirements and assessment criteria, Beverley's score was 32/35. (Bitter sweet perhaps!)

The Shire does have external funding of \$1.2M confirmed for this project from 4 funding partners and will proceed with document preparation to enable tenders to be called with a view that staged implementation of the Beverley Cornerstone project may now be required.

Ovals, Parks and Gardens

The gardeners have been busy ensuring reticulation systems are ready for summer and slashing has been carried out on various vacant shire blocks and road reserves within the town boundary. Mosquito spraying is scheduled to be carried out along the river.

<u>Roads</u>

Work is underway along two sections of Westdale road which to be widened in the 16/17 road programme, although things are a little behind schedule due to the extended wet weather this year.

Beverley Heroic Weekend 2016

The 2016 Beverley Heroic evolved into a two day weekend with the inclusion on Saturday of a contemporary "The Beverley"; a modern handicap cycling road race won by World Track Champion and Tour De France participant Cameron Myer. Local resident Geoff Edwards, (who rode in an older version of "The Beverley") was involved in race starting for the event.

On Sunday the Heroic 100mile ride attracted 47 participants; the Populaire Heroic 50 mile ride 76 participants, and Heroic town ride 84 participants. Together with friends and family there were many visitors to our town over the weekend.

As a matter of interest former Beverley ANZ employee Bill Staude, now in his 80's, rode in this years 50mile ride, accompanied by two of his sons and a grandson (Geoff Edwards and Bill rode "The Beverley" together in 1952!)





The George Dent Memorial

You may have noticed a recent addition to the entrance of the Methodist Cemetery on Vincent Street – A beautiful granite stone with a bronze plaque attached. This plaque belongs to George Perkins Dent, an early pioneer who died on his farm at Jacobs Well in 1930 and when buried here in Beverley, never received a headstone. In later years the flooding of the Avon River caused many records at the Shire offices to be destroyed – his grave location being one of them. George's widow and 7 children left Jacobs Well after his death and relocated to Perth. The years passed and soon there was no-one left to pass down the location of his grave and it has now been lost forever.

Later generations researching family history discovered the tragedy and decided to do something about getting George memorialised. This plaque is the result of an entire family banding together to raise money and organise a monument to his life and his death. George was a brave, strong gentleman who pioneered 3 different areas of WA – he is written about in books for his historic gold find near Sandstone in 1903, he alone was responsible for bringing his entire family from SA to WA in the early 1900's to farm at Boyup Brook, and he spent 20 years farming at Jacobs Well before he was tragically killed in a shooting accident at the age of 56.

His life was short but very full and we believe he deserves to be finally recognised for his contribution and sacrifice to his family.





Branched Broomrape

You may have noticed some upright, pink flower stalks growing amongst your garden plants. While they look pretty, these are likely the parasitic plant known as common broomrape (*Orobanche minor*) and as the name implies, they are common and widespread in south west Western Australia (WA).

We're hoping you can help us by reporting if you suspect you have the more sinister species branched broomrape, *Orobanche ramosa*, popping up around your weeds, vegetables, pastures or crops.

Branched broomrape could easily be confused with common broomrape but to date, it has only been found in South Australia in the Murray Bridge area. If it became established in WA it could affect our valuable export markets.

Branched broomrape is one of the targets of DAFWA's weed surveillance project funded by Royalties for Regions (For further information search our website).

Broomrapes

There are several broomrapes, but only three known in Australia: *O. minor*, *O. ramosa* and one poorly documented native species *Orobanche cernua* var. *australiana*.

All species produce large numbers of tiny seeds, like specks of dust that can be distributed widely or transported as contaminants in seed, compost, mulch, or in soil on dirty machinery, clothing and footwear. They are also well dispersed by wind and water and in mud stuck in animal's fur and feet.

These seeds germinate, but most of the action happens underground. They tap into the root systems of mostly herbaceous annuals like nasturtiums and petunias but have been found on other perennial and woody plants and after considerable time underground, an erect spike of flowers emerges in spring and summer

Taking all their food from their host plants they have no need for chlorophyll and thus have no green pigment. The leaves are not conspicuous and are reduced to purplish scales.

Common vs branched

Common broomrape is usually larger and more robust, with a single pinkish-brown stem and tubular whitish flowers, with brown or purple stripes.

The stem of branched broomrape is erect, thin and richly branched. These branches terminate in flowering spikes. Brown or straw -coloured, it grows 10-30cm high.

Disposal of common broomrape

If you have common broomrape in the garden, dig out the plant making sure you get the bulb-like base of the plant before it

can set seed. Bag the plants and dispose of in the rubbish bin. Quick disposal after pulling is advised as those left heaped on the ground can still go to seed.

Economic impacts

Branched broomrapes attack a wide range of crops and pastures from several plant families, including canola, cabbage, cauliflower, celery, pulse crops, pasture legumes, cucurbits, hemp, lettuce, sunflower, linseed, beans, capsicums, eggplant, potatoes, tomatoes and onions. Branched broomrape will also parasitise a range of weeds, enabling it to reproduce even when crops are not present.

The weed's presence could result in partial or total crop losses and the possible loss of potential to produce some crops in heavily affected areas. Branched broomrape can also cause the loss of export markets interstate and overseas, and increases in management and control costs.

What you can do

- Practice good biosecurity and avoid \Rightarrow bringing any contaminated seed, machinery or livestock onto your property.
- Be vigilant and learn to identify the \Rightarrow weeds on and around your property. Report unfamiliar weeds using the MyWeedWatcher on-line reporting tool or the app (see agric.wa.gov.au/ myweedwatcher) or contact the Pest and Disease Information Service on freecall 1800 084 881 or info@agric.wa.gov.au.

For more information about branched broomrape identification, search our website: agric.wa.gov.au. If you think you have branched broomrape or find any other parasitic plant attacking crop or pasture species, please do not attempt to control it, report it as soon as possible.



CYCLING FOR WOMEN IN 1940S

Pat Hawkins (born c. 1922) was an endurance cyclist from Victoria Park, Perth, Western Australia. In 1940, aged 18 and only 12 months into her cycling career, she set world records for '1,000 miles' and 'Seven days'. She also set the Australian records for distance travelled in one, two, three, four, five, six and seven days, plus surpassing the Australian professional men's record (Wikipedia).

The photos below in the *West Australian* of 18th March 1941 show the conclusion of her 1000 mile record-breaking ride in Cathedral Avenue, Perth.

Pat Hawkins visited Beverley in 1941 as reported below in the *Beverley Times* of 23rd May 1941 as part of her quest to break the world's record for twelve months of riding by a woman cyclist.

NOTED GIRL CYCLIST VISITS BEVERLEY.

Pat Hawkins, the noted W.A. girl cyclist who is at present engaged in an attempt to break the world's re cord for twelve months riding by a woman cyclist, passed through Beverley on Sunday last on her way to Popanying where she at one time resided.

Members of the Beverley Cycle Club met Pat on the York road and escorted her to town Later she lunched with Mr and Mrs E W Ed wards and Mr and Mrs LA Edwards at the latter's home Mr E W Edwards is the local agent for the Malvern Starcycle, the makers of which are sponsoring the W.A. girl's attempt on the record. At present Pat is 5,000 miles ahead of the record established some years ago by Mrs Dovey, of England, this despite delays occasioned by an accident and illness.

Of a quite and unassuming type the cyclist is popular wherever she goes She passed through the town on her return journey to Perth on Monday alternoon,

In 1949 the Beverley Cycle Club (established in 1908) introduced **cycle races for women** as reported below in

the Beverley Times on 25 March & 1 April 1949.

An innovation which proved very popular was a race over 2 laps for lady competitors, and once again the scratch marker triumphed. Shirley Randell and Verna Noonan fought out another good finish, but Miss Randell prevailed by about a length. Shirley Shackles claimed third prize. This race created a good deal of interest, and if sufficient nominations are fortheoming it is hoped to make a race for ladies a weekly feature of Club racing. The ladies' race over two laps proved a triumph for Verna Noon an, who was narrowly beaten the previous week. Although Shirley Shackles appeared to have the race in her keeping with a half lap to go, Verna Noonan stuck to her guns and gained the upper hand after a great struggle.



Colourful Fruits and Vegetables That Boost Your Immune System

Everyone knows that once spring is in the air, we can welcome back our white wardrobes.

Why wait until then I ask you?

There is a better way to get the benefits of white year-round by putting it *in* our body instead of on it!

We are often told to 'eat a rainbow' and we aim for the guideline that says the more colour a food has, the better it is because the colour is just one indicator of nutrient content.

Produce that wears white could be just as valuable. In fact some white vegetables contribute substantial quantities of nutrients that we seem to be missing most often (also known as shortfall nutrients), like potassium, magnesium and fiber.

Here is how to wear white in a way that is truly one size fits all.

Cauliflower

Move over kale. This veggie has been deemed one of the hottest trends of the year. Along with the other members of the cruciferous family, cauliflower contains sulphur compounds that are associated with fighting cancer, strengthening bone tissue and maintaining healthy blood vessels.

Mushrooms

Get ready for this list. Mushrooms are calories. low in fat free. cholesterol-free, gluten-free, very low in sodium, and yet they carry a wealth of selenium, potassium, riboflavin, niacin and vitamin D. Mushrooms are also healthy and filling so they can help you control your weight without compromising taste. They are also a rich source of umami*. Umami is the scientific expression of the fifth taste sensation. Umami helps simple dishes come alive.

Garlic

In our house, all I have to do is sauté garlic to draw hubby in my kitchen. Aside from tasting great, garlic has been touted as being able to help 'hair grow', causes acne to disappear and keep colds and flu at bay. Its

antioxidant properties can help boost your immune system, and to get the most out of garlic's active chemical, allicin, cut a fresh clove up and

expose it to the air for a little while before you cook with it.

Onion

Chef Julia Child said, "I cannot imagine a world without onions," and for good reason. The anti-inflammatory chemical in onions called quercetin can help ease discomfort from arthritis, and quercetin's beneficial properties have been associated with a lower risk of cancer, heart disease, diabetes and a stronger immune system.

Potatoes

Most people fail to meet dietary recommendations for potassium and dietary fiber. The white potato provides as much fiber as and more potassium than other commonly consumed vegetables or fruit. Potatoes also provide vitamin C, Vitamin B6 and magnesium, in addition to small amounts of high-quality protein.

Banana, Apples and Pears are considered fruits with white flesh. The sayings 'eat an apple a day'... are an easy way to increase white fruits and vegetables

Note

*umami, what exactly is the umami taste? Well, there is no English word that's synonymous with umami; however it is most often described as a "savoury" or "meaty" taste. In Japanese umami translate roughly as good flavour or good taste.


IN LOVING MEMORY OF CHERLEL


Beverley CRC Host Author Linda Bettenay





OFF ROAD VEHICLES

With the onset of the warmer weather it is timely to remind those that have unlicensed off road vehicles that it is illegal to ride them on any gazetted road. Off road vehicles are not only off road motorbikes and quads but anything with a motor that is capable of being ridden/driven and so includes any type of motorised buggy.

There is only one place within the shire of Beverley that an unlicensed off road vehicle can be ridden legally and that is the Beverley Moto X track. To utilise this facility you must be a member, however, the moto X season has just come to an end.

Shire of York have a gazetted off road MX circuit on the Spencers Brook-York Road, York. This area is open to the public, however, to ride there you need an Off-Road Vehicle registration which is available at the Shire office.

Other designated Off Road Vehicle areas are: Gnangara – Gnangara Rd Kwinana – Thomas Rd, Medina Lancelin and Ledge Point – 2 separate areas Pinjar – opposite Barbagello Raceway


Riding on private property is permissible, however, you obviously need the owner's permission and your riding time cannot exceed 2 hours a day.

From a law enforcement point of view, a road is the area between two property/fence lines, so this means if you are riding an unlicensed vehicle on a street verge, technically you are riding on a road and can be charged.

I believe there are several things that can be done to help us deal with the difficulties we are facing right now (in particular frosts for the farmers) in a positive way to protect our wellbeing. However these points can be used for any contextual issue we may be facing in our lives.

- Start to consider your options. As you consider your alternatives keep those affected in the loop.
- Consider this as a challenge more than a problem. When things are problems we usually think negatively when they are challenges we think positively.





Avoiding Viruses

I explained about viruses in the March Blarney, but because I still see many viruses (I removed over 2600 threats from one PC!) I feel it is worth covering the issue again.

Install good virus protection

Virus detectors: It is absolutely essential to have a virus detection program to prevent viruses getting on your device. Some of the older and well-known virus detection programs (often sold in shops) are inefficient and not as good as some of the more modern, lighter programs. There are very good modern ones available free - so no excuse!

Virus scanners: Virus detectors don't stop everything so a regular scan of all your files is necessary. Use a separate scanner - if the virus detector lets a virus through then scanning with the same program will not find the virus. The best scanner is free, so again no excuses.

Don't click

Avoid clicking on anything you are not sure about on web pages and beware of adverts and links buried in the text (usually highlighted or with a different font). If the web address does not look genuine, be very wary. Sometimes even closing an advert will bring in a virus, so do not click on any part of a suspicious advert. Turn on the 'Status' toolbar in Internet Explorer, then when you hover over an advert or link with your mouse the true web address will show in the bottom left corner of the web page.

Adverts to avoid

Do not click on adverts for "Driver Updates", "Scan your

PC" "Your PC is slow" etc. These are nearly 100% malicious. Driver updates are done automatically and invisibly in the background by Microsoft -special programs are not needed. Malicious scanners will often give false detections to encourage you to buy a 'repair' service. If you don't buy, they may destroy all you files or steal vour identity.

Avoid spam emails

Not all spam emails are filtered out. Opening an email to read it is not dangerous, but never click on a link within the email or open an email attachment unless you are absolutely sure it is safe. If you receive an email that is unfamiliar, check it carefully. Many spam emails pretending to come from banks, suppliers, etc. look genuine so investigate further: look in detail at the 'From' address; hover over any links and see if the web address aligns with the senders address. If either of these do not align with the supposed sender then the email is spam. Delete any suspicious emails.

Regular backup and updates are essential

Regular backups to an external drive is the only way to guarantee not losing your files when something goes wrona.

Disconnect your backup drive when not in use - it can be encrypted by a crypto virus. If you don't have an external back-up hard drive, buy one.

Take all updates: Keep your device up to date. Most updates are to repair security holes. Also update virus protection programs - there are new viruses every day.







Welcome to the 2016/17 Tennis Season


