Local Government Elections October 2017

Local Government elections will be held on Saturday 21st October 2017. Nominations open for 1 week, commencing 44 days before polling day and close 4pm 37 days before polling day. For anyone who has an interest in nominating as a candidate the Shire of Beverley will be holding an information session on Thursday 13th July 2017 (details elsewhere in Blarney). Alternatively you can make an appointment to speak to the CEO and Shire President.

As an Elected Member you represent and contribute to your community at the Local Government level. Training is provided and the role can be interesting, varied and rewarding (perhaps at times a little frustrating too!) Please give your consideration to attending the information session to gain an understanding of your Local Government.

Roadworks within the Shire

Gravel sheeting has been completed on Deep Pool Road and is currently occurring on Ski Road into the lakes area and on Yenyening Lake Road east of the Qualandary cross roads. Federal 2017- 2018 Black Spot road funding has been announced to upgrade and improve the safety of a 1.66km section of the Top Beverley-York Road near Walgy Road.

Mobile Black Spot Communication Upgrade for Bally Bally

Bally Bally has been included in the most recent Federal Government's Mobile Communications Black Spot program. The Shire has received correspondence indicating that the planning process has commenced.

<u> Beverley WA – Be very you</u>

Following development of the Beverley Tourism Business Plan and Tourism Framework 2016-2020 the Tourism Officer is progressing roll out of a new branding and logo for Beverley tourism stakeholders, including business and community. Creative ADM were engaged to develop the unique identifier for Beverley and the Tourism Steering Committee provided oversight on this process.

The CRC are hosting a Business Sundowner Branding Workshop on 20th July 2017 at which development of the Framework and marketing and branding process will be explained and the Tourism Officer will provide an update on how the new brand can be used (details elsewhere in Blarney).

The Tourism Steering Committee's role is now complete and the interest and commitment to this project has been valued. The group was established in March 2015 and commenced with Cr Dee Ridgway, Cr Tom Buckland, Kathryn McLean - CDO, Sam Fricker - CRC, Jo Johnson, Scott McLean, Jacinta Murray, Kate Sofouis, Heng Ee and Arie Valkhoff as its members; Heng and Arie resigned during last year for various reasons.

A Tourism Advisory Group has now been established with terms of reference to assist the Tourism Officer

with the task of Tourism Framework implementation.







Gee that title sounds terrible, not really one for me more like the caretaker so next month I will change it. I hope everyone is enjoying the fine weather we are having but like everyone else we are waiting for the rain. The fine weather has given us the opportunity to work more in the bush reserve than inside. The past couple of weekend has seen some of the National Trusts workers and their families come up from the city and enjoy what Avondale has to offer. The National Trust has a community work day scheduled on July 02 from 9.30am to 4.00pm. The 52 hectare bush reserve is recognised as significant for its high degree of biodiversity, priority flora and range of unusual species. The National Trust has been working towards weed control, revegetation, fire management and feral animal control in the reserve and it is important that this work continues to maintain and improve the quality of the bushland and to enable educational and tourism programs. The trust is seeking volunteers to help with the management of the reserve on either a casual or ongoing basis. The National Trust aims to form a community based volunteer group who would be interested in meeting on a regular basis to help care for and maintain the bush reserve.







Aged care housing in limbo, Davies

June 2, 2017

The Labor Government is failing to guarantee the future of planned vital aged care and independent living investments across regional WA.

Member for Central Wheatbelt Mia Davies MLA said questions to the Minister for Regional Development in Parliament provided no certainty that Labor would deliver the \$117 million of Royalties for Regions funding approved by the previous Government.

Ms Davies said The Nationals had planned and delivered unprecedented investment into aged care and independent living infrastructure, however many projects were now in doubt.

"Every project delivered or earmarked for development has been established in close collaboration with local Shires and regional communities, who are now worried that the government won't honour this important investment."

"The Nationals know looking after those people that have invested in their communities is important, they want to stay close to family and friends", she said.

Housing projects in Cunderdin, Tammin, Quairading, Beverley, Brookton, Pingelly, Dowerin, Goomalling, Toodyay, Wongan-Ballidu, Corrigin, Kondinin and Wandering are all in limbo as the Minister is busy looking for savings.

"These projects are the perfect example of what Royalties for Regions should be used for, making aged care work in the regions is difficult and you need to be innovative."

Member for Agricultural Region Martin Aldridge MLC said enabling older residents to remain in their communities close to family and friends at a time when they most need their support was important but not the only driver for Government to invest.

"The demands for aged care facilities will only increase in the coming years as older residents seek to continue to live independently within their communities," Mr Aldridge said.

"The Nationals in Government also recognised that investing in aged care and housing was an economic driver, creating new jobs in our regions.

"Without these measures, older people will be forced to leave their communities and this is an unacceptable outcome."

Protecting your Information

Identity Theft

Identity theft occurs when someone collects enough information about you that they can make out they are you. Some examples of what someone can do if they steal your identity are as follows:

- Access your bank and steal money from you (including from mortgages that have a draw down facility). This has happened to one of my customers – fortunately the bank's protection system stopped the transaction!
- Buy/hire a car in your name and commit a crime
- Sell your house
- Take out loans or open credit card accounts in your name and rack up huge debts.
- Obtain a passport in your name
- Commit a crime and leave evidence incriminating you.
- I'm sure you can think of more!

Many people have been ruined as a result, or have great difficulty proving they were not involved in crime.

How can your identity be stolen?

In the past there was little personal information available publicly that people could use to steal your identity. The most common way to obtain personal information was through theft. However you are likely to notice pretty quickly if you have had a break-in or you lost your wallet/handbag.

Now there is lots of your information available publicly, in public records, Facebook etc. which can be found easily by internet searches. But the most common way identities are stolen is by someone breaking into your PC, phone or tablet. This can happen if you lose your device, it is stolen, or you leave it unprotected in a place where someone can access it without your knowledge. The most surreptitious of them all is to enter your device from the internet. The first line of protection is to use a password to log in to your device. Without a password people have easy physical access to your device and can access all your information.

Even if your PC is password protected there are tools available that can crack the passwords quite easily. Windows 10 has better password protection than earlier Windows versions, also phones and tablets are more secure than PCs.

To be secure a password needs to more than 16 characters long and consist of random uppercase letters, lowercase letters, numbers AND symbols. Long complex passwords could take hundreds or thousands of years to break using today's technology.

Most people can't remember more than one or two passwords so they tend to write them down. **This is extremely dangerous.** It is easier to find someone's password list than use software to break the password!

A simple way to protect your passwords is to put them all in a password-protected Word or Excel file (passwordprotected files are also encrypted). Then you only have to remember one long and complex password. There are also password management programs available.

The best protection is to also encrypt all your files, then if someone does get access to your PC they can't read the files without decrypting them. However, most people will not go to these lengths. I do because I am very aware of the dangers.

Best practice:

- Put a password on your device
- Use long and complex passwords
- Do not write passwords down on paper
- Keep passwords in an encrypted file or use a password management program.
- Encrypt all your files for best protection.

Hello Everyone,

As you learnt last month I have been on annual leave. I am now back, well rested and ready to go. I would like to thank the York officers, S/c Ben White and S/c Greg Kerr, for their efforts while at the helm in my absence.

Having reviewed our crime statistics I thought it would be worthwhile to share this information with you. Firstly, what are crime statistics and what do they mean? Crime statistics are one manner in which our work can be interpreted but not the only way. Our agency also report annually on Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) to gauge how we are going.

Like all statistics, crime statistics are open to interpretation as to what they tell us and their ultimate significance. If you want in-depth detail about KPIs and crime statistics, there are technical notes about how WA Police statistics are gathered, across what timeframes, against certain legislative meanings and so on, you can go to <u>www.police.wa.gov.au</u>

Thankfully Beverley has minimal crime so I can keep this fairly simple. Year to date, offences against property (namely theft/stealing) are up 67.6% (28 in 2016 and 39 YTD 2017) when compared to last financial year.

Crime rates are influenced by numerous factors, not just policing. Police can influence crime rates by targeting causal factors (crime prevention), providing an effective response to incidents and by successfully investigation offences and apprehending offences. However, many other factors come into play such as economic conditions (unemployment rates), the time of year, weather (more burglaries tend to occur in warmer months), the make-up of the community (predominantly elderly or young people, well-off or not so well-off), the extent to which people and businesses implement crime-preventions strategies and so on.

For the community of Beverley I can safely say that crime-prevention, or more to the point, the lack thereof, is one significant area contributing to stealing Simple steps such as securing your offences. valuables out of sight would go a long way - out of sight out of mind. Lock before you leave your home or vehicle. Also, CCTV camera technology has come a long way and is now very affordable. Selling items on eBay, gumtree and the Beverley Buy and Sell page are very popular and for this reason can be fraught with danger as they are trolled by those who are only too willing to take advantage of good natured, trusting people. My advice to anyone buying and selling in this forum is to ensure you proceed with caution; do not part with any money/deposits unless you are

100% sure that you are dealing with a reputable business/person or you have sighted the item and/or the seller in person. Remember the adage, if it seems too good to be true then it is too good to true. Scamwatch - *www.scamwatch.gov.au* is updated on a regular basis with all the latest scams and for this reason, worth checking on a regular basis.

CONTACTING BEVERLEY POLICE STATION

While we have discussed this before, we still receive questions about station opening hours and the best way to contact us. If you want some advice or guidance from your local officers and we are not at the station, you can email us

<u>Beverley.Police.Station@police.wa.gov.au</u> When we get back to the office, station email is checked regularly throughout the day and you will receive a response from us, usually the same day.

If you want to drop into the station, we have made it easier to see at a glance if we are in attendance. You will notice a new '**OPEN**' LED sign in the window by the front door; when the sign is illuminated you will know we are in the office and available to meet with you. Of course, if the sign is not on, we are likely to be dealing with a higher priority incident, on a traffic patrol, or out and about engaging with you, our community.

Remember, if your situation is urgent and/or life threatening then dial 000. If it is not life threatening but you require a police response, then dial 131 444.

STOP SIGNS

We only have a few of these within the CBD of Beverley so there are no excuses; make sure you come to a complete STOP, do not roll on through. FAILURE TO STOP AT A STOP SIGN will see you issued with a traffic infringement; the penalty is a hefty **\$300 and 3 demerit points.**

SCHOOL HOLIDAYS

Always take care while travelling on our roads but especially during school holidays when we see an increase of vehicles on our roads with people and families heading off on their well earnt getaways. Plan your trip to include regular rest breaks and with the approach of the winter rains, please slow down and drive according to the conditions. Heavy rain and fog warrant extra care and attention!

Working with Warriors Staying Connected in Challenging Times

Things that we cannot control are our biggest distressors, in agriculture it is mostly weather issues followed by a multitude of other factors such as commodity prices, machinery breakdowns (how long is a bit of string!)

This year every area of the Wheatbelt (from Northampton to Southern Cross to Esperance and in between) has had different rain events and the crops and pastures are at different stages of germination and growth. We must remind ourselves that it is winter and we are in July. These challenging starts to the season affect the whole community (farmers, people involved in agribusiness and those in the agri-link industries like the mechanics, the mitre 10 store). Everybody feels the pain.

No one can change what happens with the weather, all we can do is manage our programs and control our business as best we can which importantly includes looking after ourselves and each other (our mates and neighbours).

Remaining connected is one way of doing this. So, what does this mean? Rural communities have an innate capacity to reach out and organize and participate in many bottoms up activities. RMHI has been attending a lot of these events including, breakfasts, sundowners and many other gatherings which allow the communities to have a conversation about where they are at individually and as a collective. There is less and less of us living in regional areas, add this to the nature of modern farming as well as a challenging season and isolation becomes more prevalent. Staying connected is important and something we must actively work on.

As blokes, we have a propensity to self-medicate. A lot of people think that is done by sex, drugs and rock & roll however in the work we do its mostly blokes spending more time in their cave, working harder, longer, and talking less (some ladies might find that hard to believe). It is important that we start to talk about some of the pain and distress that as blokes we tend to suffer alone.

We describe "primary care" as what can we do to look after ourselves and others, invariably it is about connection. Some simple things we can do:

- Talk to a Mate realize that we are not alone.
- Talk to whoever needs to be informed about our situation (family, financiers, advisors).
- Keep an eye on others drop into a neighbour and have a chat and a coffee. Take the time to ask someone "are you okay?"
- Slow the pace of our life a little, join a group that fits in with our passions and interests. It will make a difference.

• Maintain our sense of humour, laugh at ourselves and with others. Australians are well known for their larrikinism and humour, Edward DE Bono one of the world's foremost thinkers called humour "a key lubricant for life" and oftened referred to humour as "social glue and the best anti despair device we have". I think he is right on the money, when we lose our sense of humour we are buggered.



We'd like to thank all the 60 or more 'early adopters' who have already completed their forms and had their samples sent in to the research project. We acknowledge that there's a bit of effort involved and we're appreciative of the contribution to the cause.

The early submitters have assisted in the clarification of procedures and the Murdoch team have updated their website. The requirements for taking part in the pilot study remain unchanged - that is that patients must have a known tick bite and a positive result from any lab for any tick borne disease. You are still able to send your samples if you don't remember a tick bite, but those samples will not be included in the pilot and will be securely stored for future testing. We've been made aware that some doctors could not or would not draw the blood themselves. For patients that have to get the laboratory to take their blood, they may be invoiced. If this causes any financial distress, please the Lvme Disease contact Australia Association of for assistance via email on info@lymedisease.org.au with: a) your details b) a photo of the invoice from the lab c) photo of your Murdoch project application - we will pay the laboratory invoice directly on your behalf and confirm with you.

We have been told that some doctors are concerned about signing the forms and being linked to this project. We respect their choice, we advise you to be persistent in finding a GP. This is simply a project addressing research urgently prioritised by the Chief Medical Officer since July 2014 and there is updated information for doctors on the Murdoch University website to support them in being fully informed

Remember, if you do not meet the criteria for the pilot study you may still volunteer, but your sample will be stored for possible future studies which are subject to funding and/or other conditions. Murdoch are accepting financial donations for their tick research if you are interested



Some research has shown Kombucha's ability to prevent and heal leaky gut and stomach ulcers. It can also help heal Candida yeast from

overpopulating within the gut because it helps restore balance to the digestive system.

Energy

Kombucha's ability to invigorate people is credited to the formation of iron that is released from the black tea during the fermentation process. It also contains some caffeine (although in very small amounts) and b-vitamins, which can energize the body.

Immune Health

The overall effect that Kombucha has to modulate the immune system is best seen in its ability to control free radicals through antioxidant measures.

Joint Care

Kombucha can help heal, repair and prevent joint damage in a number of ways. It is loaded with glucosamins and supports the preservation of collagen and prevents arthritic pain. In the same way it supports joint collagen, it also supports collagen of the entire body and reduces the appearance of wrinkles on the skin.

Cancer Prevention

Kombucha is also beneficial for cancer prevention and recovery. A study published in Cancer Letters found that consuming glucaric acid found in Kombucha reduced the risk of cancer in humans. President Reagan even reportedly drank Kombucha daily as part of his regimen to battle stomach cancer.

Weight Loss

Data from a study in 2005 showed evidence that Kombucha improves metabolism and limits fat accumulation. Though we need to see more studies before we can confirm these results, it makes sense that Kombucha supports weight loss since it's high in acetic acid (just like apple cider vinegar is) and polyphenols, which are proven to help increase weight loss.
