SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT REPORT - JANUARY 2019



Vincent Street Bridge Refurbishment Due to Commence

Refurbishment work to the Vincent Street Bridge is due to commence. This will occur over quite a length of time and unfortunately there may be times of inconvenience for road users. Please be patient and look forward to an upgraded bridge that is a little wider for traffic and more "user friendly" for pedestrians.

Long Term Employee Retires

After working for the Shire of Beverley for 39 years Malcolm Turner has called it a day. He retires with many stories and memories of his time working for the Shire. Council offers best wishes to Malcolm and Jenda.

<u>Lightning Strike Near Olive Farm</u>

Stormy weather and extreme windy conditions recently created hazards around the district, including a potentially catastrophic fire west of Mt Kokeby near the olive farm which was lit by lightning. Co-ordination and management of the fire ground, monitoring and "mopping up" by FCO's and over 100 volunteers from around the district, supported by the Shire of Beverley and York CESM, was a credit to all involved. Heavy machinery was called in and teams of volunteer firefighters were in attendance 24 hours a day for several days requiring sustenance provided out of hours by local business. Thankyou to everyone who assisted.

DeLisle Street Industrial Land

Council met with Landcorp in December for an update on the DeLisle Street Industrial Development. One serviced block from the first phase remains for sale. Development of the remaining 8845m² requires the serviced block to be sold. Advice was provided indicating Landcorp are flexible with planning and progress of the 8845m² if approached by interested parties. It was a worthwhile meeting and Council has requested signage be placed at the DeLisle Street industrial area to advertise this information to passing traffic. Council also requested that design work be undertaken to enable a road to be progressed by the Shire.

Various Works Information

Rumble strips have been installed on York Williams Road at the intersections of Waterhatch and Westdale Roads. The Shire is currently searching for a loader suitable for the refuse site following accidental damage to the old one resulting in an insurance payout. Approximately 30KL per day of reuse water is being received from Water Corp which supplements oval watering. The retaining wall and storm water pipes have been installed at the "Flying through Time" display on Hunt Road and concrete is to be poured. Earthworks are underway at the Hunt Road Village for the installation of a new leach drain.

Council Meetings 2019

The first monthly meeting of Council for 2019 will be held on Tuesday 26 February 2019. In January Council will review Phase 2 of the Local Government Act and provide a feedback submission. A working group comprising Shire President, D/Shire President, CEO, D/CEO and Chair of the Audit and Risk Committee will commence a review of the 10 year Long Term Financial Plan (LTFP) for Council consideration.

Australian Masters Cricket

An update on the previously reported Masters Cricket played in Sydney with teams from Australia, England, Wales, Canada, South Africa, Pakistan, New Zealand and Sri Lanka competing. Australia won the competition and Shire CEO Steve Gollan was selected in the "team of the tournament". Congratulations Steve!





Media Statement

Beverley Health Service redevelopment complete

The redevelopment of the Beverley Health Service was officially opened by Agricultural Region MLC Laurie Graham, representing the Minister for Health, who commented, "I am pleased to have officially opened the redevelopment at Beverley Health Service. The upgraded infrastructure will reduce the need for country patients to travel long distances, away from home, for care".

The renovations are part of a \$300 million capital works program that is improving infrastructure in 37 towns across the Wheatbelt, Great Southern, Mid-West and South-West regions.

The \$5.4 million upgrade to the Beverley Health Service includes the construction of three new consultation rooms for allied health staff, who previously operated off-site, and a resuscitation and treatment room. Improvements have also been made to the kitchen, the entrance and car park along with improved ambulance access.



MLC Laurie Graham commented, "I'm particularly pleased that the upgrade to the Beverley Health Service includes the construction of three new consultation rooms for allied health staff, having access to health services within the same building greatly improves the experience for patients."

The project involved extensive upgrades to electrical and mechanical services together with improved hydraulic works.

The ICT improvements mean telehealth services have been expanded with cancer care, stroke care, emergency telehealth and many allied health

services all available. WiFi for clinical services is now also accessible throughout the facility. The Health Minister Roger Cook said, "Capital upgrades, along with investment in digital and information systems combine to make contemporary health services more accessible to people living in regional areas. Telehealth upgrades mean patients can receive treatment near home, avoiding the need for costly and stressful travel."

In the Wheatbelt, the WA Country Health Service's capital works program also includes the redevelopment of Merredin, Narrogin and Northam hospitals as well as upgrades to 23 small hospitals and health centres.

These infrastructure projects are part of a modernisation program supported by Royalties for Regions and taking place across the WA Country Health Service, Health Minister Roger Cook further added "The McGowan Government is committed to ensuring patients in regional Western Australia have access to quality healthcare closer to home.





Shire of Beverley CEO, Stephen Gollan represented Australia in the over 50's cricket World Cup recently at a 3 week tournament in Sydney. He has been named in the top 11 players in the world also named in the team of the tournament.

Australia was one of the 8 teams playing in the series against countries such as: Pakistan, New Zealand, Canada, England, Wales, South Africa and Sri Lanka. Australia made it throughout the tournament undefeated.

Gollan is passionate about the game and plays in the local Beverley cricket team and is the chair for Wheatbelt Regional Cricket Council. Over the 3 weeks he bowled 50 overs taking 12 wickets and seven maidens. He also averaged 41 runs with a highest score of 39 not out.

Following the World Cup, an Ashes inspired series was played and over the 3 game series, the umpires awarded Gollan the spirit of cricket award.

The next Over 50's World Cup is to be held in 2020 in Cape Town, South Africa.



My favourite part of the Museum was the cellar but we didn't go there. My Poppy went to the cellar before.







Snake bite



IN A MEDICAL EMERGENCY CALL TRIPLE ZERO (000) FOR AN AMBULANCE.

DRSABCD Danger ▶ **Response** ▶ **Send for help** ▶ **Airway** ▶ **Breathing** ▶ **CPR** ▶ **Defibrillation** The DRSABCD Action Plan is the first step when providing first aid. Use this to assess the immediate situation.

All known or suspected snake bites must be treated as potentially life-threatening, and medical aid should be sought urgently.

WARNING

Do not wash venom off the skin or clothes because it may assist identification.

SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS

Signs of a snake bite are not always visible and, in some cases, the patient may not have felt anything. Symptoms may not appear for an hour or more after the person has been bitten

Depending on the type of snake, signs and symptoms may include some or all of the following:

- immediate or delayed pain at the bite site
- swelling, bruising or local bleeding
- bite marks (usually on a limb) that may vary from obvious puncture wounds to scratches that may be almost invisible
- swollen and tender glands in the groin or armpit of the bitten limb
- faintness, dizziness
- nausea and vomiting
- headache
- abdominal pain
- · oozing of blood from the bite site or gums
- double or blurred vision
- drooping eyelids
- difficulty in speaking or swallowing
- limb weakness or paralysis
- difficulty in breathing
- occasionally, initial collapse or confusion followed by partial or complete recovery.

WHAT TO DO

- 1 Follow DRSABCD.
- 2 Call triple zero (000) for an ambulance.
- 3 Lie the patient down and ask them to keep still. Reassure the patient.
- 4 If on a limb, apply an elasticised roller bandage (10–15 cm wide) over the bite site as soon as possible.

Apply a further elasticised roller bandage (10–15 cm wide), starting just above the fingers or toes and moving upwards on the bitten limb as far as can be reached.

Use clothing or other material if an elasticised roller bandage is not available.

Apply the bandage as tightly as possible to the limb.

- 5 Immobilise the bandaged limb using splints.
- **6** Keep the patient lying down and completely still (immobilised).
- 7 Write down the time of the bite and when the bandage was applied. If possible, mark the location of the bite site (if known) on the skin with a pen, or photograph the site.
- 8 Stay with the patient until medical aid arrives.





Lyme Disease Association of Australia

The number of people who are being hospitalised with tick bite symptoms in Queensland is on the rise.

Statistics from the office of state Health Minister Dr Steven Miles showed tick bite hospitalisations had more than doubled in the ten years since 2008.

In 2008 just 59 patients were admitted to hospital in Queensland after coming into contact with a venomous Tick. This number increased to 129 in 2017-18, according to data provided by the Health Minister in response to a question on notice in the state parliament.

A recent research paper out of the University of Queensland has sought to identify and characterise the habitats and habits of different ticks in Australia.

Lead by Professor Stephen Barker and Dayana Barker and published in the journal *Microbiology Australia*, the paper explained that, out of the 71 ticks found in the country, only two were "notorious" for biting humans.

These were the eastern paralysis tick, found on Australia's east coast, and the kangaroo tick, found in some parts of outback Queensland and Western Australia.

While the kangaroo tick could carry disease-causing bacteria, the eastern paralysis tick had an incredibly potent venom.

"The toxins of this tick seem to be the most potent of all tick-toxins with at least 20 fatalities," the report read.

"Thankfully, deaths from the bite of [the eastern paralysis tick] are now rare due to the advent of intensive care-units in regional hospitals and expert medical treatment."

Knowing what ticks lived where was a crucial part of combating tick-borne disease, Professor Barker said.

"We are trying to figure out why the distributions are so distinct," Professor Barker said.

"Perhaps a farmer was bitten and feels unwell, then if we know the location that's a key part of identifying the tick, and then what bit them."

LNP agriculture spokesman Tony Perrett said the spike in tick hospitalisations was "very concerning".







Warrior Wellbeing Article Sun Safety...looking after your skin!

Us West Aussies love nothing more than getting outdoors and enjoying the abundance of sunshine that lathers our great state. A small amount of incidental exposure to sunlight, around a few minutes each day, is actually important for maintaining adequate levels of Vitamin D needed for strong bones, muscles and overall good health. Too much exposure however, places us at great risk of damage from Ultra Violet 'UV' radiation which potentially could lead to the development of skin cancer. We need to get the balance right!

Australia has one of the highest rates of skin cancer in the world mainly due to our very high UV levels. According to the Cancer Council of WA, at least two in every three people will develop some type of skin cancer before they reach the age of 70.

Of the three main types of skin cancer most of these people will develop a Basal Cell Carcinoma which is usually a small, slow growing abnormal growth found mainly on the upper body, head and neck. They don't usually spread far but if left can result in facial and body disfigurement. The next most common is the Squamous Cell Carcinoma often found on the lips, ears and scalp. These grow quicker and if left can potentially spread into the lymph nodes of the neck and then to other parts of the body.

The last and most dangerous type is the Melanoma which accounts for about one to two percent of all skin cancers. It can be found anywhere on the body but is mainly on the upper back of men and lower legs of women. It is an aggressive type and if left untreated can spread quickly to other parts of the body and potentially be fatal! It was estimated that this year alone there will be over 14,000 new cases nationally of Melanoma skin cancer detected, with over 8,500 of those men.

By spending more time in the sun, we inevitably place ourselves at an increased risk of skin damage and potential skin cancer. Taking measures to be sun safe should be part of our daily routine especially if we are involved in outdoor work! It's important to remember that the UV levels can still be high even on a cool and cloudy day.

Following these simple tips will get us well on the way to being sun safe ...

- Cover up with appropriate clothes
- **Use sun screen** (don't forget to reapply often)
- Wear a hat (the broader the better)
- Seek out shade
- Wear sunnies to protect your eyes

Early detection is always the key. Check your skin regularly all over for any unusual spots or growths (get your partner to help!). You can visit the Cancer Council of WA website for information about what exactly to look for and don't hesitate to get anything of concern looked at by your doctor. An annual skin check with your GP or at a reputable skin clinic is also a good way to keep track of any changes or developments.




Welcome to 2019 at the Beverley Football Club. We hope that you have all had a relaxing Christmas and New Year period with your friends and family!






