## SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT REPORT - AUGUST 2019



**Budget** Council adopted the 2019/2020 Budget at the July Council Meeting, again supporting a 2.5% overall increase in rate revenue. It is becoming increasingly difficult to retain this modest increase amid ongoing cost pressures for Local Government. The budgetary process has been underway since February including road inspection, periodical meetings of Council Committees to determine the Capital program, review of services, facilities, fees and charges and final deliberation which required significant changes to proposed projects and capital works to achieve a balanced budget. The 2019/2020 Budget is available on the Shire website (www.beverley.wa.gov.au) or from the Shire office.

Rate Notices Rate notices will be received soon, if not already. A 10% discount for rates paid in full by the due date of 2 September 2019 has again been offered. An instalment plan is available but is ineligible for the 10% discount and instalments unpaid by due dates incur penalty interest. Please note that the percentage increase in total rate revenue of 2.5% may not translate to the same percentage increase for individual properties due to changes in UV and GRV valuations by the Valuer General, land amalgamations and subdivisions.

#### **Shire Stand at the Beverley Agricultural Show**

The Shire will have a stand at this year's show where Councillors and staff will be in attendance throughout the day. An array of information will be available including plans for future projects such as the proposed Youth Activity Precinct. We look forward to seeing you there.

#### **Local Government Elections 19 October 2019**

Changes to the Local Government Act require candidates intending to nominate in Local Government elections to participate in an online induction then undertake compulsory training in the first 12 months of office should they be elected. As yet no information has been provided by the Department of Local Government about online induction. Hopefully potential candidates are not deterred from nominating. It is an opportunity to gain understanding of what is required and be confident that base level training modules will prepare successful candidates for the important role they have just been elected into on behalf of their community. Unlike State Government, elected members may straight away be making planning and financial decisions on behalf of their communities which can be somewhat daunting as was the case when I first commenced. At our first Council meeting decisions were being made regarding building a new house for the pool manager.

Youth Activity Area Update The Youth Activity Area project is included in the 2019/2020 budget for an estimated cost of \$650,000. The Shire will be seeking external funding toward implementation. Thanks must go to the Working Group which included Councillors, Community members and staff, for their commitment, investigation and feedback regarding this long awaited project. Thankyou to the many participants, young and young at heart, involved in the extensive community consultation. A Concept Plan is available for viewing at the Shire Office or website.

Ag Museum Steering Committee A Museum Steering Committee has been formalised to development, progress promotion and progress development, promotion and operational functions of the Agricultural Museum at Avondale. The Shire took over the Collection from the Agriculture Department on behalf of the community when management of the property was transferred in 2009 to National Trust WA. The museum continued to be overseen by the Avondale Farm Project Association however this organisation has now been wound up and funds transferred to the Shire for the purpose of museum development.

Town Hall Kitchen Refurbishment The Town Hall kitchen refurbishment is due for completion by the end of August and it's looking great. A new fee was introduced in the 2019/2020 Fees and Charges for hire of the whole complex over 3 days for events such as weddings and large functions. The Shire is planning to market the facility and what our town has to offer.

**Grass Tree Replacement at Cornerstone** Four dead grass trees at the Cornerstone building are due to be replaced by the Landscaping Contractor and the Shire.

Western Power Drone Trials The Northam and Geraldton regions have been chosen by Western Power for a trial using drones as a new way of inspecting the network to speed up the process of locating faults and reducing outages. The trial is expected to run from July to December 2019.

<u>Destination WA</u> Destination WA on Sunday 14 July including segments on Beverley and York as the presenters commenced a journey of the Avon Valley. Well worth a look if you haven't seen it yet. **youtu.be/J3TY5AN2n-Y**

In accordance with the Local Government Act 1995 (and regulations), an Ordinary Election is held every two years on the third Saturday in October.

#### **Eligibility to Enrol and Vote**

You are eligible to enrol if you are:

- 18 years of age or older;
- $\Rightarrow$ An Australian Citizen;
- Correctly enrolled on a State or Commonwealth electoral roll; and
- A resident or a non-resident owner of rateable property or land within the Shire of Beverley.

The Committee have been inundated with lots of enquiries for research lately and we are hoping the Beverley Community maybe able to help with the following three.



STANDPIPE FEE INCREASES

The Shire of Beverley would like to remind all standpipe users of the impending substantial increase in charges for the Brooking Street and Balkuling Road Standpipes.

As previously advised, the Water Corporation is changing their pricing structure. The standpipes at Brooking Street and Balkuling Road will no longer be entitled to concessional pricing.

The new fee will be set at a cost recovery basis being \$8.35 per KL plus an administration fee of \$5.00 per issued invoice. The new fees will come into effect from 01 July 2019.



Over the last month Mr Mal Roberts has witnessed wills. A will prepared by a lawyer/trustees can cost around \$700. So please check first, with legal centres or community advice bureaus. Referencing support letters, for a parole hearing. Witness to letters of support, for other witness's statuary declaration, affidavit. Advice on Centrelink matters. Referral to Share-Care. Witnessing enduring power attorneys (seek legal advice). Mal Roberts does not give legal advice. Please note that Doctor Remy has offered Mal an office, at the Medical Centre. It is convenient for people with medical problems and wheelchairs. The town hall office will still be used for families, eq. Enduring power of attorney's wills and immigration. Witnessing a large number of documents. Mal Roberts also provides home visits for people in wheel chairs or frail aged and mobility needs. People who are vision impaired or hearing impaired. It is advisable, when having documents attested. Please seek a doctor as the first witness, and a Justice of the Peace as the second. Please note the office (Mal's) is not available for photo copying or secretary work. Please use the services of the CRC, which we have been using for 15 years, for both B.V.C.S and CRANA Aboriginal Corp Inc. Needy cases those in urgent need facing financial difficulties or renting problems, please contact Share-Care, Homeswest (Centrelink recipients). Mal Roberts will provide covering letters and referrals to the doctor for medical certificates to qualify for emergency rentals and other facing hardship.

#### Class Action Lawyers:

Mal Roberts has regular phone contacts, under authority as to Royal Commission Matters. Such matters are now progressing in the high court. Currently one case will be finalised in August 2019.

Hon. Christian Porter. Attorney General and member for Pearce. Mal Roberts met Mr Porter some 6 years ago, when he came to Beverley. Since then his office has helped many Beverley residents, on a wide range of issues under referral, by Mal Roberts.

#### Parole and Parole Boards:

Check with your lawyer and parole board for dates, times and character references, if needed by whom.

#### Dental facilities (serious problems)

We have had several enquiries from very concerned residents as to the high cost of dental fees which most pensioners and low income residents cannot afford. Some twenty years ago, Mal Roberts wrote to Tony Abbott M.P, Ministers of Health, State and Federal. Also Judy Moylan, former member for Pearce. This resulted in dental services returning for a few years.

#### Justice of Peace

Certifying Identity Documents. Recently I notice photo copies of driver's licenses, passports. Strict regulations on all ID documents must be clear, legible and good quality. I suggest you use the CRC for quality photocopying.

#### Superannuation:

New Regulations come into effect from 07 July 2019. These are legal requirements so please contact Super companies and the ATO information supplied on all TV channels. Re. Management fees, how much insurance plus cover and type.

#### Prisons:

For eight years Mal Roberts has been helping families seek justice for some cases in prison. They are entitled to a case manager, legal aid, visitation rights and also seek transfer to another prison. Also community work, and to apply for education courses (for good behaviour). Please note B.V.C.S does not offer transport or legal advice.








## Playgroup FUN!



Avondale Farm, a place of learning from the land.

For thousands of years this has been an important place for the Ballardong Noongar people, their customs and culture nurturing the land between two rivers which gave fresh water and food and a connection to Country that remains today. Chosen in 1836 by James Stirling, the first governor of the Swan River Colony and farmed by settlers until bought by the Government in 1910, Avondale Farm became new farms and hope for soldier-settlers after WW1.

1924 saw the farm become an agricultural research station, the innovations and trials undertaken here making a major contribution to Wheatbelt farming and landcare practice throughout the twentieth century.

In 2009 Avondale Farm was transferred to the National Trust of Western Australia by the Department of Agriculture. We continue to explore sustainable ways of caring for this fertile yet fragile landscape and learning from the land.



# European wasp season closes on a high









It has been another record-breaking season with 166 European wasp nests found and destroyed in Western Australia, all in metropolitan Perth.

Wasps discovered in Department surveillance traps, scattered around freight and transport hubs, led to the quick discovery and destruction of nests. But the real battle raged in the Perth Hills. To assist, Shires and other State Departments trapped, the community reported, and our operations staff traversed bushland and private property across the Darling Scarp to find the hidden underground nests, each with entrance holes only the size of a 20 cent coin!

On the front-foot from last season's surveillance and communication efforts, we knew where most of the action would be and the community quickly told us where else we needed to look.

Reports came in thick and fast - wasps stripping meat from discarded crab carcasses, scavenging food from picnics, and invading backyard breakfast tables. Nests were reported in retaining walls, school grounds, road verges, dam walls and adjacent to driveways. Thankfully, no confirmed reports came from outside the Perth Metro this season, but the risk remains and there are fewer people to keep a lookout in regional areas.

European wasps, like fire ants and exotic stinkbugs are difficult to find, survive well in most environments and spread rapidly. Early detection is paramount, and often the only way to achieve localised eradication.

Come Summer, when wasp activity starts up again, we will know how WA's efforts this season paid off. For now, THANK YOU to all who looked, reported and spread the word!







August means that winter is almost over and now it's all about getting ready for spring.

There are plenty of tasks to keep you busy throughout August so that you're prepared for the full showing of September onwards.

### **Gardening tasks**

Prune any dormant plants, especially rose

bushes if you haven't already done so - always prune at a 45 degree angle to help the plant heal better while also limiting the risk of pests and disease taking hold

- · Wait for the end of August or early September to start applying a slow release fertiliser to all of your plants
- · Apply a healthy layer of mulch to lock in as much moisture as possible. Aim for layer of 5 to 10 cm
- · Start planting spring fruits and vegetables, such as; spring onions, leeks, peas, lettuce and strawberries
- · Plant tomato seeds in trays but keep undercover for now to protect them from frost
- · Start planting annuals such as Petunias, Marigolds, and Vincas

During August, most nurseries will be stocking up with a wide range of annuals for the spring season, so go in and have a look at what's on offer





# Warrior Wellbeing Article TAKING THE STRESS OUT OF BEING A STEPDAD

Walking the tightrope of being a stepdad can be a particularly stressful time for many blokes and this added situational distress, that some blokes sometimes find themselves in, can be both challenging and take time to resolve. Remember all relationships are a work in progress.

Quite often, we may still be dealing with the scars of a past relationship breakdown whilst forging a new bond with our new partner. The confusion over the new role can be self-defeating not only to the marriage but to the relationship with the new kids. It's not only Dad trying to cope with a new role, but Mum and the kids are trying to find their feet in a changing landscape as well.

Here are some tips to hopefully help smooth the ride:

- -Whilst you may already be a father, don't assume that this role will be the same with your step kids. Approach step fatherhood as more of a mentorship role. You will be a protector, a role-model and a significant influencer as they grow. These kids will almost certainly have an instinctive love and affinity to their natural father, so attempting to take that from them can only be counterproductive.
- -Encourage their relationship with their biological father (unless this is counter to their safety or wellbeing). One of the worst things you can do is constantly make snide remarks about the "ex". All that this achieves, is that it teaches your kids to weaponize relationships. If your opinion or sentiment towards the "ex" is poor, keep it to yourself!
- -Don't be forced into the role of being the sole disciplinarian. This can be hard, as it is quite often expected of the father. The problem is, that you haven't been there from day one, so therefore the relationships and rapport that you may already have with your own kids just hasn't had time to develop. Discipline should come from the

biological parent with you in a supporting role, at least initially.

- -Just be a great partner. Kids are intuitive, and if they witness a loving, supportive bloke who genuinely cares for their mother, the love and respect that you're yearning from your step-kids should hopefully follow.
- -Speak with other stepdads about their experiences and what has worked for them. You are not on your own and a wealth of experience waits for those willing to ask.
- -The new role can't be rushed. To expect to immediately have the sort of relationship that you may already have with your own kids is wishful thinking. Listen attentively, be sensitive to how they are feeling and build trust.

From my personal experience, being a stepdad can be challenging at times but on the flip side, it's immensely rewarding. The trick is (like with anything worthwhile) to realise it's going to take time. All children no matter their age require and seek the approval of a father, stepdad and/or male mentor in their life. Remember, anyone can father a baby, but it takes a special bloke to raise a child!






