#### **Local Government Elections**

The Local Government Elections were held on Saturday 19 October 2019. Congratulations to all candidates who nominated as the voting was very close. Cr's Brown and Gogol were returned to office and we welcome new Councillors Chris Lawlor and Terry McLaughlin. Former President Dee Ridgway and Cr Lew Shaw did not re-nominate. Thank you to both who were Councillors since 2007 and to Dee Ridgway serving the Community as Shire President for ten years.

Elected and sworn in as President was Cr Don Davis and Cr Chris Pepper was sworn in as Deputy President. I look forward to working with you both and with Council over the next two years.

#### **Mosquito Fogging**

Fogging has been carried out twice over the last few weeks. The Shire plans to carry out at least one more, possibly two applications prior to summer.

#### <u>Permits to Burn</u>

Whilst the Prohibited Burning Period is now upon us and no fires are permitted, I'd like to make everyone aware of the new electronic Permit to Burn system for next year. Permits will be available online: https://www.beverley.wa.gov.au/services/ emergency-services/fire-control.aspx

You can no longer ask your FCO for a permit. If you are unable or unwilling to apply for a permit online, you can visit the Shire of Beverley offices during business hours and apply for a Permit to Burn over the counter. Please be aware that an application for a Permit to Burn can take up to 48 hours to approve so please take this time frame into account when deciding when you wish to burn. If the details of the permit need to be clarified your local Bush Fire Control Officer will contact you to get further details or book in a time to inspect your burn and approve the permit.

#### Youth Activity Area

Thank you to everyone who was involved in the first stage of the Youth Activity Area planning. This includes the Working Group, Councillors, Beverley District High School students and teachers, Shire staff and the Community. I am advise that arant pleased to fundina applications have been submitted to progress the Youth Activity Area project. #### Vincent Street Bridge 729

The refurbishment of the Vincent Street bridge is almost complete. The bitumen hotmix approaches have been scheduled for the 23 October, then the expansion joints will be installed the following week. All going well the bridge should be complete early November. #### SHIRE OF BEVERLEY FIRE SEASON INFORMATION



#### Prepare for Fire Season


The Shire of Beverley's Community Emergency Services Manager (CESM) along with the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer wish to remind all property occupiers to ready and maintain their properties for the fire season.

Fire breaks need to be installed before 01 November this year and maintained until 15 April next year. The minimum requirements for a firebreak in the Shire of Beverley is for the break to be at least 2.2 metres wide of bare mineral earth which means no vegetation (dead or alive) or flammable materials can be present. Alternatively small rural land holders can clear their properties of all inflammable materials or maintain grass mown to a height of less than 15cm.

Larger rural properties should ensure that they have an operational independent mobile water filled firefighting unit with a water capacity of not less than 600L to be ready to be immediately deployed at all times throughout the Prohibited and Restricted burning periods.

Fire breaks play a part in reducing the spread of fire but just as importantly they provide a safer space for fire fighters to work from when trying to combat a fire. Although not mandated in the Fire Break Order volunteer firefighters are urging property owners to also consider the access to their properties by large fire appliances. Generally this means making sure that there is an adequate gate width of at least 3 metres and to ensure that there are no overhanging branches or obstructions below 4 metres high over entry points and fire breaks to allow fire appliances to safely navigate your property should they need to defend it from fire.

Prohibited Burning within the Beverley Shire is scheduled to begin on 01 November after which time no fires are permitted to be lit until the 15 February unless otherwise notified when a Permit to Burn (PTB) can be applied for online by visiting the Shire of Beverley website at www.beverley.wa.gov.au

It has come to our attention that some residents were unaware of their ability to vote in the recent Local Government Election. As the Shire of Beverley no longer has wards (removed in 2013), **all** registered residents and ratepayers are entitled to vote every two years in the Local Government Election.

If you are on the State Electoral Roll at a different address but are a ratepayer in Beverley, again you are entitled to vote provided you have completed an Owners and Occupier Form prior to the end of August in the election year. When the Owners and Occupiers form is completed you will stay on the roll until you no longer own property in Beverley (ie you are only required to complete the form once).

The next Local Government Election will be Saturday 16 October 2021.

### **BEVERLEY MEN'S SHED**



Beverley Men's Shed was recently awarded a \$5,500 contract to construct playground equipment and furniture for the Dowerin Field Day Committee. Our Men's Shed was the only Men's Shed or Community Group in the region, for one reason or another, willing to undertake the making of the 24 mainly wooden items, completed at short notice over a two week period. The quality of the work was of such a high standard that some items were taken to this years' Royal Show. All the material, amounting to approximately half the value of the contract, was purchased at a competitive price from Avon Trading Company in line with the Shed policy to support local business.

This latest project was one of a number carried out by members of our Men's Shed for a range of organisations over the last 10 years. These include our local Shire Council (with whom we have enjoyed a very close association), the Shire of Brookton, Wheatbelt Natural Resource Management, the Alex Miles Lodge, the Beverley District Hospital, as well as a number of smaller projects.

Our next venture is the partial restoration of an old Morris Truck, formerly owned by the Shire, now located at Avondale. When completed, the truck will be located in the area now occupied by the Centenary of Federation Square, where the proposed Skate Park development will be.





Over the last few weeks we have had some incidents on Vincent Street where people have been assaulted. One person has been arrested and charged for the incident a few weeks ago and only last week we arrested the same male person for assaulting his partner. Another person has been arrested for brandishing a knife in the main street.

We will not accept unsocial and violent behaviour in this town and especially on the main street, where people are going about their daily business. The community has been fantastic with advising us of these incidents and also assisting us with our inquiries so we can make arrests.

As I said recently to someone and mentioned before in the Blarney: "If you are doing nothing wrong, then you have nothing to worry about". But there are a few who continually want to break the law in regards to anti-social behaviour and dealing in drugs. We know exactly who they are and I make no apologies for targeting these people.



#### **Behind the Microphone**

101.3fm operates from the heart of the Avon Valley and Central Wheatbelt. It's a Community Radio Station. But what exactly is community radio? It is the alternative to commercial radio and

the ABC (public broadcasting). Community radio exists to provide content that is popular and relevant to its *local* audience.

In Australia, Community stations are not-for-profit organisations. Each week, over 5 million listeners tune into community radio and there are over 450 stations throughout Australia. 101.3fm is wholly staffed and run by volunteers – a great achievement, considering the huge amount of weekly, live broadcasting!

Voice of the Avon is the local community station covering Beverley, plus more than a dozen other towns in the Central Wheatbelt and Avon Valley.

For around 90 hours each week, there are live, locally-based presenters and programming at this station. Some are there from 6am, others finish at 10pm. And they have former broadcasting professionals (from both radio and TV) who are part of the volunteer broadcasting team and who happily share their experience and love of radio.

#### **Broadcaster Training**

If you've ever wondered what it's like to work in a radio station, now is the perfect time to have a try. What's so good?

- Knowledgeable and experienced trainers: take the opportunity to learn from people who know how to select and program music, plan programs, teach you to use your voice correctly and present to a professional standard.
- Programming covers a far wider range than the music and content presented by commercial radio.
- You are supporting and connecting with your friends, neighbours and local folk.
- Radio is the kind of volunteer area open to a huge age-range: Generally, the minimum age is 15, but there is no other age limitation.
- Initial community radio training can be the pathway to career qualifications.
- Broadcasting develops skills and confidence it is definitely not just for extrovert personalities!

Voice of the Avon 101.3fm is preparing to run another initial training course. You will be part of a small group – no more than 4 trainees. And the sessions are very relaxed, positive and supportive. But first, do come to look through the recently-refurbished studios and meet your trainer. ## It's a TRAP!

Many of Western Australia's native trapdoor spiders are often mistaken for the notorious Sydney funnelwebs. This is because they are both part of the Mygalomorphae group (also known as primitive spiders) and look pretty similar!

Trapdoor spiders are common throughout Australia. Although they all live in burrows, most have a trapdoor lid covering their holes, whilst some only have camouflaged entrances.

Unlike funnelweb spiders, trapdoor spiders are not considered life-threatening or aggressive, although some can deliver a nasty (but not life endangering) bite. They spend the majority of their time in their burrows and may only be seen if their burrow is dug up or flooded, or when the males wander in search for females during the warmer months (the girls prefer to stay at home waiting for their suitors).

Trapdoor spiders are useful for biological control as they enjoy a diet of cockroaches, beetles, moths, crickets and other insects, which venture too close to their burrows. The spiders themselves then become dinner for birds, bandicoots, centipedes and parasitic wasps.

The WA Museum has stated that funnelweb spiders cannot survive for very long, nor establish in the WA environment. WA's environment is very different from the environments of the eastern states where they are native.

If you are looking to get an unfamiliar spider identified, we strongly encourage you to take pictures of the spiders and send to our Pest and Disease Information Service (PaDIS) or MyPestGuide team, rather than kill them. There is a high chance they are one of our natives!

The hot weather is definitely upon us with hopefully a few showers in between and there is lots to do in the garden during November.

### WHAT TO PLANT IN NOVEMBER

Vegies – beetroot, capsicum, cucumber, pumpkin, lettuce, sweet corn, tomato, zucchini, radish, spinach and spring onion.

Flowers – alyssum, marigolds, petunia, portulaca, sunflower, salvia, calendula, lobelia and impatiens.

November is a great time to attend to the following tasks in the garden:

• Plant fast growing leafy green every 6 weeks for continuous cropping



- Lift and divide chive clumps to increase stock
- Tip prune passionfruit to promote flowers and fruit that form on new growth
- Trim daisies to remove old flowers
- Dress roses with a 5cm layer of well rotted cow or chook manure to feed and condition the soil for summer growth
- Prune old or tatty canna stems to ground level
- Dead head roses so they put their energy into producing new blooms
- When there are just 4 or 5 green leaves left on the stem, your garlic is ready to be dug up
- Harvest sweetcorn when the silks are brown and the kernels seem plump and emit a milky fluid when squeezed
- Plant silverbeet and rainbow chard as a gap filler, even in your ornamental garden
- Remove fruit from newly planted custard apple, avocado, mango and citrus. They need at least 2 years to establish strong roots and branches for crops
- Sweet potatoes love the heat. Buy a tuber and plant it. Trim off the runners into 20cm lengths and plant the cuttings.

### **Email virus in Beverley**

There is a major PC email virus threat spreading in Beverley. Hopefully by the time you read this article the threat will have disappeared from the Internet. Once a damaging spam email is identified all the mail servers on the Internet will be updated to block the threat. However, the information below is useful to help you to identify and deal with viruses delivered by email

### What is happening?

- You receive an email on your PC with a dangerous virus attachment. It may appear to be from someone you trust – a relative, friend, school, club or business
- 2. As you trust the sender you open the attachment
- 3. The attachment immediately installs a computer virus on your PC and sends your Address Book to the criminal.
- Emails are then sent to everyone in your Address Book or Contacts. The sent email includes the virus you received and an invoice (to be paid to the criminal!)
- 5. Your contacts now receive the infected email you received in 1. Above

And so, the cycle continues - and grows ....

#### What should I do if I receive an email with an attachment?

- If you receive an email with an attachment you can open the email – but do not open the attachment without checking, even if you are expecting an email with an attachment.
- Check the 'from' address is it genuine? It may have the name of the sender, but is the internet address correct? For instance, a spam email that claims to come from me might have a false address: e.g. Peter Horth peter@abc.xyz.123. If the address is false - delete the email.
- If you think the email is genuine phone the sender to confirm whether they sent you an email with an attachment
- 4. If the sender confirms they did **not** send the email **delete the email.**
- If you are unsure if an email is genuine delete the email. The sender can always resend it if necessary.

### Is Internet banking safe?

The answer is **Yes** – providing you are careful with the security of your Customer IDs and passwords. I have been using Internet banking since it first came out in 1998 and I have never had any intrusion into my accounts.

Internet banking uses a secure session on your Internet browser (Firefox, Edge, Google Chrome, etc.) and an encrypted connection between your browser and the bank. Tablets and phones have similar security. Banks have highly secure computing systems.

The weakest link will be how you secure your Customer ID and password. Do not keep the Customer ID and password in plain text on your PC, or on a scrap of paper, or in your wallet, or an easily accessible notebook, etc. It is best to keep them in your head(!), or in an encrypted file on your device, or use a password manager (see last month's article).

A confirmation text to your phone adds extra security but can be compromised if a criminal has your Customer ID and password. Many banks offer a dongle that creates a random code to enter when you log in. Get one. The best security is "something you know + something you have".

#### What should I do if I accidently open the attachment?

- 1. If you accidentally open an attachment that is infected immediately shut down the PC
- Shut down the PC by pressing and holding the power button until the PC is forced to shut down – Do not use the normal shut down process as this may have been hijacked by the virus
- 3. Seek expert help to remove the virus do not connect the computer to the Internet until it has been cleaned.
- 4. Change the password on your email You can do this by phoning your email service provider's support (e.g. Telstra, iiNet, Westnet, Microsoft etc) or use a tablet, phone or another PC to log in to the provider's email online site.
- 5. Stop the virus spreading Contact the people on your address book, let them know you have a virus and advise them to delete any recent emails from you.



### Warrior Wellbeing Article Our Wellbeing During Adolescent Transition

Transition periods are a normal part of life, they are ongoing through our many different ages and stages and are often associated with varying aspects of change or moving out of our comfort zone. Most young people, regardless of attending agricultural college or mainstream high school, growing up on a farm or in the city (both male & female) will have experienced some form of change in recent years. Whether developmentally (puberty), moving away from home, creating new friendships or the expectations placed on you around attitude, behaviour and study requirements, change is inevitable.

At this time of the year many young people (and their parents) are taking important steps to prepare for the final stages of their high school journey and transition into the beginning of their working lives. If you are one of these young people and reading this article it shows at least two things: 1. You have already survived and thrived through one very significant time of change and transition; 2. You are taking positive steps and preparing yourself for the next exciting transition of becoming a young adult and entering the world of employment or further study.

Periods of transition come with a new set of challenges that may put us under pressure. Moving out of our comfort zone means exposing ourselves to new and unfamiliar situations and can often lead to:

- uncertainty and discomfort;
- having to create new routines and habits (sleep can be affected);
- feelings of fear, worry or anxiousness (this is normal, but if it's ongoing and intense seek help);
- Increase in stress levels (some stress helps us operate during difficult times, but we need manage and keep an eye on our stress levels).

This all sounds a bit negative I know but the good news is that if we talk about these things, normalise our reactions and push through these times the boundaries of our comfort zone will grow and expand. We can gain satisfaction and meaning from getting through such times. There will always be some hold-ups, knock-backs, days when we question our decisions and things just won't go our way. Transition is a process, so you need to allow some time to settle in and adjust before you can survive and thrive.

Here are a few tips to help with the next stages of your life journey:

- Accept change as a part of life "stop wishing for what was and enjoy what is";
- Talk to your parents, peers and mentors about how you're feeling;
- Make time for your passions & interests;
- Exercise and take time to relax. No one can work or study 24/7, time out is an important part of your wellbeing and stress management;
- Stay socially connected and take time to laugh with others (not just on social media, get out and create opportunities to form new friendships and surround yourself with real people);







7) Immigrations lawyer- last week spoke on TV. Some Visa changes take place, sometimes overnight without any notice. These laws are so complex one may have to seek proper advice from the legal professionals. There is a huge amount of paper work to apply for a Visa and all the Visa numbers are changed.






