#### **Bush Produce at Avondale**

Last month the National Trust announced its proposal to offer Avondale Farm as an innovation hub for the emerging bush products industry. The purpose of Avondale Farm will be to support the development of the industry to grow, value add and market Native Bush Produce. The place will offer an integration of research, application and enterprise support. Complementary to this is the development and commercialisation of a range of tourism offerings.

The proposal for Avondale is in the early stages of concept development and project planning. To support the planning process a request for funding has been submitted to Regional Development Australia, Wheatbelt. A grant application has also been submitted to Lotterywest for new interpretive signage throughout the heritage precinct, making for a better visitor experience at Avondale.



The National Trust acknowledges and thanks AFPA for their enormous contribution to Avondale over the years. The generous commitment of the AFPA volunteers was seen in the tractor museum, the care of the Clydesdales, Robbie and Comet, and AFPA's general commitment to the place and supporting visitation at Avondale.

The motor museum collection is owned by the Shire of Beverley and remains a key attraction at Avondale. For those interested in restoring and showcasing this collection a new volunteer structure will be formed as AFPA winds down their activities.

Although AFPA will no longer exist as a separate incorporated association, Avondale will always be a place for community and volunteers. During April two busy bees were held, one in the Bush Reserve and the other around the grounds. Thank you to the volunteers from far and wide who generously gave their time at the busy bees.

#### SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT REPORT - MAY 2018



#### **Rural Fire Division**

The Premier recently announced that a Rural Fire Division will be progressed to increase the focus on bushfire management and volunteer relations in response to recommendations from the January 2016 Waroona Bushfire Special Inquiry. He also announced that an increase of \$28 to the metropolitan ESL and between \$8 and \$17 per annum across the four regional ESL categories will be included in the 2018/2019 State Budget to fund it. Good news on one hand, not so good on the other. ESL is not a Local Government charge and currently is collected by Local Government on behalf of the State Government.

#### Feedback on the Draft Strategic Community Plan 2017 - 2027 due Wednesday 09 May

Please review the Draft Strategic Community Plan 2017 - 2027 and provide any feedback by Wednesday 09 May 2018. This document helps guide Councils' future programmes and direction. The Report is available on the Shire website under the News tab or from the Shire Administration Centre.

#### Administration Centre Flags

As reported in the April Blarney, Council proposes to seek grant funding in 2018/2019 to purchase two new flag poles for the Shire Administration building to fly the Australian Flag and Aboriginal Flag. The Shire of Beverley flag will be relocated to the town hall and used to continue what has become a tradition of respectfully recognizing the passing of current and previous Beverley residents following notice from family members. During NAIDOC week 2018 the Shire will be flying the Aboriginal flag in front of the Administration building.

#### **Bridges and Crossings**

Renewal of bridge 4307on Bremner Road (south of Miller Road) has been completed. Works are due to commence on Bremner Road bridge 3206 (south of Negus Road) which will require the road to be closed for around 5 days. Work is also due to commence in May for an upgrade of the crossing on Jonson Road which will require the road to be closed for approximately one week. A start date is not yet known for refurbishment the

Vincent Street Bridge and further discussion has been required around funding and design of the proposed alternative river crossing.

#### Alfresco Parking Bay Project

The relocatable Alfresco platform is to remain at each of the three café/restaurant food establishments for a further 4 weeks. The structure will then be retired to the Works Depot for the remainder of winter. Council will be assessing its future availability as relocation does come at a cost. This project has certainly supported the thinking behind Vincent Street redevelopment and the Shire will endeavour to attract external funding to progress the Vincent Street Redevelopment Concept Plan.

#### **Easter Art Exhibition 2018**

The Beverley Easter Art Exhibition continues to attract a high standard of work and again in 2018 was presented beautifully at the Town Hall by Beverley Station Arts and their helpers. Over 50 years ago it seems art groups were growing around the state. Following a competition held by the Shire Council of the day the Beverley Times Friday 12 April 1965 reported "About half of the pictures are by "foreign" painters from such centres as Albany, Quairading and Perth, while the rest are our own local talent". In 1968 a newly formed Art Gallery Committee held their first acquisitive art exhibition in Beverley with a view to building up the local art gallery. The Community Art Collection which now has a home in the historic 1886 Beverley Railway Station has been growing over this time.

Congratulations to the RSL and community members involved in presenting the dawn and morning ANZAC commemorative services in Beverley. Both were well attended. A wreath beautifully crafted by Geraldine Faithfull was laid by the Shire President and Deputy Shire President at the memorial on behalf of Beverley citizens during the morning service.

#### **Ban on Single Use Plastic Bags** Commences 1 July 2018

From 1 July 2018, lightweight single-use plastic bags will be banned statewide in Western Australia. This has already occurred in South Australia, Tasmania, NT and ACT. Queensland has committed to a ban from 1 July 2018 also. You may have noticed the local Beverley IGA has already commenced this process.



#### DON'T LET YOUR FIRE BECOME THE GREAT ESCAPE!

The Community Emergency Services Manager along with the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer for the Shire of Beverley would like to remind everyone to take <u>all care</u> when deciding to conduct any form of burning and to be <u>well prepared</u> to prevent the fire escaping your control.

It is always the responsibility of the person who conducts a burn to ensure that the fire does not escape their control and penalties and sanctions including fines and/or the recovery of the costs associated with local Bush Fire Brigade response can apply where a fire escapes and impacts others.

The following is a list of factors to consider when conducting burning...

- What are the current weather conditions particularly relating to wind strength and direction? (no burning if the wind is likely to exceed 20kmh) Can you postpone your burn to a better day?
- What are the forecast wind conditions for the following days?
- Do you have sufficient resources available to prevent an escape of your fire?
  - → If you live in town have you made sure that you have a hose or hoses that can easily reach the site of your fire and beyond? Have you checked that the water is turned on and ready immediately if required?
  - → Have you cleared a bare mineral earth break around the area to be burnt? Do you have rakes and shovels immediately available to use?
  - → Are you dressed appropriately with long pants and long sleeved cotton clothing, sturdy boots and leather gloves?
  - → Have you ensured that your fire is a sufficient distance from trees, shrubs or anything else you don't wish to burn? Remember flames heights can be considerably higher than your rubbish pile and radiant heat can set fire to surrounding items. Maintain a minimum of 5 metres clear for small garden fires. Wet down surrounding areas.
  - → If you are outside of town do you have an adequate number of fire fighter units to control the burn? Have pumps, motors and hoses been checked to ensure immediate operation and water supply when required? Has a bare mineral earth firebreak been installed around the paddocks you wish to burn as per the Shire's Firebreak Order?
  - → Do you have a sufficient number of people organised to monitor the fire and maintain supervision until it is fully extinguished?
  - Remember to be vigilant to ensure the safety and protection of the whole community.




#### Dale Station Military Post -**Beverley's First Government Building**

Beverley's earliest government building was a military post for troops from the 21st Fusiliers and later the 51st Fusiliers sent from Britain to the Swan River Colony to help keep order. Referred to as the Dale Station, the post was on the original Avondale property of Nicholas Carey. It was established on the east bank of the Dale River on a road known as King George Sound Road, a well-travelled route from the settlement at York to another military station at Williamsberg (now Williams). No trace of this road remains. The subsequent York-Williams road is on the western side of the river. The site of the Dale Station is on a farm property known for over a hundred years as The Barracks in recognition of its early military use.

Little remains of the military outpost now apart from scattered stones, portions of mud brick & some fragments of broken crockery. There were two separate buildings, several hundred metres apart. It is believed the station building itself had 3 areas: one room as a station office, a second was perhaps a living area for single men, while the third area was stables. There is a photo (below) of the ruins of the other building which appears to be two adjoining cottages. They were living quarters for the use of married soldiers and their families.



The Dale Station had a short life. It is believed to have been built about 1839 yet by 1843 or perhaps 1844 the station was closed. The station was staffed by between four and seven men over the years. Troops were supplied with some provisions but were expected to supplement their diet by hunting, & growing their own.



#### What To Do For Choking First Aid On Babies (Under 1)

We all know how much babies love to put tiny objects in their mouths from the second they can grasp. While most parents do baby-proof their homes and remove all tiny objects, it is impossible to keep an eye on babies 24/7 and their

eyes often spot items we don't notice.



- 2. Give back blows as follows:
- Place the baby with their head downwards on your forearm
- Support their head and shoulders on your hand
- Hold the baby's mouth open with your fingers
- Give up to 5 sharp blows between their shoulders with the heel of one hand
- Check if the obstruction has been released after each back blow
- If the obstruction is relieved, turn baby on their back and remove any of the foreign material that may have come loose with your little finger

It is quite difficult to gauge the right amount of pressure and timing for the back blows and chest thrusts if you've never done a First Aid course before, particularly when it comes to babies. You may be surprised at the pressure needed, which is why all parents should undertake First Aid Training at least once, but it's even better to do it approaching the birth of each baby.

# Warrior Wellbeing Article Looking After Our Back

As blokes we are all guilty of just wanting to get the job done and sometimes throw our bodies on the line without ever considering possible consequences. We see this with both young and old blokes alike, and injuring our back is one possible consequence. In fact, the Australian Institute of Health and Welfare suggest that 70% - 90% of the population will experience lower back pain in some form during their life.

Back problems can be caused by a multitude of factors ranging from: a pre-existing issue or weakness we may have from childhood; wear and tear caused by the physically demanding jobs blokes undertake; or just a fact of life due to our modern day sedentary lifestyle (e.g., hours sitting in trucks/ tractors, office chairs and on the couch). There are also those situations where we push ourselves that bit too hard or things just go pear shaped. It's important to recognise that our back is a precious commodity, just ask anyone who has suffered a back injury resulting in chronic pain... it can be debilitating!

A *neglectful attitude* is something else a lot of blokes are guilty of and this attitude can exacerbate many health conditions. This is a common attitude that underpins the often unspoken but hardwired attitude that "I am a warrior" and "it will not happen to me". How many times have you heard a bloke experiencing pain say, "she'll be right, I'll see how it goes?" and puts up with his issue for weeks, months, and even years. If we're lucky we do 5 minutes of stretching and remember to sit up straight for the rest of the day, but that's about as far as it goes.

Proper back care should be part of our regular routine and there are simple steps we can take that will not only decrease the chances of back problems but also benefit our overall wellbeing, such as:

**Exercise and stretching**; the better shape our body is in with a good range of movement decreases the risk of putting our back under unwanted pressure. Try some yoga!

**Proper Posture;** whether it's sitting in a tractor, behind a desk or with our feet up enjoying Saturday arvo footy, our body is not designed to be in a seated position for extended periods. Get up and stretch out as often as possible and make sure we don't slouch or slump in our chairs. Place a rolled -up towel behind the lower back for good lumbar support.

**Bulging Belly**; we can't all have a raging six pack like some of the pin up boys out there but losing a few kg's off the guts and increasing strength around our core muscles, especially our pelvic floor, takes unwanted pressure off our lower back.

**Lifting Logically;** we need to bend our knees, keep our back straight, and keep the load centered to our body. The Silhouette Star wound camera with accompanying trolley and laptop is valued at almost \$10,000 and will be used to treat patients across the Wheatbelt region attending the wound clinic with complex and chronic wounds.

Wound clinic staff are extremely excited to receive the donation and are currently undergoing training with the equipment. The new camera will also be available for use in the podiatry department, ED and patient ward.

The camera's lasers and lights are able to measure wound depth, width and length reducing the risk of contamination and produces vital information to assess the status of wound healing. This method is more accurate especially when measuring irregular shaped wounds.

Auxiliary members volunteer their time working in the hospital kiosk with profits channelled into providing equipment for Northam Hospital.

The Auxiliary would like to thank hospital staff, patients and visitors for their continued support of the kiosk.

#### WET WEATHER DRIVING TIPS

As we are approaching the wet winter months it's a good time to check your cars tyres and wiper-blades. The fundamental thing to realise is that wet weather driving demands you drive much slower. Here are some tips to help you avoid an accident:-

- Exercise extreme caution if a deluge has followed a long dry spell During a dry spell, engine oil and grease collects on the road. When it rains, the surface becomes slippery. Continued rain will eventually wash away the oil, but the first few hours are the most slippery so bear that in mind.
- Allow for more travel time Traffic will be moving slower. Your normal route might be flooded or jammed, so don't blow a fuse if it is, just relax and arrive safely.
- Turn your headlights on Not only will your lights help you see the road, but they'll help other drivers see you.
- Drive in the tracks of a car ahead of you
  Following another car's tracks on wet roads can
  reduce the amount of water between the road and
  your car's tyres. Keep a safe distance and a keen
  eye on their brake lights so you can quickly
  anticipate their actions.
- Brake earlier and easier than normal This
  increases the stopping distance between you and
  the car in front of you and lets the driver behind
  you know you're slowing down. Use you turn
  signals earlier, so that other drivers can read your
  intentions easily.
- Keep an eagle eye out for pedestrians and cyclists Visibility is lower and rain deadens sound, so the usual visual and audio cues for measuring car distances become obscured. Pedestrians are also impatient to get out of the rain so may make rash crossing decisions.
- Defog your windscreen Rain can cause your windscreen to fog up. Switch on both front and back demisters/heaters and make sure the air conditioning is also turned on.
- Avoid large puddles Water splashing up into your car's engine compartment may damage its internal electrical systems or a pothole under the water could damage a rim or knock your suspension out of alignment. If you can't gauge the depth, try to avoid it. After you are across the puddle, tap on your brake pedal lightly to dry off some of the water on your rotors.
- Give trucks and buses extra distance Tyres from large vehicles can splash enough water to block your vision completely. Avoid passing one, but if you must, do it as quickly as safety allows.
- Traction and stability control are helpful on rain-soaked roads Traction control helps you

maintain grip by putting the brakes on the tyres struggling for traction, while a stability control system monitors your steering input, intervening with the brakes and/or reducing engine power.

- How to manage aquaplaning if it happens Aquaplaning occurs when the water in front of your tyres accumulates faster than your car's weight can push it away. The water pressure causes your car to rise up and slide on a thin layer of water between your tyres and the road. If you find yourself aquaplaning, don't brake or turn suddenly as you may skid. Ease your foot off the accelerator and if you must brake, do it gently. If your car has anti-lock brakes (ABS), then brake normally. The car's computer will automatically adjust the brakes. If your car doesn't have anti-lock brakes then use light pumping actions.
- How to recover from a skid If you find yourself skidding, ease your foot off the accelerator, and steer in the direction you want the car to go.
- Don't attempt to cross running water... A metre
  of rain water can wash a car away. Fifteen
  centimetres can knock a person off his or her feet.
- Keep your tyres inflated properly <u>Don't put off</u> replacing worn tyres. Slow down when roads are wet, and avoid puddles to prevent aquaplaning. If you have any doubts about the wet-weather performance of your car's tyres, get a professional to check them.
- Make sure your wipers are in good nick and functioning correctly If the blades are brittle or damaged, replace them before you're caught in a deluge.
- In very heavy rain or fog, stop When visibility is so poor that the edges of the road or other vehicles can't be seen at a safe distance, pull over and wait for the rain to ease off. If you can't stop at a rest area and the roadside is your only option, pull off as far as possible and wait it out. Keep your headlights on and turn on your hazard warning lights to alert other drivers. Be very careful to pick a safe spot to pullover as everyone's visibility is dramatically reduced.

#### **Beverley IT** Making IT Simpler

I have covered a lot of topics about criminal activity on the Internet. In to filter, monitor or block your child's activities. this article I am focussing on children's safety on the internet. There's However, if the focus is on monitoring and limiting where your child a lot of hype about children's online safety, with the media making a real meal of any such issues. What I want to give is a down-to-earth introduction to how you can help protect children when they go on the Internet – without the hype!

**Internet awareness** Kids make mistakes. But studies have shown that children often won't go to parents and carers when something bad happens online. That's because they think parents won't understand, will take away their phone or computer, or will intervene but only make things worse. It's hard to keep kids safe when they're not letting you into their digital life.

So, the most important thing a parent, grandparent or other carer can Keep your own and your kid's devices clean. Keep all software up do to help keep children safe online is to have an ongoing conversation with them about technology. Get children to teach you how to do something. Ask them what's the coolest thing about the latest app. Play an online game with them (and be graceful when you lose). Get them to help you with a task that requires Internet use. Show that you are interested in the technology and how they use it. Show that you understand the important role technology and the Internet play in their lives.

Of course to do this you will need to learn about the Internet and cyber safety issues. Don't assume your kids know about this stuff. Safe online socialising Help your child learn how to socialise online safely:

- Remind kids that online actions have consequences.
- Explain to kids why they should limit what they share. Help them understand what information should stay private — like their address, phone numbers, family financial information,
- Encourage online manners. Suggest that they use Cc: and Reply all: with care in emails so they don't give away other Kids email addresses and personal information.
- Limit access to your kids' profiles. Use privacy settings, create a safe screen name, and review their friends list to include only people they actually know.

Controlling Internet use Become familiar with parental controls that are available on all online devices and use age-appropriate settings

## **Cyber Safety for Kids**

goes online, they may begin to hide their activity from you, which can put the child at greater risk. Safe online behaviour is largely about good decision-making, so support their good online choices.

There are a number of different programs and apps available that will limit access to sites that kids should not visit. Put "Cyber safety apps" in your Internet search engine (e.g. Google, Bing, Safari, etc.)

Make sure your own computer or mobile device also has appropriate security and/or make sure that it is password protected. There is bound to be information which the kids don't need to know e.g. passwords, bank account details etc..

-to-date and scan regularly for viruses and have the latest security software. This is the best defence against malware.

Cyber bullying and predators. Don't freak out if a child tells you that someone is bothering them online or they accidentally went to an adult site. If you do they may think they will be punished and will be unlikely to tell you about future incidents. Be open with them and get as much information as you can and try and resolve the situation. Help them - I's not their fault. Get tips from. haltabusektd.org.

Don't underestimate your kid's knowledge. Parents have a tendency to underestimate their children when it comes to safety. Studies have shown that kids are often more savvy than we give them credit for. So, before installing any filters or monitoring software or freaking out over all the things that could happen, ask your kids Emphasise that once they post something, they can't take it what they think. If you are too restrictive they will find a way around your controls.

> Technology is moving so fast that kids often deal with technology you may not be aware of. You may find they know more than you think they do and you might learn something about your own online safety, privacy and security. Be prepared to learn from them!

> Very young children need close supervision and close parental involvement but, as they get older, kids need some freedom to make their own decisions. Support them in their decision -making.

## **Avondale Farm Project Association (AFPA)**

The AFPA AGM was held as advertised on Saturday 07 April and was well attended by committee and members. The past twelve months, once more has gone very quickly without many events occurring and limited funding coming in to support our work here.

We have had meetings with staff from the National Trust (NT) this As was outlined in their media release in the April Blarnev they will be investigating the possibility of developing a research facility in relation to native bush plants being developed Avondale conjunction with in research organisations. This investigation will probably take over two years to complete. This is a positive move forward for Avondale Farm and may in the future lead to a rejuvenated community facility which will benefit not only Beverley but the whole Wheatbelt area.

AFPA have had to make some decisions about its own future going forward and have had some discussions around this in recent weeks. The role of AFPA over the past few years has not been viable and indeed its role since forming when the Department of Agriculture managed the property has changed dramatically.

A recent risk assessment completed by the NT indicated that

there are many risks around the farm for visitors. Some of the structures may not have been maintained in such a way that ensures public safety, particularly for events as have been held in the past. It is also clear that the NT's new direction does not see their role as caring for or supporting any farm animals at Avondale.

As can be seen in our regular requests for assistance and in our financial reports, the costs for the upkeep of the Clydesdales, Robbie and Comet, are increasing whilst our ability to raise funds is This is decreasing. not sustainable situation. There have also not been enough volunteers to manage the horses under the governance obligations of an incorporated organisation. It is time now to realise that Avondale will never be what it was, with full time staff managing and organising great events. It is time for us to move on and look forward to the future.

After much discussion over the previous weeks, the committee voted to dissolve AFPA as it currently operates by 09 June 2018.

This will allow for interested members to focus energy and funds on the Machinery Museum. As the collection is owned by the Beverley Shire, and is situated at Avondale, this would mean that any volunteers would retain a link with both organisations. There will also be the opportunity for volunteers to assist any activities organised by the NT such as work in the bush reserve and heritage precinct. Any funds held by AFPA would be transferred to the Shire where it will be placed in a trust account which will be quarantined for the museum and is consistent with the rules of the AFPA constitution.

With AFPA winding up it means selling any assets. This includes Robbie and Comet and anything else owned by AFPA. This was obviously not an easy decision to make. There was clear direction from the members at the AGM that Robbie and Comet should remain together and the welfare of the Clydesdales was οf importance than the highest offer. meeting also voted to acknowledge the hard work, love and excellent care that Monica, Mitch, Kai, Rachel and other volunteers have given in looking after the horses over such a long period of time.





WA Parliament Talks Lyme

Patients' lagging hopes were buoyed to hear six members speaking about Lyme (like) illness in the WA Legislative Council on March 29. segment spanned an hour of speaking, much of it calling for urgent action for sick Australians. The LDAA has placed a copy of the Hansard and video on our website:

#### **NICE Guidelines**

This week the UK's National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE) released new Lyme auidelines.

To assist patients and their families, the LDAA has summarised the highlights:

The good news:

- Lyme should be considered in patients that don't remember a tick bite
- · Antibiotic treatment can be started before testing if Lyme is strongly suspected
- · Patients should be advised of the limitations of
- If patients sicker for longer than 3 months get a negative ELISA result, a Western Blot is recommended
- The involvement of specialists is mentioned, including infectious disease specialists, rheumatologists and neurologists. Psychiatrists are NOT mentioned.
- Previously, only a month of antibiotic treatment was recommended. A second course of antibiotics

recommended for ongoing symptoms. (This is still not long enough in many situations, but it is an improvement!)

- Current research on effective diagnosis and treatment is considered "poor quality" and more research is recommended
- EM rash is considered diagnostic (this helps our case for the bullseye rash campaign) The bad news:
- Tick bite is the only of method transmission mentioned
- Standard treatment is a single antibiotic for a maximum of 28 days. An extra course of a different antibiotic may be given if symptoms persist, but additional antibiotics should not be routinely prescribed. (However, further antibiotic treatment can be given for other tick-borne diseases)

You may feel disappointed that the antibiotic regime hasn't been extended further. Please remember these recommendations are still an improvement on the previous. The NICE guidelines are VOLUNTARY. Doctors don't have to follow them to the letter. The French government will be going a step further when they release their guidelines in mid 2018; we understand that they are not going to limit the period of antibiotic treatment at all. Change is coming!



# Backyard Buddies Your monthly guide to pests, diseases and weeds



While many pests are seasonal there is one with a year-round effect – ants! Different species of ants require different control methods and Australia is home to more than 2000 species of ants, of which more than 800 are found in Western Australia.

Unless you know the species of ant, control can be guess work, time consuming, and sadly you can waste a bit of money. Sending in ant samples for identification will help you choose the right product and help with surveillance for exotic species.

The most common outside nesting ant and an industrious excavator, is the coastal brown ant (*Pheidole megacephala*) from Africa – a foraging ant that requires granular bait with the active ingredient hydramethylnon for control. Native green headed ants (*Rhytidoponera metallica*) are increasingly being reported as pests due to their painful sting. They respond to the same treatment.

House infesting ants such as white-footed house ants (*Technomyrmex* species) and black house ants (*Ochetellus* species) respond best to liquid or gel baits. Odorous garden ants (*Iridomyrmex*

species) and other native species are best treated with permethrin or bifenthrin Some native ants sprays. Camponotus and Tetramorium generally cause no problems and can be left to do what ants do.

Argentine ants (Linepithema humile) once a threat, now rarely seem to be reported as problematic. Singapore ants (Monomorium destructor) occasionally flare up in the north of the state.

Exotic species could accidently be imported into WA. They are a constant threat to our state and if they establish here, would impact on our lifestyles and WA's agricultural and food industries. Red-imported fire ants and electric ants are serious ant pests of the world. Both are aggressive and inflict painful stings and are present in Queensland.

Yellow crazy ants have the ability to spray formic acid which causes burning and irritates the skin and eyes of humans and animals. They are present in Queensland and on Christmas Island.

Browsing ants have been detected and eradicated previously in WA.




