Governor tours Beverley

The Governor, Honourable Kim Beazley AC was back in Beverley on Monday 03 August to see more of the town's attractions, following on from his brief visit here in July.

He enjoyed lunch at the Hotel Beverley, with CEO Rob Cossart from Wheatbelt Development Commission, including the opportunity to meet some of our locals.

Stephen Gollan, CEO and Cr Don Davies, President, Shire of Beverley gave the Governor a guided tour of the Visitors Centre, which showcases the interactive digital displays and the 1:5 scale model, exact replica of the silver centenary plane. This was followed by the building tour of the Cornerstone. Meeting with the business owners that rent the commercial office spaces and the staff from the Community Resource Centre.

He visited the Station Gallery and Platform Theatre a multi-purpose cultural precinct that was built in 1886 in a Victorian Tudor style and restored in 2006 by a group of dedicated volunteers. As local residents would be aware, the gallery is the home to the Shire of Beverley's art collection and the Platform Theatre hosts musical and theatrical events. This is still and active railway as trains regularly pass through.

A short drive to the Avondale Agricultural Machinery Museum, (which is currently closed as it is undergoing a feasibility study) the Governor had a look through the extensive collection which tells the story of the development of farming in WA. Many of the machines have been restored to operating condition by the museum volunteers. No visit would be complete without meeting the resident Clydesdale horses, Robbie and Comet who were very happy to see the Governor.

Vincent Street Streetscape Project - Public Consultation

Council are working towards the commencement of the Vincent Street redevelopment which will include the undergrounding of power, upgrades to drainage and footpaths and the general beautification of the main street from Hunt Road to the bridge. The original concept plans developed in 2014 from robust public consultation are being refined and updated for actual construction. Public consultation of these refined drawings will be held on Tuesday 8 September 2020. You can drop in any time between 9am – 12 noon or 5pm – 8pm at the Cornerstone. Full details on next page. Due to the nature of our external funding, the consultation process will be swift so I urge all community members to make themselves aware of the project.

Over the next 18 months there will be disruptions to access via roads and footpaths and I ask for everyone's patience as the end outcome will improve safety, slow traffic, be inviting, return some greenery, improve parking and encourage visitors.

Businesses on the main street will be sent regular updates throughout the construction process.

Youth Activity Area

The Youth Activity Area is coming along nicely and on track for opening late September / early October. The concrete has been poured for the skate area and our friends at Skate Sculpture had a quick test run to ensure that it not only meets all safety requirements but is an exciting track to ride... they are very happy! Lighting has been installed and tested. The pump track and shelters will commence the first week of September.

Council has chosen to call the Youth Activity Area 'Moort Wabiny Park' which was suggested by 10yr old Grace from Beverley District High School. Moort Wabiny means Family Play in Ballardong Language. Thank you for your contribution Grace.

Graffiti

Banner Poles

It is proposed that the four poles will be relocated to the RV Park, the Community Garden, the Station Arts and the Dead Finish Museum. Thanks to Kylie for presenting a great idea.


COVID-19

Our next outing was discussed and decided we will go to York, visiting the bush garden and perhaps a walk over the swing bridge. We will car pool, meeting at the Dead Finish at 10am on Tuesday 01 September.

The Annual Rose Show will go ahead as planned unless the Covid 19 takes a turn for the worse and we are shut down again. The date is set for the 23 and 24 October and we are hoping to have a bumper crop of roses again this year.



Tips for Planting in September

- Plant seeds for flowers and vegetables for summer
- Fertilise strawberries to encourage a bumper crop
- · Get weeds under control
- Apply a slow-release lawn food to all grassed areas
- Use a metal rake to remove any build-up of thatch
- Increase watering of potted plants as the weather warms up
- Apply a slow-release fertiliser to all potted plants
- Tidy up ornamental grasses to promote new growth
- · Fertilise all plants and lawns as growth resumes
- Prune hibiscus and also prune plants that flowered in winter and early spring
- Plant herbs such as parsley, mint, coriander, and oregano
- Renew mulch on garden beds cover the soil with compost and then cover with a layer of mulch
- Watch for pests on new growth such as aphids and snails. Aphids can be squashed or treated.
- Snails and slugs can be trapped or deterred
- · Repot potted plants that are root bound
- Dead head spring annuals and bulbs



3 demerit points \$500 infringement

4 demerit points \$1,000 infringement

NEW MOBILE PHONE LAWS

In 2019, almost 20% of deaths on WA roads were caused by distracted drivers. 95% of all WA drivers acknowledge the danger associated with using their phone while driving, and yet surprisingly 50% of people still admit to this selfish behaviour.

As of **01 September 2020**, there are new increased penalties for the use of mobile phones whilst driving. The new penalties if you're caught using your phone while driving:

Penalty 1 – Touching or holding your phone for audio calls: \$500 and 3 demerit points.

Penalty 2 – More distracting tasks like texting, using social media or watching videos: \$1000 and 4 demerit points.

FAQ:

HOW CAN I LEGALLY USE MY MOBILE PHONE WHILE DRIVING A VEHICLE OR RIDING A BICYCLE?

A driver or cyclist is permitted to touch a mobile phone that is securely mounted to the vehicle or bicycle to accept or end a phone call. Any other action will result in an infringement, and for those driving a vehicle, a demerit point penalty as well.

CAN I USE THE MAP APP ON MY MOBILE PHONE WHILE DRIVING OR RIDING?

All drivers are permitted to use their mobile phone as a navigational tool, but only if the phone is placed in a mounting secured to the vehicle, and the route is set and started before driving or riding commences. If you touch the phone while driving to change the function of the navigational app, even when secured in a mounting, you face a \$1000 infringement and 4 demerit points.

Mother Mary Stanislaus 1856-1921

Beverley Times Saturday 17 September 1921

Obituary: MOTHER MARY STANISLAUS.

The death of Mother Mary Stanislaus (Miss Annie Houlahan) occurred at the Sacred Heart Convent, Beverley, on Tuesday morning last, at the age of 65 years. Deceased was in charge of the Convent in Beverley from the date of its opening in January, 1909, until four years later, when she relinquished the position on account of ill-health, but since that time she has been in Beverley off and on ever since, with occasional breaks on account of failing health. For some time past her condition was considered most serious, especially during the past three or four months, and, despite the capable and unremitting attention of Dr. Hodgson, she passed away, as stated, on Tuesday morning, full of honours in a life spent in the service of God and the rising generation, and it is comforting to know that the influence and example of her good work will long be treasured by those who were privileged to receive her instruction.

The funeral took place on Wednesday afternoon in the local Catholic Cemetery, and the remains were followed to their last resting place by a large number of sympathising and sorrowing friends. The burial service was conducted by the Rev. Fr. O'Brien, assisted by the Rev. Dean Brennan, of Narrogin. The procession from the Convent to the graveside was headed by the altar boys bearing the Crucifix, followed by the school children, the Children of Mary Sodality and the Sodality of the Sacred Heart, Dean Brennan, Fr. O'Brien, the Sisters of the Sacred Heart and

members of the congregation. Numerous letters and telegrams of sympathy have been received from the Archbishop, the Clergy, and sympathising friends from all over the State.

Deceased was born in N.S.W. and entered religion at Hay in that State 31 years ago. She has been in Western Australia for 17 years, the greater portion of which time she spent at Beverley, where she was beloved by all who knew her, and many outside her own denomination will mourn her loss.

Is Stoicism a Dirty Word?

It's become fashionable in some circles to lump stoicism in with other, less than desirable traits like aggression, when talking about male behaviour. There is even an ongoing argument in the American Psychological Association about how it was controversially included as a harmful trait in their guidelines. Harvard professor, Steven Pinker argued the APA was misguided, "Stoicism is a good quality, not, as the new guidelines say, harmful". He's on the money when he argues that the guidelines should encourage "the masculine virtues — dignity, responsibility, self-control, and self-reliance." All of these are the qualities and virtues of manhood that we should be celebrating.

What is stoicism? Its origins go back to a school of Roman philosophy with proponents that sound like the cast of Gladiator. Roman Emperor Marcus Aurelius, playwright and political advisor Seneca, and the upwardly mobile slave, turned teacher Epictetus. But before we all don our tunics and sandals and face the lions in the Colosseum there are some modern-day and relevant ideas tied up in stoicism. Much of its underlying message is actually what underpins "mindfulness". Stoicism taught its followers the development of self-control and fortitude as a means of overcoming destructive emotions. Stoic philosophy advocates accepting life's challenges, which often are not within our control, and then focus on what to do with the given situation, which is within our control. "We can't change what is, we can only change our reaction to it".

These days the use of the word stoicism has incorrectly incorporates a "push on regardless" attitude by men in particular. It is used as a negative description for blokes failing to address ongoing health concerns by ignoring the warning signs and self-medicating by purely concentrating on their work. This is without a doubt a very dangerous attitude, but real stoicism needs to be celebrated. Every great invention, discovery or work of human endeavour has been a result of stoic behaviour. It is a trait not only found in men but women also, and it is a quality to be admired. Pregnancy and childbirth are just two examples that come to mind that couldn't possibly be achieved without a degree of stoicism.

Like anything health related, be it food, exercise, or even sunlight, the trick is "everything in moderation". If being stoic is the only plan in our playbook, then the results will be negative. However if we learn when to be stoic, and importantly, when to ask for help, our lives will benefit immeasurably.

The Stoics of old, recognized that wellbeing depends on the cultivation of one's character, on one's choices and actions, rather than on what happens in the uncontrollable world around us. It is something that the Regional Men's Health Initiative advocate every day; that the bulk of our health outcomes are influenced primarily by the choices we make and if we can be well-informed, and make informed decisions, then positive health outcomes will follow.

Backyard Buddies

Your monthly guide to pests, weeds & diseases

Woolly weather, woolly bears!

It seems to be the winter of the fluffy caterpillars, with reports of these woolly moth larvae coming in thick and fast. The affectionate name 'woolly bear' is applied to several common and widespread, native species. Let's meet two of them.





Pictured **above** is *Anthela* canescens, also known as the Western Anthelid, Family: Anthelidae. The caterpillar quite striking, with reddy-brown and black hairs mixed in with white tufted hairs. Rarely pesty, they usually feed on various *Eucalyptus* or *Corymbia* species and seek out a well-protected places such as under bark or amongst firewood to pupate. Adults are drab coloured large moths which are clumsy flyers and are attracted to light.

Pictured **below** are the caterpillar and adult of the black and white tiger moth, *Ardices glatignyi*, Family: Arctiidae. The caterpillar's colouration can be highly variable. Sadly, this one is a pest.

The caterpillar will munch its way through native plants, vegetables, herbs, rosemary, nasturtiums – just about anything green. Birds don't tend to eat these due to their hairy bodies, so if they are causing too much damage to tolerate, control by hand or select a product suitable for caterpillars. The moths do not damage plants, but are commonly attracted to light.
