# SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



#### COVID-19

The Shire has recently reopened the Playgrounds and changerooms under Phase 3 in addition to the Town Hall, Amenities Building, Caravan Park and Netball Courts that were opened in Phase 2. All places have a developed COVID-19 Safety Plan and restrictions do apply when hiring. At the time of writing, Phase 4 was just announced which will allow the gymnasium to open. The 2sqm rule will still apply to our patron limits in Shire buildings.

# Important Notice - Rates , Fees and Charges 2020/21

In case you missed it in the June Blarney: the draft 2020/2021 Budget is being planned with a rates freeze and Council set fees and charges should remain at 2019/20 levels. Whilst a true rates freeze is what Council would have hoped for, in late May 2020 we received advice from the Valuer General that rural assessments have been revaluated and values have increased at an average of 4.19%. Council are extremely disappointed that the State Government are going ahead with this increase after lobbying by LG's and WALGA not to implement this years valuations, particularly in light of the COVID-19 pandemic. This ultimately means that even though Council will not be increasing the overall revenue raised, some rural landowners may see a difference in their 2020/21 rates assessment when compared to their 2019/20 assessment.



#### **New Pump Station for Beverley**

Water Corporation will soon begin construction of a new pump station on Hutchinson Street, near to the intersection of Hunt Rd in Beverley. This essential work also includes installation of 250m of connecting water supply main along Hutchinson Street.





#### BEVERLEY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

FROM THE BEVERLEY TIMES 100 YEARS AGO

14 December 1918

#### Pneumonic Influenza.

TRANSPORT BOONAH'S CASES. VERY SERIOUS OUTBREAK.

#### DEATH OF PRIVATE DING.

The transport Boonah, which arrived at Fremantle on Wednesday, had on board a great many cases of pneumonic (or Spanish) influenza, the number of cases increasing to no less than 350 by Thursday night, by which time five had proved fatal, and another patient, our old friend, Private A. W. Ding, of Beverley, passed away yesterday morning. The patients have been landed at Woodman's Point, whilst for the present the healthy passengers and crew will remain on the boat in Gage Roads. The Boonah, which was proceeding to Europe with troops when news of the signing of the armistice was received, was ordered back from Durban; at which port she spent eight days, and the first case of influenza developed on the day of her departure for Fremantle. Everything possible is being done to prevent the spread of the complaint by the central health authorities, and with this end in view a circular letter has been sent by them to the various health boards throughout the State, asking the latter to make necessary preliminary arrangements in anticipation of an outbreak in their respective centres. The preliminary arrangements which the Central Board of Health require to have attended to are summarised as follows:—

- 1. The appointment of a small executive to perfect local organisation and assume control of affairs if an outbreak occurs.
- 2. Review the motor transport in the district suitable for use as ambulances or readily convertible to this purpose.
- 3. Invite the registration of those persons willing to give their aid to the health authorities in the various capacities of domestic assistance, nursing, orderly work, street patrol, etc.
- 4. Open public inoculation depots, well advertise the fact, and encourage the public to take full advantage of these.

The first intimation Mrs. Ding had that her husband had contracted the complaint was received by her on Thursday, and she and her two children left for Perth by the same afternoon's train. Yesterday the sad news was received in Beverley that Mr. Ding had passed away. Deceased had been in business in this town for a number of years prior to his enlistment a few months ago, and he held the respect and esteem of the whole community. Only last Saturday he was appointed Secretary of the local Hospital in anticipation of his early return to Beverley. He leaves a widow and two boys to mourn his loss, to whom the sympathy of a host of friends goes out in their sad bereavement.

#### Pneumonic Influenza.

PUBLIC MEETING AT BEVERLEY.

A public meeting, convened by the Beverley Road Board, was held in the supper room of the Mechanics' Institute on Saturday night. There was a representative attendance of about 30 persons, and Mr. F. T. Broun, M.L.A., as Chairman of the Board, presided, and outlined the steps which had been taken by the Board to cope with the scourge should it make its appearance in the district. The meeting, he said, had been called that night to place the public in possession of the facts and for the purpose of forming committees to be in readiness should an outbreak occur. The District Medical Officer (Dr. Butler) said he had given the matter consideration, in conjunction with the members of the Local Board of Health, with a view to making necessary preliminary arrangements, as once pneumonic influenza got about among the people it would be too late to organise, as the progress of the complaint was so swift. They had been asked to come together for the purpose of organising and forming small committees. It had been made necessary that anyone suffering from influenza should notify the local authorities immediately. Should a case occur in the town it would be necessary to stop all public gatherings and close the schools, etc. They had been strongly advised by the Commissioner not to use the local Hospital as an isolation ward should an outbreak occur, and the local Board decided that the Mechanics' Institute would be utilised in such an event. He then went on to outline certain precautionary treasures to be taken and emphasised the necessity for early organisation and voluntary aid in the case of a visitation from the dread scourge. In answer to Mr. Royce, the Chairman said that the Board had gone carefully into the matter and the members were satisfied that the Mechanics' Institute was the most suitable building available for the purpose. After a general discussion and several questions, volunteers handed in their names for patrol, ambulance and other work necessary in case of an outbreak, and the meeting then closed.

#### The Influenza Epidemic.

Whilst the outbreak of pneumonic influenza appears to be practically stamped out in the Eastern States, it seems to be getting a firmer hold in the West, and, in addition to the cases reported in the metropolitan area, outbreaks have occurred in the various country districts, which is naturally causing considerable uneasiness. Everything possible, however, is being done by the Public Health authorities to minimise the dangers of infection, and, with the assistance of the public in conforming to the regulations laid down by the Department, it is hoped that anything in the way of a panic may be averted. All cases of an auspicious character should be at once reported to the proper authorities.

In so far as the Beverley district is concerned, seven cases of pneumonia, following upon ordinary influenza, have been reported, but it is satisfactory to note that none of the patients have developed dangerous symptoms. The Government Medical Officer (Dr. Butler) and the local health authorities are fully alive to the possibilities of the situation, and in all cases which have come under their notice isolation of the patients has been resorted to, and every precaution is being taken to prevent a spread of the complaint. The patients are at present all being treated in their own homes, but should it be found necessary, arrangements have already been made for the lease of a cottage as an isolation hospital. The public are advised to adopt all precautionary measures, and to report any and every suspicious case which may occur to the local authorities.

At York, where there are said to be approximately between 40 and 50 cases under treatment, the State School has been closed and taken over by the health authorities as a temporary isolation hospital. The disease is spreading throughout the town and district, and Drs. Montgomery and Ward have their hands full in giving attention to the large number of cases brought under their notice. 





#### **LIVESTOCK THEFT**



In the Wheatbelt over the last 2 weeks there has been an increase in livestock theft. The latest theft only happened just out of the Beverley. Large amounts of sheep on both occasions have been stolen.

Whilst the latest incidents have targeted livestock, that doesn't mean that any other items on your property are safe. Below are some tips that you may already be doing or maybe you can incorporate to your security arrangements on your farm already.


Research indicates that opportunity and visibility are key factors for thieves. If thieves believe they can get into and out of your property and easily and without being seen, your property is at a higher risk.

- Consider visibility when designing and erecting new buildings, sheds or stockyards. (Ideally these should be in sight of a farm house).
- Prevent accessibility to your property. Gates should be as strong as possible, mounted securely to strong corner posts. Secure gates with quality heavy duty chains and locks.
- If possible, use heavy duty rollers or metal gates at the entrance to sheds and any outbuildings.
- Consider the installation of movement sensor cameras or closed circuit television (CCTV) if practical. This can assist in the successful identification and prosecution of offenders.
- SIGNS should be placed at entrance points to your property advising that it is "Private Property" and that "Trespassers will be prosecuted".
- Warn intruders of security measures used on your property: electronic monitoring; sensor lights; guard dogs and identification markings.
- If it is necessary to leave machinery on site overnight, leave it in view of a farmhouse or highly visible area. Where this is not practical, park out of sight of any passing traffic.
- Where possible, store farm machinery in a secure shed or enclosure preferably in sight of a farm house.
- Secure equipment with heavy chains and quality locks. Either chain and lock pieces of equipment together; to trees or other stationary objects; or chain the rear of vehicle to the front wheel/axle.
- ALWAYS lock vehicles and machinery.
- NEVER attempt to hide the keys in a location nearby.
- NEVER leave valuable items displayed inside a vehicle or leave tools and other items scattered in vehicle trays. If a tool box is attached, secure the contents with a quality padlock.
- Maintain an accurate inventory of all your vehicles and machinery including: registration; chassis and model numbers; and VIN numbers.
- Photograph or video machinery and valuables to enable easy identification.
- Keep all paddocks, shed and stockyard gates closed and locked. Use locking posts to obstruct large openings to yards.
- If possible, locate stockyards/loading ramps away from public road and any entrance to your property. Ensure loading ramps are stored out of sight when not in use.
- Regularly check stock. Also check paddocks and fences for any signs of trespass and/or damage.

  - 1) create a sense of alarm or urgency, or require immediate action

  - 3) ask for your personal information.
- Be aware of fraudulent charities or crowdfunding campaigns.
- Register on www.staysmartonline.gov.au/alert-service for updates on online threats.
- Do not download mobile apps from unknown sources.





#### What is a Mental Health Care Plan?

The term mental health encompasses all aspects of our emotional, psychological and social wellbeing, it affects how we feel, think and interact with the world around us. It's important to acknowledge that "dealing with life's challenges and changes" can be difficult at times and place our mental health and wellbeing under pressure. The effects of this will be different for all of us, as we all have an innate but varying capacity to cope and deal with these pressures.

A **Mental Health Care Plan** is designed for someone struggling with their mental health and wellbeing or experiencing a mental health disorder as diagnosed by a doctor. This mental health treatment plan is about **YOU and your GP** having a conversation and both agreeing that you need additional support. The mental health treatment plan is written out by a GP and identifies what type of extra support you need. It is really about patient and doctor agreeing on what is needed to help you achieve your goals and to support your recovery journey.

#### A Mental Health Care Plan may include:

- Referral to a psychologist, counsellor or other mental / allied health professional.
- A discussion around other types of support or strategies to help you.
- Review of current medication or the prescription of new medication.
- Other health checks or blood tests to explore other physical health issues.

Another major benefit of a *Mental Health Care Plan* is that it comes under the *Better Access* initiative, which entitles you to a Medicare rebate for up to 10 sessions with a mental health professional. The current guidelines do not cover all 10 session in one year. Your plan will cover you for 6 sessions, following that you can discuss with your GP whether the additional 4 sessions would be of benefit via a Mental Health Care Plan review and additional referral.

#### Some things to remember in context to a Mental Health Care Plan:

- When booking an appointment with your GP ask for a longer consult or mention the reason for the booking (struggling with mental health / discuss care plan etc.)
- Sometimes there can be waiting periods to see psychs / counsellors. Discuss alternate support options until you can get an appointment. This may include family, friends, support lines or other services. Options can be limited in rural and remote areas.
- Like any plan, it gives us direction, but it's important it is actively reviewed through follow-up appointments with your GP and check-ins to monitor progress.

Recovery from mental health and wellbeing challenges and / or mental illness is an ongoing process and is often referred to as the *recovery journey*. When we can seek help, talk about, normalise and work through our mental health and wellbeing problems, the boundaries of our comfort zone grow and expand. This is also how we grow as individuals and is the true meaning of resilience!

#### THE "NORMAL" FOR POLICE OFFICERS

It's not normal, to see the things police officers see, hear, smell, touch and experience.

It's not normal, to carry the burdens police officers do, emotionally, physically, and mentally.

It's not normal, to see dead bodies, mangled bodies, decomposed bodies, dead children, abused children, homeless people suffering, and people victimized, taken advantage of, raped or killed.

It's not normal, to respond to scenes of horrific suicides, fatal car accidents, gang violence, domestic violence, random violence, dead animals, and abused animals.

It's not normal, to tell a family member their loved one has died and won't be coming home due to some event accidental or otherwise.

It's not normal, to respond to shooting calls where you watch someone take their last breath, or stabbing calls that make you cringe when you see their flesh cut wide open and blood everywhere.

It's not normal, to stand next to a dead body for hours securing a crime scene, waiting for the coroner to arrive, so you can go eat dinner, as if nothing happened, as if "it's just another call".

It's not normal, that seeing such horrific things becomes your "normal" and you tell yourself it doesn't bother you. It's not normal, to be numb to things that would likely devastate the rest of society.

It's not normal, to experience extreme highs and lows in one day, one minute you're typing a report and the next you're responding to the local business being held up at gunpoint with shots fired.

It's not normal, to work rotating shifts, rotating days off, work on holidays, birthdays, anniversaries and maintain a semblance of a "normal" life. It's not normal, to miss these moments in life and expect it not to take a toll on a marriage or the relationship with your children.

It's not normal, to slowly lose friends that aren't police officers too. It's not normal to say, "they just don't understand me anymore" or "they don't know what it is like to be a police officer". It's not normal, for lifelong friends to wonder why you've changed, become more cynical or even angry and distance themselves from you.

It's not normal, to go to work and not know what time you will get to go home, or if you'll even make it home at all.

It's not normal, to wake up at night in a cold sweat because you dreamed you got shot multiple times by a "bad guy" and you were powerless to stop it. It's not normal, to lie in bed unable to sleep, because all the things you saw that day play in your head like a bad movie you can't turn off.

It's not normal, that nearly every call you answer, someone is counting on YOU to help them. They may be at their lowest point, maybe they are experiencing a crisis, a loss, and you have to be there for them, no matter what is going on in your personal life.

It's not normal, that you as a human being could be personally dealing with a crisis, a divorce, a dying family member, alcohol addiction, or thoughts of suicide, and you're expected to show up and solve other people's problems with no regard for your own.

It's not normal, to go to work every day in hopes of making a positive change or influence in someone's life only to be spat at, kicked, punched, stabbed, or shot. It's not normal, to feel you can't "win", no matter what you do, or how many lives you save or stickers you give to children.

It's not normal, that simply sitting in your work vehicle being present, can get you shot and killed because the decal on that work vehicle said, "POLICE" on it.

It's not normal, to be shot while eating dinner, minding your own business, only because the patch on your shoulder said, "POLICE".

It's not normal, to never be "off duty". To always be alert, aware, cautious, even concerned, that you may be a target at any given time due to your chosen profession.

It's not normal, you do the job and maintain a professional demeanor or smile while holding back tears, because in the end you know, someone has to do it and you're proud that you aren't normal.

It's not normal, to attend a funeral for a co-worker who died doing the same job as you.

It's not normal, that no matter how much all these things bother you, you couldn't see yourself doing any other job, because carrying this burden is what you were meant to do. This is your calling.

Luckily their normal is not your normal. If you're reading this and you aren't a police officer, some of the things you just read may have bothered you. Odds are good, the images that popped into your head made you uncomfortable or were hard to think about or even picture. I hope this was the case, because that is a police officer's daily reality. At the very least, I hope it changes your perspective of police officers and what it is they actually do and experience every single day.

Maybe now when you see them, you don't just see a man or woman in a uniform that took an oath to protect you, but also a person who runs toward the things most run away from each and every day. They see things, so you don't have to see them. They carry a heavy burden and do it because they were chosen to carry it, so you don't have to.

Being a police officer is much more than writing traffic tickets, breaking up a fun little house party with underage high school students, or responding to the fender bender to facilitate the exchange of personal information. A police officer is much more than what meets the eye or what you see on television.


I hope all that is said, changes that. The next time you read about a fatal car accident or horrible tragedy, feel sympathy and empathy for the victims, but don't forget the people responding to the scene, what they experienced and how they are affected as well.

Being a police officer is recognizing that you will see the worst side of humanity that society has to offer, and you accept that as your normal. Chances are good that when a police officer starts their career, they have thought about these things but didn't quite know what it actually meant until they experienced it firsthand.

It takes a special kind of person to do this job, one that isn't..."normal".

To the hundreds of thousands of brothers and sisters in blue around the world, who put their lives and their "normal" on the line every day, thank you.

## **Backyard Buddies**

July 2020

European wasp season closes







The Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development's (DPIRD) 2019-20 surveillance season has now closed, with 118 nests detected and destroyed.


Operations spanned >140,000ha, with 4200+ traps across 21 Local Government Areas (LGAs), and DPIRD received more than 1000 public enquiries.

Regional detections in Hyden and Geraldton were a testament to strong community awareness, with reports of wasps eating meat stew at the Wave Rock Caravan Park, and wasps scavenging on a discarded hamburger patty in Geraldton!

The season's highlight was the collaborative and joint efforts between DPIRD, the Shire of Mundaring, City of Kalamunda, Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions and local residents which reaped rewards - nest numbers plummeted in these LGAs, from 56 last season to just seven this season. This is proof of what can be achieved when a community joins forces to hunt down and destroy one of the most destructive wasp species.

Significant progress was also made across other hot spots in Perth - City of Gosnells, Canning, Cockburn, Swan and Belmont.

Thank you to all those who kept their eyes peeled this season! Operations run December through May/June, but reports of suspect wasps can be made year-round.

As restrictions are gradually being lifted, we are hoping to have a meeting on Tuesday 04 August but please wait for this to be confirmed. In the meantime we have reviewed our activities for the rest of the year and here is our tentative agenda.

August 04 – meeting at the CRC conference room with Linley giving us a talk about herbs.

September 01 – Visit to gardens in York and a sculptor plus a talk on bee keeping.

October 06 – Meeting at the Dead Finish and a visit to the Brooking Street reserve to view the orchids.

October 16 - Visit to Lake farm with the Mundaring garden club with lunch at the Hotel Beverley.

October 23 and 24<sup>-</sup> Beverley Rose Show

November 10<sup>-</sup> AGM and Bonsai talk.

December 01- Christmas lunch at Greenhills.

#### **Garden Tips**

- Oreat time to plant now, so pop in some Brussels sprouts, cabbage, cauliflower and broccoli. Peas and beans can also go in, as well as radish, turnips, Swedes and spinach.
- It's time to get happy with herbs, so try some chamomile and lemon grass. You could give mint and lemon balm a go as well, but be careful to contain them as they can take over.
- Why not try some lovely flowering stuff in your patch as well, like: cornflower, calendula, dianthus, pansies, viola, snapdragons, stock, ageratum and marigolds. These guys are great at attracting pollinators and beneficial insects to your patch, and I reckon they look tops as well.
- You should start seeing bare rooted fruit and deciduous trees starting to appear in your local nursery. This is the cheapest and easiest way to purchase. The stress is less for the tree

as it is dormant. Pick trees with a nice shape, and don't forget to prune them back before you plant them out (best thing to do is ask the local nursery to do it for you). Remember to make sure you have the correct pollinators to ensure a good crop. Some stone fruit trees will not fruit until they have been in the ground for a few years. So be patient.

- Consider a green manure crop to add some nutrients back into your patch, especially before planting heavy feeders in spring. At this time of year try faba bean, field pea, oats and wheat. This will improve your soil incredibly, and, for a bit of forward planning, you'll find it well worth the effort!
- ♦ Top up mulch on your veggie patches, herb gardens and ornamental beds, especially important for weed suppression at this time of year. A hot tip is to mulch after watering the patch, to a depth of about 7cm. Keep mulch clear of plant stems, especially young seedlings. Choose low environmental impact mulch, one that will enrich your soil as it breaks down.
- Plants feel the need for a feed at this time of year. A seaweed tea or low environmental impact liquid fertiliser is perfect, especially for the seedlings planted this month. Apply to the soil early in the morning, and in the concentrations mentioned on the packet.
- Weeding is still needed at this time of year. Most plant growth has slowed down, so it will not have to happen as often. But it also means that it is also a time of year to try and remove as many competitors as possible before the weather starts warming up again.
- Water smarter at this time of year. Water first thing in the morning, and instead of quickie irrigation, a nice, deep drink a couple of times a week is far more beneficial! Always check soil moisture before watering, don't waste your precious drinking water if Mother Nature has already done all the hard work for you!






