

Kinetic Sculpture

The Kinetic Sculpture built by Grant Hobbs will remain in its current location. Council originally commissioned the sculpture for the dam at the Information Bay on Hunt Road but due to its popularity on Vincent Street chose to leave it where it is.

Flag Poles

The Shire has installed three new flag poles outside the Administration Building to fly the Australian Flag, Western Australian State Flag and the Aboriginal Flag. The Community are invited to a Flag Raising Ceremony on Tuesday 24 March 2020 at 9.30am. Please RSVP to the Shire Office by Thursday 19 March if you wish to attend.

Memorial Flag

Council has amended its Flag Policy that will see the Shire of Beverley Flag flown at Half Mast as a mark of respect to a resident who has passed away (instead of the Australian Flag). The memorial flag will still fly on the Town Hall. This policy will come into effect from 24 March after the Flag raising ceremony. The change is due to the previous Memorial Flag Policy not meeting Australian Flag protocol as directed by the Office of Prime Minister and Cabinet.

As part of the Plant Renewal Programme, Council have taken ownership of a new Water Truck and Case 721FXT Loader.

Avondale Machinery Museum

At the February Council meeting, Council temporarily close Avondale Machinery Museum to visitors. The closure comes about after a Risk and Hazard Assessment was completed by the Shire's insurers. Council will complete a full review of Avondale over the coming months to rectify issues raised in the report, appropriate safe work policies and develop a planning framework. The Planning Framework will include community engagement and is to identify the future of the Museum. The Shire is actively seeking ways for volunteers to continue maintenance of the machinery whilst the Museum is closed.

Department of Transport Strategic Bicycle Network Planning

As part of the Western Australian Bicycle Network (WABN) Plan, Department of Transport (DoT) is seeking to improve planning for cycling across the State, including in the regions. So, in various collaboration with the Department of Transport is developing a Regional Cycling Strategy for Avon and Central Coast, which is the region Beverley has been categorised into (Avon). The DoT will be engaging with the community to develop the plan. The plan is fully funded by the DoT and will provide a tool for future grant funding. Please have your say when you see the consultants out and about.

Community Grants

Congratulations to the many Community Groups – BORMSA, Beverley Early Years Network (Toy Library), Beverley CRC (Beverley Community Garden), Beverley Tree and Garden Society, Beverley Agricultural Society and Beverley P & C for being awarded funding in the January 2020 round. Unfortunately, the grant round was heavily oversubscribed but Council were able to assist all groups with significant funding to assist their various projects.

Cleaning tips

The following tips will help to ensure your difficult-to-clean eligible farm chemical containers will be accepted for recycling at your



Suspension concentrates (Atrazine, Simazine, etc)

Rinse your container immediately after use to ensure any chemical residue does not dry



- Use methylated spirits to remove dried residue. If this doesn't work, fill the container with water and soak for at least 24 hours before rinsing.
- Oil-based chemicals (ULVs, LVs)



Follow specific instructions on the product label or contact the manufacturer for further assistance



Other chemical residues

- Rinse container immediately after use as all chemical residues are much harder to remove when dry
- Some containers may require additional rinsing (more than three rinses)



A brush or high pressure hose may be required to clean stubborn or dried chemical residue

ELIGIBLE CONTAINERS WITH DIRT, RUST AND DYE STAINS ARE NOT CONSIDERED HAZARDOUS AND ARE THEREFORE ACCEPTED AT drumMUSTER COLLECTION CENTRES

OFF-ROAD MOTORCYCLES

There has been an increase in complaints regarding the use of off-road motorcycles in public areas, particularly on gazetted roads (including gravel roads) around town. The people who are continually riding their bikes in areas where you are not allowed, not only put themselves at risk of serious injury but also run have the potential to injury pedestrians. I will take this opportunity to serve a timely reminder to those who choose to do the wrong thing and to the parents of youngsters who allow their children to ride in areas where these bikes are not permitted.

If you are caught riding an unregistered motorcycle on a road, firstly **the bike can be seized**. The owner will be liable for costs involved in the seizure and storage of the vehicle and you may very well lose the bike for good. Secondly - you may be charged and face a magistrates court which can ultimately affect your motor driver's license with a suspension period and/or hefty fines being issued.

If the rider happens to injure another person whilst riding, they are not insured and any injury caused to another party as a result may leave the rider (or their family) liable to civil action for all financial losses to the injured party.

If your child has an off road motorcycle, please teach them responsible riding behaviours and to ride in designated areas or facilities/areas specifically provided for this type of activity. Use a trailer to get the bike to a suitable off-road area or location and of course, wear protective gear!

If you do witness this behaviour then make sure you notify police.



NO ONE LISTENING TO COMMUNITY CONCERNS ABOUT AGED CARE

There is growing concern that issues being raised about provision of aged care in rural areas is falling on deaf ears.

A letter on January 16 from the acting CEO of the WA Country health Service, Margaret Denton, failed to address issues raised in a letter from the chairman of the York Health Advisory Group, Julian Krieg, in December last year.

Representing the Western Wheatbelt District Health Advisory Council, Mr Krieg, said the group believed it was essential that all small hospitals delivering home care services be able to compete with private providers for federal funds. Mr Krieg pointed out that in July 2018, the then Minister for Aged Care, Ken Wyatt, said the Federal Government saw no reason that this could not happen. But this would require WACHS to work out an appropriate mechanism to allow the funding to be made available through the overall WACHS budget.

He said that the letter from Ms Denton tried to divert attention away from the central issue of funding for the very successful local Multipurpose Health Services saying it would take time for other providers to enter the market. "The WACHS welcomes the opportunity of other providers entering the market to deliver the range of home and community care services to meet the needs of the community and provide greater choice... there are more consumer directed service models affording older people greater care choice based on needs and promoting well-aging in the community setting," the letter said.

It goes on to say: "We acknowledge it will take time for other providers to establish themselves and maintain service delivery particularly in small communities and it is important to note that WACHS would complement rather than compete with these providers. I am advised it was acknowledged at the meeting in York that WACHS may need to be a 'provider of last resort' in some locations where no alternative provider exists or is likely to establish a service and where this is the case WACHS will need to engage and negotiate with the Commonwealth".

Then in what appears to be a contradiction to the earlier part of the letter, Ms Denton, says: "The Australian Government recently commissioned an independent review of the MPS model that found, overall, the flexibility of the MPS model supports delivery of aged care services that meet the needs of rural and remote communities. A key recommendation from the review is for the Commonwealth and States to work collaboratively to examine the home based care funding model. WACHS Aged Care Directorate will be meeting with Commonwealth representatives to progress this recommendation".

Mr Krieg said: "There has been no community consultation. The response does not address community concerns and is contradictory, devious and unacceptable. It is abundantly clear that there are very few private care providers willing or interested in delivering care packages in country areas. What is more, there are instances where the few that do, charge excessive administration fees that mean people aren't able to afford the care they need. In an example that came to light recently, a family of a 90-year old in Dalwallinu complained that there was no provider in the area to deliver his care package and was given a list of six providers, including two based in Melbourne. None had a care provider in the town," he said.

"Our concern is that the delay in WACHS resolving the issue of funding for aged care through the MPS model is adversely impacting on the morale and retention of skilled, caring staff and on small country hospitals and allied health services putting their long term futures at risk, "Mr Krieg said.

Trying for a Baby? It Takes Two to Tango!

As blokes we are all aware that there are a range of steps, pills and behaviours that the women in our lives can take in the effort to conceive. An often-neglected part of the equation is how we as men look after our own health in order to maximise the chances of a successful conception. You know what they say, "It takes two to tango!"

Age: Blokes are quite capable of producing sperm well into their seventies as Pablo Picasso and Charlie Chaplin famously proved. Unfortunately, the quality of sperm declines as men age. Blokes over the age of 45 might find that their partners take longer to fall pregnant and that the risk of miscarriage increases. As dads get older, they also start to run a slightly higher risk of having children with a range of mental health issues or autism compared with younger dads. Obviously, our age is beyond our control, but if you are considering starting a family, start trying sooner rather than later!

General Health: Get active as physical activity is good for your health in general and will also help you maintain a healthy weight and improve the health of your sperm.

Diet:

- 1. Maintain a healthy weight as being overweight can impair sperm production. Testosterone helps sperm production; however excess fat increases the presence of oestrogen.
- 2. A healthy balanced diet including plenty of fruit and vegies. Antioxidants and polyunsaturated fats improve sperm motility.

Chemicals:

- Abstain from illicit drugs. They reduce the sperm count and affect the production of male hormones. Steroids also have a negative impact on sperm and therefore should be avoided.
- 2. Prescription and over the counter medicines you use may affect your fertility. You may need to change some medications while you're trying to conceive.
- 3. If you are a smoker, then guit. Smoking affects sperm motility and the DNA within.
- 4. Exposure to toxic chemicals both in the workplace and in everyday life can affect sperm. Limit exposure and use protective clothing.

Temperature: Jocks too tight? Laptop sitting on top of your crown jewels? Either way, temperature regulation is imperative to sperm health, and overheating is a leading cause of low sperm counts.

Trying to conceive can be difficult, hopefully these steps may help take the pressure off what should be a joyous time.



Thank you to the very talented Joanne Wheat from Nine Mile Design for designing our Early Years Logo – it looks fantastic!









Backyard Buddies

Your monthly guide to pests, weed March 2020

The Ant Blitz is on!



Want to know what your problem ants are and how to control them? Or simply keen to contribute to ant surveillance in WA?

Our Department is running an Ant Blitz from the 24 February to 3 April 2020 and is encouraging samples and reports of unfamiliar ants in WA. If you have an ant problem in your property and have been struggling with control - why not collect a sample, submit it to our department and we will tell you what they are and how to control them (if needed).

Unless you know the species of ant, control can be guesswork, time consuming, and sadly you can waste a fair bit of money trying different products. Sending in samples for identification can help you choose the right product.

By submitting samples, you can also learn about the types of ants at your property and contribute to ant surveillance in WA. The recent detection of two exotic and problematic species; Red Imported Fire Ants (RIFA) and Browsing ants in WA, is testament to the ability of ants to arrive in WA via freight and cargo. Their rapid detection provides the best chance of eradication and preventing the

economic, social and environmental impacts of these ants - so help with surveillance to keep the world's worst ants out of WA!

Sampling Instructions

- Brush ants into a sealed container or zip lock bag and place in the freezer for 1 hour.
- Label samples with the collection location (e.g. backyard, kitchen, bathroom, driveway etc.), your name, contact number, email address and postal address.
- Deliver or post to: Ant Blitz, Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development, Pest and Disease Information Service, 3 Baron-Hay Court, South Perth WA 6151.






