SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT REPORT - MARCH 2017



February Weather Emergency and Avon River Flooding

Record breaking unseasonal rainfall during February left damage in its wake and significant flooding of the Avon River, which rose higher and flooded longer than the January 2000 storms. Evaluation of damage is incomplete at this stage (as some of the infrastructure was still underwater!) Thankyou to Shire staff, DFES, SES volunteers and community members who worked hard in dealing with the local emergency, providing assistance where needed in town and around the district.

Cornerstone

Community information regarding the exciting Beverley Cornerstone project is included as a centerpiece in this edition of the Blarney.

Proposed Removal of Licence and Stamp Duty Concessions for Local Government

The Department of Transport advised that vehicle licence concessions currently available to WA Local Government Authorities will cease on 1 July 2017. These changes were quietly included in the State 2016-17 Budget and have only recently come to light. Emergency vehicles, limited use vehicles and those with approved wheelchair hoists or ramps will not be affected. Whilst the concession removal will vary between Councils, it would translate to an additional annual cost to the Shire of Beverley for licencing of approximately \$14,600 and an average annual cost due to removal of stamp duty concessions on plant of approximately \$24,000. This is extremely disappointing for communities, especially as Local Government already pick up the slack in many ways on behalf of their constituents (for example retaining Doctors and Medical facilities locally). Local Government Zones have been actively supporting the WA Local Government Association's advocacy to have this decision reviewed. Electors and communities should be up in arms about this new round of cost shifting to prop up the States difficulty with its own finances.

Weeds & Mosquitos

The rain has encouraged masses of summer weeds and unfortunately there will be mosquitos. The Shire has commenced spraying some of the reserves and is investigating mosquito control. Residents are strongly encouraged to be vigilant in their summer weed management (especially caltrop!)

Council Meeting Minutes

As a matter of interest minutes from monthly Council meetings, including unconfirmed minutes, are located in the library at the Shire administration office. For several years now they have also been available online via the Shire website.

Waste Bins 240Lt vs 140Lt

Avon Waste was awarded the Refuse and Recycling Contract for Beverley in December 2016 for a period of three years. As the company is replacing all generic bins (green lids) with new ones, an option was provided to the Shire of scaling back to a smaller 140Lt sized bin, which some Shires in the Wheatbelt have done. Whilst this may assist in diverting material from the Beverley refuse site, Council has supported retention of the 240lt bins. The community is strongly encouraged to recycle wherever possible.

Beverley Tourism Framework 2016 – 2020

The time required to prepare grant applications for the Cornerstone project has delayed development of a "Beverley Brand", which is an action within the Beverley Tourism Framework. Whilst some progress had been made, the Tourism Steering Committee will subsequently be assisting with development of this aspect of the Framework prior to disbanding. Another Framework action proposes the formation of a local Tourism Advisory Group to implement the Beverley Tourism Business Plan.

Australia Day Event at Beverley Pool

Top day, bumper crowd, user friendly shade areas, great inflatable, fantastic to see so many locals. Just some of the comments which have come through following another very successful Australia Day event held at the Beverley Swimming Pool. Thank you to Brad and Contract Aquatic for assisting the Shire and organizing this very popular event which attracted around 350 people.

Cleaning tips

The following tips will help to ensure your difficult-to-clean eligible farm chemical containers will be accepted for recycling at your local *drumMUSTER* collection centre.



Suspension concentrates (Atrazine, Simazine, etc)

- ✓ Rinse your container immediately after use to ensure any chemical residue does not dry
- ✓ Use methylated spirits to remove dried residue. If this doesn't work, fill the container with water and soak for at least 24 hours before rinsing.



Oil-based chemicals (ULVs, LVs)

- ✓ Follow specific instructions on the product label or contact the manufacturer for further assistance



Other chemical residues

- ✓ Rinse container immediately after use as all chemical residues are much harder to remove when dry
- ✓ Some containers may require additional rinsing (more than three rinses)
- ✓ A brush or high pressure hose may be required to clean stubborn or dried chemical residue



✓ **ELIGIBLE CONTAINERS WITH DIRT, RUST AND DYE STAINS ARE NOT CONSIDERED HAZARDOUS AND ARE THEREFORE ACCEPTED AT *drumMUSTER* COLLECTION CENTRES**



Avon River in full flow February 2017

Recent rains have resulted in very high water levels in the Avon River.

At approx. 10am on Thursday 15 February the River reached the water level of the 2,000 floods and was still rising.


An observation made was the cleanliness of the water, a direct result of the major change in land use practices (minimum tillage) use for cereal production.

This is in comparison to the days of ploughing and cultivation which, in times of heavy rainfall left the agricultural land prone to erosion, most of which finished in the river.

Another factual observation made was that had the centre of the river not been cleared of debris in the 1950's, the current river level would be significantly higher than that mentioned above.

For those interested, a book entitled "Bulldozing the Avon" "Parker Print" 2015 gives an authentic description of the Avon catchment, The Kokeby Paleo Chanel, the history of Qualanderry Crossing and the Avon River Training Scheme carried out in the 1950's. ISBN 978-646-93510-2



RAIN and FLOODING IN OUR REGION

With the recent rains and flooding in our region, there have been a few tense moments in our community and across the Wheatbelt. For some it has been damaging, for others, a close call. In cases of flooding, fire, high category storms and other natural disasters, St John Ambulance has a part to play.

Our volunteer ambulance officers were on stand-by over the last two weeks, not just for our town, but for the region. As with the other emergency services, St John Ambulance keeps enough resources at each town to maintain normal service, while also preparing for crews to go into affected areas and attend to people in need. They may be deployed to a scene for the welfare or care of members of other services who are dealing with the event itself. Or they may find themselves attending an evacuation centre, nursing home, or residences where chronically ill, elderly or injured people are in need of assistance.

These preparations happen more often than people realise, and our Beverley crews have been at the ready on a number of occasions over the last couple of years. These include incidents like the Hotham bushfire where they and five other sub centres deployed crews to Boddington, and also the recent bushfire near Popanyinning.

These February rains posed potential threats to routine ambulance activities too. Patients are often transferred from hospitals in the country to larger facilities in Perth. With some routes flooded, longer routes and delays had to be considered in a patient's care plan and co-operation between St John Ambulance sub centres in neighbouring towns can be crucial. Your Beverley volunteers have always worked closely with their immediate neighbours in Brookton, York and Quairading. As a part of a larger regional team, they are organised and remain ready to step up and help wherever and whenever required.

Take a moment then if you will, to appreciate the volunteers who step up for all of the different services in our community. We would be a lot worse off without them. We are always pleased when the worst doesn't happen but our volunteers are always ready for if it does.

Florence Emily McLean (nee Reynolds) Eulogy

Florence Emily McLean (nee Reynolds) was born in the old Beverley Hospital on the 25th April 1917 to parents George Edward and Florence Margaret Reynolds. George was a carpenter/builder for the local district and Florence raised their three children. Gordon the first born, deceased, Florence the middle child fondly known as Flossie and Elsie the youngest child, deceased.

All of Flossie's education was in Beverley, where her creativity for dressmaking stood out and was often rewarded with certificates from school and at the Beverley show. On leaving school Floss followed her love of fashion and began working as an apprentice seamstress to Jean Miller. Working for seven years in a room behind the Miller Haberdashery shop. In later years Floss started her own dressmaking business working from Gillespie's Clothes/Haberdashery Shop (now owned by Peppers).

Floss also had a natural ability playing centre half back for the Beverley hockey team. It was during her time playing hockey that she caught the eye and heart of Jack McLean. Hailing from County Peak, Jack with his fair hair and blue eyes stole Floss's heart. So began a courtship that was interrupted by Jack's enlistment to the Second World War. Jack gifted Floss a collie puppy named Prince to keep her company while he was deployed. Prince signified their connection to each other, separated by war, with many letters written back and forth. On the 20th of March 1944, they were married. Floss 27 and Jack 32 years old respectively.

When Jack returned from the war, they began to build their home at County Peak, selecting a beautiful position on the rise with expansive views towards Yenyenning Lakes and across to County Peak and Uralla Homestead. Floss loved being a farmer's wife, always very practical and helping where needed, rounding up sheep, feeding lambs. However what she loved the most was spending time with her family and her sewing. In time Jack and Floss raised three children on the farm Ron, Glenys and Ruth. They all have fond memories of Floss as a thoughtful, kind and caring mother.

Ron remembers Floss being supportive of all Family activities. Attending school sports/functions, ski club carnivals and football, rarely missing a game, home or away. Floss would insist on transcribing Jack's reports for the Beverley Times as she claimed no one could read his writing. Floss was always a keen Eagles supporter. Holiday times at Busselton with (Macs) the boat - Skiing. It was impossible to get Floss into the boat though, because Floss "Just could not swim" and did not like the Ocean - Thank You. Ron recalls - When he was away at Narrogin Agricultural School, the family having a very young Buddy Ugle living and working on the farm with the family and of course Buddy was put straight too - like the rest of us. Floss was happy to see him return over the years with his family shearing and liked to catch up. Also. Floss after much discussion was supportive of opening County Peak to share with the General Public and supplied and maintained the visitors book for many years.

Glenys remembers Floss's caring nature most of all, this was evident in how much Floss loved sharing her sewing with others. There were countless special occasion outfits, grandchildren clothes and curtains made. Glenys recalls working with Floss to create and sew a sportswear outfit for the Junior Farmers Achievement Weekend. Glenys was so excited for this weekend and recalled the many hours working together to make this outfit perfect. Glenys was awarded a prize which she attributes to Floss's outstanding dressmaking teachings and caring nature in spending this time with Glenys. Glenys

recalls Jack saying to Floss "do you ever get tired of sitting at that machine sewing". Shew never did, her passion and eye for detail was always evident, especially when making the wedding dresses for Glenys, Ruth and Suzanne, Glenys's wedding dress is still hanging proudly in her wardrobe.

Ruth has loving memories of her mum as a quiet and kind mother who valued spending time with her family and friends. Even though Floss thought she was not a good cook, some of Ruth's fondest memories are of Floss's homemade treats that she baked for the family. After school Ruth remembers there would always be afternoon tea ready to eat, some favourites were, forcer biscuits with icing, lemon marshmallow slice and powder puffs. The same with Sunday Football, Ruth remembers watching her mum Cooking in the kitchen, Ruth sticking her fingers into the mixer bowl as it spun and trying to eat the spoils before they went in the Sunday Football picnic basket. Fond memories of the family sitting under big gum trees, sharing food and watching footy.

As time went by and the children flew the nest, Floss volunteered at the local adult education centre teaching dressmaking skills to young aboriginal girls. There was often much laughter around Floss's impeccable sewing standards, resulting in much unpicking. Floss also enjoyed being outdoors especially in the garden, always having fresh flowers in the home, Lavender was a special favourite and was always a familiar smell in the family home. One of Floss's most memorable experiences was the trip her and Jack took to England in 1979. They travelled across the United Kingdom for six months. Visiting all the famous sites of London, touring England, Wales and Europe then onto Scotland their Ancestral homelands.

In 1983 Floss was widowed, with Jack dying unexpectedly from a heart attack. Floss continued to live in their farm house for another six years. In 1989 Effie Ridgeway's home was offered for sale and Floss thought it was a perfect home for a move into town. With a view of the big gum trees, sunrises and the moon rising in the night amidst laughing kookaburras this home was much loved. Floss participated in the HACC craft days and enjoyed more frequent contact with her friends in town.

This was a very happy time for Floss. Over the years a series of ill health events led Floss to move into the Alex Miles Lodge, which fortunately was just across the road, which allowed Floss to pop back home and spend time in her garden. A few years later Floss suffered a major heart attack and spent two months in Hollywood hospital. It was a testament to Floss's determined spirit and courage that against the odds at age 86 Floss recovered, with her wry sense of humour and strength of will intact and a body less able, yet recuperated, allowed her to return to the lodge.

Floss always enjoyed spending time with her family, watching and hearing about how the family was growing. Her five grandchildren were now starting families of their own and Floss always enjoyed visits from the great Grand children, there was always plenty to catch up on. In 2012 Floss moved to the Beverley Hospital to accommodate her higher care needs, where she lived for the next four years, still maintaining her determined sense of independence. Floss passed away peacefully in the Beverley hospital, on Monday 6th February. Our family will always remember Floss for her quiet and determined strength, her courage to overcome adversities in her life with a tenacious spirit and most of all as a kind, caring and loving wife, mum, grandma and great grandma. We will all miss her very much.

Permaculture Earthworks Course

For the first time in WA, join Ross Mars and Don Woodcock for three days of teaching and learning about water harvesting strategies for rural properties.

April 8 – 10, 2017 (Saturday to Monday)

Held at Westdale - northeast of Brookton (about 1 hr from Perth metro)

Course covers:

Day One

- Surveying techniques – using dumpy and laser levels, abney level and more to survey and peg out swales, drains, dams.
- Catchment assessment, measurements and calculations on possible water capture for both paddock and house.
- Basics of keyline design, types of dams, swales and drains.
- Introduction to the types of machinery used in rural applications – their limitations and capabilities.
- Reading maps – for estimations of slope, dam locations, water movement, location of valleys and ridges.
- Dam construction.
- Soil testing – dispersion test for clay, pH, percentage clay and fines, soil structure.
- Water testing – pH, salinity, water quality.

Day Two

- Machinery will be site to: Construct dams, clean drains and make swales.
- Building of silt trap for main dam, earthworks to repair existing erosion problem at dam entry.
- Rebuild spillway.

(Participants will be mainly observing these tasks while helping with machinery supervision and operation).

Day Three

- Second dam build.
- Building of drains into dams.
- Observation of construction of large steel-liner rainwater tank and assist with pipework from house.

You can participate in only the weekend, but we will assume everyone is there for all three days.



I hope you have noticed that the pergola that was on the east side of the hospital has been relocated to the lodge grounds, to give the residents somewhere to sit and have a cuppa and keep an eye on us all. This project would not have been possible without the hard work and expertise of the Beverley Men's Shed.

The reticulation on the lodge grounds had been in a bad state for sometime and it was decided that it would be a good idea to renew the retic to make everything green again. I approached the chairperson of the Hospital Auxiliary if they would be interested in funding this project, which she took back to her committee and then gave us the okay to go ahead. The job has been completed and I am sure you can notice the difference to the lawns and gardens. We would like to thank the Hospital Auxiliary for their most generous donation to fund this project.



National Trust

WESTERN AUSTRALIA

The National Trust was recently successful in an application for Royalties for Regions funding and \$215,000 has been granted towards the upgrade of a number of houses at Avondale. The Trust will put in \$120,000 including in kind support. An application is currently being prepared to match this grant through the Building Better Regions Fund which will aim to include green building initiatives such as solar power, fans, rain water collection, insulation, into the houses.

The upgrade of six existing houses at State heritage listed Avondale Farm is in line with recommendations in the Avondale Master Plan and aligns closely with the Avon Sub Regional Economic Strategy. The houses project aims to be a key step towards making the place economically sustainable while providing a distinctive education and tourism offering in the Wheatbelt. Upgrading the houses will enable the Trust to offer short term accommodation on site for a unique farm stay experience for individual tourists, families, groups, educational organisations and corporate weekend stays. In addition the Trust can offer opportunities for visitors staying on site to engage with the place through volunteer work and educational opportunities covering natural environment management, building conservation, farm machinery conservation, and farm management.

The Avon Sub-Regional Economic Strategy identifies that tourism to the region is predominantly comprised of day trips and that “maximising the sub-region’s exposure to overnight and multi-day visitation is critical to increasing the economic value of tourism in the local market”. (ASRES 2013 p32) Avondale is listed specifically as a key attraction in the region along with the observation that farm stays are increasingly common.

Tourism is specifically identified as an opportunity in Beverley and the Town’s vision for its future includes “an increased regional role as a tourist destination for Perth visitors with the Avondale Farm as a significant regional and agri-tourist attraction”.(ASRES p42) The Beverley Strategic Plan (2013-17) outlines the Shire’s vision for “history, heritage, community, agriculture and environment all in one very welcoming place” which is a statement that encapsulates Avondale and is representative of the National Trust’s mission to “engage and inspire community support for the conservation of our natural, Aboriginal and historic heritage for the present and the future”.

The Avondale houses project will have important synergies with the Beverley Cornerstone project due for completion in May 2018 including collaboration with events, volunteers, education and tourism. The region is already identified as having a high volunteering rate and the Centre will increase the capacity for volunteering through support services. It also identifies a need to support the projected dramatic rise in the 0-14yr old age group and to support vulnerable local youth in education and employment. All of these are areas that are relevant to a re-activated Avondale.

To further assist with the activation of Avondale, the National Trust and Shire of Beverley have agreed to fund a part time position to look at strategic level and activation initiatives for Avondale. The job description is currently being prepared and will be advertised soon. Concurrently, the Trust is working with the Shire to distribute a survey to gauge community response to the recommendations of the master plan. Keep an eye out for it and we look forward to hearing your feedback.

The State Governments' Local Government Reform Programme seeks to create a process of continuous improvement across the sector with Councils required to develop Integrated Planning and Reporting Frameworks including plans such as the Strategic Community Plan, Corporate Business Plan, Long Term Financial Plan and Asset Management Plans (plus others).

In 2012 our rate payers and electors gave Council a very clear mandate there was limited support toward continuing with the South East Avon Regional Transition Group and potentially amalgamation. It was clear that amalgamation was not a preferred option at all for our community. Although it is unknown if Local Government will be the focus of forced amalgamations in the future, there are some who believe this will be the case.

Improving sustainability, addressing efficiencies, regional collaboration, and fostering economic development in the district, will place the Shire in a stronger position to argue against amalgamation. The Department of Local Government has developed a series of financial ratios, which when applied determine if the Local Government is or has the potential to become sustainable with appropriate planning over the long term.

Asset Management Plans have been an eye opener with the annual funding shortfall for asset management, renewal and replacement challenging. This has encouraged many Local Governments to rationalise and consolidate the infrastructure they are responsible for, removing it from their Asset Registers altogether. Renewal costs, including expenditure to conform to current building and universal access standards for public buildings requires evaluation against potential use of the space, social benefit gained and associated cost to the ratepayer.

This was the basis of Councils decision not to expend any more funds on the Infant Health Building and initiate its removal, whilst also seeking community support and external funding for the Cornerstone multipurpose facility to service the needs of the community into the future and contribute to the economic growth and development of the district. Proposals need to be considered in terms of capital cost, social benefit, economic return and whole of life costs including operational, maintenance and replacement costs.

Beverley's 10 Year Financial Plan includes a proposed 6% annual rate increase which facilitates an improvement in our financial ratios. The actual rate each year is determined as the budget is developed and it is Councils' decision to set the rate depending on the community's needs and expectations based on the Integrated Planning process. In 15/16 this increase was 4 % and the 16/17 budget 3%. It is Councils intention to continue a conservative budgetary process.

Cornerstone, the beginning ...

A Feasibility Study was undertaken in 2013 with funding from the Department of Regional Development, Shire and support from the Community Resource Centre (CRC). The Feasibility was initiated by the CRC and Council considered its recommendations would be of benefit to the wider community. Following a 6 week consultation period Council subsequently adopted the Business Plan which was developed as a result of the Feasibility, and commenced investigation of external funding sources to build a collocated, multi-purpose, universally accessible community centre, addressing the objects of the Strategic Community Plan to contribute to economic growth and social development in a financially responsible manner through rationalisation of assets.

Consultants brief...

CCS Strategic was the successful applicant to undertake the Feasibility and had a brief from the CRC to assess *perceptions of the level and scope of facilities and services currently offered; those facilities and services that the Beverley CRC may need to offer in the future; and the most appropriate accommodation solution for the centre, be it renovation, expansion, relocation or construction of a new facility*. The study commenced in June 2013 with a needs assessment, followed by community engagement during July – September. The report was completed in November 2013. (CCS Strategic undertook the Recreation Project Feasibility for the town oval building project)

Needs Assessment, Feasibility and Consultation...

CCS Strategic reviewed Beverley CRC business plans, the Shire Strategic Community Plan (SCP), Shire building condition reports, studied the Regional Development Trust report following its May 2013 review of the WA CRC Network, reviewed the Shires inventory of buildings and community facilities, looked at facilities in Beverley operated and maintained by other groups and looked the Auction Centre in Queen St. An analysis was provided on the CRC's utilisation patterns of space in the Old School with commentary provided on that utilisation. A comparative analysis with other CRC's was undertaken as well as an analysis of the Beverley demographic. Community consultation was extensive and included a 6 week online and hardcopy survey distributed throughout the community, stakeholder interviews, an open community workshop and interviews with Shire Councillors and staff focus group. Over 140 people were involved in this process during July – September 2013.

Investigations and Consultation continues...

Council and staff representatives undertook a Wheatbelt study tour in May 2015 to view and seek information about collocated community facilities from 5 other CRC's. The opportunity was also used to commence investigation regarding what other towns are doing in refurbishment of their swimming pool facilities. The Community Development Officer has continued consultation during the NSRF grant process seeking letters of support for the project which must follow the strict funding criteria requirements, including developed plans. Letters have been received from many organisations who would use this new facility or can see its long term benefit including CRC, Max Employment, the Disability Employment Scheme, WACHS, Landcorp, CBH, Pitlock Industries, Experience Perth, Avon Tourism, Holyoake, Beverley School, Ag Society, Beverley Station Arts, Photography Group, Naturalists Club, Local Emergency Management Committee, CRANA, Shire of Brookton, Local Businesses, various Politicians. Main street businesses were interviewed during the Vincent Street redevelopment information gathering process. Public submissions on the Business Plans for funding applications have been invited and received. Statistics show there are 700 users/mth of the current CRC facility, with inadequate universal accessibility and limited technology capacity.



- The work undertaken on the Old School to replace the roof, stabilise the foundations and repair the floor and has been undertaken over the last few years as part of the Shires Asset Management program as the owner of the building. The refit to the building for the CRC's purposes prior to their tenancy was not a Shire cost.
- Council hasn't determined what the use of the Old School Building will be when the CRC relocates, however it is likely it could be used as part of the Shire's administrative space, particularly storage.
- The Shire does not propose to use all of its reserves for this project as has been reported in some sectors of the community. The two reserve funds eligible for consideration of this project are the Cropping Committee and Building Reserves which as of 31st January 2017 totalled \$702,548.




CORNERSTONE FLOOR PLAN

With the recent heavy rainfalls mosquitoes will become more prevalent, residents are encouraged to “Fight The Bite”, to prevent irritation and mosquito borne illness.

You should consult your doctor if you experience the following otherwise unexplained symptoms:

- fever
- drowsiness
- headache
- stiff neck
- nausea
- dizziness
- skin rashes
- painful or swollen joints
- sore muscles
- flu-like symptoms (fever, chills, headache)
- tiredness or weakness.

Prevent mosquito bites

Many mosquitoes bite around dusk and dawn, but some can bite day and night. The only way to prevent mosquito-borne disease is to avoid being bitten. Know how to prevent mosquito bites – cover up, repel, clean up.



Cover up

Wear long, loose-fitting, light coloured clothing, covering as much of the body as you can. Mosquitoes can bite through tight clothes like jeans. Make sure children are also appropriately covered up.



Repel

Use [insect repellent](#) containing DEET (diethyltoluamide) or picaridin and always follow instructions on the label.



Clean up

Stop mosquitoes breeding in water pooling around your home or holiday accommodation by emptying water from containers and draining areas where water ponds, such as low lying areas or gutters that don't fully drain

Recently introduced provisions of the Road Traffic Act 1974 (RTA) empower police officers to **impound an unlicensed motorcycle** that has not been licensed for 2 years or more and **is being or reasonably suspected of being, used on a road** (this includes the street verge).

DID YOU KNOW?

The penalty for the driver of a motor vehicle using a mobile phone while moving or stationary but not parked is **\$400 and 3 demerit points.**


