#### SHIRE OF BEVERLEY **PRESIDENT REPORT - JUNE 2019**



#### Budget 2019-2020

Council and staff are well underway with the 2019/2020 budgetary process, recently reviewing fees and charges and the capital program.

#### Vincent Street Bridge Works

Works are progressing on the Vincent Street Bridge widening and from all accounts are on schedule. The new footpath is almost ready to be opened for pedestrians and looks like it's going to be a massive improvement from what everyone was using prior to the refurbishment.

#### Town Hall Kitchen Redevelopment

Town Hall Kitchen renovations have commenced. The hall is still available to hire without the kitchen

#### Roadworks

Conditions are very dry and while we are all desperately looking for rain the lack of it has seen the road crew and several contractors continue with programmed footpath and roadworks without delay. Reconstruction, widening and sealing has been completed on Morbinning Road between Aikin and East Lynne Roads with work currently underway on a 2km section near Athol Road. Footpath west of Hunt Road on Vincent Street has been renewed with concrete. Gravel sheeting has been completed on a 1km section of Rickeys road, 2km on Dale Bin North road and nearing completion on a section of Kokedin Road. A culvert on K1 Road damaged in the 2017 flood event has been replaced and the culvert in the gravel railway carpark has been repaired. Tree lopping under town powerlines and on several rural roads is due to commence. Hopefully good soaking opening rains are on the way soon.

#### Youth Activity Space

The Working Group has narrowed the location of a Youth Activity Space and Skate Park to two sites. Feedback has been sought from residents, community group users and businesses near those locations and will be reviewed by the group in early June. Following site selection and concept planning for what might be included the Working Group will make a recommendation for Councils consideration at hopefully the June Council meeting. Following Council endorsement a business case can be developed to support funding applications for the project.

#### Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network

Over the last 2 years significant work has been undertaken to identify priority routes and provide technical data in the preparation of a pre-feasibility business case and cost benefit analysis for a project known as the Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network. With the support of 42 Local Governments across the region this comprises 4400km of local government managed roads that connect with State and National highways and aims to provide safe and cost effective access for heavy vehicles into the region. The project group to date have been successful in receiving \$70m Federal funding for stage 1 priority works and \$100,000 State Royalties for Regions funding to engage a lead consultant project coordinator for the Project Management Team. The 42 Local Governments have been asked to make a 2019-2020 budget allocation of \$6,000 toward the project management pool of funds which the Shire of Beverley will be supportina.

#### Beverley Cornerstone Visitor Centre

I hope by now many local people have had a chance to pop into the Visitor Centre at the Cornerstone and have a look at the aeronautical exhibit and other interactive displays and information. Additional content will soon be added to the Aviation kiosk to include the Cornerstone building official opening and town flyover of the Silver Centenary.

#### Purple Bench

The Shire supported an approach by our local police to install a Purple Bench in the main street to raise awareness about the alarming issue of domestic and family violence. We might like to think these things don't happen in our community however it's not something people would like to go around talking about either. The Womens Domestic Violence helpline is available anyone requiring support or Ph 9223 1188 or 1800 007 339.

#### Spoilt for Choice?

Are we spoilt for choice in Beverley? The Station Arts have run some terrific entertainment programmes over the summer months with declining numbers supporting those events. The Beverley Mens Shed has been trialling showings of old fashioned favourites and special interest movies on the dual screens in the Cornerstone conference room and the CRC have shown some fabulous modern movies, once again not yet well supported. Perhaps the winter months might entice some more patrons?

The Shire of Beverley would like to remind all standpipe users of the impending substantial increase in charges for the Brooking Street and Balkuling Road Standpipes.

As previously advised, the Water Corporation is changing their pricing structure. The standpipes at Brooking Street and Balkuling Road will no longer be entitled to concessional pricing.

The new fee will be set at a cost recovery basis being \$8.35 per KL plus an administration fee of \$5.00 per issued invoice. The new fees will come into effect from 01 July 2019.

Pursuant to Clause 4(4) of Schedule 2, Part 2, Division 2 of the *Planning and Development* (*Local Planning Schemes*) *Regulations 2015*, notice is hereby given that Council, at its meeting of 30 April 2019 proceed with a Local Planning Policy – Relocated Second Hand Dwellings & Repurposed Dwellings.

The objectives of the Local Planning Policy – Relocated Second Hand Dwellings & Repurposed Dwellings are as follows:

- to align the policy with the Shire of Beverley Local Planning Scheme No. 3;
- to provide clear standards as to what constitutes an acceptable type of relocated second-hand dwelling or repurposed dwelling;
- to ensure the design, style & construction of relocated dwellings & repurposed dwellings are in keeping with the character of the surrounding dwellings in particular, and the locality in general.

Pursuant to Clause 4(1)(a) of Schedule 2, Part 2, Division 2 of the *Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015*, notice is hereby given of Council's intention to adopt a new Local Planning Policy – Short Term Accommodation.

The objectives of the Local Planning Policy – Short Term Accommodation are as follows:

- To encourage good quality, well managed short-term accommodation for use by visitors that does not compromise the amenity of residential areas or nearby residents.
- To provide guidance and development provisions for operators seeking to establish short term accommodation within the Shire of Beverley.
- To establish a clear framework for the assessment and determination of applications for short term accommodation.

Submissions are invited on the draft policy with all comments to be submitted to PO Box 20 Beverley WA 6304, within 21 days of the date of this notice.

#### **Portable Steam Engine**

One of the items in the collection at the Beverley Ag Museum is a Portable Steam Engine, kindly donated by Ray Owen's family from Pickering Brook.

Produced in 1911 by Clayton & Shuttleworth Ltd of England.

The latter years of its life being used at a Sawmill in the Pickering Brook area.

Although still a functioning unit, this item cannot be used today under WA safety conditions due to its riveted boiler, similar units with welded boilers can operate here in WA.

This steam operated engine was stationary and would have been hauled to the area of operation (Sawmill, Harvesting Paddock) by horses at the time, although a tow frame has been fitted for use with a vehicle.

Ray Owen worked for the Agriculture department many years from 1924 before entering the WA Parliament between 1944 and 1962 where he served in the Legislative Assembly.

Recently a descendant of his family, Stella, was a strong participant in the purchase of the Oaten Hay harvested last season the museum volunteer group. We pleased to say that our group is aiming to continue this service for the community later this year, given good weather conditions and crop yield.



# **Harvest Mass Management** Scheme 4 Step Guide

Follow these four steps to ensure you are ready for the 2019-20 HMMS harvest period:

#### Confirm RAV Network

 Transport operators and farmers needs to ensure all roads they use are approved for the particular RAV combination being used. This information is available on the RAV Mapping Tool. Roads endorsed under a HMMS Road List in 2018-19 will be approved if they meet the minimum safety standards. If the roads requested do not meet the minimum standards, the applicant will be contacted by Main Roads and advised accordingly.

#### New RAV Access is Required

 If additional roads are required, the transport operator or farmer needs to apply for new RAV access via the standard RAV application process. DO NOT submit a HMMS Road List to Main Roads. Further information and application form is available on the Road Access page of our website.

#### Register for **HMMS**

 The transport operator must register their vehicles with a registered Grain Receiver. They should also familairise themselves with the Business Rules available on the Harvest Mass Management Scheme page of our website.

#### Commence Operating

 Once the roads you require are all approved for the relevant RAV combination being used, your vehicles are registered with a Grain Receiver, and you are familiar with the Business Rules, you are ready to start carting for the harvest season.

#### Changes to the Scheme

- The 'first and last mile' special RAV access arrangements have been finalised.
- HMMS will continue, however will revert to its original intent as a mass management scheme.



#### **Access Update**

- 1053 roads were endorsed under HMMS Road Lists for the 2018-19 harvest period.
- Onsite assessments are underway with the intent to add these endorsed roads to the relevant RAV Networks prior to the upcoming harvest period.
- This eliminates the need for future special access arrangements under <u>HMMS</u>.



#### **Key Points**

- No changes to the HMMS mass provisions.
- Apply for new RAV access early, allowing up to 12 weeks.
- HMMS access is now via RAV Networks or Restricted Local Access Permits.

# Harvest Mass Management Scheme

What you need to know for 2019-2020 Harvest Period



#### Register for HMMS

- If you wish to participate in HMMS, continue to register your vehicles with a participating Grain Receiver.
- Familiarise yourself with the HMMS Business Rules, available on the Harvest Mass Management Scheme page of our website.
- DO NOT submit a HMMS Road List to Main Roads.



#### **New RAV Access**

 If there are additional roads you need, for an upcoming harvest period, which are not approved for RAV access and you did not apply for them under HMMS last season, you will need to apply to Main Roads to have the roads assessed via the standard RAV application process.



#### **RAV Access Options**

- Use a Category 1 RAV vehicle combination that is 20 m or less in length and 50 t or less in gross mass on any road.
- Use a RAV that is greater than a Category 1 RAV vehicle combination on approved RAV Network roads.

#### Alex Miles Lodge Gazebo Refurbishment

Funds received from the Shire of Beverley's Community Grant Program and the Beverley Hospital Auxiliary enabled the Beverley Frail Aged Lodge Committee to renovate the gazebo at Alex Miles Lodge, transforming it into an accessible and attractive feature for residents and their visitors to enjoy.

The gazebo was relocated from Beverley Hospital to the Alex Miles Lodge several years ago prior to commencement of hospital upgrade works. Its refurbishment has seen installation of concrete pathways, lighting and an impressive repaint which included maintenance work prior. 

### The Purple Bench Project

You may have noticed that the park bench on the Vincent St (near the gravel car park) has had a makeover and is now purple. The push to paint the bench purple, a colour associated worldwide with the domestic violence awareness movement, was led by Beverley Police Officer Karen Gubanyi with support from the Beverley CRC and the Shire of Beverley who approved the project and painted the bench. A special thanks to Dalene Davis (CRC committee) who also donated the paint.

Having previously worked in the area of family violence, Karen is passionate about educating and raising awareness in our community about family violence, a subject often swept under the carpet.

The Purple Bench initiative, founded in Canada in 2015, has made its way to WA, with the WA Women's Council for Domestic and Family Violence Services launching its own campaign. It is important that domestic and family violence is spoken about openly; especially as domestic violence rates are higher in rural and regional areas. It is definitely changing but there's still a lot of people that are too scared to come forward or might not realise that there is help out there.

How do purple benches make a difference?? Changing public perception of violence against women and children in particular requires a commitment from all levels of government and the community at large. The Purple Bench acts as a stark reminder that as a society we can make a difference, with both little and large steps. The presence of the Purple Bench in a location where events have been held to raise public awareness would provide the opportunity for this important issue to remain visible as well as providing a physical place to reflect about the important work achieved to date and how we can move over the next generations to bring an end to domestic and family violence.

The impact of domestic and family violence on women, men and families, needs to be understood across the community. Intimate partner violence is a leading contributor to illness, disability and premature death for women aged 18-44. To find out more, visit http://www.womenscouncil.com.au/

#### 25 Years of Local Radio

On 19 June, local community radio station 101.3fm Voice of the Avon celebrates a quarter century of broadcasting. Its focus is local towns and community organisations. 101.3fm enthusiastically supports local musicians and is a community news and events network.

Big celebrations are planned there for Sunday 23 June this year. A free concert, community information stalls, the Lions Food Truck, the Lions Miniature Train and more. 101.3fm relies entirely on community support from members, sponsors and donors to continue to broadcast the wide range of music and local community info.

This small, not-for-profit community station is fully staffed by volunteers and really growing. Voice of the Avon currently provides over 90 hours of live, local programs every week for the Central Wheatbelt and Avon Valley.

Three current presenters come from Beverley Shire as part of the 17-strong broadcast team from towns including Grass Valley, Northam, Kauring, York and Merredin. Training is more comprehensive now days and delivered by one of the two very experienced retired radio professionals who are station members

Not all of the 101.3fm members are presenters. Great volunteers maintain the gardens, arrange technical developments, plus building repairs and maintenance. And there are also non-broadcasting committee members who are essential to the organisation.

Originally on the AM band, the station now broadcasts FM, and also live-streams as "101.3fm Voice of the Avon". The name now more accurately reflects the far wider range of the community it now serves but the official call sign remains 6YCR.

All FM radio signals can be heard if listeners are within "line of sight" of the radio mast. 101.3FM's antenna is on Mt Bakewell and programs can be heard in locations from Wongan to Pingelly; from western Merredin to eastern edges of Mundaring; and from Toodyay to Quairading.

The radio station 101.3fm is still growing and supporting the Central Wheatbelt and Avon Valley. Everyone is warmly invited to the free Open Day Celebrations 23 June from 10.00am at 26 Barker St York.

# Beverley GARDEN AND TREE SOCIETY

After the meeting we visited two local gardens. Both were quite new and very different in design and scale. The weather was kind to us and it was a most enjoyable day.

The next meeting will be held on Tuesday 04 June and will be a trip to York to view two gardens and a talk by Sue Deadman on growing and showing roses. We will meet at the Dead Finish at 9.30am to car pool to York. Those who wish to may lunch in York.

It is now the beginning of winter and time to make sure your plants, gardens and lawn are ready for the colder temperatures on the horizon.

#### **Shrubs, Trees & Climbers**

- Trim trees and shrubs to allow sunlight to reach plants and lawn below
- Plant bare-rooted shrubs and trees
- ☑ For smaller gardens, the deciduous crab-apple and crepe myrtle trees can be planted now
- Add a layer of straw around the base of newly planted roses to protect the young stems against the cold.

#### **Bulbs, Perennials & Annuals**

- ☑ Plant lilium bulbs as directed and hippeastrum bulbs with the top of the bulb protruding from the soil
- ☑ Divide out daylilies and spread to other parts of the garden
- Prune back asangua camellias once the flowering has finished.

#### **Tubs & Containers**

Reduce the amount of water given to any indoor potted plants and move them away from heaters. Occasionally mist with water to maintain their humidity.


#### Lawns & Hedges

- It is now probably too late for fertilising your lawn or any plants that will go dormant over winter. Most plants are slowing down during winter and fertilising will just leach into the soil, wasting your budget and may pollute our fragile nature.
- ☐ Treat any weeds and pests to stop them from taking over during the colder weather
- ☑ Gather any fallen leaves and debris to allow sunlight to penetrate and to avoid disease caused by rotting vegetation







#### SCAM REPORT – the following extract was taken from the Scamwatch website:-Vulnerable consumers lose record amount to scammers

Australians who are older, Indigenous or have disability reported record losses in 2018 according to the ACCC's annual <u>Targeting Scams report</u> released this week.

Australians aged over 65 submitted over 26,400 reports to Scamwatch in 2018, with losses of over \$21.4 million. This represents an increase of five per cent in reports but 22 per cent in losses.

"Scammers will scour dating sites and social media for older Australians who have recently divorced or lost a long term partner, taking advantage of those who are inexperienced with these sites and may be in a vulnerable emotional state," ACCC Deputy Chair Delia Rickard said.

"Investment scams are the most financially harmful because the scammers invest time and money into convincing sales pitches, flashy websites and even glossy brochures."

Older Australians looking to grow their nest eggs but who instead get caught up in investment scams reported losses of \$7.6 million, and those misled through fake relationships reported losses of \$5.8 million to dating and romance scams.

"Scammers will start with a cold call to their victim promising low risk investments for high returns. They may spend months grooming their victims and once a victim invests, they're quickly convinced to put more and more money in. As soon as the victim tries to cash in on their investment, the scammer quickly disappears," Ms Rickard said.

Scamwatch received over 7800 reports from people with disability or who identified themselves as having a chronic illness with over \$8.7 million in losses. These Australians also reported higher losses per report to investment scams and dating and romance scams when compared with those that did not identify as having a disability or chronic illness.

Indigenous Australians also reported record losses in 2018. Scamwatch received 2434 scam reports from Indigenous people with losses exceeding \$3 million – a 79 per cent increase compared to 2017. Investment scams were the most financially harmful with \$1.1 million reported lost.

"The ACCC is committed to continuing our education and awareness efforts including our Indigenous outreach work and distribution of our Little Black Book of Scams. As vulnerable consumers can be difficult to reach through traditional channels we also encourage the wider community to assist in warning these consumers about scams." Ms Rickard said.

The ACCC encourages people to visit <u>www.scamwatch.gov.au</u> to report scams so we can warn others about them and learn more about what to do if they're targeted by scams.

#### **MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT**

There have been a series of motor vehicle thefts in the Wheatbelt recently so here are some points to ponder; with common sense and a few basic precautions, you can make car thieves' lives just a little bit harder.

You would think the safest place for your car would be at home, right? If it's locked up tight in the garage this may be the case, but if it's out on the street (or even in your driveway), think again.

According to recent figures by the Australian Bureau of Statistics, 58% of all car thefts occur either at the home or while your car is parked at someone else's house. And if personal items are going to be

stolen out of your vehicle, that's more likely to happen at your home as well (63% of all thefts from vehicles occur at the owner's home).

Over the past 20 years, Australia has featured on several official lists of 'worst countries in the world for police-recorded car thefts' but at least for the moment, we've managed to slip out of the top ten (currently, the top 5 nations for car theft are (1) USA, (2) UK, (3) France, (4) Italy and (5) Canada. But there is certainly no room for complacency, because car theft is here to stay.

Do your research on the most effective methods of car theft prevention and then make the choices you feel are right for you. If you've got a garage, keep your car there when you're at home.

How to protect yourself from car theft:-

- 1. Never leave valuables in plain view in an unattended car it's an open invitation to thieves.
- 2. There are a number of things you can do to reduce the risk of your car being stolen.
- 3. When you leave your vehicle, close all the windows, lock the car and take the keys with you.
- 4. Never leave valuables in plain view in an unattended car it's an open invitation to thieves.
- 5. Park your car in well-lit areas whenever possible.
- 6. Turn your wheels toward the curb to make it harder for your car to be towed by a thief.
- 7. If you're parked in your own garage, lock the car (and close the windows) and lock up the garage
- 8. Make sure garage windows are secured too.
- 9. If your car has an alarm or other theft prevention device, make sure you use it even at home.
- 10. You may want to use more than one anti-theft device for even more protection.

If circumstances require leaving your car unattended for an extended period of time, consider disabling it by removing the rotor, distributor, electronic ignition fuse or other crucial part (but make sure you know what you're doing!).

Don't think that just because you drive an old car, you're somehow immune from theft. In fact, older cars are often easier for thieves to steal because they lack immobilisers. However, they can still be profitable when sold for parts. And speaking of parts, it doesn't hurt to engrave major parts and pricey accessories with a personal ID number or VIN. You can even have the VIN etched on your windows.

Several anti-theft options are available. Steering wheel locks, ignition kill switches, floorboard locks (that disable the floor pedals), gearshift locks (that prevent shifting of the transmission) and wheel locks all deter would-be thieves. Vehicle tracking devices are becoming more popular these days. These can be activated when your car is stolen to aid police in quickly tracking its location.

You can also buy locks that prevent criminals from accessing your steering column or raising your car's bonnet. Vehicle tracking devices are becoming more popular these days too, and can be activated when your car is stolen to aid police in quickly tracking its location.

One thing you might not appreciate about Australian car thieves is just how loyal they are to our own home-grown brands. Year after year, Holden Commodores make the list of Top 5 Stolen Cars in Australia – often more than once, depending on the model.

He sold his two works that he exhibited at Easter to the Steve and Geena at the Freemason's Tavern as well as being commissioned to paint an historical picture of the old hotel so one could say he has left his mark on the town. And so now we welcome two artists from the Eastern States -Catherine Fitz-Gerald and Ursula Kiessling who held an exhibition for the Adelaide Fringe '2019 Water Ways'. Catherine approached me via Honey Pot at Adelaide Fringe hoping for a residency placement in the west. Both she and Ursula come highly qualified:

Ursula Kiessling has painted all her life, and exhibited many times in her native Germany before immigrating to Australia in 1983 with husband, three children and parents. She began slowly to take in this new and beautiful country and her first

solo exhibition in 1990 in the Adelaide Botanic Gardens was a sell-out.

She has continued to successfully show her work in many galleries throughout Australia, including the Australian Naïve and North Shore Galleries in Sydney and White Patch Gallery in Brisbane.

Travelling and camping throughout the outback has proved a constant source of inspiration. Her sophisticated, lyrical, naive artworks have been accepted into the Waterhouse Natural History Prize six times, as well as being a multiple finalist at the Heysen Prize and the Whyalla Art Prize.

Last year, Ursula and friends fitted out an old school bus to be a rolling art gallery and during the Fringe they took it all over South Australia - with much acclaim from the public - during SALA it was stationed at Victoria Square in the city of Adelaide.

In 2018 her work returned to Europe as one of thirty invited artists showcasing Australian Naïve Art at the renowned international Art Naif Festival in Katowice, Poland.

Catherine Fitz-Gerald's art explores the different ways light and colour reveal form and expose the essence of a subject through the prism of experience, memory and time. Her work investigates emerging science on how light, colour and place can affect our brains beyond regular colour vision through non image forming pathways. Spending time in 'blue space' is proven to improve creative decision making and change our brainwaves significantly.

Transparency, opacity, tone and colour are used to form shape and depth. Images are built out of simple elements, focusing on creating a rhythmic dynamic between colour intensity and retreating or advancing hues. The abstraction that results from this process does not intend to dispense with a recognisable subject, but to create works which explore slices of light and colour while still bearing a relationship to the original object.

#### WORKSHOPS

Catherine and Ursula understand that sometimes numbers are difficult to determine and are happy for the whole thing to be as casual and useful as our community would like. Here are some options being offered by them:

- 1) Are you stuck on a personal project and want some help? Join us for a painting session and bring your work for constructive suggestions. Free
- 2) Lyrical realism with a naive twist. Join Ursula Kiessling in exploring a new way to look at the world. Acrylics (A small fee would need to be charged to cover materials)
- 3) Have you always wanted to explore colour and oil painting? Oils with palette knife or brush. (A small fee would need to be charged to cover materials)
- 4) Rainsticks an exploration with found materials for children. (Maybe a small fee, could be free if children brought some items to be recycled from home)

5) Planning to study art in Year 12? Come and see us for a chat, or join us for an informal painting session. We don't bite!





# Beverley Voluntary Community Services (BVCS)

General information and matters dealt with on community issues.

- 1. Will and Enduring Power of Attorney (EPA)
  - a. For Wills, the Testators signature can be witnessed by any two independent witnesses
  - b. For EPA, the donor's signature must be witnessed by at least one qualified witness, such as Justice of the Peace, and the second witness can be any independent person. The donee's signature need not be witnessed.
  - c. Where the donee is the person accepting to act as Attorney (usually when the donor can't manage their own affairs).
  - d. When in doubt new EPA and Wills, always seek legal advice. In life these are the two most important documents
  - e. If one has any health impairment that may affect their capacity (medical) to sign legal documents, please seek a medical report from your GP to avoid any doubt as to legal capacity.
  - f. Phoning tax office. They now work on voice ID only. After speaking to ATO, get their reference number.
  - g. When speaking to law firms, insurance and superannuation firms, get names and reference numbers, and email confirmation.
- 2. Dog Owners. Make yourselves familiar with the dog act as to your rights and responsibilities. In the event that your pet dog is accused of biting a person or another dog, and is accused of being a vicious dog under the dog act, the evidence must be produced. Witness statements and photos must support the accusations. A recent case sited where a pet dog was impounded but the ranger, and would be destroyed on the seventh day. Mal Roberts was made aware of this matter on day six, looking further into this matter. It was revealed that the neighbour had made a complaint that their dog had been bitten by the dog next door. In questioning, it was found that the dog was impounded by another ranger in Northam. She has now taken over as secretary and writer for Mal Roberts.
- 4. It should be understood that our services and main role in the community is to help, support and seek justice for the needy and not so fortunate in our community. This is irrespective of the person's status. Our role is not to judge others. For disputes, seek legal advice. When we speak for each other we do so in their presence and with their authority. Especially when we deal with class action lawyers.
- 5. Justice of the Peace work. Mal Roberts witnesses and identifies/certifies a large number of legal documents. Please note we do not provide legal advice.

# **Spam Email Analysis**

I was fortunate to receive a Spam email recently. Why fortunate!? The email was no threat to me (or anyone else) so I was able to analyse the content and, more importantly, the mail header. A similar email was received by my wife and has been received by several of my clients (both male and female). More recently I received a another similar empty threat but with very bad English.

What is the mail header? Every email has a header that has detailed information showing where it has come from and is going to, where it has been forwarded on the way, plus security information about the email. This header either is not accessible or difficult to access on phones, tablets and online mail services. However, it is available if you are using Microsoft Outlook or other sophisticated mail programs on your PC.

What's the threat? None! The email shows that it has been sent from your own personal email address to yourself - which is not true. Based on this the criminal claims that they:

- Have full access to your email account 1.
- 2. Have infected you with a Remote Administration Tool, a few months back when you visited an infected website
- 3. Have since then has been observing your actions.
- 4. Have full access to your system and see everything you do
- Can turn on camera and microphone without you noticing
- Have made a video showing both you (through your webcam) and the video you were watching (on the screen)
- 7. Can access your contacts, to send the video to your contacts.
- 8. Will send the video unless you pay \$900 in Bitcoins, in 8 days.
- Will know you have paid and delete the video

None of the above is true, as I will explain below.

# How do I know it is spam and not true? I can see this based on the headers and my knowledge of PCs:

- They have sent the spam email to my email server using my email address as the sender. To do this It is not necessary for the criminal to access my email account.
- Often people will find a Remote Administration Tool (RAT) on their PC but I have tight security and I know there is no RAT

# Windows 10 Update Released

The May 2019 Windows 10 update has been released. It will update directly from both Versions 1803 and 1809

- on my PC. I am also cautious about sites that I visit.
- Not possible to observe my actions without the RAT!
- Not possible to have full access without the RAT!
- My camera and microphone are permanently disabled which cannot be changed without my authority. I use a phone or tablet for video/voice communication - not my PC.
- No Video can be recorded without a camera, microphone and remote control - none of this is available
- 7. Not possible to access contacts without the RAT!
- Using the payment method defined in the spam email the criminal would not know who sent the payment
- Without the payment knowledge or the RAT, the criminal would not know which of the "clients" has paid or not.

The only RAT is the criminal sending the email! - and none of my contacts have received a video!!!

How does this work? The criminal carefully crafts an email that will pass the email spam tests, buys a bunch of email addresses (thousands) and sends out an automated email to each one, probably spaced out to avoid having them marked as spam - then waits for the money to roll in from frightened punters.

This scam is a fairly safe and lucrative criminal occupation with very little effort and risk. To go through the process described in the email is risky and requires a lot of effort and knowledge to break through the security on PCs.

How does the email pass the scam tests on the email server? The email server uses several tests to determine whether each email is spam or not, then gives a score. This carefully crafted email scored 4.7 out of 5 therefore passed the test.

# How do I avoid this and similar scams?

- Never respond to scams
- Have good virus protection on your PC
- Scan regularly for viruses on your PC.
- Avoid potentially dangerous sites



# Warrior Wellbeing Article Situational Distress What is it?

For our small team community educators working in the field of men's health and wellbeing, we are always challenged on what is classified as a mental illness. We realize there is a small percentage of the population who have a genetic mental predisposition. Situational Distress however describes a stage in our mental health and wellbeing that gives us permission to be in a space between being well and being diagnosed with а mental illness. The adoption of this language resonates with blokes and community and fosters change to take personal responsibility for our wellbeing and health.

Our Mental Health and Gauge Wellbeing (below) shows the space (amber) that there is between being well and a mental illness diagnosis. This is a very important space, because quite often the system wants to shift us from being well straight to a mental illness diagnosis. As individuals we are born with a random capacity to handle things thrown at us in life, these situational factors can come from many places i.e. relationships, financial worries, traumatic events. physical health, pressures of what we do etc. We know that our mental health and wellbeing is a continuum and the gauge can trip from being well (green) to situational distress (amber) and to a mental illness diagnosis and back.



# Warrior Wellbeing Article Situational Distress What is it?

Continued.....

We say all of us will spend some time in the amber through our life (daily, yearly etc) but very few of us will end up in the red zone. The only way we get to the red zone is by being born with a mental illness (a very small percentage of the population) and/or spending too much time in the amber area (this will vary for all of us based on our individual capacity).

We must allow people to have a normal reaction to an adverse/abnormal life event (situational distress). If we recognize and acknowledge the issues causing distress and take steps to address the problems, we will then be able to back up out of the amber zone and back into the green zone.

We focus on the slogan ...before it all gets too much— Talk to a Mate. If mates and family members don't ask, it is difficult, even impossible, to ascertain that someone is struggling. Additionally, if issues are left unresolved (too much time is spent in the amber zone) a mental illness diagnosis and/or suicidal thinking can occur.




### **OVERSEAS SHOE BOXES PROJECT**
