You may have noticed the area next to Elders has been cleared ready for the Youth Activity Area. The playground will be relocated to the BBQ area next to river and the shelter has been erected at the RV Park. Construction at the Youth Activity Area is expected to commence early June.

Meanwhile at our local Men's Shed, Ken and Daryl (pictured below) have been busily restoring an Austin Truck for the area. Ken has been panel beating and spray painting the body of the truck with Daryl rebuilding the tray out of wood, giving it a new lease on life.

The truck's former life was as Beverley's rubbish truck, owned by the Shire of Beverley Works Crew before retiring at the Avondale Machinery Museum. We look forward to seeing it featured as a hang out spot at the Youth Activity Area.





SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



COVID-19

The Shire has recently reopened the Town Hall, Amenities Building, Caravan Park and Netball Courts for hire. All places have a developed COVID-19 Safety Plan and restrictions do apply when hiring. The gymnasium and playgrounds currently remain closed.

Important Notice - Rates, Fees and Charges 2020/21

The draft 2020/2021 Budget is being planned with a rates freeze and Council set fees and charges should remain at 2019/20 levels. Whilst a true rates freeze is what Council would have hoped for, in late May 2020 we received advice from the Valuer General that rural assessments have been revaluated and values have increased at an average of 4.19%. Council are extremely disappointed that the State Government are going ahead with this increase after lobbying by LG's and WALGA not to implement this years valuations, particularly in light of the COVID-19 pandemic. This ultimately means that even though Council will not be increasing the overall revenue raised, some rural landowners may see a difference in their 2020/21 rates assessment when compared to their 2019/20 assessment.

Kinetic Sculpture

Thank you to everyone who participated in the Kinetic Sculpture survey. Of the responses received, 79% were in favour of leaving the sculpture where it is. Council resolved that the sculpture will remain in its current location. Many comments suggested the commissioning of another sculpture, this is something Council will take into consideration for the 2020/21 Budget.

Youth Activity Area Update

The Youth Activity Area is underway with a scanning of the site complete and erection of the fencing along the railway line. In addition, the Beverley Mens Shed have been working on the conversion of an old Austin Truck which will add to the play equipment.

Roads

The June roads programme (dependent on weather) includes maintenance grading in various locations throughout the Shire and bitumen sealing on George Street and ANZAC Lane.

On Site Accommodation

Council has progressed planning on building up to six on site accommodation units at the vacant site north of the existing Caravan Park. It is intended the units will be constructed by local tradesman/business under the project leadership of Rozema builders. This location is on the same title as the Caravan Park and existing services can be extended to service the development (at significantly reduced utility headworks cost).

It is acknowledged that there are existing accommodation options in town, however the proposed units are seen as offering a different type of family accommodation and will be complementary to the hospitality businesses in town as these units will not have any cooking facilities, therefore directing people to eat and shop from pubs, cafes and the supermarket.

This project is directly supporting local tradesman and will work towards providing a boost to local business via increased visitation which will be crucial in the recovery phase of COVID 19. The On Site Accommodation project is to be funded utilising funding from the Drought Communities Program Extension and Council Reserves.

Signage


The Tourism Officer and Shire Planner recently completed an audit of street signage throughout the Shire. From the review, new directional signage stacks have been ordered which will assist visitors at the corner of John Street and Hunt Road and another two at John Street and Forrest Street.

Brooking Street Reserve

Council has approved the development of two small walk trail loops in the Brooking Street Reserve which will have marker posts and directions. There will be one large interpretive sign at the beginning of the trail that is at the parking area. The interpretive sign is a work in progress as the information, photography and design is collated. The Shire are hoping to have the works complete before the main wildflower season starts which has seen increasing numbers to the Shire in past two years. The walk trails will help preserve the reserve by eliminating extra unnecessary footpaths throughout the reserve.





DROUGHT RELIEF FUNDING

The Salvation Army is delivering assistance through the Australian governments Drought Community Support Initiative (DCSI - Round 2). The second round of this assistance commenced on 21 November 2019.

If you are a farmer, farm worker, farm supplier or farm contractor who is doing it tough due to the drought you may be eligible for a one off payment of up to \$3,000.

To be eligible you need to be:

- Over the age of 18 years
- Be an Australian citizen or permanent resident
- Live and / or work in the Shire of Beverley (or Brookton, Pingelly, Corrigin or Quairading)
- Have not already received this payment from The Salvation Army or St Vincent de Paul since 21 November 2019.

The maximum amount a household can receive is \$3,000. If more than one eligible household members reside in the same residence, the total assistance provided to the household cannot exceed \$3,000.

You can apply for the drought assistance online at <u>www.salvationarmy.org.au/drought</u> (preferred method) or by calling the 24/7 Telephone Assistance Line on 1300 551 030. If your preferred method is to call the Telephone Assistance Line, please only use this line to make a new application and please leave a voice message with all the information requested.

The Salvation Army has distributed over \$28million of this funding to over 9,900 drought affected households since 21 November 2019, and as at 31 March 2020 were distributing over \$1.2million every three days. As you would appreciate, demand for this assistance has been high.

The Salvation Army will call you to complete your assessment as soon as they can. Please do not make a second application if you have already applied as they will get to you.

The payment is not considered taxable income. If you had assistance in DCSI (Round 1) which concluded on 30 June 2019 you are eligible to apply for assistance for DCSI (Round 2).



FROM THE BEVERLEY TIMES 100 YEARS AGO

Bulk Handling of Wheat. MEETING AT BEVERLEY.

ADDRESS BY MR. J. H.PROWSE, M.H.R.

[Federal Member for Swan – Country Party]

There was a large attendance of farmers and others from the immediate and surrounding districts at the meeting held in the Mechanics' Institute on Monday afternoon to hear an address on the bulk handling question by Mr. J. H. Prowse, M.H.R. The chair was taken by Mr. F. McDonald (Chairman of the Beverley Road Board), who briefly introduced the speaker.



Before Mr. Prowse's address a moving picture entitled "Bulk Handling in Canada." was screened, giving a realistic pictorial description of what is being done in our sister Dominion across the seas. The pictures shown gave a good idea of the system in all its branches, and was an educational treat which was thoroughly appreciated by all present.

Mr. Prowse, in the course of a clear and concise description of the scheme, said that it was not a new idea, and the countries which had adopted it, Canada, Argentina, etc., would never return to bags as a means of marketing their grain. The money expended in bags was a distinct loss to Australia, and in this State represented a waste of about half a million of money. The difference between bags and bulk handling worked out at approximately 5½ per bushel, which could be saved to the primary producers, who were at present handicapped by a costly and antiquated system. To defray the cost of the installation of the bulk handling scheme the Commonwealth Government was prepared to advance two-thirds of the capital outlay at 6 per cent., repayable in 30 years, and there was in his opinion no time more opportune than the present for the introduction of the system in Australia, as he considered that for the coming season the farmer would receive at least 10s per bushel for his wheat. He was optimistic as regard the farming industry in Western Australia, and believed that farming land in this State was due for a very appreciable advance in value.

Mr. Prowse's address was attentively listened to throughout, and at its close Mr. White, inspector for the Westralian Farmers Ltd, who accompanied Mr. Prowse on his tour, read the prospectus of the company, to be known as "The West Australian Grain Growers Co-operative Elevators Ltd.," to have a capital of a million and a half sterling in 1,500,000 shares of £1 each. He also read a petition to be forwarded to the Premier with a view to facilitating the introduction of the bulk handling system in Western Australia. A committee consisting of Messrs. J. L. Thomas, R. C. Smith, H. W. A. Tanner, F. H. Blechynden and J. R. Bremner was appointed to advance the movement in this district, and a goodly number of those present put in their applications for shares and signed the petition to the Premier. [19 June 1920]

There was not a dull moment from the first rise of the curtain until it was finally rung down on the last act, and it is seldom that residents in the country have an opportunity of witnessing a production by players of the calibre of Ronn Shafto's company, all of whom acquitted themselves in a manner which stamped them as thorough artistes in their profession.

Sudden Death. MR. JOHN FLEET.

Quite a sensation was caused on Saturday night by the sudden and unexpected death of Mr. John Fleet. He had not been feeling very well during the afternoon and evening, but nothing of a serious nature was suspected. He was resting on his bed when the train came in and Mrs. Fleet went down for the paper. Returning shortly afterwards she found him lying on the bed with his mouth open. Feeling alarmed at his appearance she tried to arouse him, but was unable to-do so and subsequently, communicated with the Police and Dr. Butler. The latter, upon examination, found life to be extinct, but the body was still warm. The doctor performed an autopsy the following morning, and gave a certificate to the effect that death was caused by failure of the action of a fatty heart induced by the engorgement of the lungs and by right pleurisy. An inquiry was consequently deemed unnecessary.







Blokes and Dehydration

We've all heard the old rule of thumb "8 glasses of water per day". We shouldn't be surprised to learn that this is an approximation for the average person and doesn't consider gender or lifestyle. In fact, eight glasses a day might actually be leaving us dehydrated and the average intake for blokes might have to be revised upwards to about 13 glasses.

Men generally require more water than women due to their (on average) higher fat free mass and energy expenditure. Physical activity is a major influencer of water consumption in the body, the more physical activity we do the more we need to hydrate. We get thirsty once we start to dehydrate so, during exercise its important to keep up our liquid intake prior to feeling those pangs of thirst.

Climate is another consideration. Obviously, someone with a desk job has lower hydration requirements than a boilermaker working in a confined space in summer in the Pilbara. What is not so obvious is the fact that the desk jockey may have elevated water requirements due to air-conditioning; the dry air increases the body's water needs.

We do get some of our daily water requirements through our food, as many fruits and vegetables have a high-water content, i.e. watermelon, tomato, cucumber etc. We can also count flavoured drinks as some of our intake, but water is the preferred option. Drinks with a high sugar content should be avoided, and before anyone says, "Well, three beers is a litre!" there's an important distinction to make. Coffee and beer are examples of diuretics (substances which make us pee) therefore regardless of the intake there may be a nett loss happening. For example, for every 200ml of full-strength beer consumed, you pee around 320ml. That works out to drinking a six-pack and peeing 10 stubbies!

What Can We Do?

- Assume we are dehydrated; it is so common as to almost be the norm.
- Drink around 13 glasses of water per day, more if you are doing physically demanding work or sweating profusely.
- During exercise drink every 15 minutes to pre-empt dehydration.
- Use your pee as an indicator. Pale or straw-coloured is ok; yellow means dehydrated, and dark or verging on a brown colour is a sign of severe dehydration.
- Water is by far the best form of hydration. The electrolytes in sports drinks are also present in a balanced diet. Sports drinks only have a role for endurance athletes who, during an event, push beyond the body's natural stores of minerals.
- When calculating water intake, consider the effects of diuretics like alcohol and caffeine.

 Remember "Drink 6 Pee 10".

Keeping on top of dehydration is more than just drinking heaps of water. We need to understand that at different times, our hydration demands fluctuate. We need to be active observers of our bodies and take responsibility for keeping it in peak working order.

Update on COVID-19

The current advice from GolfWA is that, under Stage 2 restrictions, we are able to conduct internal club competitions only. 



Committees should assess the risks associated with resuming pony club activities and reconsider any aspect that does not comply with all local, state and federal government restrictions, social distancing and hygiene guidelines.



Monday 4th May 2020

- Groups of no more than 10 people should be gathered on the grounds at any one time
 - Group activities should be set at a maximum of 4.
 - One support person per rider is permitted.
- Non riding siblings are not permitted. Gear Checking should be conducted by the rider's support person
- to maintain social distancing. This is an ideal opportunity for
- Club rooms are not to be accessed by participants or support
- Toilets should be made available, however only used if necessary and with cleaning materials on hand.
- Horses are to be tied up to floats or placed in owners float yards. Riders should bring their own water and buckets. Taps and hoses are not to be used.
- Horses should be sponged down using own water and buckets if required. Taps and hoses are not to be used.

 Hand washing facilities or hand sanitiser to be available.
- Disinfectant to be stationed at the gate for use on gate latch during entry/exit to the ground
- Participation is to be restricted to club members.

Monday 18th May 2020

- Ensure that your club has a COVID-19 Safety and Hygiene plan in place. All members, coaches and officials are to be familiar with this plan so activities can be modified accordingly, and risk managed.
- Groups of no more than 20 people should be gathered on the grounds or training zone at any one time The 20-person limit to include participants, parents, siblings, spectators, coaches and club coordinators.
- If using multiple training zones, ensure there is suitable distancing to prevent one gathering encroaching on another gatherings area.

 Consider staggering starting times for lessons to avoid congestion or crossover of groups.
- Gear Checking should be conducted by the rider/support person under coach supervision to maintain social distancing. This is an ideal opportunity for education!
- Club rooms can be accessed by participants with the 4sgm rule applied
- Toilets should be made freely available.
- Thorough and regular dearing of common contact surfaces, 'high touch' items and shared amenities, such as handles, taps, lundronoms, and toilets to be actioned.

 Yardystables should be separated and allocated according to training groups. One horse is permitted per yardystable per day. Alternatively, horses are to be tied up to floats or placed in owners float yards.
- Cashless canteens can be operated for take away food and drink with physical and social distance practices applied for queuing and consumption of food.
- Riders should bring their own water, buckets and sponges. Taps and hoses are not to be used. Horses should be sponged down using own water and buckets if required. Taps and hoses are not to b

- Disinfectant to be stationed at the gate for use on gate latch during entry/exit to the ground.
- Participation is to be restricted to dub members.

CANTER


