



Happy New Year

2019 was once again a busy year for Council. A few of the achievements include the official opening of the Cornerstone Building, Youth Activity Area Concept Plan with funding applications submitted, Swimming Pool Redevelopment Plans, Town Hall kitchen renovation and successful roads, gardens and footpath programs.

Council will continue to represent the Community to make Beverley the place to BE! Some of the projects for 2020 include the development of the Youth Activity Area, remedial works to road levels on Vincent Street to alleviate high kerbs near the Post Office and ANZ Bank, Seniors Concert in the Town Hall (October) and widening of a section of Mawson Road and Top Beverley Road.

Community Bus Shed

The old Fire Truck shed that houses the Community Bus recently sustained some accidental structural damage. Due to the shed containing asbestos, the Shires insurers have agreed that the old shed will be removed and a new steel one built in its place.

Solar Lights

The Shire has installed five solar street lights on Railway Street to assist residents and visitors to find their way around safely at night. These are the first solar lights the Shire has invested in which are intended to reduce costs and be better for the environment.

Bush Fire Volunteers

Once again thank you to all the local bushfire volunteers and our friends from Brookton who attended a large fire in the Dale, 11-12 December. There were approximately 80 volunteers on the fire ground who worked tirelessly in trying conditions.

Community Grants

The Shire of Beverley Community Grants open 02 January and close 31 January. Early and late submissions will not be accepted. There are minor grants (up to \$1000) and major grants (\$1001-\$5000 with 50:50 matching funds) available for local incorporated groups.

THANK YOU TO VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS



The Shire of Beverley's Fire Control Officers wish to extend a huge THANK YOU to all the volunteer fire fighters, heavy machinery suppliers and operators, food and drink suppliers and preparers and to our neighbours from the Shire of Brookton who for the second season in a row now have worked side by side together to successfully control a large fire.

Last year's fire was at the olive oil tree farm near Dale Kokeby Road.

On Wednesday 11 December this year a fire broke out near Williamson Road in the Dale region which burnt just over 160 hectares fanned by strong winds and hot conditions.

Along with approximately 80 firefighters on the ground who came from every district within the Beverley Shire and beyond, DFES air support was received with the assistance of two fixed wing water bombers and two Helitak choppers and an Air Supervisor helicopter. Without the terrific commitment and support of everybody who assisted the fire would not have been able to be contained so successfully with no reports of significant property damage or injury.

The fire at times threatened to jump the Dale River and head towards Westdale Road and beyond but was kept in check by the efforts of firefighters on the ground and the water bombers and Helitaks in the air.

Incidents like this highlight just how wonderful the Shire of Beverley community is in helping each other in times of need.









BE VERY FIRE AWARE!

It has been a long, hot and dry harvest period and the Shire of Beverley's volunteer Bush Fire Brigade members along with Shire staff have been kept busy with responding to fires during this time. Now that harvest is nearly done and the Xmas/New Year Holidays are upon us it is important for every community member to remain vigilant against the threat of fire in the many months still to come.

The community becomes increasingly vulnerable during January when many farming families go away on holidays depleting our volunteer firefighting resources meaning the rest of us need to be even more prepared to deal with fire threats.

The Community Emergency Services Manager along with the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer for the Shire of Beverley would like to remind all farmers and small rural land holders of the need to remain properly prepared to protect not only your own properties but to also be available to help your neighbours when there is a fire in your district.

Every rural property should have at least one firefighting unit full of water, with an operational pump and hose reel, mobile and ready to respond to a fire at short notice. Skid mounted firefighting units should remain on your ute from October to May every year and trailer mounted units should be ready to hook up and go.

We would like to remind everyone that it is important to look out for and help your fellow community members wherever you can. The Shire of Beverley is a wonderful community and when there is a fire every bit of assistance is appreciated by every single person who turns out to extinguish that fire as quickly as possible.

By remaining prepared and working together we can all help to protect property from fire and keep everyone safe.

We thank you too for the wonderful stories you wrote and observant drawings you made back at school, which are all printed below (with some comments on the illustrations). 
By Declan (The pupils are correctly waiting by the desks)



AVONDALE FARM UPDATES AND CHRISTMAS GREETINGS



It's been a busy year at Avondale Farm. The very successful community day in September celebrated a number of projects that have been completed including the redevelopment of three of the houses into short stay accommodation - one with universally accessible facilities - and upgraded signage and interpretation throughout the precinct.

A lease has been signed with Living Farm, a York-based agricultural research company who will work with WA farmers to continue the history of agricultural research at this significant property.

"The National Trust is also very excited to announce a joint project with the Noongar Land Enterprise Group, Food Innovation Australia Limited and the Shire of Beverley, focusing on the development of an Aboriginal led bush produce research, training and enterprise development hub at Avondale" National Trust CEO, Julian Donaldson said.

The project includes a scoping study of Aboriginal participation and opportunities in the bush food industry across Australia. One of the key outcomes of the project is to design a model to increase participation of Aboriginal people in the bush produce industry and Avondale, as a hub, has been identified to have potential to be a key part of this process.

It is important to understand that Aboriginal people benefit from Bush food production, including through commercial production, while at the same time respecting cultural knowledge and understanding and that there are limitations to protecting intellectual property. The study will include extensive engagement with Aboriginal people to ensure cultural knowledge is a central driver for the project.

Bush food production has potential to provide a range of benefits both to Aboriginal people and the broader community including nutritional and medicinal applications.

Oral McGuire of the Noongar Land Enterprise Group (NLE) is also excited by the opportunity. "The hub will be used to conduct research and development, training and marketing, and dissemination of information and learnings to Aboriginal and other communities across Australia. This is a fantastic opportunity for Aboriginal communities and the Beverley district," he said.

The feasibility study was launched on Tuesday 17 December and work will begin in the new year. Exploring the potential for a Bush Food Innovation Hub to be established at Avondale Farm is part of this project.

The Trust continues to work closely with the Shire of Beverley and the dedicated volunteers who open the Agricultural Museum and work on the care and conservation of its collection. This collection is not only a key attraction in the Shire but it holds significant material reflecting the industrious and inventive farming community over many decades.

"On behalf of all here at the Trust we would like to thank Monica and the volunteers for their hard work and wish everyone a happy and safe festive season. We really look forward to working with the community next year to continue to build the profile of Avondale Farm and make important contributions to the social and economic well-being of this important community.

Avondale Farm is closed during the summer months. Keep an eye out for 2020 opening times in the next Blarney.





Snake Bite

Snake bites are not common in Australia, but all should be treated as life threatening. Snakes force venom out under pressure through fangs in the upper jaw. The spread of snake venom depends on its absorption through the lymphatic system.

Caused by

Fangs puncturing the skin.

Signs & symptoms

- Visible in an hour or more after the person has been bitten.
- In children signs and symptoms may appear within minutes.
- Puncture marks or scratches, may bleed.
- Nausea, vomiting and diarrhoea.
- Headache, drowsiness, giddiness or faintness.
- Double or blurred vision, drooping eyelids.
- Voice changes, trouble speaking or swallowing.
- Pain or tightness in the throat, chest or abdomen.
- Breathing difficulties, respiratory weakness or arrest.

What to do

- 1. Follow DRSABCD St John Action Plan.
- 2. Lay the casualty down, rest and reassure.
- If the bite is on a limb, apply a broad pressure bandage over the bite site as soon as possible.
- 4. Then apply a further elasticised or firm bandage - start at fingers or toes and move up the limb as far as can be reached. Apply tightly but without stopping blood flow.
- 5. Splint the limb including the joints on either side of the bite.
- 6. Ensure the casualty does not move.
- Urgent medical aid. Call Triple Zero (000) for an ambulance.
- Write down the time that the casualty was bitten and when the bandage was applied.

DO NOT

- Wash the venom off the skin (it may aid in identification).
- Cut the bitten area and try to suck venom out of the wound.
- Use a tourniquet.
- + Try and catch the snake.


Marta invites people to drop into the Station to watch her paint and answer questions on her technique or anything about botanical art.

Thank you to John and his staff for their friendly efficiency. The secret Santa proved to be very popular as were the door prizes. Who would have suspected that a bag of manure or potting mix could be greeted with such enthusiasm? We wish all of our members a safe and happy New Year. We will meet again on Tuesday 03 March 2020 at 10.30am at a venue to be announced.

Gardening in Beverley during January can be challenging dealing with the heat waves and strong, hot winds.

Vegetables to plant in January include: beans, beetroot, broccoli, brussels sprouts, cabbage, carrot, cauliflower, leek, lettuce, radish, rhubarb, shallots, silverbeet, spring onion and turnip,

Flowers to plant in January include: alyssum, aster, dahlia, gerbera, impatiens, marigold, nasturtium, pansy, petunia, portulaca, salvia, stock, sweet pea, verbena and zinnia.

January is a great time to attend to the following tasks in the garden:

- Divide bromeliads
- Trim hedges and espaliered plants to maintain good shape
- Dead head roses to encourage more flowers
- Tip prune basil regularly to encourage bushy plants
- Top up mulch on everything including pot plants to help retain moisture in the soil
- Check your worm farm regularly to ensure it does not dry out
- Tip prune native shrubs that have finished flowering to help make them bushier
- Harvest fruit, vegetables and herbs daily
- Clean out excess plants from your pond
- Remove suckers from grafted plants, especially citrus, robinia and roses
- Prevent seeds forming on agapanthus by removing spent flowers
- Prune roses by one third to encourage good flowering for autumn
- Remove a third of developing fruit on trees to reduce disease, increase fruit size and quality and to evenly distribute the weight of the fruit
- Cut back lemon verbena, mint and lemon balm so they don't become leggy. Use the prunings to flavour drinks
- Remove dead leaves from tropical plants such as palms, cordyline, strelitzia, ginger and bromeliad and strappy plants such as kangaroo paw
- With a chance of summer storms, January is a good time to ask a qualified arborist to check all trees and remove any dangerous branches
