Local Government Elections 19 October 2019

All intending candidates for the forthcoming local government elections are required to undertake Local Government Candidate Induction online through the Department of Local Government, Sport and Communities website. Nomination information packs are available from the shire office. Nominations open on Thursday 05 September and close at 4pm on Thursday 12 September.

Town Hall upgrades

Stage Curtains have been installed and tracking replaced at the town hall. They look amazing and Beverley Amateur Dramatics' Bruce Denny and Mark Kont provided glowing endorsement about ease and quietness of operation. The kitchen refurbishment has been completed, transforming it into a compliant and modern food preparation area, also looking very smart. Replacement of the coolroom with bar fridges has created a better working space for the bar.

Town Hall Fig Tree

The large fig tree outside the Lessor Hall has been a concern for some time regarding damage should limbs fall due to the heavy canopy. Pruning could possibly have helped however the recent town hall kitchen renovations required installation of a commercial grease trap at which time very large roots were discovered heading under the Lessor Hall; this is significantly more of a concern. Council is proposing to have the tree removed and reinstate the area as a "breakout" space for the Lessor hall with the addition of paving and more suitable trees. Community feedback is welcomed.

Thank you to those who popped in to the Shire Marquee at the show, especially the youth information. looking at the skate park "Flythrough" screening of the Youth Activity Space, Vincent Street Urban Design Project, and Aquatic Centre Proposal was very popular. As previously reported external funding will be required for implementation.

New Shire Boundary Signage Installed

The new Beverley welcome signage has been installed at Shire boundaries on all major roads. The signs encompass artwork from 3 of the town murals created by renowned artist James Giddy and incorporate the new Beverley tourism branding.

Roadworks

Work is due to commence on the road on the northern side of the new industrial blocks with installation of culverts and gravel sheeting. Gravel sheeting has been undertaken on Corberding Road. The graders have been busy around the shire over the last month. The oval has been tended to following the show.

Youth Activity Area Update

This project has received positive feedback within the community and from a meeting with Lotterywest representatives regarding funding possibilities. The Shire is in the process of preparing a grant application. Thank you to the dedicated group of local residents who are fundraising toward this project through the monthly Saturday markets and other catering projects. Council resolved that the Federation Square Gazebo would be relocated to the RV Friendly Park on the corner of Vincent and Lukin Streets once the youth project is funded.

Kinetic Sculpture

A beautiful kinetic sculpture acquired by the Shire has been temporarily installed in the lawn area between the shire office and post office. Built by local resident Grant Hobbs, it will be relocated into the pond at the tourist information bay once water levels subside in the summer.

Wildflowers in the Shire

Tourism Officer Jacinta Murray has been out and about photographing wildflowers in various reserves to assist in creating a brochure for a wildflower trail in the Beverley area. 

Council at its meeting on 27 August 2019 resolved to give notice of its intention to review and/or revoke a number of Local Planning Policies (Policies).



Balladong noongars traversed the land for thousands of years

In more recent history the growth of agriculture has seen development of formalised pathways in road and rail.

Building of the train line from Perth to Albany via Northam supported a progression of inland settlements which saw Beverley as a terminus for several years where passengers stayed over before continuing by coach until rail lines met.

While agriculture has been and still is a significant feature of the district there are many small businesses in Beverley, some are on display today in the Big Marquee, which I would encourage you to visit.

Transfer of your Medical Records

Your Medical Records are the property of your current Medical Services Provider, this is the Medical Practice you are registered with, not the individual General Practitioner you may have been seeing. If you decide that you would like a copy of your medical records forwarded to a new Medical Service Provider you will need to obtain a "request for Medical information to be transfered form" from the new provider and have them forward it to your current MSP. Most Medical Practices charge a transfer fee to cover the colating of information by an administrator, paper or Disc and registered postage. This fee can vary from practice to practice.

For those of you that don't know me, I have worked as a country police officer for nearly 18 years so I understand the dynamic of small county towns. So who are you getting? A tough, but fair police officer. If you are doing the right thing, then you will have no issues from me. If not, then guess what????

One of my main priorities is community engagement. In a small country town it is vitally important to be a part of the community. So expect to see police become more involved with community events (both on and off duty) and having a big visual presence around town.

So I am looking at holding another event in which rural crime and security will be discussed. If in the meantime you have any issues on security you need to discuss, don't hesitate to contact the police station for more advice.

So while community engagement is high on my priority list, it still doesn't stop us from focussing on traffic and crime related issues. Our traffic work is important to ensure everyone gets home safely. And again if you're doing to right thing then you have nothing to worry about

Again I am really excited about being here for the next few years and providing a quality policing service to the community. You will see me around town and I am always available to have a chat at any time.







PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Welcome to the **75**th **Annual General Meeting** of The Beverley Hospital Auxiliary

The Hospital Auxiliary has had another successful year. Our committee now numbers 17 dedicated ladies behind the scenes in the Op Shop, collecting and sorting the donated goods, cleaning and organising the Shop and making decisions on how the funds will be distributed within the Beverley Health Service. As well, they represent our group at various community and Service functions. Jo Sims, Betty Wauchope, Erica Murray, and Gina Adams are the newest members of our team. There are 35 "extra" volunteers who are rostered to work in the Opportunity Shop at various times. Without the input from all of these people, the Opportunity Shop would not exist and therefore items for the Hospital, and the Frail Aged Lodge could not be purchased.

We are a charitable organization whose funds will directly benefit the health of our own citizens.

There are still many ways that we can improve facilities and equipment within the Beverley Health Service and every request is carefully considered. A non-financial request came from the local Saint John's Ambulance Sub Centre to apply for a Lotteries West Grant to purchase a community defibrillator in our capacity as a licensed Charitable body. This application was successful and the defibrillator has been placed outside the St John's meeting room which is used regularly by our Senior Citizens. During 2018-2019, the Auxiliary has purchased an Air Comfort Flotation bed plus accessories for the Palliative Care Room at the Hospital at a cost of \$2400 and wheelchairs [\$2420]. We contributed an amount of \$3150 to "The Pathways At The Lodge" project. Together with a grant received from the Beverley Shire by the Frail Aged Lodge committee, this money has provided for the residents a safe means of accessing the outdoor gazebo area. Comfort packs emergency department

patients, Christmas gifts for Lodge and Hospital residents are other items which the Auxiliary has funded.

We are always pleased to acknowledge the help given to our group by the community and this year we once again thank the staff at Avon Trading for accepting and storing donated items when the Op Shop is not open. The Ashworth family has donated a microwave which has proven most useful now that helpers are working in the Shop over lunchtime. As well, the Shire continues to allow our group to use a Town Hall space for the Op Shop at minimal rent, for which we are grateful. And I acknowledge our anonymous donor who, for the past 3 years has shown appreciation of the value of the Hospital Auxiliary by making a financial contribution.

Thankyou to all people who donate goods to the Op Shop and for the people who pass through the door to purchase or to just browse. You will be amazed at what you find there.

Special thanks to Glenda Burns our Treasurer who stepped in when needed and who has done a great job in keeping the finances in order and to Val Moad, Op Shop Co-ordinator who keeps a constant eye on the state of the Op Shop. Jan Howell has completed 5 years as secretary and continues to make sure that everything runs smoothly in the Auxiliary.

And lastly, thankyou to Michelle Bauer HSM, the staff at the Hospital, The Frail Aged Lodge, HACC & Allied Health for working with me and the Hospital Auxiliary to further improve the wonderful health and care facilities we have in Beverley.

September is the beginning of spring and time to get ready for the warmer days ahead. It's a great time to plant pretty much anything and undertake an outdoor spring clean. There's lots to do in the garden but don't get overwhelmed; just aim to do a little each week and you'll have it under control in no time

Top tips for Planting in September

- Plant seeds for flowers and vegetables for summer
- Fertilise strawberries to encourage a bumper crop
- Get weeds under control
- Apply a slow-release lawn food to all grassed areas
- Use a metal rake to remove any build-up of thatch
- Dead head spring annuals and bulbs

- If looking a bit sparse reseed or returf bare areas of the lawn
- Increase watering of potted plants as the weather warms up
- Apply a slow-release fertiliser to all potted plants
- Tidy up ornamental grasses to promote new growth
- Fertilise all plants and lawns as growth resumes
- Prune hibiscus and also prune plants that flowered in winter and early spring
- Plant herbs such as parsley, mint, coriander, and oregano
- Renew mulch on garden beds cover the soil with compost and then cover with a layer of mulch
- Watch for pests on new growth such as aphids and snails. Aphids can be squashed or treated.
- Snails and slugs can be trapped or deterred
- Repot potted plants that are root bound
- Divide herbaceous clumping plants as new growth resumes

Top tip

September is also a great time to spring clean your backyard ready to spend more time outside having fun, relaxing and entertaining. Check all your outdoor furniture and equipment (including cubby houses, trampolines, swing sets). Clean and repaint or re-oil outdoor furniture as required. Check and tighten nuts and bolts. Sweep or water-blast paved areas to remove mould or moss build-up as well as accumulated leaves and dirt. Clean the BBQ and replenish the gas bottles so you're all set to enjoy the warmer weather that September brings.







Warrior Wellbeing Article SELF-MEDICATION, THE GOOD AND THE BAD

Stress is normal, in fact it's essential for our survival. It's the body's way of preparing us for a fight or flight response. However, continual elevated stress can lead to distress and dysfunction and often, we self- medicate via "sex, drugs and rock and roll". Our first step should be to talk to someone and seek help if we're feeling stressed, but historically, as blokes, we've been pretty poor at this.

As a result of alcohol self-medication, we see twice as many men die of alcohol abuse, and men in their sixties are more likely than any other demographic to die as a direct result of alcohol. However, in the work we do, the most common forms of self-medication for blokes are working harder and talking less.

It's normal to avoid the uncomfortable sensations of distress through a range of different ways, collectively referred to as coping mechanisms.

Healthy Coping Strategies

There are strategies that are healthy and deal more directly with the underlying problems rather than just temporarily masking them, these include;

- Talk to a mate: Identify mates that you can really discuss things of importance with. Do this in the good times because it will present more of a challenge when you are already stressed. These mates might be a partner, peer or a mentor, but regardless of who it is, the research points to this being one of the most effective methods of support around.
- Exercise: The links between exercise and good mental health and wellbeing are undeniable. Not only does the body feel better but the mind does too.
- Watch what you eat: One particularly unhealthy coping strategy is comfort eating. If you have a raft of unhealthy eating behaviours, don't try to build Rome in a day. Take one aspect like the use of salt or sugar intake and tackle them one at a time.
- Factor in time off: Regardless of whether it's actual time off like a holiday, a weekend away, or just a mental break, via an activity like meditation or adopting mindfulness, giving ourselves timeout, is an invaluable form of healthy self-medication.
- Seek professional help: Whether it's your GP, counsellor or a helpline, there's a myriad of professional services to assist you if you're feeling stressed and need advice on healthy coping strategies.
- Stay connected: The Act, Belong Commit message gets a flogging, but that's because social connection is the most important and effective way of heading off many mental health and wellbeing issues before they start. Join a club, start a band or volunteer for a local cause, it all helps.

Self-medication doesn't have to be a dirty word so long as we are making the right choices and taking the right medicine!
