# SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT REPORT - OCTOBER 2018



#### **OHS Award**

Congratulations to Shire staff for their recent Occupational Health & Safety Award received from Local Government Insurance Services. Sound work practices are helping to reduce insurance premiums and provide rebates back to the Shire for safety related initiatives such as the safety railing installed on the town hall roof for air conditioner servicing and maintenance.

#### IT Upgrade Completed

It is fortunate that a budgeted upgrade of the Shire's IT system was completed early in the 18/19 financial year. In September when everyone was busily paying their rates the Shire was subjected to a Crypto lock which put the office out of action, however with the backups and support provided by Focus Networks who are the new IT provider, everything was back up and running by the end of a day. Several other shires were also subjected to the same problem and are understood to have taken days, and in one case weeks, to get things back in order.

#### River Park Picnic Area Theft

Council was in disbelief when informed about the theft of two aluminum bench seats from the river park picnic/barbeque area. The benches were bolted down so the theft was planned and deliberate. The Shire, and indeed our community, work hard to improve facilities for all to enjoy so it is distressing to know there are, or have been, such inconsiderate misfits about. If anyone has information or can help with enquiries please come forward.

#### **Silver Centenary Model**

Delivery and installation of the Silver Centenary Model Aircraft which was commissioned by the Shire for inclusion in the Cornerstone Museum/Visitor Centre is expected to occur later in October.

#### Caravan Park Power Upgrade

A power upgrade has been completed at the Beverley Caravan Park. The increase in use (and popularity) of the Park over the last 10 years is significant. You may have also noticed increasing use of the free 48 hour stopover at Apex Park. Feedback received by the Shire from users of both locations is very positive.

#### **Local Government Elections 2019**

Just a reminder your next opportunity to participate in Local Government Elections is October 2019. Non-resident rate payers need to be registered with the Shire in order to vote in Shire of Beverley elections. For any potential candidates there are 4 elected member terms which expire.

#### York Williams Road Giveway Signs

Councils concern about the give " intersections on York Williams Road with Westdale Road and Waterhatch Roads was followed up with Main Roads WA to enquire about the possibility of introducing stop signs. This concern has been reinforced by information from several situations when vehicles travelling on York Williams road haven't abided by the give way signage. Advice received from Main Roads was that the site distances on both intersections are well above recommended for stop control and there is no recorded crash information for either of these intersections for the last five years to support such a requested change. Ironically the purpose of Councils concern is to prevent accident or death. Have you experienced any issues at these intersections?

#### Town Hall Flag

The Australian Flag was flown full mast at the town hall early in September to recognize National Australia Flag Day.

#### **Avondale Ag Museum**

The Shire agreed to become custodian of the large Agriculture Museum at Avondale on behalf of the community in 2009 when management of the property was transferred from the Department of Agriculture to the National Trust WA. Community concerns were that the collection remains intact. at Avondale and available to the public. There were many volunteers helping, however this interest has gradually waned. The museum houses a significant collection of items representing development of agriculture in Western Australia, particularly the Wheatbelt and you have an opportunity to be involved in discussions about the future of it at a Community Forum in October, details elsewhere in the Blarney.

#### **DEFINITIONS**

**Firebreak:** Means a strip of land that has been cleared of all brushes, grasses and any other object or thing or flammable material leaving clear bare mineral earth 2.2 metres wide. This includes the trimming back of all overhanging trees, bushes, shrubs and any other object or thing over the firebreak area

#### Fire Break & Hazard Reduction Guide

- Land Within a Townsite 2.012ha (5 acres) or less: Must be slashed, mowed or ploughed and hazard reduced to ensure inflammable material is less than 150mm high.
- ♦ Land Within a Townsite over 2.012ha ( 5 acres ): Shall be clear of all inflammable material or have a 2.2m fire break around perimeter of property.

# FIRE SEASON INFORMATION

#### PREPARE FOR FIRE SEASON

The Shire of Beverley's Community Emergency Services Manager along with the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer are reminding all property occupiers to start preparing their properties for the coming fire season.

Fire breaks need to be installed before November 1st this year and maintained until the 15 April next year. The minimum requirements for a firebreak in the Shire of Beverley is for the break to be at least 2.2 metres wide of bare mineral earth which means no vegetation (dead or alive) or flammable materials can be present. Alternatively small rural land holders can clear their properties of all inflammable materials or maintain grass mown to a height of less than 15cm.

Larger rural properties should ensure that they have an operational independent mobile water filled firefighting unit with a water capacity of not less than 600L to be ready to deployed throughout the Prohibited and Restricted burning periods.

Fire breaks play a part in reducing the spread of fire but just as importantly they provide a space for fire fighters to work from when trying to combat a fire.

Although not mandated in the Fire Break Order firefighters are urging property owners to also consider the access to their properties by large fire appliances. Generally this means making sure that there is an adequate gate width of at least 3 metres and to ensure that there are no overhanging branches or obstructions below 4 metres high over entry points and fire breaks to allow fire appliances to safely navigate your property should they need to defend it from fire.

In the Shire of Beverley, no burning without a permit can occur from the 03 October unless otherwise notified of a change to the schedule. Prohibited Burning within the Beverley Shire is scheduled to begin on **01 November** after which time no fires are permitted to be lit until the **15 February** when permits to burn can be applied for once again subject to prevailing conditions.


#### Fund raising and Local Government grant provides new amenities for RSL



In fact it was so cool in the Museum that the morning cuppa with bring and share nibbles were consumed outside of the front of the building, with a longer than normal break to catch up with the local news after the 8 week break.

Earlier John A was on 'tyre pumping' duty as over the winter period it was noted many tyres had deflated a little, Kerry, Kevin and Duayne persisted with trying to start the Massey Ferguson Baler until it was decided that it could well be a lost cause for now, with the Wisconsin V4 petrol engine having a poor history for starting when they were well maintained.

John Hawke moved between items he was working on, firstly the C30 International truck he had made a new wooden cab for previously; fitting the generator (dynamo)





### Yoga - Is it Exercise?



Yoga is best described as a traditional exercise and can have a positive influence on our physical, mental and social/spiritual wellbeing. Yoga has been around for centuries in some form and in more recent times has undergone its own transformation by becoming a more mainstream exercise practice in western culture. Research into Yoga shows there are many benefits and it helps people manage their stress, anxiety, depression and all the challenges that life may throw our way. However, I want to briefly look at and outline the physical benefits of Yoga as an exercise. When we do any sort of movement (we do have to just get moving) the benefits are often overlooked by us blokes.

Yoga as exercise can be described as structured physical movements that get the body moving through a series of stretches. Some of these stretches include but are not limited to:

- lumbar spinal stretches;
- hip stretches;
- hamstrings stretches;
- core body work, including our pelvic floor;
- balance routines/stretches.



Yoga can be complimentary to whatever we choose as our main exercise routine, whether that be our regular sport, leisure like walking, running and/or swimming. Yoga can also be a complete exercise regime on its own. When we read the research around Yoga, it also has a multitude of benefits to aid in rehabilitation from major accidents and/or surgery. Quite often the exercises we see elite athletes performing before and after their games (in particular football) are in fact Yoga based exercises.

Yoga has been summarized as preventative health around our body awareness, something as blokes we may lack an appreciation for. A lot of research and common literature tells us that there are many benefits to Yoga, particularly for men. The practise of Yoga can:

- cause a reduction in cardiovascular risk factors such as high blood pressure, blood sugar levels, cholesterol and improves the levels of antioxidants in the blood;
- improve male sexual function Yoga appears to be an effective method of improving all domains of sexual function in men:
- improve incontinence Yoga may lessen the side effects in men undergoing prostate cancer treatment.
   There is a body of work around the benefits in exercise for improving our pelvic floor and incontinence with or without prostate surgery;
- improve male reproductive health Yoga has been identified as having a positive impact on male reproductive health and fertility;
- maintain and increase strength, tone and flexibility.

We all need to exercise more, and Yoga is another tool for us blokes to utilize, especially when we add in the advantages that is has for our man bits. Give it a go, you may enjoy it as well as gain some improvements to your overall wellbeing.







#### **How to Correctly Remove Ticks**

Avoiding being bitten by ticks in the first instance is always recommended and being aware that ticks can cause serious harm to humans and pets is wise. Ticks were predominantly found in the bush in days gone by, however this is no longer the case. Ticks are prevalent in all states and territories of Australia. Stories of individuals being bitten in the suburbs are now all too common as these minute parasites have progressively made their way from the country and into our urban areas.

Whilst the Australian Government maintains its stance on Lyme disease not being a notifiable disease in Australia we at the Lyme Disease Association of Australia (LDAA) are contacted on a regular basis by individuals who have been bitten and now have a chronic condition. Don't let this happen to you.

In an article "<u>Methods of tick removal: A systematic review of the literature</u>" published in the Australian Medical Journal, Stephen and Nikki Coleman studied peer-reviewed literature to determine which was the best method of removing ticks to prevent future health complications, from a scientific perspective.





The Colemans performed a systematic review of the published literature based on scientific and medical studies conducted between 1985 and 2016 on tick removal. Their conclusion was to endorse what is the current accepted medical practice – also endorsed by the World Health Organisation (WHO) and the Centres for Disease Control (CDC) – to remove the tick by mechanical means as soon as possible after the tick is detected. Gripping the tick around the mouthparts using either fine-tipped tweezers or a 'claw-like' tick removal tool to pull the tick away from the site of attachment is best. The area around the tick bite should then be thoroughly disinfected.

Some Doctors recommend freezing the tick in place as a method of tick removal, but the Colemans found that there is, at this point in time at least, insufficient scientific evidence to support such a method of removal; the same conclusion was also reached by the WHO and the CDC.

## Backyard Buddies Your monthly guide to pests, diseases and weeds

Pesky but pretty



These tiny, 3 mm long, black or brown insects seen flying around drains, sewers, septic tanks and sludgy soil are often the aptly named 'drain fly' or 'sewer fly' (Family Psychodidae). Due to their presence in the kitchen they are often mistaken for fruit flies and ferment flies, but to understand another of their common names, 'moth fly', you will have to get up close to see their

distinctive fluffy moth-like bodies. Better yet, under the microscope, you can marvel at the unique and beautiful patterns of their wing veins, and they are pretty darn cute!

In the home, these flies need drains to breed and feed, and lay their eggs (10-200 of them) in the organic matter build-up (grease, hair, miscellaneous sludge). The eggs hatch within a few days and for the next two weeks or so, the larvae live in and happily eat the organic matter before pupating into adults. Adults live for another couple of weeks and repeat the life cycle. They are most active in the evening and rest during the day on walls or other flat surfaces.

#### Control

Drain flies are not dangerous to humans or pets but can be annoying when they build up in numbers, especially in the bathroom and kitchen. Squish or swat the adults and ensure you have clean drains, sewers, tanks and free draining, sewerage-free soil, so there's no place to breed. Regularly cleaning these breeding sites with commercial products or home-made remedies such as

Making IT Simpler

#### **Home Entertainment**

In last month's Blarney I wrote about Home Automation. Home Entertainment is another technology converging with wireless and the Internet.

What is Home Entertainment? Home Entertainment. (also called Home Cinema or Home Theatre) refers to home entertainment audio-visual systems set up in a room at home that reproduces a cinema experience using consumer electronic video and audio equipment. A Home Entertainment system can range from: a full set-up with high quality TV and audio systems and reclining cinema type chairs; to simply a modern large TV that can integrate all media sources together.

What has changed? Home Cinema started in the 1980s and consisted of movies on pre-recorded tape; a VHS player; a huge TV and a quality audio system. Everything was heavy, bulky and very expensive. Home Entertainment improved, got easier and cheaper in the 2000's with DVD players, set top boxes and flat screen TVs with multiple inputs. However, it was still too expensive for most people. Then there was satellite and cable TV – still expensive.

#### Home Entertainment is now more affordable.

Now wireless and Internet technologies are more widespread and cheaper. Electronic equipment is cheaper. TV's have also become more intelligent and are able to integrate all the services together. Hence, home entertainment is now affordable for most people.

- Many of the features required for Home Theatre have been included in new TVs, so separate boxes are not required;
- Home Entertainment equipment is almost entirely electronic. While most things you buy are getting more expensive, electronic equipment is getting significantly cheaper.
- The widespread availability of the Internet and better mobile coverage enables universal access to online media sources;
- in the last few years, Internet usage allowances have increased significantly and internet usage costs have dropped dramatically, making it cheaper to download films and other media over the Internet;

- Downloaded media is significantly cheaper than DVD's etc. as manufacture and distribution costs are much less;
- Media rooms are included in many new houses.

#### How does modern Home Entertainment work?

TVs have become the hub for modern Home Entertainment systems. Modern TVs have inputs for DVD and Blue-Ray Players and older devices such as record players and VHS tape. They also have outputs for HiFi systems or speakers for better quality audio.

#### How easy is it to set-up Home Entertainment?

Packages are available from HiFi shops but these are expensive. The easiest and cheapest set-up is around a new "Internet-ready" TV and an NBN connection. Modern TVs connect to your NBN or ADSL router using WiFi or Ethernet (for best performance).

Older flat-screen TVs are unable to directly connect to the Internet so will require a set-top box or PC to integrate everything together. This can be quite tricky to set-up. If you have an older TV you may want to consider buying a new TV to make life easier!

#### How do I get movies etc. from the Internet?

- **Streaming** download directly as you watch a movie or listen to the radio or music. For movies you will require a high download allowance (videos are huge), and high speed to stop that annoying circle during download.
- **Download** download, store on the TV or a PC to play later.

What sort of Internet connection is required? If you want to get movies and other media from the Internet you need to consider what connection you need and the service required:

- NBN Fibre or Wireless have the download capacity and speed for streaming or downloading. NBN Fibre is still not available in Beverley but is in York and Brookton townships.
- ADSL may have the download capacity and speed for streaming or downloading depending on the distance from the exchange and the number of houses connected. ADSL will be replaced with NBN fibre.
- **NBN Satellite or mobiles** are unsuitable for streaming as they are too expensive and the allowance is limited. You may be able to get special packages or download during the off-peak period at night.


