Burning and Easter

LRCI Funding Updates

The Lesser Hall Courtyard is now finished with only minor works (plants and lighting) to go in.

At the Town Hall, the AV upgrade is complete and new doors have been installed. The sliding doors look fantastic and will allow those with wheelchairs and prams to enter with ease.

Work next to the playground (at the oval) is due to start in April.

Bridge 3197 – York Willams Road

Please slow down on approach to Bridge 3197 on York-Williams Road. Bridge and road conditions have been modified whilst the Shire lobbies for funding to carry out upgrades. The bridge is now single lane and you need to be able to stop for traffic which may already be on the bridge as you approach from either direction.

2019/20 Annual Report and Annual Electors Meeting

There is no change from March Blarney and Council and the Audit & Risk Committee are still waiting for final approval from the Office of the Auditor General to receive and adopt the Annual Report. Once adopted, the Annual Electors Meeting will be held. Advertising will take place when approval is given from the OAG.

Beverley Caravan Park - Onsite Units

The onsite units are nearing practical completion with approximately one month to go. Gyprock to the walls and ceiling is complete. The bathrooms and wet areas are being tiled now.







The March meeting of the Garden Club was the first for 2021 What a great time to be gardening in with 19 members present and 8 apologies.

The agenda for the year was discussed and accepted.

- Membership fees will be kept at \$5 per year and morning teas \$2.
- The annual Beverley Rose Show discussed and it was generally accepted that we will retain the format of opening and judging on Friday 22 October and open again on Saturday morning. This year we will add interest with a display of teapots.
- We will be having a busy bee at the Dead Finish garden on Wednesday 31 March from 8.00am.

After the meeting we visited the Bonsai garden owned by Pat Broissant and what an interesting visit it was with Pat's cheeky parrot determined to be part of the fun, much to Delys's delight. Pat is obviously very keen on his bonsai having many plants on display and he also showed us how to care for and pot up some plants. Thank you very much Pat for a delightful morning with tea and cakes to follow.

Our next meeting, on Tuesday 06 April will be a visit to an Eremophyla Nursery in Kalamunda. We will meet the Dead Finish at 9.30am to leave on the bus at 10.00am, aiming to arrive at the nursery around 11.15am to 11.30am. You may wish to bring some morning tea with you to have on the bus. perfect time to be planting in the garden.April is a great time to attend to the following tasks in the garden: Aerate compacted lawns with a garden fork · Lift and divide bearded iris

April. The days are getting shorter

and the nights are much cooler. A

- Remove and discard any diseased or rotten fruit that may be hanging in trees
- · Repot plants that have outgrown their containers. Use fresh potting mix and a slow release fertiliser
- Mass plant ground covers to create a living carpet to suppress Good native weeds. ground covers include native violet and grevillea
- Empty compost bins and use it to condition vegetable and flower beds and spots where you plan to plant bare-rooted trees and shrubs in winter
- Prune hedges of lavender and rosemary
- Plant annuals for winter and spring colour. Try pansy, cineraria, viola, poppy, primula and stock
- Prune summer fruiting trees that have finished cropping. Pruning after harvest reduces the risk of fungal disease and gives the trees a chance to put on some growth before winter
- Trim native shrubs by about a third after they have finished flowering
- Prune any potted plants that are looking tired and lanky by half
- Top up slow release fertilisers in all pot plants to replace nutrients leached out by regular summer watering
- Apply a wetting agent to pots if water runs straight down the side of the pot and the potting mix below the surface stays dry
- This is the perfect time to establish native trees and shrubs such as bottlebrush, wattle and banksia.







The Easter period will be especially busy as it is the start of school holidays. Police will be out in force over these periods, so drive safe and take care on the roads.

protect before you pedal

The most common injuries for cyclists often occur as a result of a fall and generally in off-road locations such as footpaths, home driveways, cycle ways and skate parks. In WA, all cyclists must wear a bicycle helmet whether riding on the road, footpath, cycle paths and other off-road areas. Children riding bicycles with training wheels or sitting in a carrier seat on a bicycle must also wear a helmet. Children riding scooters, roller blades, rip-sticks and other wheeled devices are not legally required to wear a bicycle helmet. However, as many riding injuries are caused through falls it is recommended that children are encouraged to wear a bicycle helmet and protective gear such as elbow, wrist and knee pads and enclosed shoes.

A bicycle helmet is designed to offer the wearer protection and if worn correctly, decrease the risk of head injury by up to 85%. An Australian Transport Safety Bureau report that summarised multiple research papers on helmet issues concluded that:

- cyclists who do not wear bicycle helmets are twice as likely to suffer head, brain and facial injuries as cyclists who wear helmets
- non-helmeted cyclists are three times more likely to be killed as a result of a crash

A bicycle helmet that has been damaged by high force impact or heat damage cannot offer the wearer the same level of protection and should not be worn. Bicycle crashes and falls often occur when drivers of other vehicles fail to see the cyclist or wheeled device rider. Wearing fluorescent or bright coloured clothing can increase the visibility of riders in the traffic environment.

If you are over the age of 16 years and you fail to wear a helmet when riding your bicycle then you may receive an infringement for \$50.00.

Bicycle helmets are for your safety so make sure you wear one, and make sure your kids always wear a helmet when riding their bikes.





The COVID- 19 Vaccine roll out is currently underway, the Beverley and Brookton Medical Practices have been notified that they will receive their vaccines on or about the 12 April 2021.

As you can imagine there is a significant demand for safe and effective vaccines to end the COVID-19 pandemic and as vaccines become available they are prioritised for people in higher risk groups.

Priority groups have been identified and these include people that would be at a higher risk of serious illness if they contracted COVID-19 and those most likely to be exposed to it.

We can now book patients who meet the eligibility for phase 1b Priority population groups, these are as follows:

- people over 70 years of age or older,
- Health care workers:
- aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander adults over 55 years,
- younger people with a disability
- Critical and high risk workers including Australian government officials about to be deployed overseas on official government business.

Please ensure to book your appointment by calling us 08 9646 1241.

Patients will need to prove their eligibility to receive the COVID-19 vaccine in phase 1b and medical staff will need to make a copy of proof provided, eg: healthcare, critical and high risk workers will need their ID card or Phase 1b declaration form, people over 70 yrs drivers licence or passport, people over 18 rys with medical conditions will need clinical information supporting the condition, carers and disability workers will need ID card or the phase 1b declaration form.

Living our Life by Quarters

Just like a lot of sports, if we view our life through the paradigm of life taking four quarters to play then we find there are many common themes. A blokes life expectancy is 80 to 82 years and I have had fruitful discussions with several blokes who have died around this age. Subsequently I feel it is apt to be able to breakdown our life's journey into four quarters.

First Quarter (0 to 20 years). This is where we are learning the rules and getting into the game (establishing who we are in our life). Sometimes it takes time to get warmed up, (educated and starting work). The conditions we play in also affects our influence on the game (just as the different situations in our life). First quarters are often tough, and the opposition is unknown, (life throws up many curve balls like it does in adolescence).

The second quarter (21 to 40 years) is when we are getting used to our game plan and our teammates, there are many challenges such as injuries, opposition strengths and playing conditions (getting a head of steam up, forging our identity, sorting out our life plan and putting things into place to set us up for the future). We then look to see if we are in front or behind on the scoreboard (are we heading in the right direction?)

Half time. We get to have a rest, (a time for self-reflection) make some changes, reset the game plan and off we go again.

The third quarter (41 to 60 years) is often referred to as the premiership quarter. This is when we put in the tough yards, work hard, and put ourselves and the team in a winning position, giving up is not an option (this is part of mid-life, sometimes we must earn respect, and make tough decisions which will ultimately set us up for the last quarter and transition us easier into retirement).

The four quarter (61 to 80 years) is the time we get to enjoy the spoils of the game. We hope we have some distance between us and the opposition and are kicking with the wind, consolidating our position and winning the game (we can smell the roses and reflect on the hard yards we have put into life and hopefully enjoyed the journey).

Unlike sport, in life there are often no rules:

- We can get injured and/or taken out at any point throughout any quarter of the game.
- We need to participate in all quarters of the game and it is often said "you get out what you put in". Like with everything in life, we must make an effort.
- A couple of my friends passed away in the third quarter of life and when reflecting they have said to me, "they wished they had enjoyed their life a bit more".
- Recently I had a special mate who died after his 80th birthday. Before he passed away, he told me how he had a great game, and was in time-on and still enjoying himself.

I am a firm believer that "the world is run by people that turn up" and this is true both for sport and the game of life. Turn up; put in an effort, train and work hard, take calculated risks, have repeated efforts, stick to the game plan, hold out for the whole four quarters and ultimately celebrate success. Ultimately, we must enjoy ourselves along the way, it is not about the final siren but the way we played the game.



Beverley Historical Society presents another BEVERLEY PIONEER -

Andrew 'Sonny' Strange 1880-1966

Andrew Strange



Born – 21st October 1880 at Beverley, Western Australia

Married – 19th February 1920 to Julia McLeod at Beverley

Died – 6th June 1966 at Narrogin, Western Australia

Andrew & Julia had four children. Roy, Hilda, Freida & Fred.

Andrew Strange moved to the 'Dale' west of Beverley in about 1946 to farm "Oakland Valley' with his brother Fred.

He had previously farmed a property west of Brookton named 'Oak Hill', where he left his eldest son Roy to continue farming.

Andrew supplemented his income from the farm by trapping dingoes which were a problem to farmers in the area who were losing stock. Andrew was known as an excellent bushman.

Andrew lived on the property until his death in 1966 even crutching his sheep up until the age of 78. His youngest son Fred, took over the running of the farm and still lives there today.

Death of "Sonny" Strange

The death of 86-year-old 'Sonny' Strange of the Dale which occurred on Thursday of last week and was briefly referred to in last issue of this paper removed one of the district's finest bushmen whose lifetime spent in the Dale country was lived in the best traditions of the Australian outback. He was known far and wide in these parts and although he never appeared burdened with the material riches of life he accumulated a wealth of friends who recognised him as one well-endowed with the basic humanities of goodwill, kindness and tolerance. All who knew him were sorry to learn of his passing which occurred at the Narrogin hospital only a few weeks after the death of his life partner, Julie, who died suddenly whilst she was accompanying her husband to the Beverley hospital some weeks ago. Pioneering blood flowed in "Sonny's" veins as he was a member of a family with the very earliest associations with the Dale area. The funeral took place at the Anglican cemetery following a service at St. Mary's church on Saturday morning. The Rev. Henry Tassell officiated and friends and relatives came from far and wide to pay their last tributes of respect.

TRIBUTE

A Dale resident who has known the deceased citizen for many years has forwarded the following tribute to "Sonny" and his late wife: -

In the passing of Julie and "Sonny" Strange the district has lost two very fine people. A real "Darby and Joan" with real devotion to each other, their hospitality was known far and wide: it mattered not what walk of life a visitor came from, he or she was always invited in for a meal and made very welcome. Julie never had a bad word for anyone. She had a humble and retiring nature and although she never took a leading part

in communal affairs she used to attend every 'do' and always enjoyed herself. She and 'Sonny' were always asked to any party that was on even if it was for the young people.

'Sonny' was a unique character with a wonderful sense of humour and marvellous memory. He used to shear his own sheep at 78 and until he suffered a heart attack. He could also tell a good tall story and many people have filled in hours listening to his tales about the dingoes and brumbies he has trapped or the roos he shot. A lover of the outdoors he was a great bushman with the reputation of never having been lost in all his life. The Dale will not seem the same without him, and with these two gone it could be said that an era has ended for they were certainly pioneers in the true sense of the word. Julie in her early married life faced great hardships and the pair helped make the country what it is to-day. They reared a family of four and it would take a lot of space just to relate a few of the things accomplished in their lifetime. It was a fitting tribute to see such a big crowd of people come along to see them laid to rest.

Chilli thrips - a hot topic across Perth

The Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) has been inundated with reports of unfamiliar rose damage from the metropolitan area over the past few weeks.

Department testing has confirmed damage to rose samples were caused by the culprit: **chilli thrips**. Viral threats have been ruled out.

Chilli thrips (Scirtothrips dorsalis) are found throughout the world and were first reported in the State's north about 20 years ago.

The recent rainfall and humidity has created conditions that are conducive to chilli thrips, which like to feed on the sugars in new shoots.

Chilli thrips have moved down from the north of the State to the south in recent years and have been very active during the past few weeks in Perth gardens.

Also known as strawberry thrips and tea thrips, chilli thrips feed not just on roses but also on all citrus and their hybrids, as well as a range of fruit and vegetable hosts.

Chilli thrips are tiny and difficult to distinguish from other thrips species with the naked eye. The pest is about two millimetres long, pale or translucent in colour with an elongated body.

Plants infested by chilli thrips have damage similar to that caused by other thrips species, such as wrinkled, curled or distorted leaves with distinctive brown scarring along leaf veins, flower buds and the calyx or outer casing of fruit.

Management/Control

Thrips are difficult to control, however, thrips rarely kill or threaten the survival of trees and shrubs. Inspect early and often for damage symptoms and take immediate action to minimise the pest's impact. Once damage is seen, it's almost too late to take preventative measures, so act when thrips first arrive.




An option is to encourage new growth by doing a hard prune of infested plants to remove damaged plant material. If feasible, bag the offcuts before binning to prevent the pest from spreading.


Chilli thrips can be managed via a range of products registered to treat other species of thrips, scale or aphids. Multiple applications of treatments, whether organic or not, will probably be required and it may be wise to apply treatments to other nearby host plants to protect them from the pest.

Lots of information and advice on how best to control thrips on ornamental plants is available online, but advice can also be sort from local garden centres. As always, if you notice damage you've never seen before – please report it for screening.


This win meant that Beverley progressed to the Grand Final, to play the winner of the Preliminary Final between York and Tammin.






