Happy New Year to all our Garden Club members. The first meeting for 2019 will be held at 10.30am on Tuesday 05 March at Bruce Thompson's Chinese date orchard at 7691 Great Eastern Highway, Beverley. Please bring a chair and mug.

Anyone wishing to visit the Mundaring Garden Club on Tuesday 05 February for information on growing Pelargoniums, Geraniums and Gerberas, please contact Dorothy on 0429 989 031. We will leave the Dead Finish at 8.15am, cost is just \$3.00 each. Places are limited.

Gardening in Beverley during January can be challenging dealing with the heat waves and strong, hot winds.

Vegetables to plant in January include: beans, beetroot, broccoli, brussels sprouts, cabbage, carrot, cauliflower, leek, lettuce, radish, rhubarb, shallots, silverbeet, spring onion and turnip.

Flowers to plant in January include: alyssum, aster, dahlia, gerbera, impatients, marigold, nasturtium, pansy, petunia, portulaca, salvia, stock, sweet pea, verbena and zinnia.

January is a great time to attend to the following tasks in the garden:

- **Divide bromeliads** -
- Dead head roses to encourage more flowers -
- Tip prune basil regularly to encourage bushy plants -
- Top up mulch on everything including pot plants to help retain ക moisture in the soil
- Tip prune native shrubs that have finished flowering to help make them bushier
- Remove suckers from grafted plants, especially citrus and roses -
- Prevent seeds forming on agapanthus by removing spent flowers -
- Prune roses by one third to encourage good flowering for autumn **\$**
- Remove a third of developing fruit on trees to reduce disease, increase fruit size and quality and to evenly distribute the weight of the fruit
- -Cut back lemon verbena, mint and lemon balm so they don't become leggy. Use the prunings to flavour drinks
- Remove dead leaves from tropical plants such as palms, cordyline, strelitzia, ginger and bromeliad and strappy plants such as kangaroo paw
- With a chance of summer storms, January is a good time to ask a qualified arborist to check all trees and remove any dangerous branches

Other chemical residues

- Rinse container immediately after use as all chemical residues are much harder to remove when dry
- Some containers may require additional rinsing (more than three rinses)
- A brush or high pressure hose may be required to clean stubborn or dried chemical residue

Regional Overview



Overview of statistics

These statistics relate to the 5-year period of 2012-2016 and are restricted to killed or seriously injured (KSI) or serious crashes unless otherwise specified:-

- \Rightarrow 666 people were killed or seriously injured in regional WA in 2016.
- \Rightarrow 4,102 people were killed or seriously injured in regional WA from 2012-2016.
- \Rightarrow KSI rate is 127.5 per 100,000 populations.
- \Rightarrow 61% of KSI were male.
- \Rightarrow 22% of KSI were aged 25-35 year old.

Types of crashes

Most of the fatal and serious crashes that occur in the regional areas of Western Australia involve only one vehicle which has either run off the road and/or collided with an object or rolled over.

- \Rightarrow 24% of fatal and serious crashes involved a single vehicle run-off-road or non-collision rollover.
- \Rightarrow 37% of people killed or seriously injured was a result of hitting an object (excludes animals).
- \Rightarrow 49% of fatal and serious crashes occurred on 110 km/h speed zones.
- \Rightarrow 15% occurred on roads with speed zones of 50 km/h.

Behaviour statistics

These are the key behaviours involved in fatal and serious crashes for the 5-year period from 2012-2016:-

- \Rightarrow Seat belts were not worn by 11% of vehicle occupants killed or seriously injured.
- \Rightarrow **Speed** was a factor in the 18% of fatal and serious crashes.
- ⇒ At least one driver/rider with a **blood alcohol concentration** (BAC) of 0.05 or higher was recorded in 7% of fatal and serious crashes.*
- ⇒ Research indicates 21% of fatal and serious crashes involve fatigue.**

*BAC data missing for 2015 and 2016 due to changes in the sharing of data from the Chem Centre WA. **Restricted to proxy measures of fatigue.

BEVERLEY HISTORICAL SOCIETY REPORT ON AN EXCURSION TO HISTORIC BOYADINE HOMESTEAD IN NOVEMBER 2018

During 2016 David and Fiona Mofflin - the current owners of the historic Boyadine property on the York -Williams Rd, came across an interesting handmade wooden `paddle/spade`. They kindly donated this

item to the Beverley Historical Society. We still haven't been able to get any positive identification of it despite help from Museums Australia, the general public and other organisations.

The Mofflins were most interested to learn the history of the homestead so we had a busy collaboration between previous family owners and the Society to research as much as we could. This culminated in a wonderful visit to Boyadine when we all shared stories, facts, photographs and much more over a cuppa in the homestead dining room and a wander around the buildings.





Sam Moore took up the Boyadine land in 1843 however the original Grantee was Henry de Burgh in 1845. The English style homestead was built by Mr de Burgh. From early times we found that it was a centre for weddings, births, baptisms, tennis (picture of court on left) and a post office and store to name a few. It appears that there was a police presence at some time as in the end of the stone & mud shearing shed is a male gaol cell and in the original detached kitchen building there is a female gaol cell where the window bars still remain .

By 1869 the property, still owned by de Burgh was occupied by Mr Edward Doncon and was advertised for sale with a large house and good dairy attached to it. Mr Doncon purchased the property in 1871 and was appointed postmaster on the princely sum of 10 pounds per annum. Increased to 20 pounds in 1898. The mail was delivered once a week - 88 miles from Perth. RC Doncon was born in 1872.

In 1903 Messers Edward and Robert Doncon bought 'Timaru' at East Beverley where later Hubert & Sylvia Doncon farmed and raised their children Kenneth, Shirley (Smith) and Cliff.

In 1928 - R Doncon sold `Boyadine ` to Hon George W Miles MLC and in the same year he bought `Hillhead` from the Potts family. He died at Hillhead in 1944 and his wife Sarah (Knott) lived in Beverley until 1949. His son Len Doncon continued farming Hillhead and had four children. (See below)

Alex Miles was born in Marble Bar and after his education and work in the North West he came to Boyadine and farmed with his father George. During this time there was considerable improvement to the property

and homestead. Fertilisers and clover were introduced, it seems water was plentiful with 2 dams and 5 wells with mills. The property was now 3,400 acres with 2,500 being cleared.

Anne Fisher recalls visiting her grandparents at Boyadine in her childhood and it was interesting to hear that the dining room and kitchen were in opposite places to today. They extensively renovated the homestead in the 1940's and the different styles of construction reveal some very thick walls, some narrow walls and quite different ceilings -some with wood panels.

We also found out that Sylvia Doncon, who married Alex Miles, was a superb pianist, and her brother Len played the drums at local dances.



This large semi underground tank is made of stone and fully covered. It was apparently hit by a tractor and restored. Next to it is the shearing shed with a wonderful stone and mud wall through the centre and the men's gaol cell at the far end.

In 1953 Alex Miles retired to Beverley and the Alex Miles Lodge is named after him. Boyadine was leased to RT Broun later of `Waterhatch` until it was sold around 1960 back to the Doncon`s – this time Len Doncon of `Hillhead` - Alex Miles brother-in-law.

Len's eldest son Blair later lived in the 'Boyadine' homestead again with his young family. During this time (1970's) they told of lifting all the 'white- ant eaten' jarrah floorboards, turning them over and restoring them. They still look beautiful today. They also built a more modern kitchen inside the homestead and restored the roof on the original detached kitchen/women's gaol building to save this building.

The Doncon's again sold the property around 1980 and it had several owners before the Mofflin's purchased it in 2005. The house was by this time rather abandoned.

We were surprised to learn that Blair and Debbie tried to have the property Heritage listed but it did not fit the criteria as it had been so extensively added to over the years. It surely is one of the oldest homesteads still being lived in in the Dale area and we can all be very thankful that so many people have cared for it over it's lifetime.

The life of a

Parasitoid wasp



Spider wasp (Family Pompilidae) dragging spider

No native wasp species in southern Western Australia are social, thus, they lack a queen, her drone consorts and a nest of workers doing her bidding. Instead, our native wasps have interesting lives as solitary hunters or parasitoides they feed on and actually kill their hosts. They are also kleptoparasites, stealing their host's food vlague before they kill them.

These wasps often focus on one type of host such as caterpillars, beetles, bugs, cockroach or grasshopper ootheca (egg cases), spiders or spider egg cases or even other wasps! The female wasp locates suitable food plants or habitats and then uses her antenna to taste and search systematically for a suitable host. Once a suitable host is found, she will use her ovipositor to either insert eggs into the host body or attach them externally. When the larvae

hatch, they consume the living host, and pupation takes place within what is left of the dead host, inside the host's pupal chamber or they form their own pupa. The length of the ovipositor (the modified egg injecting stinger on the back end) can indicate the type of they look for. For host example, some wasps have ovipositors 8 times their body length as their hosts are wood-boring insects.

Potter, Digger or Spider wasps will build or dig a chamber for a single egg, and then hunt down larger prey like spiders and grasshoppers. To keep the larva's food supply fresh each victim is paralysed and delivered live to the nest where an egg is laid on the host.

Cuckoo wasps lay their eggs inside the nest of other wasps. The cuckoo larvae then consume both the host wasp and its food supply.

Other wasps are tiny, or have weirdly shaped abdomens, and attack spider or insect eggs or even aphids and other sap-sucking insects.

Warrior Wellbeing Article Negotiator ... Action Hero ... Dad

Sometimes it's easy, other times we're talking to Godzilla. Being a father of teenagers is challenging and rewarding, but it doesn't have to be a health hazard. Keep in mind, that most of us just want three things for their kids; To be happy; to be independent and for them to contribute. That said, we're integral to them getting there.

We can have a fantastic relationship with our kids, but don't fall into the trap of trying to be their best mate. They need boundaries, they yearn for them, however as teenagers, they'll want a stake in setting them. For that to happen, our parenting style needs to become more a negotiator than a Dictator. We're teaching them life skills around conflict resolution, developing a voice and being concise. This helps them immeasurably in their adult lives.

Negotiating allows our kids to see an argument through someone else's eyes. Even if they don't agree, we're developing empathy and understanding rather than dogmatism and pigheadedness. The by-product of this is developing a loving relationship with our kids rather than dysfunction.

Attentive Dads are linked with a lower incidence of depression, suicide and lawbreaking in our youth. We're also role-modelling for their future relationships; The way we parent, or behave towards our partner, will be acted out by them. Conversely, harsh parenting is linked to not only depression in teenagers but in fathers as well.

What Are Some Ways to Get Involved in Our Teenagers Life?

- **Be there;** Not right up in their grill! Just around. Sometimes being that mentor figure, for them to know that they can lean on us or ask for guidance is priceless without them even knowing it.
- **Be active;** Ride a bike; Go for a walk together; Shoot some hoops. If they're not overly sporty, substitute with a hobby, board game or cards.
- **Become the student;** Letting our teenagers take the reins and teach us something, even if it's just a game that they're into, builds their confidence and assertiveness.
- **Parent**; Have boundaries and enforce them. The world has rules and consequences so, not exposing them to this can leave them vulnerable.
- **Be a negotiator;** The results will be twofold. Our relationship will be so much more pleasant; and our kids will learn skills to better equip them as young adults and future parents.
- **Share passions;** Talk passionately about what interests you, and listen attentively to them, it can be contagious and create new bonds for both of you.
- Spend time with them and let them know you love them; As much as they'll call us "dags" or roll their eyes, inside, kids yearn to be loved and a hug does wonders. If you're not "huggy" then you can still demonstrate love by being involved in their schooling, at their sporting commitments or picking them up from parties.

Someone said recently, "Did you know, that when your teenager leaves home, those childhood years represent 80% of the time that you will ever spend with them?" No, I didn't but I do now. It's changed how I see myself as a father, and how much I value time with my kids.

Have you ever wondered what attending a church is really like?

Well here's how our service goes...... Our service lasts only 1 hour in total. Our Pastor welcomes everyone to the church and then offers a short prayer. We sing about 4 or 5 modern hymns (accompanied by recorded music and large printed words on a screen). You can join in if you feel like it or just listen, nobody will be watching you as we are all facing the screen!

We then have Communion, which we take every week (Communion is the taking of bread (in this case we take small pieces of broken crackers) and fruit juice which represents Christ's body and blood given for us all on the Cross). The Communion is brought around and offered to everyone (again this is optional you won't be watched or judged if you do or don't take it).

We take up an offering with a cloth, non-see through bag (so nobody sees what is given) that is carried around. Visitors are not expected to put anything in to help our ministry work, and we believe strongly that all our church members should give (or not give) whatever they feel lead to do, and not a set amount.

Our Pastor then gives a message of around 20 minutes, which consists of him presenting the whole message printed on the screen in front of us so everyone can follow along.

He then lets us know of any announcements of coming events or any specific items we should be praying for, and then offers a short closing prayer.

We then go through to our little kitchen/dining area (complete with small individual café tables decorated with cloths and flowers and comfy chairs) and have a very informal gathering to share a light lunch and tea/coffee/milo (no need for you to bring anything with you, there's always plenty to share!).

So now you know! But why not come and see for yourself what happens in a church that REALLY practises what it preaches!

A warm welcome awaits you and it could be just what you've been looking for!

Our Pastor continues his rock solid, Bible based preaching every week, when we don't have a visiting speaker, so it's ALWAYS worth dropping in to a Beverley Real Life Church meeting!

Beverley IT Making IT Simpler

Secure Email

I have discussed information privacy and security in previous articles. This time I will focus on email security, particularly when you want to send private information by email to someone or to organisations such as government, health, and finance (e.g. banks).

Internet Security. As I have pointed out previously, the Internet is **not** a secure network. Phone and data networks are superficially secure, as long as you stay within the provider's network. But any connection to the Internet may not be secure. This is a real issue if you want to send private information, so I need to go into more detail on how insecure your personal information can be and how you can best protect it.

How safe (unsafe!) is your information. There are probably more than 100 million criminals on the Internet - all looking to steal your money. They either try to do that directly using scams, or by collecting personal information and then using that to raid your bank accounts or other investments. For instance, a few years ago some houses in WA were illegally stolen from the owners using personal information. This led to a significant tightening of the house purchase legal process. There have been huge security breaches of major information holding organisations with unknown consequences.

Protecting private information. As a result of these major security breaches many major organisations, such as government, health, and banks, have taken steps to secure and control the private information they hold. They have set up secure encrypted communication links between their various offices and between themselves and others who they work with., e.g. between Government departments and between hospitals and doctors.

The missing link. There is one vital communication link missing: that is between the organisation and its customers! For instance, my doctor's surgery will only communicate with me by post, phone or text. They will receive emails (after pointing out that they are insecure) but suggest I post a letter instead. There needs to be better mechanisms available to communicate personal information to and from customers.

Security tip

NEVER put logon details (user id and password) in an open email. Only put the information in an encrypted attachment. Only give an encryption password by phone, but make sure you are not overheard. Or use a secure messaging service, e.g. WhatsApp, Facebook Messenger, Signal, Telegram, or Wire (all have end-to-end encryption). Note: encryption was removed from Skype when Microsoft bought Skype.

Banks use encrypted communication between themselves and to the government etc. but still use email to their customers if you allow them to. As most customers have secure login IDs, and the connection between you and the bank is encrypted, documents could be transmitted via on-line banking. This would be totally secure. However, I'm only aware that ANZ have implemented this.

Connecting to the Internet. Connections to the NBN or ADSL are not encrypted, unless you use a Virtual Private Network (VPN). This means that anything you send or receive in plain text is capable of being intercepted. Regardless of the communication mechanism your information will be visible on the server.

Emails are not secure. Internet links are insecure when unencrypted therefore email is insecure. However the main vulnerability is the email server. Emails are kept by your email provider (e.g. Gmail, outlook.com, Bigpond; or your own internet domain host e.g. mydomain.com.au). Emails are usually kept unencrypted on a server hence the information is available to the email service owner and anyone who breaks in. Most of the servers are in the USA. To avoid exposure of private information, have end-to-end encryption between the email sender and the receiver then the email service provider cannot unencrypt it.

File encryption. Avoid putting sensitive information in the body of an email, unless you are using secure email (usually used by businesses). Instead, use an encrypted attachment. Unfortunately, most people do not know how to encrypt or unencrypt files (even banks!!!!). Alternatively use cloud storage, such as Dropbox, especially for larger documents. However, ensure that the file is encrypted.
