Youth Precinct Working Group

A working group comprising Council and Community representatives is being established to progress a feasibility study to develop an outdoor Youth Activity Space within the Beverley Townsite. The role of the Working Group is to: investigate a facility that would best suit the needs of youth in the community; a suitable location; and an estimate of cost to establish this facility. Keep an eye out for a future community forum to present and discuss options and seek feedback.

Diving Board Delay

The condition of the diving board at the Beverley Swimming Pool was poor and it needed to be removed. The Beverley Council determined that a new one be purchased which required a special resolution as this was not considered in the 18/19 budget. The new diving board was expected to have been installed prior to the popular Australia Day celebrations this year, but clearly this did not eventuate due to delay in its delivery from America. When it does arrive, being so close to the end of the pool-open season, installation will occur for next summer.

Cornerstone Aeronautical Display

Have you visited the new Cornerstone building? Come in and have a look at the interpretive museum located in the Visitor Centre which is open whenever the "i" flag is flying outside. There is information about the airfield, gliding club, 1950 Amana air crash and of particular interest a 1:5 scale model of the Silver Centenary and how it was built, along with the story of the original silver centenary and its subsequent restoration many decades later.

Planning for Kitchen Refurbishment at the Town Hall

Refurbishment of the town hall kitchen has been

considered by Council for several years. Review of proposed plans by a community focus group has assisted with feedback that should see progress during 2019 of this project.

Speed Sign Change

Beware the speed sign change at the rail crossing on Great Southern Highway between Beverley and Mount Kokeby where it drops back to 80km/hr. For those who regularly travel this road and have done so for many years this may take some adjusting. There were occasions in recent weeks when I arrived in town and suddenly realised "oops"! 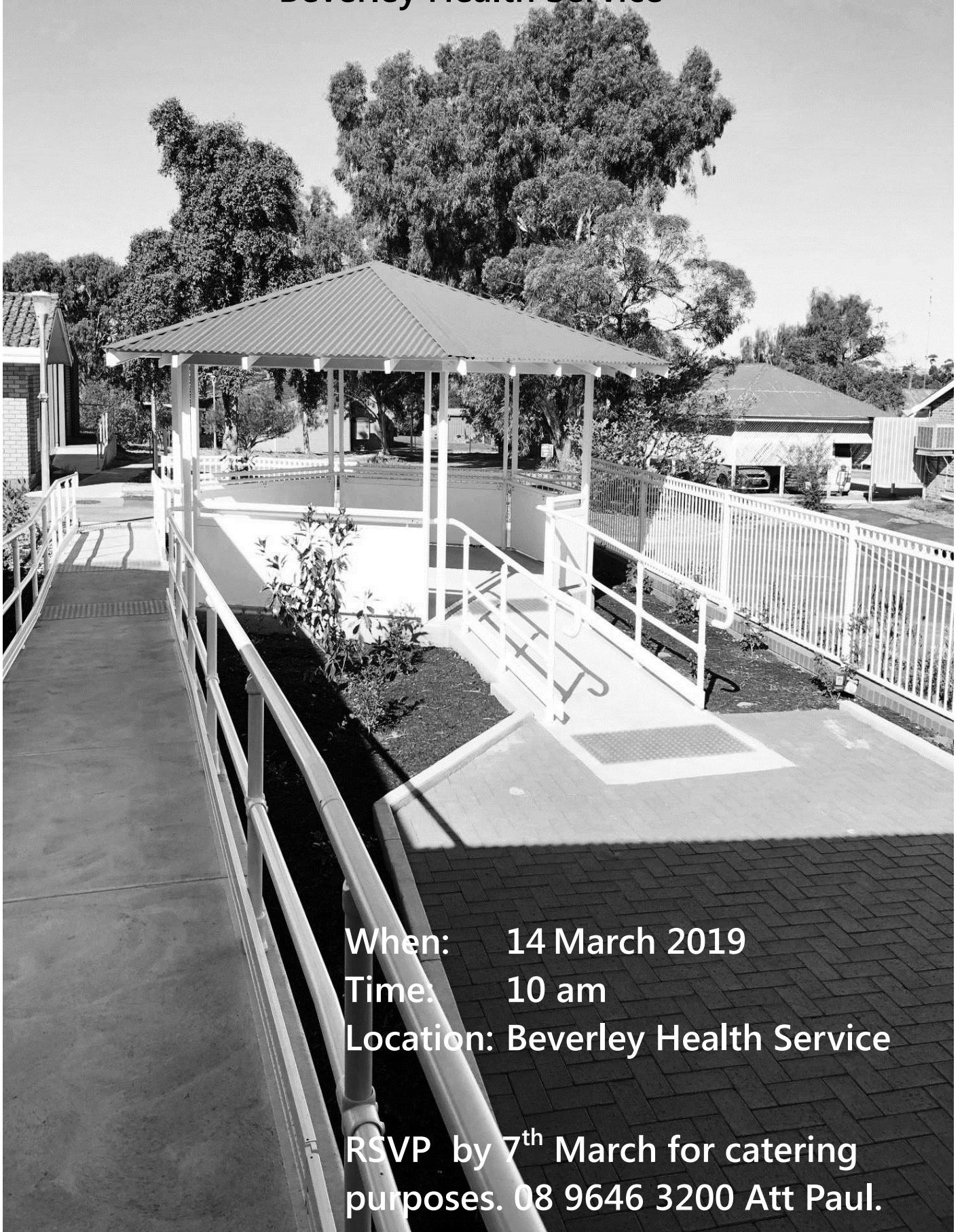



Restricted Burning period for the Shire of Beverley **Begins 01 March and will continue until 31 March** unless otherwise notified.

A permit to burn is required from your local Fire Control Officer (FCO). The list of FCO's and their contact numbers is available on the Shire of Beverley website and in the 2018/19 Information Booklet.

Please exercise all care and undertake careful planning when deciding to conduct a burn. Action will be taken against escaped burns and anyone burning without a permit.

DON'T LET YOUR FIRE BECOME THE GREAT ESCAPE!

The Community Emergency Services Manager along with the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer for the Shire of Beverley would like to remind everyone to take **all care** when deciding to conduct any form of burning and to be **well prepared** to prevent the fire escaping your control.

It is always the responsibility of the person who conducts a burn to ensure that the fire does not escape their control and penalties and sanctions including fines and/or the recovery of the costs associated with local Bush Fire Brigade response can apply where a fire escapes and impacts others.

The following is a list of factors to consider when conducting burning...

- What are the current weather conditions particularly relating to wind strength and direction? (no burning if the wind is likely to exceed 20kmh) Can you postpone your burn to a better day?
- What are the forecast wind conditions for the **following days**?
- Do you have sufficient resources available to prevent an escape of your fire?
 - If you live in town have you made sure that you have a hose or hoses that can easily reach the site of your fire and beyond? Have you checked that the water is turned on and ready immediately if required?
 - Have you cleared a bare mineral earth break around the area to be burnt? Do you have rakes and shovels immediately available to use?
 - Are you dressed safely with long pants and long sleeved cotton clothing, sturdy boots and leather gloves?
 - Have you ensured that your fire is a sufficient distance from trees, shrubs or anything else you don't wish to burn? Remember flames heights can be considerably higher than your rubbish pile and radiant heat can set fire to surrounding items. Maintain a minimum of 5 metres clear for small garden fires. Wet down surrounding areas.
 - If you are outside of town do you have an adequate number of fire fighter units to control the burn? Have pumps, motors and hoses been checked to ensure immediate operation and water supply when required? Has a bare mineral earth firebreak been installed around the paddocks you wish to burn as per the Shire's Firebreak Order?
 - Do you have a sufficient number of people organised to monitor the fire and maintain supervision until it is **fully extinguished**?
 -

Remember to be vigilant to ensure the safety and protection of the whole community.

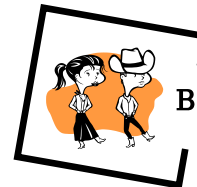

The Chamberlin 9G Tractor (which was used while tilling the soil for last years hay crop) was run up with a view to changing the oil, this is now being placed on the ‘to do’ list as an oil filter was not available at the time.

John Hawke took great pride in starting up and running his Caterpillar and was seen kicking up the dust outside while wrestling with the levers and pedals, an art he has mastered well. He also, with the assistance of Kerry & Kevin, started the Fargo Truck.

Kerry and Kevin together with Duayne were instrumental in the starting and running of one of our vast range of small engines, a Mac’s Diesel single cylinder, and as Kerry pointed out it is a very reliable unit and sat chugging away for well over half an hour, luckily the exhaust pipe is located to the outside of the building.

While this was happening Richard Boladeras and John Alexander were busy with the air compressor pumping tyres (and there were plenty) that had decided to descend (only on the bottom!) towards the floor.

Our efforts were followed by a ‘bring & share’ morning tea where further discussion was held concerning our activities.

Beverley GARDEN AND TREE SOCIETY

Although we did not have a meeting in February, members were invited to visit the Mundaring Garden club on Tuesday 05 February for information on growing Pelargoniums, Geraniums and Gerberas. 10 members attended and were treated to an interesting and informative talk on the above topics. We were also lucky enough to come away with four raffle prizes between us. Margie, one of the members of the Mundaring Garden club, generously invited us to her home for lunch and a wander around her and husband Ian's garden. We certainly had an enjoyable day.

The first meeting for 2019 will be held at 10.30am on Tuesday 05 March at Bruce Thompson's Chinese date orchard at 7691 Great Southern Highway, Beverley. Please bring a chair and mug.

Gardening in March is a great time as autumn has arrived. Autumn is a good time to plant almost anything!

Vegetables to plant in March include – beetroot, broccoli, cabbage, carrot, leek, lettuce, radish, spinach, spring onion and turnip.

Flowers to plant in March include – alyssum, lobelia, stock, pansy, snap dragon, sweet pea and viola.

March is a great time to attend to the following tasks in the garden:

- Prune geranium and pelargonium by two-thirds to encourage new bushy growth before winter
- Remove weeds before they go to seed. The best time is after rain
- Attract butterflies to your garden by planting red, orange, purple, white and blue flowers
- Prune petunias to keep them flowering well into autumn
- Coffee grounds can be put to good use in the garden as slug and snail repellent or in the compost bin
- Divide agapanthus plants from autumn through to early spring
- Prune off citrus branches hanging lower than 1m above the ground to reduce the spread of brown rot
- Plant bee food plants such as brachyscome, angophora, eucalyptus, callistemon, melaleuca, scaevola, grevillea, hibbertis, tea-tree and westringia
- Scorched leaves can be a sign that soil is water repellent. If the soil is dry, apply a wetting agent and water well
- Divide clumping grass-like plants, such as dianella, lomandra and kangaroo grass. Keep several shoots per clump and remove dead material
- Harvest radish regularly to stop them becoming too hot and spicy, woody or pithy
- Start planning spring bulbs

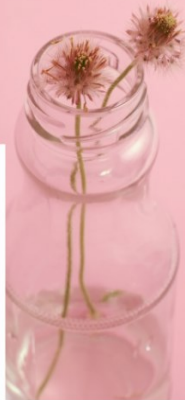

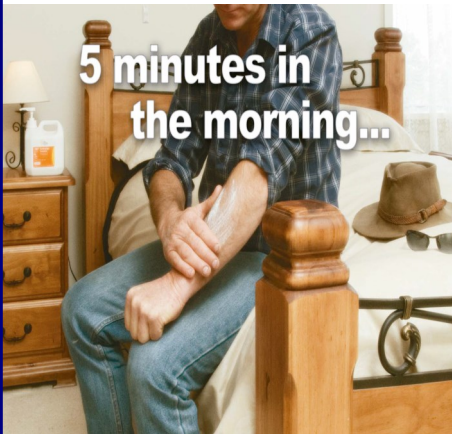

Farmers across borders - Hay from WA

Need for Feed - Disaster Relief

In 2014 a not-for-profit community organisation formed, Farmers Across Borders- a passionate group of WA farmers who aimed to help Eastern states farmers who have been severely affected by the drought. The founders of the group, Sam Starcevich and Anne Bell are farmers from the Esperance region in WA. After a bumper season of their own in 2014, the ladies organised 16 road trains to deliver donated hay to some of the drought stricken areas. The newly formed group, in conjunction with Burrumbuttock Hay Runners, completed a successful run to Bourke and Lightning Ridge in NSW. In 2018 a call was made for assistance and the WA based group again started planning for their next run to help fellow farmers in need.

The destination for the 2019 run was Cobar in NSW, the region hadn't had rain for around 8 years and the group received 3000 people applying for hay (feed). With an ultimate goal of providing those drought affected farmers hay and moral support, a convoy of 48 trucks all met in Norseman on the 22nd of January, pre-loaded and ready to head off the next day.

Our local transport companies, Beverley Transport, Game On Contracting and Roley Pearce were part of this drought relief convoy, along with trucks from neighbouring towns of York and Brookton.

The 2019 run was organised in conjunction with Lions Need for Feed. They supplied drivers with everyday needs, such as meals and water, to make it easier for the drivers and support people. Farmers got care packs as well, thanks to lions need for feed which included essentials such as toiletries.

Loaded with 3500 bales to supply 300 farmers, the Beverley crew stayed at the back of convoy. The first leg of the journey, Norseman to Eucla, WA/SA border was 710km, and when Roley Pearce needed a parts delivery from Beverley so Jules and Angus trekked to Eucla to assist.

Over the next 3 days the convoy covered 1,831kms crossing the NSW border on the 25th and arriving at their destination of Cobar on Australia Day. With a massive social media following, Sharyn Johnson travelling in a Game On Contracting truck with her husband Ross, was astounded by the number of supporters who would come out when they knew the trucks were passing through the towns. This reinforced the fact that what this group of people were doing was important. She said "There were families outside their homes and lining the streets in these small towns, including small children with flags, waving and showing

their support, it was just amazing!" As we entered into towns we had police escorts to assist and the town shires provided parking zones for trucks to safely park, not an easy job for so many road trains.

During the trip the weather was hot- at times it was nearly 50 degrees. There was an incident when one driver I took a “stretch your legs break” along the way. While on this break his load and trailer caught on fire. Thankfully he was not injured and his truck was undamaged but unfortunately the load and trailer didn’t survive.



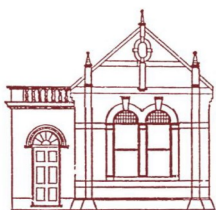

Sharyn said, “I was surprised in NSW, the smell of death from all of the animals and the amount of carcasses everywhere. Kangaroo’s were skinny and battling to stand upright and there were skeletons all along the side of the road. Even though we knew about the devastation in NSW, to see it first handed was an real eye opener, an experience that I will never forget”. On the 27th of January all the trucks dispersed to different locations,. Truck drivers would go from 50-500kms from Cobar to deliver to their allocated farmer.

The return home from the hay run had mixed emotions for Sharyn, “I’m so grateful to the helpers that supplied food and even washed clothes and those people that were cheering us on and the support and generosity of those that we meet on the way. On the run we met new people and it was a good experience but the devastation in these drought stricken regions opened my eyes as to how fortunate we are and how much support others still need. The kindness shown and the support given was astounding and will always remain with me”.

Oil-based chemicals (ULVs, LVs)

- ✓ Follow specific instructions on the product label or contact the manufacturer for further assistance



Other chemical residues

- ✓ Rinse container immediately after use as all chemical residues are much harder to remove when dry
- ✓ Some containers may require additional rinsing (more than three rinses)



- ✓ A brush or high pressure hose may be required to clean stubborn or dried chemical residue

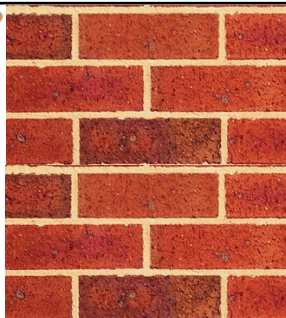

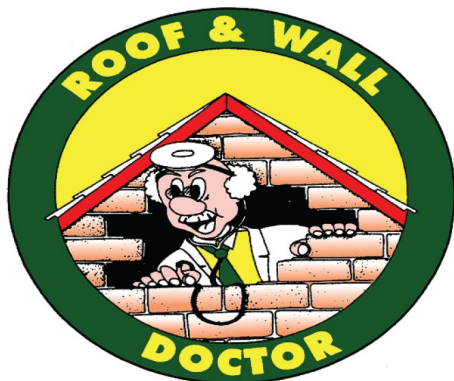

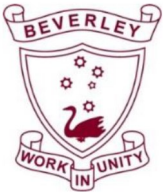

Ants – on the bright side

Ants can be good – but when is the last time you heard that? Sadly, ants are much maligned and misunderstood.

The diversity of the total ant species in an ecosystem can be an indicator of overall environmental health. Having a diverse community of ants and other insects helps keep the entire ecosystem in balance, which is important for all the plants, fungi, and animals (including us) that share the environment.

Ants are important components of an ecosystem for several reasons. They disperse seeds for propagation and their tunnelling skills make them important in nutrient cycling and soil aeration. They prey on pest insects such as flies, termites and cockroaches, but are also a food source for many other animals.

There are more than 2000 ant species in Australia, but less than a dozen of these are commonly considered pests. The majority of ant

Report suspect pests

complaints received by DPIRD concern mainly three species - coastal brown ants, odorous garden ants and white footed house ants.

Ants are social insects, existing in perfect communal harmony. More than 95% of ants exist underground with their queen, and we never see them. Ants are in fact so numerous, that if all the ants on the planet were gathered up and weighed, they'd outweigh all the humans put together.

But what happens if your ants are one of the exotic pest species and are outstaying their welcome? Don't feel too bad about controlling them! They are usually not friends of the native ant fauna, often displacing them and then building up in high numbers to the detriment of the entire local environment.

Control when needed

As different ants require different control methods, we suggest sending in ants for identification. This also helps us screen for exotic pests. We have a fantastic webpage called '*Ant identification, the key to successful control*' (Google it!) or phone our Pest and Disease Information Service (PaDIS) for advice regarding sample submission on

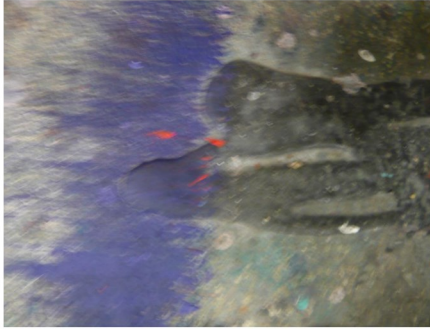

Shaving Back the Rhetoric About Toxic Masculinity

Recently, there's been much discussion about Gillette's ad and its portrayal of blokes. It's not a particularly good ad for selling razors, but the intention was to spark debate, and it has certainly succeeded there. Whilst the intention might be admirable, it's confusing. In particular, polarizing the group it clearly wants to unite for change.

Firstly, some traits targeted in the ad aren't toxic. A man sees a beautiful woman walking by and works up the courage to introduce himself. He's restrained by a bystander who says, "Not cool man, not cool". If we remove confidence from the permitted range of male behaviour, then the world's in a pretty poor state. This pigeonholes every bloke who ever worked up the courage to introduce himself to a girl, as "toxic". The debate needs to more strongly acknowledge admirable male behaviour. Stoicism and confidence are traits some feminists deem "toxic", but they're traits I wish to see in my kids; male and female.

Secondly, it's tarred the entire male population with the "Toxic Masculinity" brush. Many guys feel aggrieved by the fact that in the current climate and in this ad, even the "nice blokes" are made to feel guilty. This happens when gender rather than behaviour is the rallying-cry.

Boys bullying behaviour is a big part of the ad. Bullying is awful and should be condemned, but it's behaviour, not gender that needs targeting. In 26 years of teaching, the ratio of girl / boy bullies was 50/50. Boys tended to be more physical, however in my experience, online gossip, texting and cyberbullying shown in the ad were mainly the preserve of girls. Imagine the outcry if an ad targeted girl's "toxic femininity".

The 1950's style game-show / sit-com shots showing overt sexism and leering hosts are an obvious contrast in an otherwise modern, edgy ad. The reason they're used acknowledges that the audience understands this is behaviour from another time and that society has moved on from this culture. The biggest risk is, if we portray "schmucks" as the majority and infer that this is the prevailing culture, we legitimize their behaviour. Good men doubt themselves and think "Geez are we all like that?" and those who need to change feel absolved because they believe that everyone else behaves the same way!

Navel gazing isn't bad. Studying yourself with a critical eye encourages self-improvement. In the same vein, the Gillette ad opens with a man looking in the mirror as various headlines; "Me Too Movement; Bullying; Toxic Masculinity" are heard. You might say what's in a word, but it makes all the difference. Change "toxic masculinity" to "toxic behaviour" and it unites rather than divides. We all agree that some abhorrent behaviours need changing, however blame needs to be apportioned to a minority, not an entire gender.

If the ad is a rallying call to unite, then it shouldn't alienate those it's calling to set the bar higher by displaying "**The best a man can get**". The admirable traits of masculinity we all strive for, qualities of good character, including discipline, assertiveness, loyalty to a cause, teamwork, protection and care of others, as well as valuing our honourable role as fathers, have been omitted in what is, an overwhelmingly negative portrayal of manhood.
