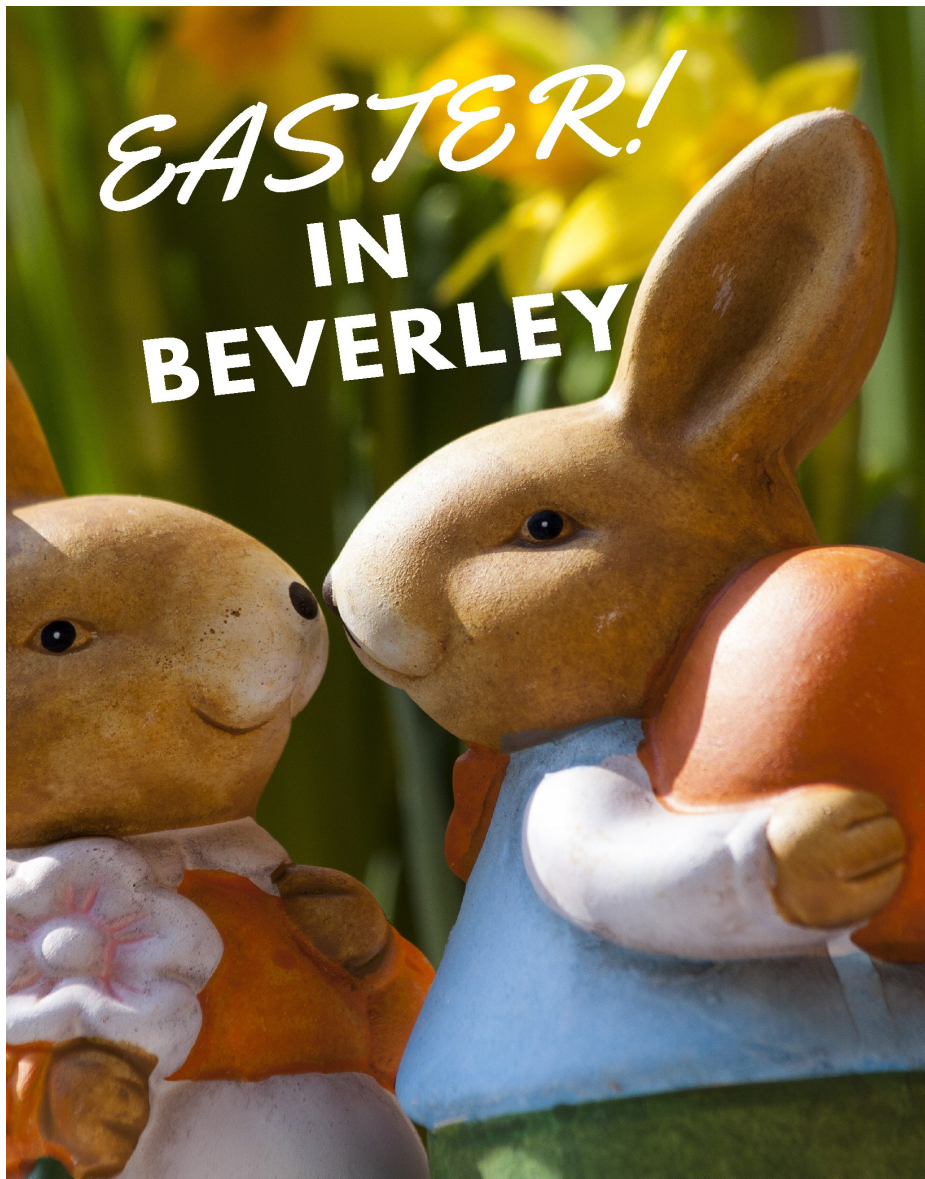

Cornerstone Official Opening

The Cornerstone Multipurpose Community Centre was officially opened on Thursday 28 February by Member for Pearce, the Hon Christian Porter MP. Work undertaken over the last 6 years to achieve a facility that will provide economic and social benefit to our community for decades to come was recognised. A large crowd of community members and invited guests attended the opening on what was a very warm day. The extra effort by everyone involved with the 'official' morning was greatly appreciated, including a special flyover by the Silver Centenary. Vincent Street Bridge Single Lane Only

Main Roads WA has advised that the westbound lane on the Vincent Street Bridge was due to close at the end of March. It was expected a lane will be closed well into completion of the bridge refurbishment works in late September.

Youth Activity Precinct Community Forum Saturday 13 April 2019

A Community Forum will be held on **Saturday 13 April 11am – 1pm** at the recreation ground to present and discuss site options investigated by the Working Group for a proposed Youth Activity Precinct in Beverley, and to workshop features and elements for inclusion in such a facility.

The Shire engaged Skate Sculpture for this project and the working group have been surprised how their own thinking has varied when guided through various considerations by the Skate Sculpture team. Interested youth and community members are strongly encouraged to attend the interactive Community Forum. A session with students at Beverley District High School will be held during school time on the day prior.

Local Government Elections October 2019

Four Councillor Terms with the Shire of Beverley will be expiring in October this year. In the lead up to the election the Shire plans to provide several opportunities to learn more about what is involved as a Shire Councillor. Candidate nominations open on 05 September for 8 days.

Property owners for whom Beverley is not their residential address on the State electoral role will need to contact the Shire to be included on the register of Owners and Occupiers for eligibility to vote for candidates in the Shire of Beverley.

A lovely gazebo area at the Beverley Hospital was officially opened in March by Mary Blechynden and Richard Smith whose family had a long association with brothers Claude and Gordon Angus who had bequeathed funds to the Beverley hospital many years ago.

The area provides a welcoming and assessable outdoor space for hospital residents, patients, their visitors and staff to enjoy.

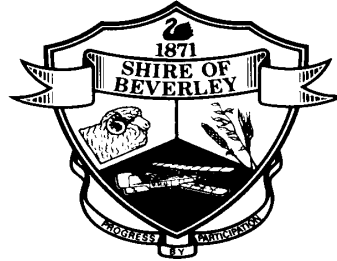

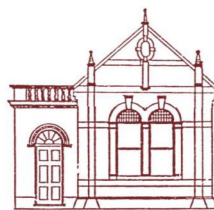

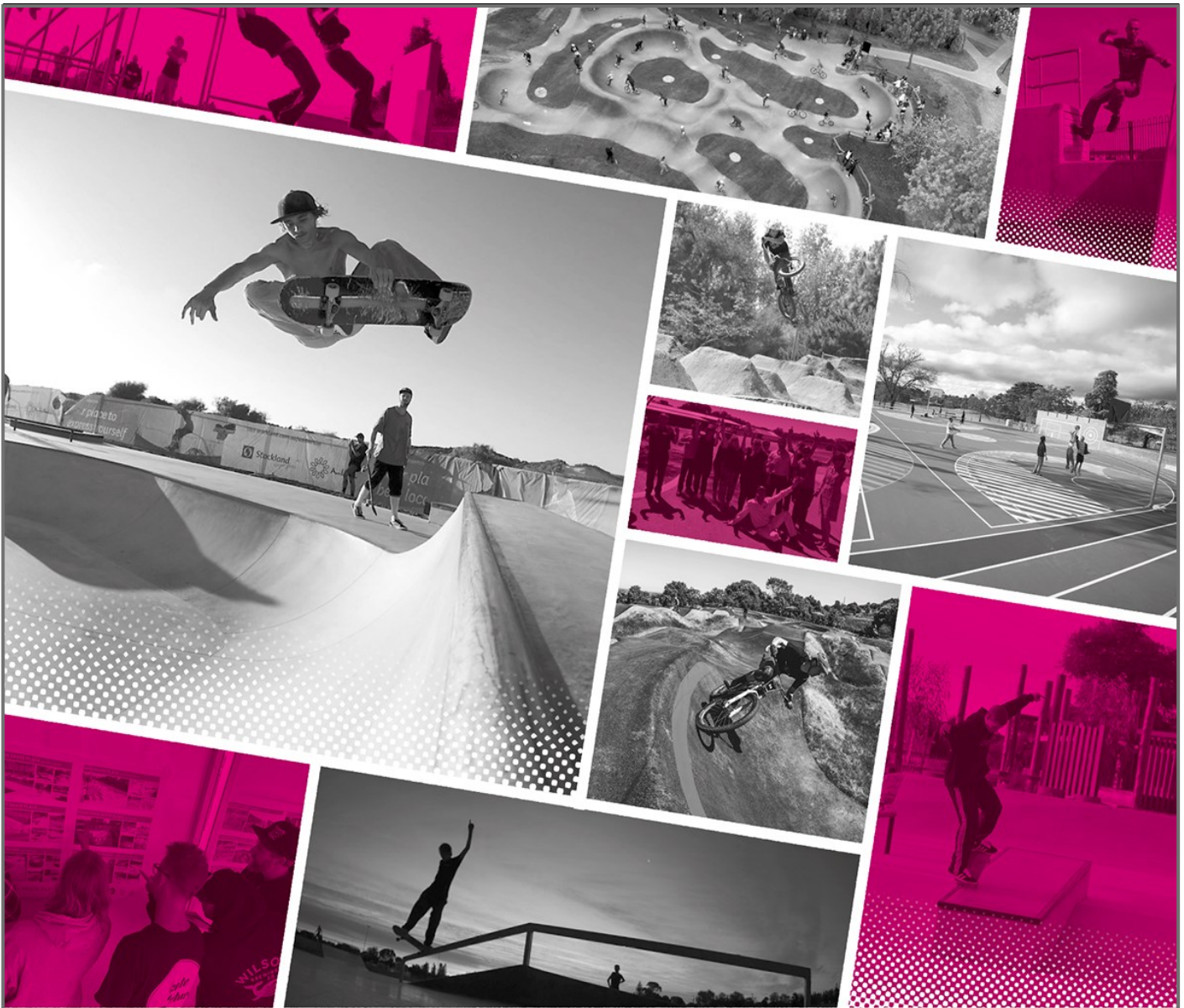

BE VERY FIRE AWARE!

It has been a long, hot and dry summer fire period and the Shire of Beverley's volunteer Bush Fire Brigade members and Shire staff have been kept busy with responding to fires during this time.

The Community Emergency Services Manager along with the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer for the Shire of Beverley would like to remind all farmers and small rural land holders of the need to remain properly prepared to protect not only your own properties but to also be available to help out your neighbours when there is a fire in your district.

Every rural property should have at least one firefighting unit full of water, with an operational pump and hose reel, mobile and ready to respond to a fire at short notice. Skid mounted firefighting units should remain on your ute from October to May every year and trailer mounted units should be ready to hook up and go.

We would like to remind everyone that it is important to look out for and help your neighbours wherever you can. The Shire of Beverley is a wonderful community and when there is a fire every bit of assistance is appreciated by every single person who turns out to extinguish that fire as quickly as possible.

Take all care and be extremely vigilant when conducting a burn. Make sure you have sufficient resources and personnel available to prevent your fire from escaping your control and make sure that the fire is never left unattended until you are sure the burn is completely extinguished.

By remaining prepared and working together we can all help to protect property from fire and keep everyone safe.

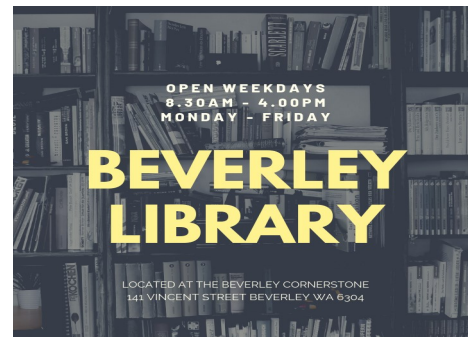

SunSmart Beverley Triathlon 2019

Our 5th annual Triathlon saw a record number of participants joining in what was a picture perfect day! Once again we had an amazing turnout with 185 competitors, dedicated locals, some travelling all the way from Kalgoorlie and we managed to attract many Perth Hill's residents as well. Our youngest competitor was 4 years old and our oldest competitor 60 years young – well done to everyone!

The triathlon was hosted at the Beverley Swimming Pool and the surrounding township on the long weekend, Saturday 2 March 2019. Our triathlon had 4 main course legs - Long, Short, Junior and Nippers. Courses and all categories included male, female and mixed teams. All competitors were timed electronically, lap counters were strategically positioned throughout the course, water stations were manned around the run leg and on completion all participants are given a hat, fruit, muffins and other light refreshments.

Our local pool management hosted a pool party after the final race which included fun family activities, inflatables and loads of other pool activities. We had lots of families stay around to join in some fun in the pool and just enjoy the relaxed atmosphere of the beautiful aquatic area

Our priority target group were families and our statistics indicate that the largest competitor's age groups were 7-12 year olds and 40 to 49 year olds therefore we meet our target group. The demographic of the competitors only were; 35% Local, 33% Metropolitan; 18% York, 8% Toodyay, and the remaining 6% made up from surrounding rural towns.

One major shift we have seen is that there was a considerable increase in individual entries compared to team entries. This is a positive indication that our event outcomes to help change people's eating and exercising habits are effective. Over the past five years we have observed many participants entering as a team for their first triathlon and then the following year/s participate as an individual otherwise entering for the Short course then moving onto the Long course.

Beverley **GARDEN AND TREE SOCIETY**

The March meeting was extremely well attended with 25 members present. This may have been due to the meeting being held at Bruce Thompson's Chinese Date or Ju Jube orchard and our members being intrigued to see what was beneath all that bird netting. We were treated to a very interesting talk by

Bruce and Carol Tee which certainly held our attention. Samples of fresh and dried Ju Jubes were available for tasting and we found them to be very pleasant, more like an apple really. Carol also presented us with delicious fruit cakes that incorporated the Ju Jubes. They were a very welcome addition to our morning tea and the platter was soon bare. We wandered through the orchard with Bruce and Carol happy to answer the myriad questions asked of them.

Hopefully your garden has made it through summer and is ready to receive the coming winter rains. Autumn is a fantastic time to be out and about in your garden. Usually the weather starts to become milder but there still remains a significant number of sunny days to potter around in. Right now is a great time to prune your summer flowering perennial plants, like lavender, ready for the winter quiet. April is a great month for planting spring bulbs, such as daffodils. This will give them plenty of time to get set and grow ready for a beautiful showing come September. It can also be a good time to spread a light organic fertiliser around your shrubs and trees. Though they'll receive Winter rains and won't be growing as much, they still require nutrients to survive the cooler winter.

Autumn can be a great time for planting trees because trees really do require good amounts of water to take root. Planting now will give them a month or 2 of good, sunny weather while still, hopefully, receiving some good rains, and then lapping up the rains of winter. The milder weather will also help because the trees won't experience sun damage as easily before they have the root system to cope with it.

It is also not too late to get your winter vegetables in, especially if you get them down in early April. Vegetables such as broccoli, cauliflower and cabbage and your leafy Asian style vegies really need to go in now if you want to get the best out of them throughout winter.

Use the next few months to really sow into your garden. As the rains start to fall in you won't have to spend as much time worrying about and making sure your garden has water so really work on other tasks, such as preparing garden beds for spring and summer annuals, fertilising, mulching and the like. Take the sunny days provided to you to provide the best benefit to your garden so that when Spring and Summer comes again your job will be easier!

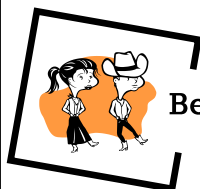

OFF-ROAD MOTORCYCLES

There has been an increase in complaints regarding the use of off-road motorcycles in public areas, particularly on gazetted roads (including gravel roads) around town. I will take this opportunity to serve a timely reminder to those who choose to do the wrong thing and to the parents of youngsters who allow their children to ride in areas where these bikes are not permitted.

If you are caught riding an unregistered motorcycle on a road, firstly, **the bike will be seized**. Pursuant to Section 800 of the Road Traffic Act 1974 (RTA) police officers are authorised to **impound an unlicensed motorcycle** that has not been licensed for 2 years or more and **is being or reasonably suspected of being, used on a road** (this includes the street verge and gravel roads).

The owner will be liable for costs involved in the seizure and storage of the vehicle and you may very well lose the bike for good. Secondly - you may be charged and face a magistrates court which can ultimately affect your motor driver's license with a suspension period and/or hefty fines being issued.

If the rider happens to injure another person whilst riding, they are not insured and any injury caused to another party as a result may leave the rider (or their family) liable to civil action for all financial losses to the injured party.

If your child has an off road motorcycle, please teach them responsible riding behaviours and to ride in designated areas or facilities/areas specifically provided for this type of activity. Use a trailer to get the bike to a suitable off-road area or location and of course, wear protective gear!

DOUBLE DEMERITS – EASTER LONG WEEKEND – 18 to 22 APRIL INCLUSIVE



A reminder that over the Easter long weekend double demerit points apply for:

- Speeding
- Seatbelt offences pertaining to drivers
- Driving with a BAC of or above 0.05
- Presence of prescribed illicit drugs or fail to supply oral or blood sample
- Contravene a red traffic control signal
- Contravene a red traffic control arrow

As mentioned previously remain extra vigilant while driving over this holiday period, take your time, plan your journey and arrive safely.

CRIME STOPPERS - You could play an important role in helping to make Beverley a safer place by making a report on any knowledge you have of criminal activity or suspicious behaviour.

It's up to you whether you'd prefer to use our online report form or toll-free telephone hotline (**1800 333 000**). Aside from the personal satisfaction of knowing you've done the right thing, you may also be eligible for a reward of up to \$1,000 from Crime Stoppers WA if your information leads to an arrest.

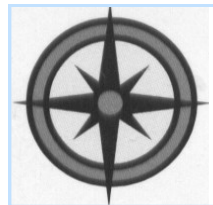

Tourism in Beverley gains momentum as we approach Easter, a busy and wonderful time in our community.

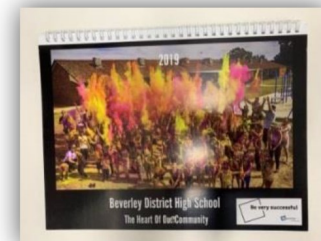

Cornerstone Official Opening Shire Presidents Address



I am immensely proud of what has been achieved by and for our community with the development and construction of this magnificent multipurpose, universally accessible facility known as Beverley Cornerstone where you will find the Community Resource Centre, Library, Modern Conferencing Facilities, Tenantable Offices, Creche/Daycare, Toy Library, and Museum Visitor Centre with its interactive displays and model Silver Centenary biplane.

This journey began following a Feasibility Study commissioned by the Community Resource Centre to determine its own future services, facilities and operation, the outcome of which was referred to the Shire Council at the end of 2013.

Council subsequently endorsed the study and could see an opportunity to investigate construction of a multipurpose facility which would provide social and economic benefit for the community, whilst also rationalising buildings that were no longer fit for purpose.

Plans were developed, reviewed, redeveloped. From Council's point of view, access to external funding was key to progressing implementation. This was a journey in itself taking many years to achieve.

Council was immensely grateful that funding allocated by funding partners in 2015 remained available to the project as staff continued to seek external funding over several years, achieving 5 funding partners

As mentioned earlier, the project enabled rationalisation of shire infrastructure, the demolished buildings are both recognised as you walk in the foyer between the sliding doors.

We have now had 4 months of use.

In this vibrant, universally assessable facility you will find welcoming and capable CRC staff as front of counter, managing the museum visitor centre and library whilst continuing to provide their services to community and visitors. We have a bright and inviting library, modern conferencing facilities already increasing in usage, offices tenanted by new businesses to our town providing regional services, with only one office remaining, confidence within the CRC Management Committee to employ a trainee, a community activated daycare, a toy library reactivated by a dynamic group of parents, space for the Beverley Naturalist Club's herbarium to be relocated into, a museum visitor centre



which includes local and regional aeronautical history as well as information about Beverley and surrounds for visitors and tourists.

This project has been the catalyst for numerous other activities and initiatives along the way.

The Old School building previously tenanted by the CRC will enable the Shire to economically expand its desperately needed additional office and civic space.

A successful application to the WDC Regional Grant Scheme enabled development of an open air display of local and regional aeronautical history to join the vampire jet already situated on Hunt road; along with commissioning of a 1:5 scale model Silver Centenary now located in the new Cornerstone museum visitor centre together with an interpretative history of the Silver Centenary.

The vampire jet which had been positioned in front of the Old Aeronautical Museum was relocated to the entrance of the Beverley airfield and refurbished by local youth Liam Gollan as a personal school project.

Although the Tourism and Development organisation disbanded, the CRC was engaged to manage the visitor centre and following successful funding from the ANZ Seeds of Renewal programme are now developing a team of supported volunteers who can assist in keeping the Visitor Centre open 7 days per week.

With the help of a Tourism Steering Committee the Beverley Tourism Planning Framework 2016 – 2020 was developed. This continues to be rolled out by a part time Tourism Officer and Tourism Advisory Group and includes the Beverley “Be Very You” branding.

The Cornerstone will form the trail head for town heritage walks, currently awaiting implementation following interpretation planning. It is also a key feature of the Vincent Street Urban Design proposal which Council hopes to progress in the near future flowing through from the highway to the town bridge, which itself is currently undergoing a \$3.8m federally funded refurbishment, and beyond there will be future redevelopment of the river park. A Community focus group has been established to investigate and develop youth activity space in the town.

Along with the day to day business of the Shire - things have been busy!

I would like to recognise Shire staff involvement in the project, particularly Stefan DeBeer, Steve Gollan, Simon Marshall, Steve Vincent, Ali Lewis, former CDO Kathryn McLean.

And thank my Shire Councillor colleagues for their vision in pursuing this project when an opportunity was presented to consider development of a multipurpose hub for the Beverley Community, servicing their needs for many decades to come and providing social and economic benefit that would be far reaching. In doing so Council also rationalised buildings no longer fit for purpose, and in time will achieve the additional administration space it requires. The Beverley Cornerstone journey has at times been challenging however the outcome and potential for the Shire of Beverley, our Community, and indeed the region is impressive.

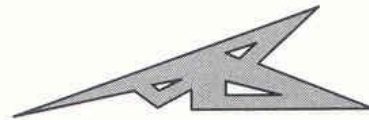

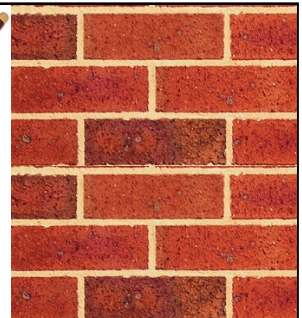

From Mal G Roberts

Community Adviser on Indigenous concerns.
Important information.

It was brought to CRANA's attention that recent works on the Vincent Street Bridge which included works on the river banks, that outside Indigenous people were selected to observe Cultural Issues in relation to the construction works on the bridge and surrounds. Mal Roberts was requested to write to Dr Dianne, CEO Main Roads and made it very clear that:

The local Beverley Indigenous community should decide and nominate their Community Elders to negotiate and work on projects like this and not any other Indigenous group, body or corporation. The Local Community Elders respect our local Indigenous culture, the land, the rivers, and the former past ancestors and present Indigenous families.

Mal was informed by email, phone and letter that some many years ago the Ballardong group on the South West Aboriginal Land and Sea Council gave the names of Elders and group that various organisation's would have to negotiate with. The 5 generations of Ugle's and Mourach's families were not included in the group supplied.

It should be known to members of the public that according to the Aboriginal Customary Law, practice and culture, the local Indigenous community do not and will not have any outside body, either Indigenous or non-Indigenous making decisions on behalf of the Beverley Indigenous community.

This is a very sensitive issue about land, river, culture, dignity and respect to our local people and we see it as an insult when any outsiders do not follow our customary law.

Mal Roberts lodged a complaint protest on this matter by phone with Mr. Scullion's office, Minister of Indigenous Affairs, and was requested to lodge a complaint in writing.

Before I write, I will need the name of two Indigenous community Elders who will be placed on record as authorised to speak on the history of Beverley on matters of their ancestors and all other matters relating to their culture and tradition. This is for the local Indigenous families to decide and it is not Mal Roberts' role.

I will wait to see who is selected to speak for Beverley- once again Beverley will decide, not Ballardong or SWAL Sea Council.

Beverley Voluntary Community Service

- ☞ Christmas hampers- those in need were helped through Share and Care Northam, and Mal Roberts on a personal level.
- ☞ Community Concerns- Overseas scams: Mal spoke to Christian Porter (Attorney General's Office) and the matter is now referred to the Federal Police for a full investigation. Class Action Lawyer: representing community residents on matters such as insurance and other financial institutions. Mal has regular phone, email and hard copy contacts with Shine Lawyers Office (eastern states and Perth). Ongoing matters which relate to the Royal commission findings on insurance companies and financial institution. Vehicle registration matters: the Director General's office and Rita Saffioti, Minister of Transport, was asked to look into matters of concern. Door to door salesmen: Mal Roberts spoke to legal firms regarding home owner's rights. Still ongoing, and waiting for further legal advice.
- ☞ Advice from ABC TV and other channels, regarding purchase of any good General Motor vehicles. Always check seller's credibility, even real estate properties. Make sure you do a certificate of title search from Landgate and obtain a certified copy. Purchasing vehicles on hire or vehicle repairs: check authenticity regarding credit standing. All documents of transaction should be hard copy including quotes (not estimates), no verbal or email transactions. All proof of ID must be produced. For example, one house owner was trying to sell a house to 3 different buyers, in three different names.
- ☞ Landgate- Financial institutions who lend money and hold certificate and security- name changes to certificate of title. I have regular contacts on behalf of those residents who want to add or delegate a name and seek information from Landgate as to the requirements of a solicitor or settlement agents. Ensure, always obtain copies of all transactions.
- ☞ Prisons- for over 15 years I have been assisting families who, have had to seek justice for a loved one. Remember, prisoners also have rights, and a right to a case manager and a solicitor or criminal matter which affect the jail sentencing of the courts. In one case, 5 legal representatives did not believe their client was innocent, as a matter of principle and equal justice, the defendant refused to plead guilty. In cases like this, fresh (new) evidence must be produced to the court to refute the old evidence, if successful will affect the jail sentence. Always seek independent legal advice, working doing community services in prisons helps some to get early parole.
- ☞ Justice of Peace- identifying and witnessing documents: proof of ID, some superannuation, insurance and government departments, apart from 100% proof. They are now asking a JP to sight and witness. Shire rates and Synergy bills (proof of address). When someone passes on, do not throw away their drivers licence as super and others want the JP to certify the D/L copy, and this is the only photo ID of the person who passed away.
- ☞ Community Service- JP Role of BVCS. Mal Roberts does not offer legal advice. This has been advertised now for over 28 years, yet on a regular basis I have been asked for legal advice and even to check documents prepared by lawyers. This has a legal element and I can't do so- I appreciate and thank these residents placing their trust in me, but once again I state my main brief is to help speak for and seek justice for the needy and as a JP I carry out my duty designated role, such as witnessing court documents, affidavits, and witness of documents.
- ☞ Appreciation and Awards- serving as a Justice of Peach for 26+ years, I was awarded a certificate of appreciation from the Attorney General. I did not go to the ceremony in Perth. For community service of over 25 years I was awarded both a small gold medal and a certificate of appreciation from the Community Services Minister. Normally these awards are presented during the Special Ceremonies held in Perth. Unfortunately I am a simple man and try to avoid pomp and ceremony. Mal G. Roberts JP.

OOH YOU MAKE ME LIVE! THE IMPORTANCE OF RELATIONSHIPS

When songwriter and bass player for supergroup Queen, John Deacon penned “Ooh you make me live” as the opening line for their hit “You’re My Best friend”, I’m guessing he didn’t know that he would in later years be backed by a 75-year Harvard University study on the impacts of relationships and

happiness on health and wellbeing. Apparently, having a best friend does in fact make you live! Thanks to the Harvard University Happiness Study, it’s now proven that social connection and the quality of relationships directly influences how well and how long we live.

Following 724 men from their pimply teenage years all the way through to their wrinkly nineties with biannual interviews, blood tests, brain scans and analysis of medical records, three things became obvious.

1. Good relationships keep us happy and healthy and result in longer life expectancy. On the flip-side, loneliness is toxic. People who admit to being less socially connected than they would wish, suffer health decline earlier and have shorter life expectancy.
2. You can be lonely in a crowd or a marriage so therefore, it’s the quality of your close relationships that counts (500 friends on Facebook doesn’t). Living in a constant state of conflict (in dysfunctional marriages/families or workplaces) is bad for your health and shortens life expectancy. In the study, the eighty-year olds who were happiest, were not the ones who at fifty had the most money or fame or even the best health; They were the ones who were happy in their relationships.
3. Having secure, dependable relationships with your wife or mates in your eighties is protective to your health. Blokes in the study who had close mates or wives that were always there for them, had much sharper memory. Those who were happiest in retirement were those who actively sought out new playmates to replace lost workmates. Many of the subjects thought that fame, fortune and high achievement were the cornerstones of a fulfilled and happy life. They later found that the time and effort taken to achieve these goals, could be counterproductive to the real health builder.... meaningful long-term relationships.

What does this all mean for us, especially as blokes? What are things that we can do to make a difference to our future happiness and health? For a start, some of the effort currently expended on the pursuit of fame and fortune may be better spent forging new friendships. Getting the work-life balance right, has measurable health benefits.

Substitute screen-time for people-time, a disappearing art that can only bring people together and enhance our social networks.

Make time for you and your friends. Maybe long walks or date night with the missus, or the fishing trip you’ve talked about for ages but never had with your mates. Reaching out to family that perhaps you haven’t talked to for years.

Joining a club or a Men’s Shed so that those whose lives have revolved around business and career can find new meaningful friendships in retirement.

Maybe its not “fat bottomed girls that make the rockin’ world go ‘round”, maybe it’s best friends!

Time to Change?

If you are still using Windows 7 it is time to consider changing your PC. This month I was going to write about practical secure email solutions, but recently I've had quite a few customers who are having problems with their Windows 7 PCs – mainly due to age.

Windows life cycle – prior to Windows 10. Microsoft provided two levels of support for Windows 8 and earlier:

- Mainstream support – supports feature updates and fixes for security and non-security issues.
- Extended support – there no more feature updates and **only** security fixes are supported

When extended support ends your version of Windows becomes a security liability. You should no longer connect it to the Internet, or you may face serious security and privacy issues.

Notes: Windows XP, Vista and 8 are no longer supported and should not be connected to the internet. I've had to deal with serious security issues on unsupported Windows PCs. Windows 8 should be upgraded to Windows 8.1 (free).

Can I upgrade to Windows 10? Yes, if you want to pay \$200+ to upgrade the operating system, plus the time/cost of rebuilding your PC. Free upgrades from Windows 7 or 8.1 to Windows 10 ended on 29/7/2016.

If you are thinking of upgrading from Windows 7 you need to consider other factors. Windows 8 was released on 26/10/2012 so your Windows 7 PC is more than 6 years old. This means that the PC may be well under-powered compared to modern PCs. Also, an

Windows 7 support ends in January 2020 so it is time to think about changing your PC.

old PC is more likely to have a disc, screen or motherboard failure. A major failure of an old PC is uneconomic to repair, so the cost of your upgrade could be wasted. Note: Major failures are random, mainly due to age and manufacturing defects, not to usage. So, even if you do not use your PC often, it can still fail!

Rather than upgrade to Windows 10, seriously consider buying a new computer with Windows 10 already installed. PCs are getting much cheaper and more powerful every year. A good PC should last at least 6 years. Buy soon as prices are sure to rise when Christmas and the end of Windows 7 support are looming. Contact me for a PC purchase guide (free for existing customers).

Alternatively, if you're only a light PC user consider moving to a tablet – but there is a lot of learning involved.

Windows 10 Updates. The Windows 10 life cycle is different from earlier versions. There will be no Windows 11 etc. Instead new feature updates are released every six months targeted at March and September each year. The current release is 1809 (Sept 2018). It is wise to take the new release when it is released as I have dealt with serious update issues with PCs with old releases.

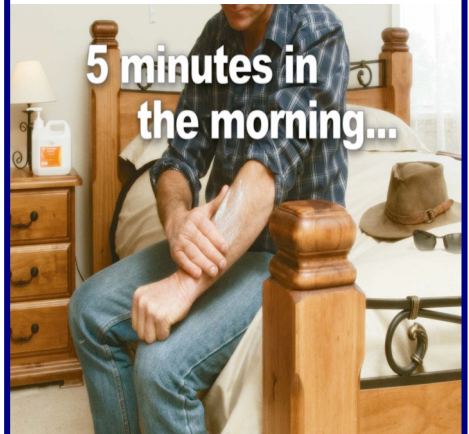

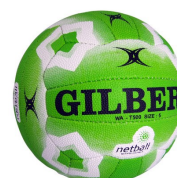

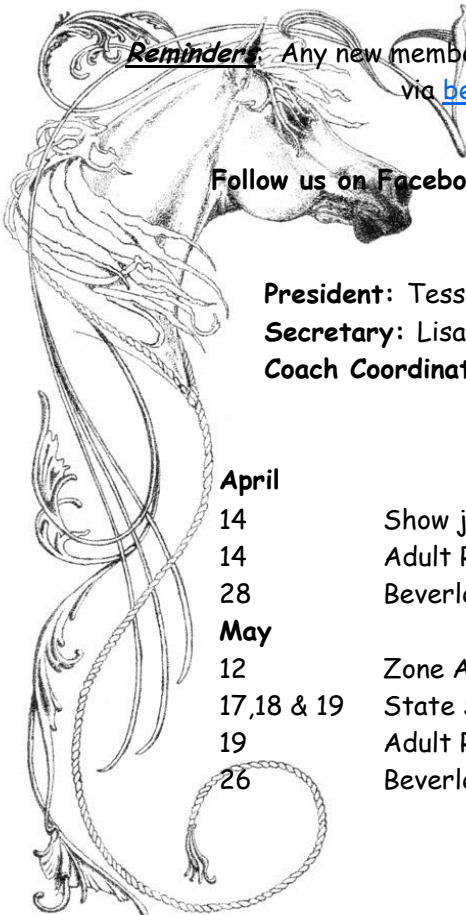
