SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT REPORT - JANUARY 2017



Happy New Year!

Beverley, Brookton, Pingelly (BBP) Age Appropriate Housing Project

The BBP group are to receive \$7.89 million to build 27 independent living units across the 3 shires, 12 are to be located in Beverley. Whilst details are yet to be provided construction is not expected to commence until 2018 and will be phased over 3 years. This funding was announced in December 2016 as part of the Royalties for Regions Growing Our South Initiative in which \$46.19 million will be invested in age appropriate housing across 28 local governments in the Wheatbelt and Great Southern regions to construct 150 specially designed houses.

Shire of Beverley Community Grants

The next round of Beverley Community Grants is open in January 2017. These are available to incorporated Beverley based community organisations for small projects to advance member interests and provide wider community benefits. Contact the Shire office for further details and application forms.

Draft Age Friendly Community Plan – Comments Welcome

The Draft Age Friendly Community Plan is available in the library and by requesting a copy from the Shire office. Community consultation was undertaken during August to form the plan and comments can now be provided on the draft.

Funding sought from Lotterywest for Interpretation Plans

An application to support interpretation planning for Vincent St and the Avon River Park has been submitted to Lotterywest. Development of these plans will assist future grant applications to implement the town walk trails as per the Shire of Beverley Trails Masterplan and future development of the Avon River Park area.

Christmas Lights

Thankyou to the businesses and residents who participated in the Christmas light competition and congratulations to the winners (details elsewhere). The Shire's Christmas additions to the Federation Square area were unable to be installed in time, however the Shire office was again transformed into a Christmas wonderland thanks to the passion and imaginative talent of Phyllis Facey.

RV Short Stay Area

An opportunity is provided for those staying in the RV short stop over area to provide feedback on their stay in Beverley. Most responses have been positive in relation to the welcome visitors receive in Beverley, the standard of facilities for travellers, and satisfaction with services for travellers. Nearly everyone commented they would recommend visiting Beverley to family and friends and had spent money whilst here.

Shire Planner Leaving

Stefan deBeer is moving to Bundaberg Queensland with his family to take up a position with the Department of Infrastructure, Local Government and Planning as Manager of the Planning Group. Council and staff at the Shire of Beverley have very much valued Stefan's efficiency, knowledge and diligence to planning in Beverley over the last 5 years following his relocation from South Africa to take on the shared planning position for the Shires of Brookton and Beverley. I'm sure those in the community who have required Stefan's services would concur. The Shire has now engaged Jacky Jurmann for 2 days per week to continue planning services in Beverley. Brookton no longer require the joint planning arrangement.

Council Meeting February 2017

The first Ordinary Meeting of Council for 2017 will be held on Tuesday 21st February 2017, being the 3rd Tuesday of the month instead of the regular 4th Tuesday, enabling Councillor attendance at regional training. A 3 month trial will be undertaken to commence Ordinary Meetings of Council in February, March and April 2017 at 3pm (in place of the previous 2pm start time).

The Beverley Cornerstone Development will now progress under the management of ADC Projects Pty Ltd with a view to the site being cleared in early 2017. This will include removal of the Child Health Clinic, Aeronautical Museum and relocation of the vampire jet to the Beverley Airfield. The Aeronautical Museum will be closed from 6th January 2017 with the contents of the Museum being stored then deaccessioned (some local content will be included in an interpretation project for display in the new Tourism Information Centre and on Hunt Road near the second vampire jet including the AMANA memorial).

Messages for volunteer fire fighters and fire brigades

What to do in an emergency...

Before you hook into the water mains, call us on 13 13 75!

When a bushfire event starts and before you hook into the water supply system, tell us! Ring 13 13 75 (24 hours a day/7 days a week).

If we know where your crews are headed, we might be able to provide you with a better location where you can maintain pressure for longer OR we might be able to do something to our water supply system which will mean that we can keep it running for a fraction longer (HOWEVER there is no guarantee that we can prolong supply or pressure).

Hydrants

Location : if you are unsure where your hydrants are located, please contact DFES or our Operations Centre on 13 13 75 who will provide you with the exact geographical locations.

Testing : if you intend to test hydrants in your area, please let us know first (13 13 75). Often a side-effect of using the hydrants is that nearby residences receive discoloured water. If we're aware of the exercise beforehand, we can ensure our operators are prepared and ready to respond to any complaints.

Broken hydrants : any issues with hydrants should be reported up through DFES. DFES will contact Water Corporation and a work order will be actioned immediately.

Reminder to residents in your Shire

Help us spread the word to people that they cannot rely on mains water in a bush fire when other critical infrastructure such as power has been damaged.

Avon Valley residents share in \$46 million for age appropriate housing

Older residents in the Avon Valley region will soon have increased opportunities to remain close to home as they age, thanks to a \$46.19 million State Government investment.

Member for Central Wheatbelt Mia Davies MLA said the *Avon Aged Housing Alliance* had received \$6 million in *Royalties for Regions* funding as part of the overall investment.

"I'm delighted this funding has been made possible via the *Royalties for Regions (RfR)* Growing Our South initiative," Ms Davies said.

"The project will benefit older people living in the Avon Valley and surrounds and has been funded as part of the construction of 150 specially-designed houses across 28 local governments in the Wheatbelt and Great Southern regions."

The *Avon Valley Aged Housing Alliance* will utilise funding to build 22 Independent Living Units (ILUs) across the Central Wheatbelt local government areas (LGAs) of Dowerin, Goomalling, Toodyay and Victoria Plains.

Ms Davies also visited Quairading last Thursday where she announced the \$5.28 million *Cunderdin, Tammin, Quairading Well Aged Precinct project*, which will benefit from \$3.68 million of *Royalties for Regions*.

"This project will result in the construction of 11 age-friendly independent living units within the three local shires, and the refurbishment of the former Cunderdin Bowling Clubhouse into an age-friendly community hub," she said.

In total the State Government's funding commitment will build 124 independent living units in the Central Wheatbelt communities of Goomalling, Dowerin, Beverley, Brookton, Pingelly, Quairading, Wandering, Corrigin, Wongan-Ballidu, Cunderdin, Tammin, Naremben and Kondinin.

Ms Davies said the Wheatbelt Development Commission had been working with the Avon alliance and four further local government alliances in the region towards the development of cluster housing projects.

Others projects to receive funding include *Brookton, Beverley and Pingelly* (\$7.89 million); *Innovation Central Midlands Inc.* (\$7 million) and *Wheatbelt South Aged Housing Alliance* (\$10.09 million).

Member for the Agricultural Region Hon Martin Aldridge MLC commended the overall "forward-thinking housing project", which he said would prove beneficial to individuals and their families throughout the region.

"Aged housing forms part of an integrated solution to create more vibrant communities that celebrate and respect older people, and the contribution they make, while providing positive futures for our small regional towns," he said.

"Regional Western Australia has an older population profile than the State as a whole and an increasing need for aged care."

The State Government's housing program is aligned with the Federal Government's aged care reform, delivering on the findings of the Ageing in the Bush Report.

The Growing our South initiative is a five-year, \$600 million *Royalties for Regions* program to implement major infrastructure and community projects in the Peel, Wheatbelt, South West and Great Southern regions.

Emergency WA is co-ordinated on behalf of the government of WA by DFES and created so you can find emergency information easier than before.

The site has a map based display with the best available emergency information from across the state. Here you can find information about fires, floods, storms, earthquakes, tsunamis, hazardous material incidents and traffic crashes.

The best way to keep informed during an emergency is to seek information from a variety of sources. You can get information by:-

- Using the EMERGENCY WA website - <https://www.emergency.wa.gov.au/>
- Staying in touch with neighbours, family and friends
- Being alert and aware of your surroundings
- Listening to ABC local radio
- Tuning in to 6PR in the metro

If someone you know tells you about a possible emergency, or if you can see or smell something that might be dangerous, that's your warning. Take immediate action to stay safe. Do not wait to receive a warning or text message.

The warnings on the emergency WA website are also available by calling the relevant agency, for example the DFES emergency information phone line (13DFES or 133337) or the Bureau of Meteorology's phone lines.

You can also follow emergency agencies social media accounts, RSS feeds or download smart phone apps such as EWN or Emergency AUS.

During an emergency, you may also receive a text or voice message from the emergency services to your telephone – visit emergency.wa.gov.au to find out more.

Remember – NO WARNING SYSTEM IS FOOLPROOF. So use a range of sources of information. Connected communities are safer communities, so on that note, take care and stay safe.

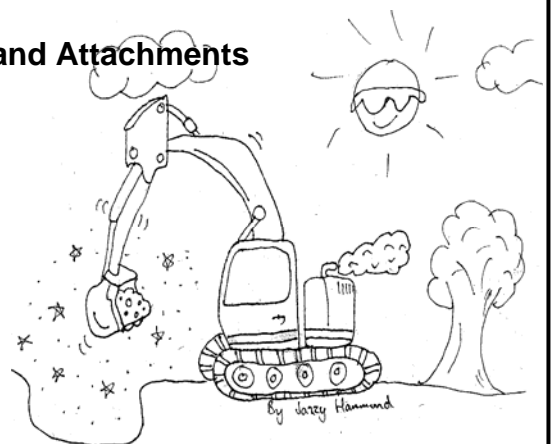

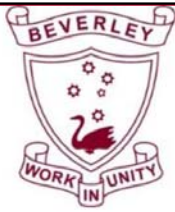

- The man down in the cellar represents a dead body. Over 100 years ago there was no other building in Beverley that had a cool room like the cellar. When anyone died the body was put in the cellar until it was buried in the cemetery.
- We got our nib pens from the people of Beverley. Every house and school had nib pens until about 60 years ago.
- Beverley history is part of Australia's history. In Africa there is African history. But there are other towns in different parts of the world that have the name Beverley.

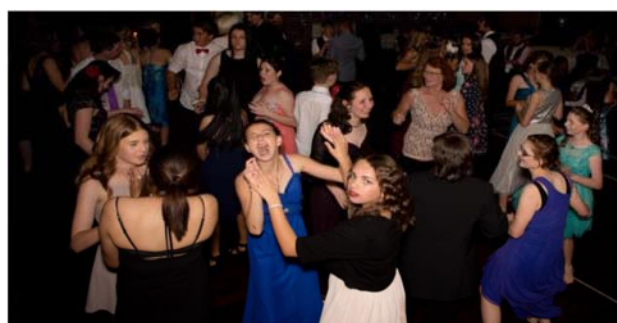
Wheatbelt Ball

How does the Internet work?

This month I'll explain how the Internet and its main applications work. There are five main aspects I will cover. The Internet network, the World Wide Web, Websites Internet browsers, and search engines. See the diagram below.

The Internet network

The Internet was invented in the mid- 1960's by the US military as ARPANET, a network that could survive a nuclear war. The sets of rules (protocols) it uses are simple and were brilliantly designed. The basic protocols have not changed since 1969 yet the Internet has grown from connecting 100 computers to billions of computers today. The Internet backbone runs across the USA and started carrying public traffic in the 1980's. The Australian network, AARNet, connecting all 36 universities in Australia, and one of the first in world outside the USA, was implemented in six weeks in early 1990. Other countries followed.

The World Wide Web (WWW or Web)

The WWW was invented by Tim Berners-Lee, an English guy, in 1989. Using the familiar <http://www.....> and other protocols it enables anyone to easily connect to every Internet site, Internet service and computer file globally.

Websites

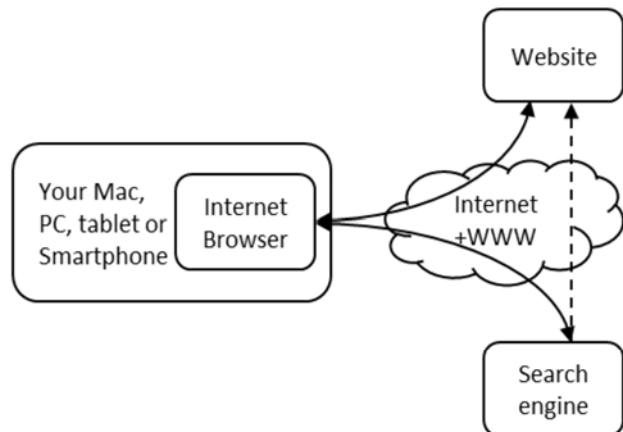
A website is any computer site that is connected to the Internet and can be accessed using its Internet name e.g. telstra.com.au .

Internet browsers

Internet browsers are application on your PC, Mac, tablet or Smartphone that allow you to connect to any website using the WWW protocols. The most popular are Internet Explorer, Safari, Google Chrome and Firefox. Browsers made the Internet and Web so easy to use that from 1995 traffic on the Internet exploded and the Internet started spreading rapidly to every country.

Search engines

Search engines (e.g. Google, Yahoo! and Bing) are websites that spend their time searching for information on the Web and cataloguing it – rather like a librarian. A search engine is not part of the Internet, but a service connected to the Internet. When you ask a question a search engine presents a list of websites that are most visited by people who ask similar questions. When you choose a website from the list, the search engine will redirect you to that website.

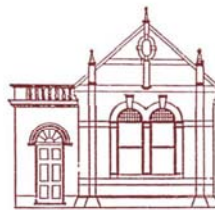

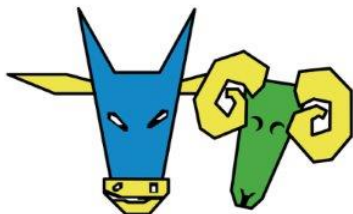

Put yourself first these holidays

The best present you can give yourself is time *now* to look after yourself. Many people put off seeking help about their health in the lead up to the holiday period.

Taking time in the lead up to the holidays to see your doctor about possible signs/symptoms of cancer is an important message of the Cancer Council WA's Find Cancer Early project.

"The lead up to holidays gets pretty hectic and it's easy to forget about looking after yourself. If you know something isn't right we encourage you to see your doctor well before - it's the best present you can give yourself", said Karen Hansen, Cancer Council WA, Regional Education Officer for the Wheatbelt.

Evidence shows that delaying seeing the doctor for just 5 weeks can have a big impact on patient outcomes. "Recognising symptoms early is important, so we want to encourage people to put themselves first" said Karen Hansen, Cancer Council WA Regional Education Officer, Wheatbelt.

If you are over 40 and have coughed up blood or had blood in your pee once off or have new spots on your skin or changes to a freckle or mole tell your doctor. You should also tell your doctor if you have had any of these symptoms for more than 4 weeks: blood in your poo; problems peeing; looser poo (diarrhoea); unexplained weight loss; an unusual pain, lump or swelling anywhere in your body;, becoming more short of breath; or a persistent cough.

Having these symptoms doesn't mean you have cancer – often they turn out to be something less serious, but it's important to tell your doctor. More information is available at: www.findcancerearly.com.au.

Free telephone GP service for country WA over summer

A free telephone after-hours GP service will be trialled in country WA to help with demand for medical services over the busy summer season.

The 1800-CALL-A-DOC (1800 225 523) trial will run until March 31 and will complement regular local GP services and provides a service when your regular GP is unavailable.

The Call-A-Doc GP will inform your regular GP of your treatment – with your consent.

WACHS Call-A-Doc project clinical lead Dr Andrew Jamieson said the service offered experienced Australian-based GPs who could provide advice, diagnosis, treatment and prescriptions for a range of conditions including fever, vomiting, dehydration, cold and flu, pain and infections.

1800 Call-A-Doc is a partnership between Telstra’s health arm, “ReadyCare”, the WA Primary Health Alliance (WAPHA), and the WA Country Health Service (WACHS). It is supported with funding from the WACHS Southern Inland Health Initiative through Royalties for Regions.

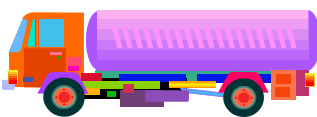

More on Late Stage Lyme Disease

Most Australia's are not diagnosed with Lyme disease until the disease has become chronic, also known as Late Stage Lyme disease. This is due to the medical profession being untrained and inexperienced in identifying the symptoms of Lyme disease. Additionally, local testing is also unreliable as a negative test result does not automatically exclude Lyme disease as it the majority of cases Lyme disease is a clinical diagnosis.

Symptoms and treatment information: The following treatment information is an extract based on an article entitled [Late Stage Lyme Disease, Patient Information](#).

- **Sudden bouts of weakness and symptoms flares** - Your body is fighting the bacteria alongside the antibiotics. But your body isn't always a nice steady predictable stream. Occasionally, and even frequently during the first cycle or two, your body will attack. Sometimes with an all-out-vengeance that will literally leave your knees weak and you panting for breath. In extreme cases, this can actually cause fainting. This can be very disconcerting if you're not expecting it. As long as your heart rate and blood pressure are OK, then you're probably fine. Go over your drug allergy checklist and consult your doctor if you think it might be a delayed reaction to antibiotics. Normally, this feeling will drop in intensity within a few minutes.
- **Headaches** - Can range from not at all if you're really lucky, to some really intense head-splitters. Do whatever you can to survive them.
- **Disconnection** - Close your eyes, now where is your arm? OK, look at it now. Doesn't really feel like it looks where it is, does it? The extreme of this symptom is a complete out-of-body experience. As toxin levels fall, you should become more and more re-connected to your body again. And there you were thinking that you were just getting really good at your Yoga exercises.
- **Panic Attacks** - You don't want to get these, really, you don't. It's a feeling of "Oh my God, I'm going to be like this forever, I can't take it please, somebody just kill me and get it over with..." The only possible good thing about this symptom is that it goes away.
- **Bright Colors** - Your pupils may dilate a bit. Indeed, you may find yourself wearing sunglasses, inside!
- **Hypersensitive Hearing** - Your ears may become hypersensitive to sound. In extreme cases, sound, even very quiet ones, can become painful.
- **Mood Swings, Irritability/Short Temper, Erratic Behaviour** - Again, all due to the toxin's effect on your mind. These will all clear up as you get well. These symptoms can be especially difficult for those around you to deal with.
- **Yo-Yo** - You'll be feeling like one. Up one minute, down the next. You might wake up feeling great one day, only to find that a couple hours later you're back feeling horrible again. UP, down, up, down, all around. Slowly, month after month, the downs will stop being quite so low, and eventually go away.

Whatever Else - Everyone is different, and the disease is quite well known these days for just how differently it affects different people. Any other significant symptoms that you are concerned about should be discussed with your doctor.

Mosquito-borne disease warning for Wheatbelt

The WA Country Health Service Wheatbelt Public Health Unit is urging all residents and visitors in the Wheatbelt to take extra care to avoid mosquito bites following an increase in the number of Ross River virus (RRV) infections in the region.

WACHS Wheatbelt public health physician Naru Pal said a total of 37 cases were notified so far this year compared to 31 cases at the same time last year.

"The illnesses caused by Ross River viruses include painful joints, aching muscles, lethargy, fever, headache and skin rashes, and symptoms may last from weeks to months," Dr Pal said.

"People experiencing such symptoms should seek medical attention from their GP or their local hospital".

"There are no specific cures or vaccines for this mosquito-borne disease so it is very important that people take care to prevent being bitten by mosquitoes".

The Department of Health's "Fight the Bite" campaign encourages individuals to protect themselves and their families from mosquitoes by adopting the following simple measures:

- avoid outdoor exposure particularly around dawn and dusk when mosquitoes are most active
- wear protective (long, loose-fitting, light coloured) clothing when outdoors
- apply a personal repellent containing diethyl toluamide (DEET) or picaridin to exposed skin
- empty or cover any standing water around the home or holiday accommodation to reduce mosquito breeding
- ensure insect screens are installed and remain in good condition
- use mosquito nets or mosquito-proof tents when camping or sleeping outdoors
- ensure infants and children are adequately protected against mosquito bites, preferably with suitable clothing, bed nets or other forms of insect screening.

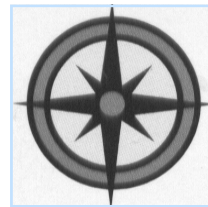

Skeleton Weed Program 2016/17

Summer Surveillance - Beverley Shire

The Skeleton Weed Program is delivered by the Department of Agriculture and Food Western Australia (DAFWA) under a service delivery arrangement with the Grains, Seed and Hay Industry Management Committee (GSHIMC).

As part of the 2016/17 Skeleton Weed Program, the Department of Agriculture and Food, Western Australia will be conducting targeted surveillance for the declared plant Skeleton weed (*Chondrilla juncea*) on non-infested properties, in the grain growing areas.

The surveillance is aimed at:

- areas where the likelihood of spread is most prevalent.
- raising the awareness of landholders in shires that currently have only a small number or no recorded infestations of skeleton weed, but that the Department considers have a probability of having skeleton weed.

Properties considered to be in this high probability category include those near or adjacent to a current skeleton weed infested property. Other properties have been identified from analysis of locations of current infestations and predictions of spread from these locations.

We plan to undertake our surveillance program between December and March and are required to check a minimum of three paddocks on your property. A DAFWA Officer will be contacting those landholders soon via correspondence and phone to discuss the process.

All landholders in grain growing areas are encouraged to undertake their own surveillance for skeleton weed, as part of their farm biosecurity. A procedure for undertaking surveillance searching can be accessed at this [link](#) provided.

If you believe you have Skeleton weed on your property, please report the sighting to the DAFWA Narrogin Office on 9881 9200 and a Biosecurity Officer will return your call.
