Beverley Soaring Society and Sculpture by the Sea “Final Approach” It’s big and it’s bold

For artist and glider pilot Geoff Overheu, this year’s entry in the popular *Sculpture by the Sea* exhibition in Cottesloe has been a long time coming.

After 25 years farming in the WA wheatbelt, Overheu completed a fine arts degree and for the last 12 years has been a practising artist. He has exhibited nationally and internationally. In 2011 Overheu joined the Beverley Soaring Society and is now a very active cross-country glider pilot and instructor.

Overheu’s idea to do a collaboration with the Club was met with enthusiasm from the start. His artistic vision and the Club’s pool of diverse skills in its 120-strong membership are coming together to produce a “big, bold and exciting” artwork that is hoped will dominate Cottesloe Beach during this year’s *Sculpture by the Sea* exhibition.

The basis of the sculpture is a Blanik glider. The Blanik is the most produced glider in history and dominated the sport for decades. Overheu sees this object (which was the pinnacle of innovation and engineering in its time, only to be superseded and made obsolete by progress) as a symbol of the ending of modernism, it being a victim of its own success.

For the Beverley Soaring Society members it has been great fun to participate in and contribute to a project that, for many of them, was completely foreign – a project that combines sport and the visual arts. This exciting project, in itself, has challenging engineering and production aspects that have leaned heavily on the skills of the members. The sculpture is huge and will need to sustain high wind loads on the beach.

Sculpture by the Sea is open to the public on Cottesloe beach from March 2 to 19 March. If you are in the City why not fit in a visit to the event and get behind the Club by voting for Overheu and the Beverley Soaring Society’s “**Final Approach**” in the People’s Choice Award.

So you may ask yourself what do your police officers do when crime is so low? Our work is varied and sees us assist wherever the demand within the Wheatbelt District. December saw us travelling to the border between Toodyay and Gingin policing districts to assist with the search for a missing person. Of course, December our focus was on road safety and high visibility patrols of our major roads.

If you are into facts and figures, for the period 1/7/2017 – 31/12/2017 Beverley Police conducted 836 random breath tests, issued 97 speeding infringements and preferred 15 traffic charges (court appearances).

I encourage you to keep the lines of communication open and talk to us at every available opportunity. Remember, if you see something that doesn't look right, please pick up the phone and give us the information as and when it is happening. Let us decide if warrants our time and attention. Again, if your call is transferred to Northam because we are unavailable, please provide them with the relevant information, it will make its way to us.

WHAT'S NEW? – SLOMO – SLOW DOWN, MOVE OVER



New SLOMO laws will take effect in Western Australia from 2 March 2018. The legislation requires drivers to reduce their speed to a maximum of 40kph when approaching a stationary emergency vehicle that has its emergency/ flashing lights activated. It further requires the driver to move over, or change lanes, where this is possible and safe to do so.

We routinely deal with incidents on the roadside, which is inherently a dangerous place to be working, especially on high-speed roads. This new law offers better protection not only to police officers but also to DFES, St John Ambulance, Main Roads WA Incident Response, breakdown services and towage personnel.

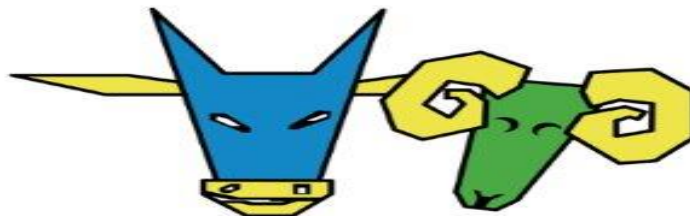

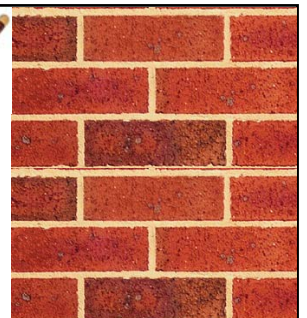

Fact Sheet **Q Fever**

Q fever is a disease caused by infection with the *Coxiella burnetii* bacteria. It mainly affects people who work with livestock as it can be spread to humans mainly from cattle, sheep and goats. Symptoms are similar to the flu.

Hundreds of cases of Q fever are notified to Australian health authorities each year, but these are mainly reported in New South Wales and Queensland. In Western Australia there have been less than 10 cases of Q fever a year notified since 2011. Most of these cases were associated with abattoir workers or farmers.

How do you get it?

You can get Q fever from infected animals by breathing in airborne droplets of their urine, milk, faeces (droppings) or birth products that contain the *Coxiella burnetii* bacteria. Sheep, cattle, goats, cats, dogs, bandicoots, feral rodents, kangaroos, birds and ticks can all spread Q fever.

It is also possible to get Q fever by drinking unpasteurised milk from an infected animal or by inhaling dust from wool, hides (animal skins) or straw that has been infected with the *Coxiella burnetii* bacteria.

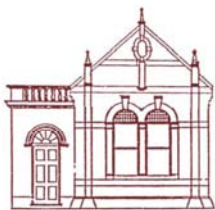
People at increased risk include:

- abattoir and meat processing workers - veterinarians
- pelt and hide tanners (those who treat animal skins to produce leather goods)
- professional shooters supplying the meat industry, such as kangaroo shooters
- Sheep shearers, sheep, cattle and dairy farmers

It is recommended that all people working in these industries consider vaccination against Q fever.

Signs & Symptoms

Q fever normally causes flu-like symptoms including:

- fever - muscle aches - body weakness - chills - headaches
- sweating - general fatigue (feeling tired)

If untreated Q fever can also cause long-term health complications including:

- pneumonia - hepatitis
- endocarditis (a heart valve infection, which can be life-threatening)

Testing for Q Fever

A diagnosis of Q fever must be made by a medical professional who will undertake blood tests to confirm infection. See your doctor if you have had close, ongoing, contact with animals and have the above symptoms.

Treatment of Q fever with antibiotics is usually successful.

Prevention

You can reduce the risks of getting Q fever by:

- being vaccinated
- - avoiding exposure to animals carrying the *Coxiella burnetii* bacteria
- using protective equipment (face mask, gloves, gowns) as recommended in work guidelines

There is a vaccine called Q-Vax which offers a high level of protection against Q fever.

However, before you can have the vaccine you must undergo a skin test to determine if you have been exposed to Q fever before. This is to make sure you are not already immune to the virus. If you are already immune to Q fever and then have the vaccination, you could have a severe reaction such as abscesses at the injection site, fever, headaches and muscle pains. The Q fever vaccination is available through your doctor.

NBN Fixed Phone Service

There has been a lot of confusion over the fixed phone services provided by the NBN, so I hope to provide some clarification.

The Mobile telephone services are completely separate from the fixed phone network and are not affected by the NBN in any way. However some mobile calls now travel over the Internet using WiFi Calling as I explained in the December Blarney.

Home Telephone The telephone was invented in the 1870's and the connection to the home has changed little since then. Home telephones are connected by a pair of copper wires from the phone (and its extensions) all the way back to an exchange. There have been some small recent changes – some lines are now digital (mainly for businesses) and ADSL mixes the phone signal with a digital data signal. However the connection to the exchange is still the same – a pair of copper wires from the home to the exchange.

This network of copper wires, sometime stretching for kilometres into the country, is decaying and maintenance costs are soaring. So after more than 100 years the NBN is replacing that technology.

Telephone Exchange Technology has had several major changes. Initially all exchanges were manual relying on a human operator. Between the early 1900's and the 1970's automatic mechanical exchanges replaced manual exchanges

The big change in technology came in the 1980's when much smaller, lower cost and lower maintenance digital exchanges replaced the old mechanical exchanges. These exchanges have now come to the end of their lifetime and need replacing.

The Internet was invented in the 1960's by the US Military as a network to survive a nuclear war. Streams of information are cut into small packets each with its own address. The Internet delivers each packet separately and the information is reassembled in the right order at the destination.

Information convergence The Internet started to spread worldwide outside the military in the 1980's and 1990's and soon other technologies started to converge onto the Internet replacing many separate technologies and networks: point to point data

Another Microsoft Update

The latest Windows 10 major update, 1709, is currently being installed. Like earlier updates it is large and takes some time to download and install.

If 1709 hasn't arrived on your PC yet, make sure your PC is up-to-date and you have adequate Internet download allowance, particularly if you are still using mobile broadband. Go to the PC Settings/Updates & Security, check for updates and install any updates. Leave your PC on and connected to the Internet to make sure any updates are installed correctly.

If your PC has not been updated before the 1709 update or if you run out of allowance update 1709 will keep on trying and chew up your data allowance. If it doesn't install you may need to do a clean start-up to ensure nothing blocks the update.

networks; information exchange, search engines (e.g. Google); email; photography; voice (e.g. Skype, WhatsApp etc.) and now radio, TV and Facebook. Meanwhile in large offices telephones are now often connected over the internal data networks.

The NBN uses Internet data protocols. While the main purpose of the NBN is to provide a universal data network across Australia, it can also carry telephony using 4G mobile technology, which also uses Internet protocols. Finally, in Australia, the home phone is joining the Internet. Eventually the separate telephone network, will disappear. Only the NBN and mobile networks will remain.

NBN Fixed Telephone The mobile has now become the universal person-to-person communication device and many people are now giving up their fixed phone. The fixed phone will continue to be used in business. If the NBN fibre service is connected to your home when NBN fibre comes to Beverley, your traditional telephone service will be disconnected. You can either cancel the home phone or use a fixed line phone service over the NBN. **If you connect to the NBN Wireless or NBN Satellite services your fixed line home phone will not be affected.**

Warning: To keep your existing phone number when transferring a home phone to the NBN you must fill in a separate form to transfer your phone number. Otherwise you will be allocated a new number.

The *Rickettsiae* are a diverse group of bacteria some of which can be transmitted to humans via the bites of fleas, lice, ticks or mites.

Several *Rickettsia* species present in Australia are capable of causing disease in people. These species include:

Rickettsia australis: Queensland tick typhus

Orientia tsutsugamushi: Scrub typhus

Rickettsia honei: Flinders Island spotted fever

Rickettsia typhi: Murine typhus.

Although rickettsial infections are relatively rare, they have been reported along the eastern Australian seaboard, Flinders Island and the east coast of Tasmania, as well as the Fleurieu Peninsula in South Australia and southern coastal Western Australia.

Rickettsia prowazekii (epidemic typhus) is spread by human body lice and can result in outbreaks of disease, but is only seen in conflict settings and refugee camps and is not naturally occurring in Australia.

How rickettsial infections are spread

Rickettsiae are usually injected directly from the saliva of ticks and mites as they feed on humans and, in the case of fleas, by contamination of bite sites by faeces.

Signs and symptoms

There is great variation in the range and severity of symptoms experienced.

Commonly a small, hard, black sore (called an eschar) first appears at the bite site where the infection was introduced. Other typical symptoms may include:

- fever - swollen lymph glands - headache - cough - muscle aches - rash

Less common severe infections can be associated with confusion and breathing difficulties.

Diagnosis

Given that these infections are not common and usually mild they can be difficult to diagnose. While signs and symptoms can suggest the diagnosis, a definite diagnosis is made with a blood test or skin biopsy (for example a sample of skin) of the bite site.

Incubation period

Between 3 to 10 days.

Infectious period

Infections are not transmitted from person to person.

Treatment

Treatment is usually with the tetracycline antibiotic doxycycline which reduces the duration and severity of infection.

Prevention

Exclusion of people with rickettsial infections from childcare, preschool, school and work is not necessary. There is no vaccine available to prevent infection.

Wear long sleeved protective clothing and a broad brimmed hat to reduce the risk of infection when undertaking activities where human contact with ticks, lice, mites or fleas may occur, such as bushwalking and camping in infected areas.

Use an insect repellent containing DEET or picaridin and examine your skin for possible bites (especially behind the ears, on the back of the head, in the groin, armpits and behind the knees) following these activities.

ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER WOMEN ENCOURAGED TO PARTICIPATE IN CERVICAL SCREENING.

Aboriginal Health Promotion Officer Kay Walley is encouraging all women to find out about the new Cervical Screening Test, and to get tested if due or overdue for screening.

Kay, the Aboriginal Health Promotion Officer at the WA Cervical Cancer Prevention Program works to encourage Aboriginal women across the state to participate in cervical screening.

“Cervical cancer is one of the most preventable cancers, and your best protection is regular cervical screening.”

“It’s really important to be up to date with your cervical screening, and now they’ve got the new Cervical Screening Test,” explains Kay. “This new screening test will feel the same as a Pap smear but is a better test so you only need to have it every five years.”

The Cervical Screening Test looks for human papillomavirus (HPV) which causes abnormal cervical cell changes. Kay says “This new test picks up HPV and any cervical cell changes early so that they can be monitored and if needed, treated before they have a chance to develop into cervical cancer.”

All women aged 25 to 74 are encouraged to have a Cervical Screening Test every five years. Kay says “Your first Cervical Screening Test is usually due two years after your last Pap smear, and then it will be every five years if your results are okay.”

“Talk to your healthcare provider about the new Cervical Screening Test and to check if you are up to date with your cervical screening.”

“Regular cervical screening as part of your women’s health checks is the best way to stay healthy and strong for yourself, your family and your community.”

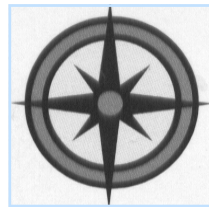

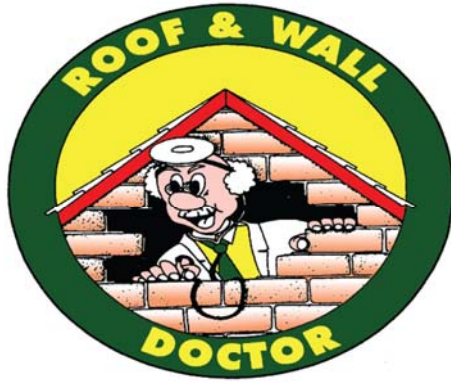

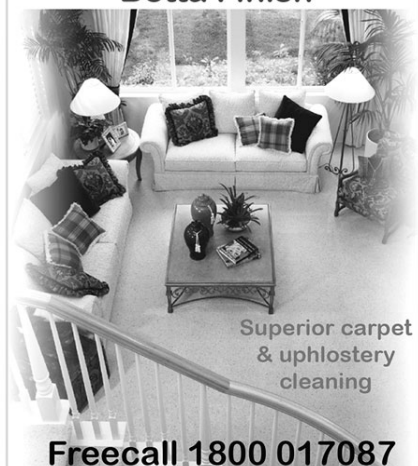
