SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Vincent Street Streetscape Project

In exciting news for Beverley, Council have awarded a tender for the civil component (footpaths, road, curbing, drainage, street trees and furniture) of the Vincent Street Streetscape Project. The project has been scaled back to run from Hunt Road to Forrest Street. Unfortunately Vincent Street, east of Forrest Street and the Town Square were removed from the project due to budget constraints. In its entirety the project is expected to be \$4.9M including undergrounding of power. Council will raise a \$1M loan for the project, use \$685,000 from Reserves and \$425,000 from General Revenue. \$2.75M is funded through Federal Government grant funding including the BBRF and LRCI streams. Council will continue to look for any other funding to reduce its contribution.

The Vincent Street Streetscape Project will create a safe, green and vibrant public area, with better seating and lighting. Enhanced pedestrian movement in and around the business area through traffic calming devices and safe crossing places. Vincent Street will also receive new drainage, curbing and level footpaths.

The project is expected to commence in October 2021 and be completed by June 2022. There will be traffic delays and inconveniences during this period but the outcome for Beverley is expected to bring economic gain for local businesses through increased tourism, the attraction of new people to town due to increased liveability and will have long lasting benefit for our future generations.

Community Grants - Now Open

The first round of the 2021/22 Community Grants is now open. The grants are available for local incorporated groups. Terms and conditions apply so grab an application pack and see if you are eligible. A quick call to the Shire will also assist you in determining your eligibility. Applications close 4pm, Friday 30 July 2021.

Caravan Park Cabins

The construction of six onsite cabins has been completed. Landscaping and road works are to be completed in due course as is the commissioning of the solar farm and vanadium battery storage. The cabins are due to open in early August and the volume of enquiries received to date to utilise them has been encouraging.

Playground Area Extension - Recreation Ground

Great news for our families and children, work is due to commence in early July at the playground located at the Recreation Ground on Forrest Street. We apologise in advance if there is any inconvenience caused during the works however there will be a new swing set, new play equipment and new table and chairs with a covering patio. We trust everyone will enjoy the changes.

Avondale Machinery Farm

Thank you to the members of the public who have provided comment on the 150 Square Report addressing the future of the Avondale Farm Machinery Museum. Council will now review all the comments to determine an appropriate way forward.

Local Government Elections – October 2021

There are possibly some retirements coming from some of our current Councillors who finish their terms in October this year. Council would like to see the Beverley Community fully represented so please consider the role of Councillor, there are 11 Ordinary Council meetings a year on the 4th Tuesday of each Month (except Jan). If you are interested in becoming a Councillor, please do not hesitate to have a chat with a current Councillor. Later in the year the Shire will hold information sessions.

Strategic Community Plan

Council have completed a Minor Review of the Shire of Beverley Strategic Community Plan and it is now available for public comment. A major review with community consultation sessions will be held in 2023. The Minor Review document is available via the front counter, the Shire website or it can be emailed to you. Please comment by 6 August.

Rates - Changes to the Discount Period

Council will soon meet to adopt the 2021/22 budget which includes rate setting. A reminder that when your rates come out this year, the discount period will be reduced from 35 days to 21 days. When you receive your notice, please read it carefully and take note of the date you must pay by to receive the 10% discount. The Shire of Beverley is one of the last Local Governments to still offer an early payment discount so please take advantage of it.

COVID - Stage 5

On 23 June 2021, the State moved into Phase 5 Restrictions which means the 2sqm rule and 75% capacity rule has been lifted. Thank you to everyone who abided by these rules when booking or using Shire facilities. You will however still need to "check-in".


Canon Groser's Crate



A wooden crate about 120 years old with a hinged lid, 108 x 30 x 27cm was recently donated to the Dead Finish Museum. The crate has the name 'GROSER' with a number and 'BEVERLEY' stencilled on the lid. On the bottom of the crate is 'MONTGOMERY WARD CO, CHICAGO, USA'. Across the corner is another stencil 'PHOTO GOODS'.

Montgomery Ward was a catalogue mail order firm that began in 1872 and from the early 1900s began issuing special catalogues of *Photographic Apparatus*.

Charles Eaton Groser was born in Brooklyn, New York and came to Western Australia in 1886. Canon Groser was the rector of the Beverley Anglican Parish from 1888 till 1914. On his arrival he and his family lived for 2 years on "Wannering" just to the east of Beverley town. The Rectory was built in 1890 and St Mary's Church in 1892 under his watch. He famously planted trees in the precinct




including the lemon-scented gum still to be seen. The whole St Mary's Precinct is now State Heritage Listed.

It can be surmised that Canon Groser had regular contact with America and could have been on the mailing list for Montgomery Ward catalogues and at some time made an order – perhaps 209546 – for photo goods that would have sailed from Chicago to Australia & eventually on the train to Beverley.

The wooden packing box was in a shed at the former home of Thelma & Richard Broun, Forrest St, Beverley. Richard was the nephew of Frank Richard Boyd Broun who was St Mary's Church Warden from 1901 to 1905. Once again it can only be surmised that rather than see this sturdy crate discarded, Mr Broun could make good use of it.

Thanks to the donor a valuable and interesting item of Beverley's history is preserved.





BEVERLEY TREE & SOCIETY GARDEN

Our June meeting was held at the Dead Finish Museum with 16 members present and 6 apologies. The 2021 Beverley Agriculture Show theme, Community Sticking Together, will enable the inclusion of the Historical Society, the Dead Finish Museum and the Community Garden in our exhibit. Members please remember to get some plants potted up to make our exhibit beautiful.

Our next meeting will be replaced by our senior members lunch on Tuesday 06 July at the CWA hall starting at 12 noon. Members please bring a savoury dish to share. Desserts will be supplied by Val Tylor. As always there will be a "bring and buy" table.

The rain has well and truly made it's presence felt but in between showers there is still gardening to do in Perth in July.

Vegies to plant

Artichoke, asparagus, broad beans, broccoli, cabbage, lettuce, onion, potatoes, spring onions, spinach and strawberry.

Flowers to plant

Carnation, foxglove, lobelia, marigold, nasturtium, pansy, poppy, snapdragon and stock.

July is a great time to attend to the following tasks in the garden:

- Clear mulch from plant stems to prevent collar rot
- Remove suckers from deciduous plants. Rip them off rather than cutting them otherwise they reshoot
- Soak bare-rooted roses in some liquid seaweed before planting into compost-enriched soil
- Plant pansies for winter colour
- © Cut back ornamental grasses that have browned. Take them right back to the ground and remove any dead foliage
- Tidy up pot plants by removing weeds and trimming off diseased and dead leaves
- W Keep garden paths safe by cleaning off fallen fruit, leaves and flowers
- Be on the lookout for mildew and rust diseases. Remove affected growth. To reduce the risk of these problems spreading, water plants in the morning
- Dig out bindies and winter grass from lawns before they set seed
- Lightly prune dwarf apple trees annually during winter to help motivate fruit production and fresh growth in spring
- Once deciduous trees are leafless, prune off any weak, dead, diseased or rubbing branches
- To extend the harvest and provide a steady stream of fresh peas, sow seeds every 3-4 weeks
- Weeding, weeding and more weeding!

Worth taking your camera out!

If you've ever noticed any colourful, strangely patterned moths or caterpillars in your garden, chances are that they may be one of our true blue, Aussie hawk moths and caterpillars. There are approximately 60 species of hawk moths in Australia, all differing vastly in colour, shape and size.

Identification

From the family Sphingidae, hawk moths are large, stout, and have cigar-shaped bodies. They are such good fliers that several aircrafts are named after them. Most hawk moth caterpillars have a distinctive spike on their back end. Many of the hawk moth caterpillars have diagonal bands running across their bodies, or large eye spots on the thorax and abdominal sections. These markings help with camouflage, disrupting the outline of the body to confuse predators such as birds.

A brief life story

Moths can lay up to 100 eggs on the underside of the larval (caterpillar) food plant. Early instar caterpillars feed underneath the leaves, but will make their way to the stems as they grow and develop their camouflage patterns.

Once large enough, these caterpillars will pupate within the leaf litter. Pupation can last anywhere from one to 25 weeks.

Fun Facts

- Hawk moth caterpillars cannot bite or sting and their spike is harmless! They may sometimes regurgitate green fluid if threatened or annoyed.
- Hawk moth adults are predominantly active during dawn and dusk. They can be seen around plants feeding on nectar, or around water such as puddles.
- Hawk moths are the most significant pollinators of papaya and pawpaw plants.

Although hawk moth caterpillars may eat your plants, their damage is minimal and moths play an essential role in providing great pollination services for many plant species. It's best to leave them be!

Suicide – You cannot address a problem without talking about it!



It does not matter what the issues are in our life, we must have a conversation and talking to someone about the situations we find ourselves in will relieve pressure and help us to normalise our own response to these issues. The challenge for all of us is to recognise where we are at, and then work through it. As a society we have perhaps become too politically correct about what we talk about and how we talk about it! Conversations around suicide are a classic example of this!

When we consider that 75% of suicides in Australia are men, it is important to develop an understanding of *life problems* in our own lives and in the lives of others around us. Suicide does not have a set of risk factors that you can refer to and suicidal ideation is not necessarily a mental illness. Suicide prevention is everyone's business.

There is a lot to talk about when we are discussing suicide, and it is essential that we all learn more, but three key points summarising what we know about suicide are:

- 1. A distressed (suicidal) person does not want to die. They want to stop the pain;
- 2. It is safe to talk about thoughts of suicide with at risk people;
- 3. Suicide is not usually a complex decision, the reasons (layers) however behind the suicidal thoughts are complex, and usually need professional help.

We also know that a lot of completed suicides are a result of people being under extreme distress (what we call situational distress) and not from a mental illness. We do not have to have a diagnosed mental illness to complete suicide.

People quite often ask, when should I be concerned? Be observant about any changes in a person's situation, anything that is out of the ordinary for that person. Some experts spend all their time talking about indicators of risk, and higher risk groups (men for example). However, we all should be deemed at risk if we have shit going on in our life. Suicide can happen to anyone, anywhere, anytime. Knowing individual human capacity is the unknown factor!

We should never underestimate the power of ordinary people to make a difference and the important role we can have supporting someone through a difficult patch in their life. This can be in the three areas of our life where we often connect with people - our family, workplace and/or community group.

We must always remember a conversation can *change* someone's life. Sometimes this is confused with, a conversation can *save* someone's life (only that person can save their own life).

We do not know if someone is suicidal unless we ask. If we have that gut feel about the person, we must ask. It's not easy, we do not need formal training and our 'language' is up to us. We do however need awareness, empathy and the ability to listen. If the answer is 'yes' put in place an immediate plan for both support and follow up ensuring the safety of all. We need to be prepared to act. There is plenty of help out there (refer to useful contacts below), the local mental health team, local doctor, and other support services in your area. Be prepared by becoming informed. Remember ...before it all gets too much... Talk to a Mate!!®






