Please make sure you place your Scheme ID is legible on your bags (tape and permanent marker work just fine).

Currently, bag drop off is on Wednesday and Saturday afternoons from 1pm until 4pm. In the future, a separate bin will be permanently placed there and emptied weekly – meaning you can drop your bags off at any time!

Refunds appear to be processed within approximately 72 business hours.

The year is nearly over but there are still jobs to do in the garden during December before relaxing over Christmas.

Vegies to plant in December include – capsicum, eggplant, lettuce, tomato, zucchini, beetroot, celery and pumpkin.

Flowers to plant in December include – portulaca, sunflower, begonia, marigold, petunia, verbena, salvia and impatiens.

December is a great time to attend to the following tasks:

- Protect ferns from burning sun and strong winds. Maiden Hair ferns don't like to dry out at all
- Add mulch to outdoor potted plants to conserve water
- Watch for fungal diseases on roses and vegies. Help keep plants healthy by removing disease affected leaves
- Blue-green algae affects ponds and stagnant water in summer and pets should not be allowed to drink from these as it can cause illness
- Harvest leafy green vegies when the leaves are small and young and harvest often
- Bundle pots together for easier watering, especially if someone is looking after your garden while you are away
- When harvesting Basil, take a bit from each plant rather than stripping one. Pinch out tips to encourage lots of new growth
- Cover your worm farm with damp hessian to keep it cool and shaded
- Keep an eye on any new plantings. Nursery plants are constantly watered so you need to give new plants extra water until their root system has established
- Check irrigation systems to ensure they are all working properly, with all spray heads and drippers running freely
- Top up mulches to reduce moisture loss and moderate soil temperatures during summer. It also helps to suppress weeds
- Ripen green tomatoes by placing them on a sunny window sill

Enjoy your time in your garden in December.

The Beverley DHS P&C has registered for a scheme ID for the Containers for Change Program. We'd love your assistance to help to raise funds for the purchase of additional educational resources and opportunities for the students at Beverley District High School. We have been successful in receiving a Containers for Change Grant, which allowed us to purchase a trailer to collect eligible containers.

This trailer is located on the school grounds, behind the canteen on Lennard Street, and is available to receive container donations at any time. Our containers are collected directly from the school each week.

Alternatively, you may drop directly to a Containers for Change Depot, using our registered scheme ID- C10242713



They'll get 10 cents for each one. With your help, we can make a change.



The scheme targets drink containers most commonly seen as litter. Most aluminium, glass, plastic, steel and liquid paperboard drink containers between 150ml and 3L are eligible for a refund.



Generally, ineligible containers are those that are less than 150ml and greater than 3L. Other ineligible containers include all plain milk bottles, while bottles, pure spirit bottles, condai and registered health tonks. Pure juice containers over 1L (or under 150ml) are also ineligible.







Warrior Wellbeing Article Dads and Father Figures Are We Selling Ourselves Short?

Modern society can at times, undervalue the role of the father in our children's lives. We tend to sell ourselves short, and the risk is that we are seen as nothing much more than sperm donors in the process of parenting. We're far more than just a second parent in the household. No other person is as likely to bring the positive outcomes that an involved dad can. Our parenting style is significantly different to the mother's, not to mention the male role modelling that is so important to both our sons' and daughters' development.

This is not saying that one parent is better than the other, in fact what is obvious is that both parenting styles are the Yin and Yang of child development and balance each other out. Whilst these are generalisations, the research backs it up. Where mums tend to preach equity, which creates a sense of security, dads model and encourage competition which helps develop independence. Dad's quite often stress rules, fairness and justice which develops the child's objectivity and sense of what's right or wrong. While mothers are the primary source of sympathy and caregiving, dads are often a driver of empathy, or the ability for the child to see the world through someone else's eyes. This might be because fathers tend to see the child in relation to the world vs the mothers view of the world in relation to the child.

Dads will show their love for their children in riskier ways and this is important. Letting them push on to the deep end of the pool (whilst we're still watching) encourages confidence, independence and safe risk taking. Rough and tumble play is also an imperative part of socialisation, which children need to develop between the ages of two and four. They learn what hurts and what doesn't. They learn that stretching, wrestling, pushing and pulling can be done in a friendly and "knockabout" manner, which is as important as learning that a thumb to the eyeball or a kick to the groin will never be taken as friendly.

The father's physical play also helps to socialise the child with regards to reading situations and understanding mood. A child who hasn't learnt to pick up and respond to these cues will find themselves struggling to create, maintain or to move in various friendship circles and may find themselves an outcast or victim of bullying in later years.

Whether we are encouraging our children to take life on by the horns (through safe risk-taking); honing their moral compass (through setting out rules and expectations); or just providing a role model of what a good man should be (for our sons to emulate and so our daughters have a yard-stick to measure future relationships by) we have an invaluable and ever changing part to play in our children's lives.





Struggling financially due to the drought?

You may be entitled to receive a one-off payment of up to \$3000 funded by the Australian Government's Drought Community Support Initiative – Round 2 (DCSI).

The Salvation Army is working together with St Vincent de Paul Society to deliver the DCSI for eligible drought affected households. Payments can help cover expenses such as groceries, vehicle maintenance, energy and utility bills, health and medical expenses.

RESTORATION APPEAL

We drive past it and possibly don't give it a second thought, but this iconic building of our town has been around since 1892. It once held a prominent place in society with many a wedding, baptism, confirmation and funeral held here at St Mary's. It remains a local landmark on the corner of John and Husking Streets, and still contributes to the community's sense of place.

The foresight of the first Rector, the Revered Groser who not only was a theologian of note but also had a nous for business, was quite remarkable. As he was able to drive the fund raising efforts and enthusiasm of the local community to donate their valuable time and significant resources to build the Church from local stone. Heavy stone was carted in by horse drawn wagons, then lifted higher and higher to complete the structure over an eight month period. All done voluntarily. Time and resources freely given.

Description from the State Heritage Office in 2013

"This was the first Anglican Church in Beverley townsite. It cost 475 pounds and was consecrated by Reverend Parry on 30th November 1892. The Chancel and Vestry were added in 1904 at a cost of 290 pounds. A memorial tower to Mr WH de Lisle, added in 1914, was too heavy for the foundation and was removed in 1926. The Lynch Gate was a War Commemoration and was dedicated on Remembrance Day 11 November 1956. The Porch was added in 1963 in memory of Mena Smith."

The Memorial Lynch gate mentioned is the only one of it's type in Western Australia.

Now, the Church has fallen into some disrepair and is in need of attention. We would not be appealing for funds if we were able to source from elsewhere. The Anglican Diocese of the Church is unable to offer any significant assistance, State Heritage and Lotteries Commission no longer supply funds for Churches. We are researching possible grant funding, however we need more than what may be available through that process.

The Church building itself is not only a symbol of our spiritual faith, as it was for previous generations who lived in the district, but it is also a building of historical significance to our Beverley community. As we go forward that historical significance can only become more and more important to future generations.

Our Restoration Plan:

- The appeal will continue for a twelve month period.
- During that time we will invite the community to regular open forums at the Church for updates and information sharing.
- We are working with the National Trust and the State Heritage body who are assisting us in the project.
- There will be fund raising activities throughout the year.
- Stages of the project include a conservation plan, then progressing through from the most urgent repairs to the painting and the finesse work of detailed restoration, all dependent on how much funds we are able to raise.

I'm sure the kids enjoyed their Saturday morning cricket trainings were they got to try and beat mum or dad with their batting or bowling.




