BEVERLEY BRAND OFFICIALLY LAUNCHED



On Saturday 19 August, Avon Valley WA Chairperson Karen Dore officially announced the launch of the newly developed brand for Beverley.

Be very you Following months of involvement by the Beverley Tourism Steering Committee, and endorsement by Council, the formal launch of the brand at the Beverley Show marked the official adoption and integration of the Beverley Tourism Plan and Framework.

Development of a Beverley 'brand' was recommended in the Beverley Tourism Plan and Framework, and was proposed to reinforce a unified approach in which all tourism initiatives, products, services, and experiences could be promoted under a unique identifier, making the town more easily recognisable as a destination for visitors.

Ms Dore said the Beverley Tourism Framework 2016-2020 is a fantastic area promotion strategy that was clearly being enacted by a passionate group of local stakeholders.

"The brand is a small, but very important, part of the Beverley Tourism Plan which was completed late last year. The plan has the valued support of the Council, and includes a framework of strategic recommendations that will facilitate decision making by Council, support economic growth of the town, provide direction for tourism stakeholders, encourage community collaboration, enable integrated planning and review, and form the basis for development of new products, services, or experiences for the tourism market in the future," she said. "I love the 'be very you' slogan and very much look forward to seeing it splashed everywhere, it will be a pleasure to share."

Building Better Regions Fund - Successful Funding Announced for Beverley Cornerstone Project

The Shire of Beverley was one of four successful Wheatbelt shires in the region to receive funding in the recently announced Round One of the Australian Government's Building Better Regions Fund (BBRF), Infrastructure Projects stream. The Beverley Cornerstone Project has been approved \$1.32m in grant funds through BBRF, which is very exciting news for our community!

Beverley Cornerstone Project

Assessment of tenders received for development of the Beverley Cornerstone Project indicates the completed project will be closer to \$3m than the quantity surveyor estimate of \$4m. This is welcome news for the Shire and an indication of opportunities afforded by the current downturn in the mining and building industries. After three unsuccessful applications to gain funding through the former National Stronger Regions Fund (NSRF), the recently announced success in round one of the Building Better Regions Fund (BBRF) will enable a significant proportion of the project to be co-funded.

Rates Discount

A 10% discount is applicable to rate payments received in full by 11 September 2017.

The 2017/2018 Budget is available on the Shire website www.beverley.wa.gov.au or from the Shire office. The ESL component of the rate notice is a State Government charge collected on their behalf.

Candidate nominations for the 2017 WA Local Government elections to be held in October open on Thursday 07 September for 8 days, and close 4pm Thursday 14 September. Information and nomination forms are available from the Shire office or at the Department of Local Government and Communities website www.dlgc.wa.gov.au

Reduction in Road Funding to Local Government

The State Government has reduced funding to Local Government for roads through Main Roads WA allocations. The untied funds are mainly used for road maintenance and it is considered the reduction is a result of the recent successful Disallowance Motion in the Upper House reversing the removal of vehicle licencing and stamp duty concessions for Local Government. The funding reduction for the Shire of Beverley is \$46,842. Council had resolved during budget deliberations that should there be a reduction in funding from State Government that the Shires capital program would be reduced rather than increase rates.

June Census Data Indicates Reduced Federal Financial Assistance Grants for WA

The WA Government Grants Commission advised in August that previous notional grant allocations for Federal Financial Assistance Grant (FAG's) distributions to Local Government, based on May census estimates, will actually be lower due to June census data affecting FAG's distribution to the State.

Minister for Local Government and Darren West MLC Visit Beverley

Hon David Templeman, the Minister for Local Government, Heritage, Culture and The Arts, and Hon Darren West MLC visited Avondale Discovery Farm on the afternoon of Thursday 24 August. They also met with Crs Ridgway, Murray, White and Buckland and the CEO at the Shire, discussing an array of topics including road funding and changes to the Local Government Act. Rounding out the Ministers portfolios whilst in Beverley was a brief visit to the Railway Station Cultural Precinct and Platform Theatre.

Local Government Convention & Trade Exhibition

With a theme of "Members First" the 2017 Local Government Convention held in early August was attended by Councillors Ridgway, Gogol and Davis and the CEO. Representatives from across the State attend the event which provides an interesting array of speakers and topical concurrent sessions and an opportunity for information gathering and networking.

BBP Aged Housing Project

The Beverley Brookton Pingelly (BBP) aged housing project announced earlier this year has been on hold since the state election, awaiting the forthcoming State budget for direction as to whether previously

committed funding is still available. The project would enable 27 independent living units to be built between the three shires, of which 12 where to be located in Beverley. The BBP Alliance are due to meet early in October.

Launch of BeverleyWA Branding

Chair of Avon Tourism, Karen Dore, officially launched the new BeverleyWA branding which is an outcome of the 2016 -2020 Tourism Framework. The BeverleyWA website has been updated to reflect the branding and an information booklet will soon be available which contains Beverley tourism information in one handy publication. The Shire of Beverley was recently excited to learn it is to receive \$1.32m from the Building Better Regions Fund for the Cornerstone Community Building. Along with valuable funding from other partners, Lotterywest, Department of Regional Development and the Beverley CRC the building will now commence construction in October 2017.

At the 22 August 2017 Ordinary Council Meeting, a tender for the construction of the Building was awarded to RHG Contractors. It is expected that the Infant Health Clinic and the Beverley Museum will be removed in September. The Vampire Jet will be relocated to the Beverley Airfield and the Amana wheel will be relocated with the jet on Hunt Road where it will be protected under the new shelter.

The Cornerstone Building will be home to a new Beverley taster museum and tourist centre. The museum will also house a replica of The Silver Centenary which is currently under construction.


A plan of the Cornerstone building is in the Shire window which also shows the library, CRC, office space and crèche. The building is designed for universal access and is fully compliant with building standards.

Rose Show Preparation

Extracted from www.rose.org Rose exhibiting for beginners

Start watching your roses for potential exhibition specimens. If you plan to exhibit a single bloom on a stem, you will need a strong, straight stem that has been disbudded as it developed. Disbudding is the process of removing all side buds that form between the stem and the axil of the leaf. This allows all the energy to go to the terminal bud. Eventually you might want to stake the cane with a bamboo stick and some twist ties. Be sure to keep the tip of the stake just under the bloom. Staking protects the cane from snapping off in the wind and prevents leaf tearing on thorns from nearby canes.

If you plan to show a floribunda spray, you will want to remove the centre (largest) bud at the point of emergence from the stem. This allows the side buds to develop and fill in the hole where that first bloom would have been if allowed to develop. That centre bloom would have developed first and been finished by the time the rest of the spray was in exhibition form. Removing it at that time would have left the hole.

Water your bushes regularly and keep up your spraying schedule! Prepare a grooming kit which you will use the day of the show. Get a small plastic or metal case and gather together the following items:

- Soft clean cloths (hotel shoe shine cloths are great)
- A package of Q-tips
- **Tweezers**
- Small sharp scissors
- Small camel-hair brush
- Several sheets of aluminum foil and/or plastic wrap
- Return address labels
- An ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses and ARS Exhibition Names

If possible, some exhibiting tags with rubber bands that you picked up at a previous show or local society meeting.





Open to the whole

Beginning of the Beverley Historical Society

The story of the formation of the Beverley Historical Society begins with a public meeting in the Beverley Town Hall Lounge on Tuesday 18th October 1977. Ruth Mann became our first President. At our very next meeting in November 1977, a suggestion was brought forward that the Society approach Shire Council for use of one or two rooms at the Settlers' Arms (as it was then known) which had been acquired by the Council in July, for our headquarters.



A reply from Council stated that – "Council would be prepared to make available to your Society a room at the Settlers' Arms for the holding of meetings. Such approval however, would be of a temporary nature pending commencement of renovations to the building."

The First Busy Bee at Dead Finish

The Society's willingness to help was evident when a busy-bee was called in late 1978 by Council for the purpose of removing an outside bathroom, louvres, and framework from the verandah of the Settlers' Arms; and to clear the area around the building of grass and rubbish. This was to be a joint effort by both Council and Society, arranged for Saturday November 4th at 9.00am.

The Council's maintenance man was to be present to supervise and help. He and Members of the Society turned up on time, and the work - including the removal of old lino, protruding floor nails and carting all outside rubbish to the tip - was completed that day. One Councillor arrived late in the afternoon, sat on the tray of his truck and watched while work progressed!

This general clean-up was later followed by Council strengthening both floors and ceilings. However, the building was not ready for occupation yet, so the Society continued to hold its meetings in the Town Hall Lounge for two years.

Ethan, our most senior Aboriginal student, offered a heartfelt acknowledgement and welcome at the opening of the Show.







The Trilogy of Fermentation – Part 6

Other fermented dairy products are made from far fewer strains, and don't contain any beneficial yeasts. Yogurt contains transient bacteria to help clean and line the gut, giving food to the good bacteria. They go in and don't stay. No additives, fillers and flavouring is needed to enjoy with your 'home made' sourdough rye bread, yummy and our all time favourite to eat during the day with a little greens on the plate, bon appetite.


AGM



The app allows qualified first aiders to sign up as a first responder and be notified when someone has called 000 for an ambulance within 500 metres of their current location and in a public place. To become a first responder you will need to provide evidence of having completed a first aid course within the last three years. Minimum qualification level of HLTAID001 Provide cardiopulmonary resuscitation. If you're not looking to sign up as a first responder yet, then that's okay! The app also contains a number of other resources, including:

- First aid instruction guides helping you to treat a range of injuries and illnesses.
- Triple zero (000) calling with automatic GPS location calling 000 from the app will send your GPS coordinates direct to the St John State Operation Centre, making it easier for an ambulance to locate you.
- **Defibrillator (AED) locator** showing all the defibrillator locations near you.
- First aid tips and special offers keeping you up to date with handy first aid information.

Welcome to our first edition of our planned regular monthly update. The Beverley Naturalists Club Inc or better known as the "Bev Nats Club" which was established in early 2000 and has been responsible for many great achievements with in the Shire including assisting in the mapping and documentation needed for the "Roadside Vegetation and Conservation Values" published in April 2005. However, more history in future editions.

Currently our primary project is the restoration and development of the "Brooking Street Reserve". This beautiful 5 acre block located in the heart of the town site bounded by Brooking and Dempster streets has been under threat until recently by DFES who wanted to burn the whole thing to reduce the fire risk. Now while we, like most reasonable people, are aware of the need to minimise bushfire risks especially in an area of high density residential living we also have seem the devastating effects of a hot wild burn on a similar block and the destruction it caused to the flora and fauna there. Following long consultation with the new "Bushfire Risk Management Team" at the Shire and DFES a compromise was reached where by a buffer zone was manually cleared (by club members) and then a very light, low intensity autumn burn was done to create a safe access and cleared zone along the reserves road exposure. This allowed the risk to be reduced and the flora and fauna the chance to flourish.

This little reserve is home to an abundance of orchids and many other species. The club, in collaboration with the Shire, plans to develop walk ways and rest areas so the community and tourists alike can enjoy and experience the tranquillity of nature within walking distance of the town coffee shops!

However to complete this we need new members! People like you who have individual skills and enthusiasm to help protect and save, for the future, our natural environment and those who want to help make a difference. We live in a world where there seems to be an increasing need to be busy and connected all the time. We are trying to pack more and more into our lives and it is no wonder many of us often find ourselves feeling over-extended with our work and personal commitments. In a rapidly changing society are we forgetting the benefits a bit of solitude can bring to our lives?

For many people, having quiet alone time is often not on the radar. In fact, these days it is almost developing a bad reputation as time that is in effect, wasted! It's realistic to imagine that a lot of people would find it difficult being alone with their thoughts for too long. The struggle not to think about deadlines and commitments or reaching for our mobile phone to get the latest news feed, email or Facebook update is persistent. Our constant focus on the need to stay connected to the outside world could be leading us to a disconnection with our true inner self and a sense of peace.

Backyard Buddies

Your monthly guide to animal and plant pests, diseases and weeds



Most people have encountered grasshoppers at some time in their gardens and watched them hop or fly away. These days we are seeing two very big native grasshoppers which have spread from their warmer northern climes and established in southern WA. They are the Giant or Hedge grasshopper (*Valanga irregularis*) and Spur-throated locust (*Austracris guttulosa*). Unfortunately both have a taste for the leaves of shrubs and trees, and this has not gone down well with gardeners.

Both species have very large bodies, approximately 50-75mm in length, with long back legs and a throat spur. Adults can live for up to 12 months. The female lays eggs in the soil in late spring. After hatching, the nymphs change colour with each moult, varying from light green to a spectacular red with blue stripes. The adult Giant grasshopper often has a strong patterned body colour and a white stripe on the top of their thorax.

Control

The word from gardeners is that chemical control is rarely effective on these chompers. Luckily there are natural control options available which only require a healthy garden environment. Grasshoppers are eaten by a wide variety of animals, particularly birds, and can be parasitised by mites, nematodes and flies. Some Scelio wasps also parasitise the eggs. In some parts of the world locusts are eaten by people - food for thought! They can also be collected by hand net and placed in a container. then into freezer. While not dangerous or known to bite, they're best handled with gloves to avoid the spines on their rear legs. Look for them in the early morning as they bask in the sun in the outer foliage of plants.

You can also help protect your trees and garden by reporting unfamiliar or unusual pests, weeds or diseases to the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (previously the Department of Agriculture and Food WA). Make an online report or download the 'MyPestGuide Reporter' app from



This month's article will be fairly short and sweet as there is not a lot to report.

FARM PLATES

A timely reminder to those who utilise farm licence plates. There are a number of conditions that apply to the use of farm plates; the main two:-

- Permitted to travel on road for purposes of fire prevention or to the nearest practical place for repair
- To be use ONLY on farm or between one portion of that farm and another portion of that farm within the Shire

For those of you who choose to drive your vehicle on a road contrary to the above conditions then the vehicle licence is deemed invalid under section 7(4) of the *Road Traffic (Vehicles) Act 2012.* Motor injury insurance will not apply and penalties may be incurred.

CRIME PREVENTION



A big thank you to the community of Beverley for taking responsibility for crime prevention in Beverley; as a result of you locking away your valuables and keeping them 'out of sight and out of mind' you have directly attributed to the reduced crime in Beverley. Keep up the great work and keep our town a safe and secure place.

DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL

Whilst our crime figures are down, disappointingly there are some that still make the choice to drink and drive. Last month a 43 year old male was charged with excess 08.

Alcohol impairs one's ability to control a vehicle and research suggests that at a blood alcohol concentration (BAC) of 0.05%, the risk of being involved in a traffic crash is double that of a person who has not been drinking at all.

The legal limits

Any alcohol at all will affect your ability to drive. In Australia, it is an offence to drive while your BAC is 0.05 or above.

If you are a novice driver; or have been recently disqualified; or are a holder of an Extraordinary Licence; or are a driver of a taxi; bus; small charter vehicle; vehicle carrying dangerous goods; or a vehicle over 22.5t, the legal limit is zero.

Note: A novice driver is a person that has not held a driver's licence for a total period of 2 or more years. Your BAC should remain below 0.05 if you:

- drink no more than two standard drinks in the first hour and one per hour thereafter (for men of average size); or
- drink no more than one standard drink per hour (for women of average size).

However it can vary significantly from person to person.





Lyme Disease Association of Australia

#BREAKINGNEWS NHMRC \$3 Million

Minister Greg Hunt MP prioritises \$3M for Research into Lyme-like illness in Australia. In 2016 the Lyme Disease Association of Australia [LDAA] made a submission to the National Health and Medical Research Council [NHMRC] through their online Targeted Call for Research pathway. In June, Minister Hunt has asked the Chief Executive Officer of the NHMRC to fast-track the Targeted Call for Research [TCR] into Lyme-like illness in Australia which resulted in an announcement of funding of up to \$3 million. A team of independent experts (the Targeted Call for Research Advisory Committee) met for the first time on August 1st. Their task is to work out where the knowledge gaps are to determine the research questions for which researchers will then be able to apply for funding. The call for funding is expected to happen in 2018. Because of the considerable community interest in this issue they have decided to provide information about the Advisory Committee and their progress on their website. We will continue to bring you updates on this as information arises.

The final fixture for the month was a Club trophy Stableford event played on Saturday August 26th. Next month's Blarney will contain the details.



Beverley IT Making IT Simpler

Secure Internet Banking

Contrary to what some people think Internet Banking is quite safe, providing you take a few basic precautions. I've been banking online since 1998 when I went to work in China, where there was no other option to access my account easily. I've never had any security issues.

Secure Connection

If you look at the bank's Web address in your browser (Edge, Internet Explorer, Google Chrome, etc.) you will see that the address starts with https:// . The 's' indicates that the link from you to the bank is secure. It has end to end encryption. Nobody can intercept the link and get meaningful information. The banks have high security on their end so the weakest link in the chain is YOU and YOUR device!

Password Good Practice

All banks use a customer number plus a password. This is the critical information you must protect. The most dangerous thing you can do is to write down the customer number and password on a piece of paper and put it next to the computer or in your wallet or purse. If your house is broken into or your wallet or purse is lost, your money is at risk.

Never send a password in plain text by email or text. Texts are stored by the service providers- emails are stored at many locations on the Internet and transmission can be intercepted. Use an encrypted email or text service, or use the phone - voice is not recorded (yet!).

If you are using more than one bank then use a different password on each bank. This will minimise losses if your password is compromised.

Storing Password

Be careful using the built-in facility for saving passwords on your PC or other device. Not all of them are secure. In some devices the passwords are in plain text - if a criminal gets access to your device they know where to find the passwords!

If you use different passwords for each web service then it becomes impossible to remember them all. However there are password management programs you can purchase to store passwords securely. Passwords are kept encrypted and automatically applied to your banking and other websites.

A simple password storage system is available if you have Microsoft Office (Word or Excel). Put all your passwords, etc. in a document then go to the File tab; click on "Protect Document" (or similar); select "Encrypt with Password"; enter a password twice and the document will be encrypted and password protected. Now you only have to remember one password for the Office document (do not write it down!). DO NOT FORGET THIS PASSWORD or you will lose all your passwords. Make sure you back up the password file.

Best Security

The best security is something you know (a password) and something you have (a security device). A criminal has to get hold of both to get into your accounts. Some banks provide security devices. These are worth getting. Some banks use a code sent by text to your phone. This is not as good as a security device, as the phone number can be changed by a criminal, but it is better than just having a password. The best advice is to be careful and protect your passwords. If you feel that security has been compromised notify the bank immediately. Never disclose your password to anyone.

Securing Your PC

Criminals can obtain information from your PC using keyboard logging, screen capture or remote access programs in order to steal you information. But they can only access your PC if you invite them in, either deliberately or accidentally. You should always have a good security program and scan regularly for viruses and keep an eye out for anything unusual.
