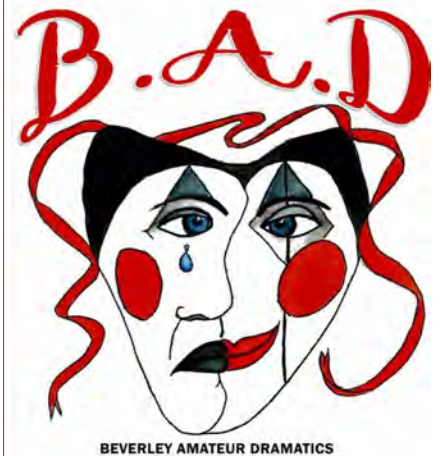

Old Nurses Quarters

Council are engaged in discussions with WA Country Health Service to retain the Old Nurses Quarters building at the Beverley health campus. The process is very positive but will take some time to negotiate and formalise should Council go ahead.

Charles Cooke Hunt The Beverley Connection

Hunt Rd in Beverley (now Great Southern Highway) was named after Charles Cooke Hunt, a surveyor well-known for making tracks and digging wells to the east of York in the 1860s. Members of his surveying teams included John Seabrook of Brookton House (Beverley extended further south than it does now) and local Noongar man, Tommy Winditj (Winditch).

Charles Hunt married Mary Ann Seabrook, John Seabrook's daughter at Brookton House in 1864. They had two children Emily Mary born in Beverley and Walter Harry, born in Geraldton.

BIRTH.

Sadly, Charles Cooke Hunt died just 4 years later in 1868.

We regret to have to announce the death Mr. C. C. Hunt, which took place at his residence in Geraldton on the 1st March. For some time previously to Mr. Hunt had filled the office of road-surveyor to that district, to which he was promoted soon after the termination of his last expedition to the eastward. He died of disease of the heart.

Inquirer & Commercial News 1 April 1868

His widow, Mary Ann Hunt (nee Seabrook), later married Charles Frederick Edwards of Speldhurst, near Beverley, in 1884 and subsequently regularly attended the nearby St Pauls Anglican church. Charles Hunt's son, always known as Harry, was born disabled. He had what we call cerebral

palsy. He died when he was 28 years old and is buried in St Paul's churchyard.

Charles Hunt's daughter, Emily, married William Arthur Wilkinson in 1888 at St Paul's. W.A. Wilkinson was a member of the Beverley Roads Board for a while. Their son, Willie, died aged 15 months at Beverley and is buried at St Pauls.

Emily Mary (nee Hunt) and Arthur Wilkinson also had a daughter, Vera Mary, who died aged 10 months. She is buried in Albany. Emily's mother and step-father had moved there later in life.

Emily and Arthur had a third child who lived to adulthood. This was Leslie Arthur Wilkinson born in York, 1897.

Emily died when Leslie was 7 years old. The young boy was brought up by his Seabrook great-aunt Sara, who married a Mr Helms, and his Wilkinson family.

He worked as a young teenager at Greenhills for an Edwards family stock & grain agency.

He enlisted in the 11th Battalion in WW1 and was killed at Gallipoli in 1915.

Private L. A. Wilkinson, of the 11th Battalion, was killed in action at the Dardanelles. He was formerly in the employ of Messrs. Edwards & Chipper, at Greenhills.

Eastern Districts Chronicle 30 July 1915

A year later he is lovingly remembered by his great-aunt, Sarah Holms (nee Seabrook).

WILKINSON.—In fond and loving memory of my dear nephew, Leslie Arthur Wilkinson, 11th Battalion, 3rd Brigade, killed in action at Anzac on June 29, 1915. Gone, but not forgotten. He did his duty. —Inserted by his loving aunt, S. Helms.

West Australian 29 June 1916

The death of Leslie Arthur Wilkinson brought the Charles Cooke Hunt line to an end.

Beverley **GARDEN AND TREE SOCIETY**

The Beverley Garden club has been in recess since Christmas and now wish all members and potential new members a happy and productive 2020.

The next meeting will be on Tuesday the 03 of March at 10.30am at our new President's home at 33 Dawson Street. After the meeting and a cuppa we will cross the street to Ailsa's home to see the result of all her hard work in landscaping her garden. Please bring a chair. We would like to swell our membership numbers so please invite a friend to join and bring them along too.

Gardening in March is a great time as autumn has hopefully arrived. Autumn is a good time to plant almost anything!

Vegetables to plant in March include – beetroot, broccoli, cabbage, carrot, leek, lettuce, radish, spinach, spring onion and turnip.

Flowers to plant in March include – alyssum, lobelia, stock, pansy, snap dragon, sweet pea and viola.

March is a great time to attend to the following tasks in the garden:

- ⇒ Prune geranium and pelargonium by two-thirds to encourage new bushy growth before winter
- ⇒ Remove weeds before they go to seed. The best time is after rain
- ⇒ Attract butterflies to your garden by planting red, orange, purple, white and blue flowers
- ⇒ Prune petunias to keep them flowering well into autumn
- ⇒ Coffee grounds can be put to good use in the garden as slug and snail repellent or in the compost bin
- ⇒ Divide agapanthus plants from autumn through to early spring
- ⇒ Prune off citrus branches hanging lower than 1m above the ground to reduce the spread of brown rot
- ⇒ Plant bee food plants such as brachyscome, angophora, eucalyptus, callistemon, melaleuca, scaevola, grevillea, hibbertis, tea-tree and westringia
- ⇒ Scorched leaves can be a sign that soil is water repellent. If the soil is dry, apply a wetting agent and water well
- ⇒ Divide clumping grass-like plants, such as dianella, lomandra and kangaroo grass. Keep several shoots per clump and remove dead material
- ⇒ Harvest radish regularly to stop them becoming too hot and spicy, woody or pithy
- ⇒ Start planning spring bulbs

Beverley Community Shines When Challenged

Mock Emergency Scenario

On 11 October the Beverley Soaring Society tested their Emergency Response Plan. A mock crash involving a pilot and three passengers occurred at the Beverley Air Strip. Three of the victims luckily managed to crawl away from the burning aircraft, one was seriously injured, the pilot died in the fire.

Peter Busher, a local resident and senior glider instructor at Beverley was conducting a routine morning flight briefing when the alarm was raised. After checking the safety of the accident site the surviving victims were moved away from danger before first aid was rendered. At the same time, airfield services such as our fire tender and mobile control unit swung into action including appointing a gate keeper to ensure clear access for Emergency Services.



Sgt Darrell Hagan and Snr Cons Ian Jeffries responded to the emergency call and assumed control of the crime scene as the pilot had died. They immediately summoned fire and ambulance. Ken and Adam Howell and Shane Greenmount quickly gained control and extinguished the fire quickly.



The volunteer ambulance staff Christine Brooke, Jenny Rayner and Drew Richardson the Community Paramedic from Beverley were quickly on scene. They were supported by ambulances and staff from York and Northam. The victims were assessed stabilised. One of the victims was taken to Beverley Hospital for emergency management requiring the

nursing staff to link up with WA Telehealth to consult with an ED doctor located in Albany. The victim was further stabilised prior to being airlifted to Perth by RFDS. Telehealth provides an amazing service and connects to 81 small regional hospitals in WA.

When the emergency drill was over there was a debriefing session attended by all participants and a large number of visiting doctors. The focus of the debriefing was 2 fold; practice our Emergency Response to learn "what we did well" and "what we could do better". Thank you to all of those people that shared their expertise and provided valuable feedback. Beverley Soaring Society would also like to thank all of those people, many from Beverley that gave up their valuable time to assist in this very worthwhile activity. Special thanks to Graham at the tip for helping with materials to make a mock up aircraft...and for taking the leftover bits and pieces back and Troy Granville who manages shire assets.

The grass tree and the hungry caterpillars

Here is a true story about an Australian icon, the grass tree (*Xanthorrhoea* species) and hungry hungry caterpillars.

Recently a grass tree, replanted after house renovations, was suffering the effects of transplant shock and a native moth took advantage; laying her eggs into the thick, long fronds.

Inspecting the dying fronds of the plant, several caterpillars were found and identified (via MyPestGuide.agric.wa.gov.au) as native webworms, *Meyriccia latro*. The caterpillars had hatched and chewed their way into the fibrous centre of the tree. This damage disrupted the tissue that carries water and nutrients to the crown. A severe caterpillar infestation can result in a grass tree rotting and dying.

As the owners cherished their tree, they did all they could to help the besieged plant. Every day they inspected each head and removed any caterpillars they could find with tweezers, along with the yellow and mushy, fungal-affected heartwood where the caterpillars were feeding. A treatment of Ready to Use Rose Gun Insecticide was then applied to each head, targeting any caterpillars that were missed. A second treatment of insecticide was applied two weeks later when a

couple of new caterpillars were seen. Over the following weeks, the grass tree sealed the damage with its own resin, like a scab, and after two months of concerted effort, the grass tree responded to the loving care by sprouting hundreds of new shoots from each head! The owners then cut off all remaining dead fronds and applied a Mancozeb Plus fungicide to treat any further infection.

The grass tree then received a couple of foliar applications of seaweed solution and one application to the soil.

After all the love, care and treatment, the grass tree has recovered, with abundant new growth and no signs of either caterpillars or infection. Is it possible to bring a grass tree back from the brink? If you can stop the hungry caterpillars in time and apply the right products, this gardener did!

We hope this story is helpful to others. A note for those transplanting grass trees – place mulch around but not touching the trunk and apply sufficient water to minimize further shock, and monitor for hungry caterpillars!

If you see unfamiliar pests damaging plants, we will always try to help with an identification. Happy gardening!

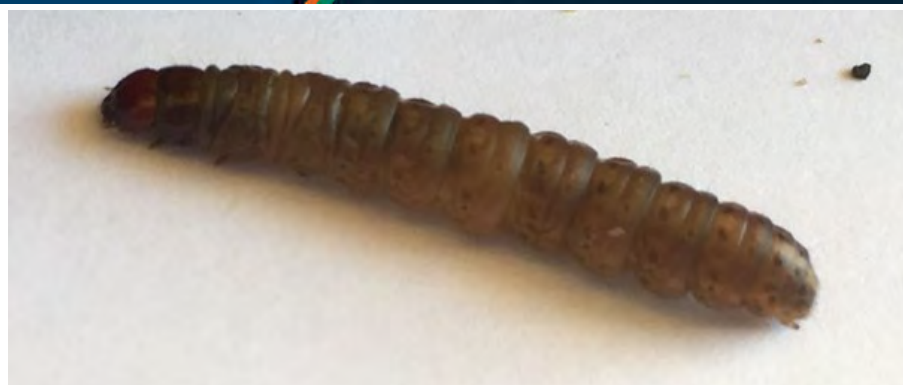

Habits, Routines and our Wellbeing

We are creatures of habit and routine so how does this affect our wellbeing? Our wellbeing is often described as a state of being content, healthy, secure, safe and happy. To have good wellbeing requires planning, making decisions, having a sense of purpose, a sense of hope, something to look forward to and then some luck.

The routine part of our life can contain components that are monotonous, predictable, regular, scheduled and sometimes become habitual. One of my habits is watching the 7pm ABC news and weather (when not on the road), checking emails and checking my twitter feed. The first thing I do when on a break is to stop this!

How do our daily routines affect our wellbeing? We know there are some things we must do every day just to survive, but mixing it up, changing our daily routines and breaking certain habits, even for a short time, can have positive effects on our overall wellbeing. 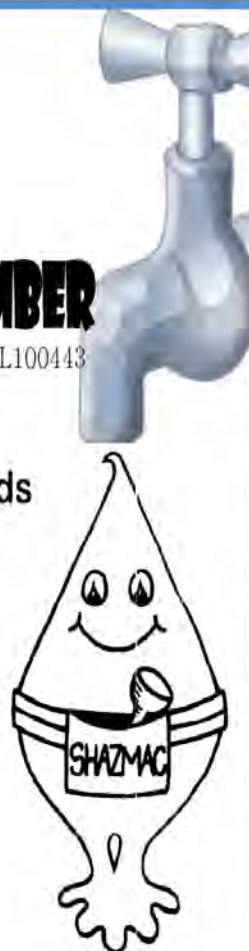

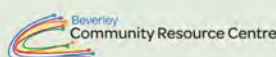

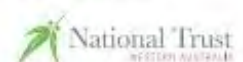

Free VacSwim for regional families

The Nationals WA believe removing financial and geographical barriers to VacSwim programs will encourage participation and reduce drownings in regional areas.

If The Nationals WA form government in 2021 we will work with Royal Life Saving WA and invest \$5 million from Royalties for Regions to make VacSwim free for regional families, provide more instructors and offer programs at more locations.

Background:

The *National Drowning Report 2019* concluded that people in regional and remote areas are 2.3 times more likely to drown than those in metropolitan areas.

According to Royal Life Saving, swimming lessons are one of the most important aspects in reducing the risk of drowning and giving young people the ability to positively and actively enjoy our waterways for fun, fitness and good health.

Research also shows that children from rural, indigenous, economically disadvantaged and migrant communities are less likely to learn swimming and water safety skills, but they generally catch up quickly if given the opportunity.

More can be done to ensure children in regional WA have a chance to participate in basic swimming and water safety education.

Discussion:

Under the McGowan Labor Government, costs for VacSwim have increased by more than 120 per cent, and Labor also threatened to remove VacSwim programs from dozens of regional communities without consultation.

The Nationals WA propose to remove the financial barrier for entry to VacSwim. This will deliver increased demand for VacSwim and help create opportunities for more locations in regional WA to participate in this important program.

Working with Royal Life Saving and the Department of Education, The Nationals WA believe we can double the enrolments in VacSwim participation from 17,000 to 34,000 per year. In addition, we will provide financial support to Royal Life Saving to develop a regional network of swimming instructors.

This will help cater to increased demand for VacSwim programs and has potential to expand VacSwim programs to additional locations. This will also create a positive first job opportunity for young people in regional WA and give them opportunities for additional training and skills development.

Recommendations:

- The Nationals WA will invest \$5 million from Royalties for Regions over five years to boost VacSwim participation and expand locations where VacSwim is offered.
- Enrolment fees for children and families in regional areas will be removed with the aim of doubling participation rates to 34,000 annually.
- A regional network of VacSwim instructors will be developed, creating job opportunities and allowing more locations to offer VacSwim programs. The Nationals WA invite feedback on this discussion paper.
- The program will be evaluated to determine if funding should be ongoing.

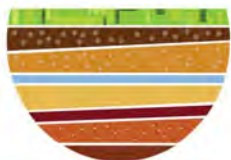

Windows 7 is now unsafe

If you have Windows 7, and you have connected to the internet since mid-January, you will have seen a big blue notice saying that Windows 7 is unsafe. This is not a scam. This important message comes from Microsoft. There will be no more Windows 7 updates.

Windows 7 support has ended

It is no longer safe to use Windows 7 on your PC. Windows 7 extended support ended on 14 January 2020. This means that Microsoft will no longer fix any security issues found in Windows 7. This also applies to other operating systems e.g. Vista, XP and Windows 8. See the table below.

Windows 8.1 now only has extended support which means that there are no more feature updates and **only** security fixes are supported.

Why is Windows 7 unsafe?

Criminals are always looking for ways to get onto your PC operating system. When they find a way in, they may:

- steal your personal information
- scam you
- blackmail you
- get into your bank account
- sell the information to others so they can do the above!

If the operating system is supported, Microsoft will develop a 'patch' on the software to block the way in, then issue an update.

Most updates are security updates.

Is your Windows 10 PC up to date?

It is important to keep your Windows 10 PC up-to-date. Always take all updates. Most updates are to fix security holes in the operating system. If you don't take the updates then you may be open to intrusions, scams and other criminal activity. To check for updates, go to Settings\Update & Security from your Start Menu.

New major versions of Windows 10 are issued around every six months. The latest version is 1909. Windows 10 versions 1507 through to 1803 are no longer supported by Microsoft.

If the operating system is not supported (e.g. Windows 7), then there will be no investigation of the intrusion, no working out how to fix it, and no update to the operating system. You are then wide open to criminals. I estimate that there about 160 million criminals on the Internet – all looking to get your money.

What should I do?

Firstly, **stop connecting your Windows 7 PC to the Internet** (it will still be safe offline). Then you need to consider these options:

1. Buy a new PC which comes with Windows 10, set it up to be safe, and transfer existing files and applications to Windows 10. PCs are now much cheaper and more powerful than when you bought your Windows 7 PC, 10 or more years ago.
2. If you are a light user of a PC, you do not use Microsoft Office and you do not have any special software, e.g. accounts or farm software; then you may consider changing over to a tablet. They are cheaper and easier to set up
3. Upgrade your Windows 7 PC to Windows 10. Windows 10 will cost you \$225 or more. Then you must rebuild the PC, set it up, then transfer any existing files and applications to Windows 10. This is quite complex. When finished you will still have a PC that is at least 10 years old. It will be well underpowered compared with a new PC and liable to failures, such as the hard drive.

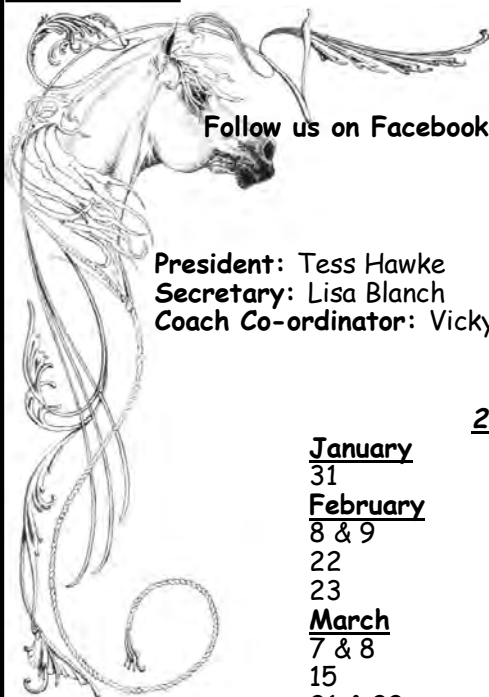
