SHIRE OF BEVERLEY **PRESIDENT REPORT - JULY 2019**



Youth Activity Space

Following a review of potential locations for a Youth Activity Space in the town site and community consultation during April and May regarding development of the proposed facility, feedback was sought from all who may be affected by its installation at locations identified as suitable. The Youth Precinct Working Group subsequently made a recommendation to Council for the Vincent Street location to be used. The Working Group has been supported by Skate Sculpture who was engaged by Council to assist with development and implementation of the project. The next community engagement to discuss layout and elements for inclusion will be held on-site Saturday 06 July from 8.30am -11.30am as a drop in presentation for people to come and go at their convenience. Councillor Information Sessions Thursday 25 July 2019

Local Government elections are held every two years with the next elections on Saturday 19 October 2019. There are four Shire of Beverley Councillor terms expiring this year, including my own which I will not be renominating for. The Shire will be holding two information sessions at the Administration Centre on Thursday 25 July from 2.30pm - 4.00pm or the evening session held at 6.00pm - 7.30pm for potential candidates seeking more information. Councillors and Staff will also be available at the Beverley Agricultural Show.

Outside Works

Gravel re-sheeting on sections of Dale Bin North Road and Kokendin Road has been completed and work on a 2 km section of Yenyening Lake road has commenced weather permitting. The 2km section of Morbinning road near Athol road was sealed at the end of May. Various bridges around the shire have been inspected and treated for any termite infestations. The old footpath from Bartram Street to the Vincent Street bridge has been replaced. The annual verge collection required almost 3 days to clear the rubbish and green waste.

Vincent St-Streetscape Project

Work continues to prepare information, identify costings and seek support toward the Vincent Street urban design proposal in preparation for funding applications for the project. Most recently this has included a cost benefit analysis, appointing consultants for underground power design, seeking local business support and meeting with RDA Wheatbelt.

Town Hall Stage Curtains

Council has supported an upgrade of the Town Hall Stage Curtains. Following a site inspection measure of the existing curtains, replacement of the tracking system has also been recommended.

Shire Stand at Beverley Agricultural Show-Saturday 24 August 2019

The Shire will have a marquee at this year's Agricultural Show with an array of information including the forthcoming local government elections and various projects in the planning. Councillors and Staff will be in attendance throughout the day and look forward to you popping in for a chat and to view what's on display.

Shire Office Renovations

Renovation in the Shire Administration Building has recently been completed. A ceiling installed in the front admin area is already improving efficiency of heating and cooling compared to the prior vaulted ceiling space. The former library now contains a larger office for the Shire Planner. an office for the Shire President, and a small conference/meeting area which I'm sure will be particularly appreciated by those seeking planning and building assistance from staff in a less public location than the front counter.

Road Safety Council Survey

As previously advised, the Water Corporation is changing their pricing structure. The standpipes at Brooking Street and Balkuling Road will no longer be entitled to concessional pricing.





Dung-nammit!



Dung beetle, Copris hispanus

To control bush flies (*Musca vetustissima*), the introduction of dung beetles to Australia has been necessary, as the native dung beetles are inefficient at breaking up the large dung pads of introduced cattle. Twelve species of introduced dung beetles have established in Western Australia, with 10 doing well in the South-West. Eight are widespread:

- Onthophagus taurus, Onitis
 aygulus, Euoniticellus pallipes and Bubas
 bison can be found across much of the SouthWest.
- Onthophagus binodis and Euoniticellus fulvus are throughout the lower South-West coastal district
- Onitis alexis and Euoniticellus intermedius are in the region extending north of Perth and beyond Geraldton.

In the South-West native beetles are active during winter, whereas the flies that breed in dung are active during summer. Nevertheless, there is still a period during spring and early summer in some years when bush flies cause annoyance.

Beetle categories and species differences.

Dung beetles broadly fall into two categories summer-active and winter-active, while different species of beetles use dung in different ways. Most species excavate tunnels in the soil under or next to the dung pad. They carry the dung down into the tunnels and fashion it into balls in which the females lay their eggs.

Other beetles carve a mass out of the dung and move it some distance from the pad before burying it. Some species simply butt the mass across the ground. Others knead pieces of dung into smoothly-rounded balls and roll them for many metres before burying them. Egg laying subsequently takes place in the soil chamber where the ball has been buried.

At some times of the year some species of beetles shred the dung instead of burying it. This process is still effective in controlling flies.





Ever seen or heard the RAC Rescue Chopper in Beverley?



Emergency Rescue Helicopter Service, known as RAC Rescue, provides two dedicated emergency rescue helicopters serving Western Australia. St John Ambulance supports the role of RAC Rescue by providing critical care paramedics on board and fieldina emergency calls through the State Operations Centre. The St John Ambulance critical care paramedics are highly skilled and trained in intensive care and aeromedical medicine. They

essential role in ensuring patients receive immediate medical attention while being transported to hospital via the helicopter.

With the introduction of a second rescue helicopter in February 2016, to be based out of Bunbury, the two helicopters now have a radius of more than 250km and cover approximately 95 per cent of Western Australia's population. The Emergency Rescue Helicopter service provides emergency rescues for incidents including car accidents, cliff rescues, mining and farming accidents. It transfers critically injured patients from regional centres and is involved in search and rescue missions. The Emergency Rescue Helicopter is managed by the Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) and funded by the State Government, and the RAC, which has sponsored the rescue helicopter service since it was introduced in 2003.

Community Defibrillators – Maintenance Fundraiser

The Beverley Community is extremely fortunate with the number of defibrillators available within our town. There is upkeep and maintenance required on these machines in particular battery replacements. We are currently doing a fundraising drive asking for donations to put towards the defibrillator maintenance. Donation tins are available at the Chemist, Post Office and Beverley Country Kitchen.

July Gardening Tips

July sees us well and truly in the midst of the cooler months but that means it is also a great opportunity to tackles some of those jobs the hotter temperatures make difficult – or just plain uncomfortable. If you're planning on creating a new path, digging a pond or building a new veggie garden, now is the time to get into it. You'll build up a sweat but it won't be as bad as trying to get it done while it's hot.

Weed Control

- ⇒ Keep on top of weeds in both lawns and gardens area by manually pulling out any that grow through the mulch or lawn.
- ⇒ If you haven't mulched your garden bed any time is a good time to mulch your garden beds

Shrubs, Trees & Climbers

- ⇒ Prune any deciduous trees and shrubs
- ⇒ Plant roses and follow up with a spray of Lime Sulphur
- ⇒ Take Frangipani cuttings and leave them to dry

Bulbs, Perennials & Annuals

- Sow seeds of Alyssum, Dianthus, Delphinium, Statice
- ⇒ Plant Amaryllis, Tuberoses and Waterlilies

Edible Gardens

- Fertilise winter growing vegetables with a general purpose fertiliser
- ⇒ Plant Rhubarb crowns, Raspberry canes, Kohlrabi and Silverbeet
- ⇒ Turn in green manure to any vegetable gardens you are getting ready for spring planting

Winter Lawn Care

- ⇒ Treat any weeds and pests to stop them from taking over during the colder weather
- Rake up any leaves and have the kids run around to collect any twigs, sticks and other debris that can block sunlight
- ⇒ Raise the mowing height on your mower to allow for more photosynthesis.

Warrior Wellbeing Article To Snip or Not to Snip?

When we as blokes, arrive at the decision with our partners that the pitter-patter of tiny feet, 2am feeds and toxic nappies are not on the agenda anymore, then some form of permanent contraception is one possible pathway. There are options for the ladies in our lives, but those options can involve major surgery and unwanted side effects. The male version in terms of permanent surgical sterilization is the vasectomy and by comparison it's minor surgery with little to no side effects.

The first question is, what exactly is a vasectomy? Quite simply it is the cutting and sealing of the tubes (vas deferens) that carries sperm from the testes to the penis. It's usually done under local anaesthetic via a very small incision on each side of the scrotum, and despite "The Snip" being the slang term, it doesn't usually involve scissors.

The most important question in many bloke's minds is, "does it hurt?" and we're well within our rights to ask this. We've already spent a lifetime keeping our crown jewels out of harm's way and on the odd occasion that we haven't, well, it hasn't and slight discomfort over the first couple of days is normal but not debilitating. A warning to my three-year-old daughter not to jump off the end of the lounge into my lap four hours after surgery would have been useful in hindsight and I definitely wouldn't suggest riding your bike home after the op!

An important point to keep in mind, is the fact that the sperm already in your reproductive system will remain viable little swimmers for up to 3 months or until "the pipes are clear". It's not uncommon for

couples to fall pregnant in the immediately following a vasectomy, an irony not immediately all that humorous to those affected.

A lot of guys worry that it will affect their experience of sex however this typically isn't the outwardly there is no as visible difference to ejaculate nor usually any change to sensation. The vasectomy in no way interferes with erectile function nor with orgasm which no doubt relief those considering to the procedure.







Backups and Archives

Why are backups and archives important? If your PC disc fails or you have a serious virus attack, then you can lose all your files. Having all your information copied into backups and archives will allow you to retrieve all your You should keep at least two copies of your archives on information. 




pressure from Storm's attack, making some incredible saves as our last line of defence. Carissa was strong over the ball a great game – even though she was playing with her minkey stick!
