

An Artist in Residence Project

The Beverley Station Arts group are excited about the next Artist in Residence project in Beverley, *Bystander*.

Rates Discount Reminder

A 10% discount is applicable to rate payments received in full by **Monday 10 September 2018**. The 2018/2019 Budget is available on the Shire website www.beverley.wa.gov.au or from the Shire office. The ESL component of the rate notice is a State Government charge collected by the Shire on behalf of the State Government.

Companion Card Programme

Council has endorsed the Shire's affiliation with the National Disability Services "Companion Card" program and will offer free entry for the Companion Card holder to the Beverley Swimming Pool, Beverley gymnasium and any admission/entry fee should Council hold an event. The Companion Card program is specifically for people who have a lifelong need for an attendant carer to attend community activities and events with them.

Disability Access and Inclusion Plan Review

The Shire is conducting a full review of the current Disability Access and Inclusion Plan (DAIP 2013-18). Please complete the surveys that came with rate notices, obtain a copy from the Shire Administration Centre or go online under the Documents tab of the Shire of Beverley website. The review process will inform the DAIP 2018-23.

Solar Street Lights

Council has budgeted to install solar lighting in a section of Railway Street which is not currently serviced with street lighting. This is potentially a more cost effective street lighting solution and will be observed with great interest once installed.

Beverley Cornerstone

Furniture for the Cornerstone has been delivered and construction of the Library and Visitor Centre fitout is underway. "Glitches" are being ironed out and whilst it would have been lovely for the building to already be in use as was the original plan, it should be in action before the end of 2018 with an official opening February/March next year.

Local Government Convention

This year's Local Government Convention at the Perth Convention and Exhibition Centre was attended by Councillors Martin, Seed, Gogol and Ridgway together with the CEO.

Beverley Town Hall

The beautiful Beverley art deco Town Hall has turned 80. Over those many years it has been used for a range of activities and events including Balls, Dances, Weddings, Movies, Shows, Cabarets, Conferences, Exhibitions, Badminton, Line Dancing, Fitness classes, Dancing lessons and Sleepovers! The hall was officially opened by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor Sir James Mitchell on 01 September 1938 and continues to be a significant feature of the town centre. In recognition of this anniversary the Shire has funded "Reclaimed Pianos" and Beverley Station Arts are co-ordinating the special event which should be a memorable one for our community. Youth Activity Space

Council has been approached with an idea for a Pump Track to be located within the recreation ground precinct. Further investigations are to be made regarding this interesting concept suitable for bikes, scooters and skateboards.

DETAILS OF MODIFICATIONS TO THE HARVEST MASS MANAGEMENT SCHEME

During the 2016-2017 harvest season, new access arrangements were introduced to address first and last mile access issues for the forecasted bumper harvest. While these arrangements enabled larger Restricted Access Vehicles (RAVs) to cart grain from the farm gate to the bins, the arrangements needed to be strengthened to ensure both transport operators and Main Roads could also meet their legal and road safety obligations.

HVS has been working with industry representatives to develop and introduce minor changes to the RAV access arrangements for the 2018-2019 harvest season. These changes have now been finalised and are outlined below.

- ⇒ A requirement for the transport operator or farmer to submit their HMMS Road List Form to Main Roads identifying;
 - the RAV Category Vehicle to be used
 - All road(s) from the paddock to the nearest road approved for RAV Network Access being used to transport grain
 - All road(s) used to return to the paddock after delivering grain to a participating grain receiver.
- ⇒ Heavy Vehicle Services will then conduct a preliminary assessment of the roads nominated on the HMMS Road List form to ensure they are safe for the proposed operation. If deemed safe, we will endorse the HMMS Road List and specify any access conditions, if necessary.

Main Roads is accepting and accessing roads list now.

All existing conditions that form part of the HMMS remain unchanged, for example the 40km/h speed limit and flashing amber warning light.


Suspension concentrates (Atrazine, Simazine, etc)


- Rinse your container immediately after use to ensure any chemical residue does not dry
- Use methylated spirits to remove dried residue. If this doesn't work, fill the container with water and soak for at least 24 hours before rinsing. Oil-based chemicals (ULVs, LVs)





Early in September we have the annual visit of the Year 2's to learn about the "olden days", keep an eye out for details in the October Blarney.



We had a busy bee at the Dead Finish on Tuesday 21 August, the roses have been pruned and the gardens weeded. Hopefully we will be able to source some pea straw to finish the job.

Gardening Hints and Tips

- Leap into springtime gardening, especially in your veggie patch! Try celery, silverbeet, lettuces, leeks, spring onions, climbing beans, cucumber, sweet corn, tomato, carrot, Jeruslaum artichokes and radishes. Wait until the frosts have finished.
- Get into herbs with parsley, chives, catnip, sage, oregano, rosemary, thyme and marjoram.
- It's time to plant blueberries, passionfruit, citrus trees, olives (non-weedy varieties). If your tastes are a little more exotic, try putting in a guava... they're tough plants and the fruit is sensational!



PRESIDENT'S REPORT 74th AGM BEVERLEY HOSPITAL AUXILIARY INC.

The Hospital Auxiliary has enjoyed ongoing success and satisfaction in being able to support the Health Service in Beverley and therefore, the citizens of our community. **We are a charitable organisation whose funds will directly benefit the health of our own citizens.**

During this past year.....

- Changes were made to our Set Of Rules [formerly The Constitution] to broaden our objectives to include supporting any community health initiatives or emergency relief [fire, flood], donating to charitable organisations whose existence directly benefits country patients and their families [e.g. family/patient accommodation facilities such as Ronald McDonald House] as well as the ongoing provision of amenities and equipment for the local Health Services, including the Hospital and Lodge.
- And the fundraising vehicle is **The Beverley Opportunity Shop** which currently enjoys the voluntary services of 48 local people including 13 committee! We are grateful for the time given and the enthusiasm shown by this wonderful group. This year, we have been trialling longer opening hours on Fridays and special community events days. Our committee spends many extra hours working behind the scenes to present the excellent standard of goods and shop environment for which we have become recognised in the Avon Valley. Collecting, sorting, transporting surplus stock to Perth, pricing, cleaning, taking several turns to be the weekly Shop supervisor, assisting the Health Service Manager with purchasing items donated by us, visiting Lodge and Hospital staff and patients to gain an insight into their well being as well as to hear what may be needed to make their surroundings even more pleasant we ask a lot of our volunteers, particularly the committee. I personally thankyou all for your donation of time, energy and above all, your enthusiasm. **And perhaps that description will help answer the often asked question....** "Just what does The Hospital Auxiliary Do?"
- During the past year 2017/18, the Auxiliary has donated \$17,031.60 to the Health Service with some items still on order and payment not complete. Items included a jarrah bench seat for front of Hospital, 3 leather recliner chairs for Hospital Day Room, the painting of Hospital staff dining room and ward curtains, Comfort packs for Hospital patients, Xmas gifts for patients of the Hospital and residents of The Lodge, roses and reticulation for the Gazebo at The Alex Miles Lodge, window blinds and recliner chairs for the Lodge supervisors flat as well as a refrigerator and a microwave. Discussion re installing Pathways to the Gazebo at the Lodge are currently underway. As well, we have purchased some shop fittings for the Op Shop. 2017/18 grand total is solely from the proceeds generated by The Opportunity Shop.
- As well as creating and spending funds, we have been fortunate to have the assistance of donations of money
 and goods and services. I would particularly like to thank the anonymous donor who contributes an amount
 annually to our account as well as the many customers who pop a donation into the tin on the Op Shop counter
 or simply tell us to "keep the change".
- With extended Op Shop trading hours this year, it was wonderful to receive the donation of a small fridge from Mike Carthew and Lyn Wilkinson. A small microwave for 'winter warmers' may be next on our list! Thankyou to the Shire of Beverley for providing the Opportunity Shop facility at a minimal rental figure and for performing any minor maintenance issues that arise. And of course, the friendly staff at Avon Trading continue to provide the valuable service of acting as a depot for all of our donated items! We are very grateful for their support and sometimes patience when their own goods are hidden beneath ours!
- We were saddened to lose Lyn Wilkinson who passed away earlier this year. Lyn was a valued committee member whose enthusiasm and willingness to contribute was well known by many groups with whom she was involved in the Beverley Community.
- Thankyou to all people who donate goods to the Op Shop and for the people who pass through the door to purchase or to just browse. You will be amazed at what you find there.

Thankyou to all the committee who have contributed so much. And to our menfolk who have picked up, delivered, put together tables and racks, shifted furniture, whipper snipped, taken rubbish to the tip and generally lent a willing hand when asked. Thankyou to Val Moad for her weekly job of sorting, tidying and generally keeping an eye on the Op Shop, to Dawn Edwards for collecting volunteer names and drawing up the roster and to Jan Howell and Betty Lobb, who as Secretary and Treasurer have kept me organised during my 4 years as President.

Avondale Agriculture Museum

With the Beverley Show being held on the third Saturday in August this year, it was decided by popular vote that the regular maintenance and restoration morning would not be held, and with most parties attending the Show we only opened up for the afternoon that day to the general public, which did prove beneficial with several people coming to visit as part of their journey home from the show grounds. Thankyou to John Alexander for giving up his Saturday afternoon at the Show to ensure the museum would be open, and to John Islip for giving up his Sunday to do the same. If you are interested in helping with this task please contact Dee Ridgway 0428 464 007.

As there was little activity in the Museum apart from cleaning and general exhibit care, there are two 'items' of interest for this month.

The first being the much loved David Brown Tractor Plough which was let out for a breath of fresh air when the Sikh's visited back in June.

David Brown Model 2 D built between 1956 and 1961.

Ideally suited to precision market garden work, the 2D was also used as a specialist row crop machine on larger farms.

It has a lightweight air cooled 2 cylinder diesel 4 stroke engine producing 14.1 horse power at 1800 revs per minute, and was designed for use with mid-mounted implements.

A rear lift and PTO were available as options. Both lifts were operated by compressed air and the two front cylinders could be operated independently. The approximate weight is 965kgs. It was donated to the Avondale Collection by the Stoneville Research Station.

Our second item has previously been mentioned during reporting on our maintenance and restoration activities and was also part of an enquiry from

Mr Kevin Ding who wrote a letter to the Blarney in July, his father donated his two Field Marshall Tractors to the collection back in the 1970's, one of the tractors is in good working order and an excellent example being held inside the Museum, the other is resting in the picnic area awaiting further funds becoming available for restoration.

Field Marshall Diesel Tractor 1949.

Produced by The Marshall Company & Sons of England and donated to the collection by Mr J Ding & Family of Eneabba.

Field Marshall Single Cylinder Tractors commenced production in 1930 with the model 15-30 and continued through to 1957 with the series 3A.

The semi Diesel 'Lanz type' engine had a compression ratio of 7-1 compared to the Field Marshall 'full diesel' which had a ratio of 15-1, this meant that pressures were very much greater.

An advantage was that the Field Marshall engine could be either cranked to start with a handle or fired up with a Gun Cartridge. The latter attracts a lot of interest from museum visitors!

If you feel that you could benefit from a visit to our collection feel free to attend on open days for a small gold coin donation.





Community Resource Centre funding to continue

- Following a review and consultation, Community Resource Centre funding will continue
- . Community Resource Centre (CRC) funding will continue at the full \$13 million per year

The McGowan Government has listened to regional community concerns about the future of Community Resource Centres and will continue to fully fund each CRC.

Auditing processes will be strengthened to ensure Community Resource Centres are delivering the best outcomes for their communities.

Comments attributed to Regional Development Minister Alannah MacTiernan:

"Our Government was forced to consider a number of Budget savings to help fix the financial mess left by the former Liberal National Government.

"After reviewing the Community Resource Centre program and listening to regional communities' concerns about the future of CRCs, it is clear CRC funding should continue.

"We will continue to fully fund CRCs to the tune of \$13 million per year, ensuring CRCs can deliver important services to regional communities.

"We want to see the CRC program strengthened, with a real focus on getting the most out of the traineeship program to drive training opportunities across regional WA."

- Commit to research, on par with other infectious diseases, such as Zika, SARS, Ebola etc.
- That this matter be treated with urgency and is initiated prior to the upcoming Federal Election.

Home Automation

Many technologies are now converging with wireless and Internet technology. In the December Blarney, I gave an example of one – mobile phones calls can now be connected via the Internet using WiFi calling. Home automation is another technology converging with wireless and the Internet.

What is home automation? Home automation allows electrical devices, e.g. lights, heating, hot water systems, sound systems, etc., to be controlled centrally in the house or remotely via the Internet. These systems have existed for some time but, in the past, they required special wiring and were very expensive. Hence, these systems were only installed in expensive homes and in offices. If you wanted to automate an existing house, it usually needed to be completely rewired.

What has changed? Wireless and Internet technology is now more widespread and miniaturised. Hence goods using wireless technology are much cheaper. This means that the electricity can be controlled at the point where it is used, in the lightbulb, the heater or other device. For instance, lightbulbs that you can control remotely can now be purchased in hardware stores and lighting shops. And, you no longer need to rewire your house to install home automation.

How does home automation work? Many electrical devices have remote controls which use wireless technology to connect between the controller and the controlled device. Home automation takes this one step further. Instead of having many remote controllers you have one general-purpose controller which can control all devices wirelessly. Taking this one step further, by using the Internet the controller can be remote from the premises – on your PC, phone or tablet. Remote control can now also be added to devices that previously couldn't be controlled remotely.

What are the benefits of home automation? Home automation can make your life easier. Here are some examples:

 Turn devices (e.g. lights) on/off by program, voice command or remotely (handy when you're away from home);

- Automate lights to turn on/off at different times when you are not at home;
- Control your hot water system so it only comes on at certain times and for certain periods, saving electricity costs;
- Link actions with other actions, e.g. if you open a door the light automatically turns on;
- Set different lighting moods so you can change the mood remotely without having to go around to all your lights;
- Link to a home theatre system to remotely control your music or films;
- Trigger events using sensors, e.g. automatically turn on a bathroom fan if the humidity gets too high;
- Keep track of power usage see which devices are using the most energy and costing the most to run;
- When building a new house the electrical wiring costs can be reduced as there is no need to bring the wiring down to wall switches – the light switches can be replaced by control pads or central/remote control devices.

Home automation is becoming more affordable.

- Remote controlled devices are now readably available offthe-shelf and are therefore becoming cheaper;
- Now it is not necessary to make expensive changes to your electrical wiring;
- For new houses, less electrical wiring is required;
- The widespread availability of the Internet and better mobile coverage enables universal remote access.

As a result, home automation is being added to existing houses. Also, some new houses are being sold with home automation built-in. The cost is partly balanced against savings in the electrical wiring costs. Soon home automation will become the standard for new houses.

How easy is it to add home automation? Home automation is not yet a mature technology. While there are many new devices available that can be controlled automatically, there are several different wireless systems for communicating to the devices and several different control systems available. Therefore, integration of all the devices and controllers into one system can be quite tricky, especially if you want to control all devices remotely. However, you can start cheaply by installing some remotecontrolled lightbulbs. Remote control apps are available for your phone or pad

Fruit fly control



Mediterranean fruit fly, Ceratitis capitata

If you grow fruit, it's likely you know the pain and expense of controlling Mediterranean fruit fly (Medfly), the fruit fly established in the majority of Western Australia's south-west. Whilst there's no 'silver bullet', there is a lot that can be done to reduce numbers.

General advice – If you want to get the best from your fruit trees you must control fruit fly all year round and prune plants and trees to a manageable size.

However, if you are not collecting the fruit for eating, you are better off stripping the fruit as they start to form or removing the plants or trees completely.

How to control

- Remove ripe, fallen or infested fruit.
- Install homemade or commercial fruit fly traps.
- Bait regularly (NaturalureTM, Nature's way or similar baits).
- Bag fruit or net trees with fruit fly netting or exclusion bags.
- Fruit disposal options
- Soak in a bucket of water with an oil film (3 days).
- **Seal** in black plastic bag and place in the sun (3-5 days).
- Boil fruit (stove or microwave).
- Freeze (2 days).

Only after treatment can fruit be composted or thrown in the bin.

The best thing to do is ensure fruit fly can't breed on your property, and to enlist your neighbours to do the same.
